WHEREAS, prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in American men and the third leading cause of cancer death behind lung and colon cancer. 1 in 8 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer in their lifetime and 1 in 6 African American men will develop prostate cancer in their lifetime. Overall, African American men are 1.7 times more likely to be diagnosed with – and 2.1 times more likely to die from – prostate cancer than white men; and

WHEREAS, veterans who were exposed to herbicides like Agent Orange are at increased risk for developing prostate cancer, and are more likely to have an aggressive form of the disease; and

WHEREAS, if caught early prostate cancer has a five-year survival rate of nearly 100%. However, for late stage prostate cancer the five-year survival rate is 31%; and

Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Present:

Michael J. Flure, County Administrator Christine Allen, Recording Secretary Michelle I. Gunther, Clerk of the Board John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Not Present: Commissioner John P. Kelly

Commissioner Haines welcomed the new Ocean County College President, Dr. Pamela Monaco. Dr. Monaco is the fifth President and first female President of the College. Dr. Monaco is working closely with her public high school partners addressing learning loss during Covid, and is focusing on expanding its programs for Adult Education. The Members of the Board are looking forward to working closely with Dr. Monaco, and offered their continued support.

Mr. Ernst discussed the downtown Toms River road improvement project that will be funded mainly by the Toms River BUILD Grant. The project will address traffic flow and flooding issues to accommodate the redevelopment plan in the Water Street area. A modern roundabout as well as a new traffic signal will be added, and Herflicker Boulevard and Irons Street will be raised 1.8 feet. Construction is planned to begin in 2024. The cost estimate for the project is \$7 million, of which \$5.6 million will be covered by the grant. Toms River Engineer Robert Chankalian, Toms River Planner Robert Hudak, and URS Consultant Scott Diehl were in attendance to answer any questions. Members of the Board of Commissioners August 10, 2023 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of August 9, 2023 Page 2

Commissioner Crea and Mr. Agliata notified the Board of a second collection date for the Ocean County Boat Flare Disposal Program taking place on September 23, 2023. The pilot program held in May collected over 1200 marine flares from Ocean County residents. The program was devised by Solid Waste Management in conjunction with The Ocean County Fire Marshals and The Ocean County Fire Academy in response to public disposal concerns as fire departments and the Coast Guard no longer accept them.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about an Open Space Acquisition recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. The 22.33-acre property located off Brookville Road in Ocean Township contains the Cold Spring Brook, a tributary of the Oyster Creek, and is adjacent to the Citta Boy Scout Campground. The property owner accepted a negotiated offer of \$100,000.00.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the construction of the Barnegat Branch Trail Phase VIII, from Hickory Lane to Berkeley Avenue in Berkeley Township. A letter was received from the State DOT informing the County that we will be receiving a County aid allotment of \$12,837,790.00 from the NJ Transportation Trust Fund. In addition, the County will also be receiving \$78,093.84 in reappropriated unexpended funds from the Statewide Transportation and Local Bridge Bond Act of 1999. These funds will be awarded by June 30, 2025 and must be used to rehabilitate and improve structurally deficient bridges consistent with the Local Bridge Fund program. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the August 16, 2023 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 16, 2023. There were no questions or comments.

There were no additional comments from the Commissioners.

Mr. Fiure notified the Board that the County CFO conducted a public American Rescue Plan Hearing. The Board agreed to allow Ms. Tarrant to adopt the plan.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Quinn, seconded by Commissioner Haines, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:42pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.




