DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Okay, we're going to start today's meeting with presentations of the winners of the annual "My County Poster Contest" in recognition of National County Government Month. Are you going to read those?"

CLERK GUNTHER: "Yes. I believe that Acting County Clerk John Catalano is here, and Commissioner Bacchione. Would you like to present?"

JOHN CATALANO, ACTING COUNTY CLERK: "Thank you guys for all coming. It's wonderful. And everyone who entered and gave us posters, terrific job. So, congratulations to you folks, being the last four finalists. So, as the Director said, April is National Government Month, and we try to do our posters in conjunction with that. Ocean County Government is responsible for road maintenance, jails, mortgage and deed recording, voting procedures, probates of will, adoption and so much more. And to that end we established this, "My Poster Contest" which started over 30 years ago in Ocean County with the intent that our students would depict something that is very unique in Ocean County and hopefully put that down on their poster. About our process...we sent out letters back in March to all the fourth-grade schools telling them about our contest. There's approximately 58 classes of fourth graders with well over 300 children. We received back 75, terrific, terrific posters and they're on the walls in the Clerk's Office for all to see and we hate when it ends because we take these posters down and it's like Christmas, you know, the walls are now bare. (laughter) Our procedure for it is I made up ballots and gave them to all 40 of my staff members and had them roam the halls and come up with their ten best. We compiled those ten best and we put those on Facebook. They were on there for about three weeks. At the end of April, we found out who had the most "likes" and that's how we determined our winner. If there was a tie it would go by the share button. If anybody had any shares, they would be the breaker. So, that being said, I'm honored now to call up our winners. And I'm going to call you up, one by one, so friends, families, come on up.

Our honorable mention was Monroe Kotsifas. (applause) He's from Forked River School. She is, I'm sorry. I'm looking at dad." (laughter)

2. New Jersey Library Association's 2025 Librarian of the Year.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, we'll continue with presentations with the New Jersey Library Association's 2025 Librarian of the Year. And again, you're up. (Commissioner Bacchione) Goodbye, all. Thank you all for being here." (applause)

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "So, we are very privileged to have in the entire State of New Jersey, chosen was Ocean County's Toms River Librarian, Librarian of the Year. So, I wanted you to say a few things about your story because it's a great story."

DIANE MUSELLA: "Well then I'm going to take it out of my...I mean I know my story, but...(laughter) But I wrote a speech that I gave last week so let me quickly...okay, so this was a huge honor that my colleagues nominated me for and so I had said that the librarians are amazing. I want to thank Ocean County Library, and I want to thank the Board of Commissioners for letting me, you know, run amazing programs and diverse programs and it was exciting to see the children here that are the future of our county, you know. So, I just want to tell you a quick story of regrowth. Actually, someone in the...Geri knows because...so, 12 years ago my children and I were technically homeless. Technically, because we were staying at my parents' house in an adult community and we weren't supposed to stay there more than two weeks at a time. My children and I were sharing one room. I slept in a recliner. My child, Richie, slept on the floor and Brendon was on a futon. We were only going to be there a few weeks, but it was six months after (Hurricane) Sandy and there were no small rentals. I wasn't able to find a rental. So, one day I was working at the Lakewood Branch of the Ocean County Library, and somebody came in reminding me about a meeting for Habitat for Humanity, Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity. And it reminded me I wanted to go to this meeting. So, I picked up a flyer and I went to the meeting and, like I said, I was trying to find a small rental but there was nothing. So, I went to the meeting in that library, and I took the steps, and I became a Habitat homeowner. This was 12 years ago. (applause)

It's a longer story. It's all transparent and if you google my name you'll find it. But what I wanted to say, and I've said is that a library can change lives and I believe in that. A flyer in the library changed my life. A meeting in a library changed my life and the libraries and library staff changed my life. Fast forward a few years after that I got a full-time job at the library after that and then I became a Circulation Supervisor and then in 2020, 28 years after I graduated high school, I got my bachelor's degree. (applause) A year later I earned my Masters of Library Science. In 2021, I became a librarian, and I do strive to help build community and transform the lives of our patrons. I do know it's possible because I was transformed with knowledge and information. And I also know that looks different for everyone. So, I say this award is not just for me. It's for all the people that have ever helped me get there, my colleagues, even the Ocean County Commissioners and the staff of Ocean County Library. I'm lucky. I surround myself with amazing people, and at the end, you know, we never know what our future could bring. 20 years ago, I was homeless. 20 years ago, I was a single mom. 12 years ago, I was homeless. Five years ago, I wasn't a librarian, and now I'm librarian of the year, so...thank you."

GARY BLACK, BEACHWOOD: "Hello. Gary Black. I'm now in Beachwood. And, Jack, you know I wasn't going to pass this up. I've been an advocate for the Natural Lands Trust since its inception. I know Ocean County is the inventor of the Natural Lands Trust. It happened in John Bartlett's office. It's not from the environmental protection and that...I know a lot of you guys are new and don't hear what I normally say about this, but of course I'm for the environmental concerns but also there's a financial benefit that everybody keeps forgetting. I know a lot of people keep attacking it saying that you're wasting county money on lands and doing favors for builders. The usual crap that you've been hearing for the past 20 years. But, no, it actually saves money because if you look on that area you got roads and stuff written in there and those are things where things can get built on. When you build it brings in revenue from tax revenue but especially residential doesn't even cover the cost, especially the education cost, the monster in the room. The Natural Lands Trust actually pays for itself. For every money the county lays out, and I know as John Bartlett used to call it, a pay as you grow. Any money we lay out eventually gets paid back and actually turns into a profit because for the taxpayers, both municipal and county, whatever area it's in because there's services they don't have to provide. The savings in school taxes. The savings in sanitation, police, fire, all of that. So, not only is it an environmental win, it's a financial win. And this is something I know you've heard this about ten million times by now, but, oh, by the way, I voted for you today."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Oh, thanks."

GARY BLACK: "Alright. But again, it's a great program. I'm glad that we're the county that invented it. I'm proud of that and just hopes it keeps going as we grow. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Gary. Would anyone else like to be heard on this resolution? Seeing none, I'll close the Public Hearing and ask for a motion to adopt."

V. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:27 PM, Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. We'll move on to Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Bacchione."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I just wanted to draw your attention on the resolutions on Q-1. One of the things that were being proposed as a bill is to support lifeguards as first-responders and this is something I think that Commissioners in Ocean County were discussing adopting as well because they do put their life on the line every summer whenever there's an emergency in the water, so they are very important to us. Again, congratulations to the Librarian of the Year. I was able to attend down at the Atlantic City Librarian of the Year, so it was pretty emotional to be there and see her win the award. So, congratulations again to Diane (Musella). Last week we had our Teacher of the Year for the county. There was a lot of teachers there and a little bit of writer issues trying to sign all those certificates, but congratulations to our teachers of the year who worked so hard.

We also had the Ocean County commencement which was amazing seeing people be able to graduate and take the next step in life. And then we had... the tourism had a panel along with Monmouth County discussing all the things we're getting ready for, for this summer. So, that's all of the comments I have. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Commissioner Arace."

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "Thank you. I just want to congratulate Brian Gabriel in the Waretown Fire Academy for another successful graduation. Now we have 24... 24 firefighters had graduated. So, thank you for all that amazing work. And obviously that's much needed around the county, and I just want to thank you one more time. Congrats to everyone."

(Applause)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Commissioner. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you, Mr. Director. There's two things – one – it's a sad thing. I mean many of you people may know, Jerry. I always called him Jerry, the Barber, Jerry Simpson. He had the barbershop. Unfortunately, he passed away and I would just ask you if you can keep the family in your prayers. He had pancreatic cancer, and I know if anyone knows what's that like he suffered for a while. But he was a great individual. I was in rotary with him, and I just want to ask if you would just think of his family.

The other thing I want to, of course it went off on my phone, I want to talk about, is a text message that I had received from someone, many of you know, he's, our mayor. And this is what he had sent to me:

"The fact that you believe anyone knows who you are and that you're someone going to steer votes away from my candidates shows just how out of touch and self-absorbed you are. You're a liberal, which I've never been known to be a liberal, set up a soup kitchen, which I did not, in a public library down the block from two schools, and you've been promoting the idea of setting up a homeless shelter in Toms River. Ginny, you're a joke. Had it not been for (George) Gilmore's favor, George you were mentioned, and county line you would never have served in office. I just want you to know how ridiculous I think you look, and my follow-up letter will point all of that out. Good riddance." I understand that he did do a letter today and I'd just like to clear up some things. We, the County Commissioners, our authority is only to appoint the people that are Commissioners to the library. It is not up to us to tell them what to do with what goes on in the library. That is up to the Board of Commissioners at the library. And the thing is maybe if Mr. Rodrick would pay attention to exactly what is the facts maybe he would start to do more things that are right.

And the other thing with regard to the homeless shelter, I have never made a comment with regards to it, with regards, but he can say what he wants. It's just that he is not for anything an individual who wants to, you know, take down a church and all the other things that he's doing to the people of Toms River, is atrocious and I just wanted to make sure I made that statement to him, because unfortunately, and I don't usually like to say this about publicly about another elected official, but if anyone reads his mail you would see that none of every single thing that he writes in all of his letters is 100% inaccurate. And I just wanted to make the statement that this is the type of thing that a mayor sent to me with regards to something that I had mailed two people of Toms River. Thank you."

(Applause)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Ginny. Commissioner Sadeghi."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Just to follow up on Commissioner Arace with the Ocean County Fire Academy graduation. That was an honor. I know the Commissioner had a prior engagement and he asked if I could, sort of, step in and participate in the proceedings but it's wonderful. I had goosebumps for the entire hour that I was there and these are...thank God that we have these young people that decide that their mission in life is to save lives and such. So, I'm grateful for having had the opportunity to be there. And again, congratulations to all the people that actually graduated through the academy. I was asking Brian (Gabriel) if you could just come up and talk for less than 45 minutes, talk about the academy, but... (laughter) maybe."

BRIAN GABRIEL: "I'll take a raincheck." (laughter)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Brian." (laughter)

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "See, I didn't do that to you. I didn't do that to you." (laughter)

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "Thank you."

W. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:33 PM, Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. We'll now move on to public comments. I'll remind everyone that we limit comments to 5 minutes and ask you to identify yourself by name and address and you're now welcome to come and address us on any issue that you find that you want to talk to us. Yes, ma'am."

RACHEL PEACE, COUNTY RESIDENT: "Hello, everyone. I'm becoming a bit of a fixture here. So, I'm back today in regard to the resolution we presented to you at the last Commissioner hearing about Medicaid, Medicare, SNAP, CHIP, etc. I know that we spoke last week, and you guys had opted not to put it on to the agenda for this week because you are all doing your due diligence in going through the 1100-page bill. And I had spoken with the Administrator's office as well. They've been super helpful and receptive. So, again, I just want to thank you guys that you are actually putting in the work. I know it is extensive to do all of this research to ensure that, you know, things that have been said to you are accurate and that the outcome is what's best for the residents of Ocean County. Oh, did I forget to say, 'Hi, Rachel Peace.' Anyhow, so I've also been doing my research in the time since we've been together last, and I wanted to state a few things for the record that I wasn't sure if everyone was aware of here. One, from my research, healthcare is actually the number one industry in Ocean County contributing to our economy. And so, beyond the impacts to individuals who rely on Medicaid we have to think about the fiscal impacts to our actual local economy and the implications for the hospitals, the healthcare providers, the nursing home providers. I know that there are 70 licensed nursing homes here in Ocean County. There are four or five major hospitals, and the state has actually already modeled the impacts of the cuts to those hospitals which are in the millions and millions and tens of millions of dollars just for fiscal year 2026 not even looking further than that. There's also a healthcare nursing crisis, nationwide, and New Jersey is one of the top ten states impacted by that nursing crisis. And we know that when nurses get overwhelmed because there's not enough nurses on their team and there's an influx of patients that leads to burn-out, dissatisfaction with their jobs and leaving those positions. So, on the heels of COVID and the pandemic when the healthcare industry is already been a bit decimated and with the implications in the bill that there will be cuts to the nurse staffing ratio where there will no longer be enforcement of a rule that was passed that required at least one RN on for 24/7 coverage in nursing homes as well as, you know, a few other nurses, LPN's, etc. We know that that's going to be the impact and also for the patients in nursing homes. I believe the statistic is a 30% increase in

deaths, or I should pull up the statistic, but I sent it to your office, if the nurse staffing ratio drops or if there's one extra patient per nurse. So, I'm not trying to get too deep into the weeds here, but, you know, I do want to kind of reiterate that both the healthcare industry from the hospitals themselves to the people who work to provide care for not just seniors, not just people on Medicaid, but the general population are going to be impacted. There have also been modeling's of the impacts for uncompensated care that's going to increase by the billions as a result of this and so you're going to see crazy waiting lines in the ER's no matter what kind of insurance or lack of insurance you have. And you're going to see rates and premiums and copays go up for people who have employer-covered health insurance.

And then I also want to speak a bit to the concerns with the work requirement for those with disabilities. My older sister could not be here today, but she asked me to speak on her behalf and to tell you all that over the course of her life she has tried many times to get and hold down jobs. She has lost them due to not being able to perform at the same level as her able-bodied or able-minded peers. She has trouble getting to and from jobs because she doesn't have a license and she has PTSD from like the six car accidents she got in when she did have a license. And so those are some real, practical, real-life barriers for people who may need to be on Medicaid but won't be able to get to those 20 hours. And then furthermore, I know administratively you guys offer programs to help people supportively get into jobs and get into volunteer positions. And so I'm just curious the administrative costs are going to skyrocket as more and more people need help to fulfill these work requirements. And if that has been taken into consideration? I'm not sure where I am on my five minutes. I could talk all day about this, but I just wanted to make sure that you also took into consideration, personally myself, I receive NJ FamilyCare and so does my son and you know, there are not just work requirements, there are reporting requirements and we've seen how that goes in Arkansas, they tried this back, in I believe, it was 2018, and at least 18,000 people within the course of seven months lost their healthcare, not because they weren't eligible, but because they could not handle the influx of paperwork. The administrative costs skyrocketed and the level of people working didn't actually go up, just the level of people uninsured did. And so, for myself, personally, I'm a contractor. I find opportunities to write for non-profits and research for non-profits and that is not steady work. I don't necessarily have 20 hours this week, 20 hours this week, 20 hours this week. I might do 70 hours one week."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Rachel, your five minutes are up."

RACHEL PEACE: "Alrighty."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I'll give you a couple minutes just to wrap up."

RACHEL PEACE: "Yeah. I think that policies that are well intended that want to help people feel fulfilled and be involved in their communities may miss the mark when it comes to the realities and the practicalities of every individual situation. I, myself, could end up losing healthcare despite the fact that I work, and clearly, I'm very engaged in my community and volunteer and advocate pro bono. So, thank you so much for your time, and I'm looking forward to seeing the new resolution that you guys come up with and I'll be back. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

(Applause)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I would ask that we don't have any clapping at the end of anybody's...we'll listen to what they have to say, and we are pleased that everybody came out today. Bob, go ahead."

ROBERT YAISER: "Good afternoon. Commissioners, I think we can all agree that anyone who's been watching the news recently..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Just give us your name and address for the record."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'm sorry. Robert Yaiser, 7 Warren Court, Manahawkin. I think we can all agree that anybody who's watched the news recently that the American people are tired of being lied to and watching blatant cover-ups at every level of the government all the way up to the White House. A few months ago, the current President of the United States vowed to restore law and order back into what he referred to as the Department of Criminal Injustice. To avoid any confusion, I plan on starting from the beginning so that the public as well as our new Commissioners can see the facts and irrefutable evidence that has been provided to this commission and the multiple agencies involved in these complaints of corruption over the last few years. These complaints have been intentionally covered up without any accountability at the taxpayers' expense. I can say that unequivocally because that's exactly what Ocean County Law Enforcement told me in 2020. The FBI also reached out to me in 2021. I was forced into this disaster when Law Enforcement contacted me and originally told me the truth. They confirmed that the students and parents' complaints were legitimate when they reached out to me for assistance. Since then, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Internal Affairs Unit has lied about what was originally told to me, refused to investigate any of the complaints or answer anything in writing. Commissioner Arace and (Commissioner) Sadeghi, I want to thank you for meeting with me recently at our meeting. I explained to you at that meeting I've been appearing here for three years after numerous students at our Academy of Law and Public Safety reported that they were bullied by district personnel including law enforcement instructors for reporting corruption and cover-ups within the Ocean County Vocational School District and their Board of Ed. All you have to do to find the truth is just ask them.

Over the last few years these brave individuals and their family members have attended, District, Board of Ed and this

Commission's meetings requesting, actually, begging, for help and accountability. I also explained to you at that meeting that you don't have to believe me, and I invited you to ask anyone who has attended military basic training or a law enforcement academy. When you meet your drill or law enforcement instructors you are immediately instructed to follow orders. Honesty and integrity are not optional, they're mandatory. Your instructors have an indelible mark on your careers. They're supposed to be role models who prepare you for all elements of service and shape you into honorable and dedicated professionals. As I've explained to you numerous times I vowed to my students and graduates, many who are currently serving in every branch of the United States Military, Military Academies, Police Agencies, Firefighters and EMS services that I vowed to get them the truth and accountability, and I intend to keep that promise.

These courageous young men and women, unlike anybody else involved in these complaints, are the only ones whose skin in the games are their lives. They go out every day to risk their lives to protect us. The news article a few days ago, rather, read, "Governor Phil Murphy had the audacity to claim that the Jersey Shore did not have a chaotic weekend." This statement is not a misjudgment; it's a deliberate attempt to sweep a serious public safety crisis under the rug for political gain. The Governor's refusal to acknowledge the severity of the situation reeks of political maneuvering. If you watch those videos many of those young officers are graduates from my academy. One of those Seaside Heights police officers involved in the melee attempted to break up a fight in a pizzeria where one of the subjects dropped a loaded handgun. Class I Officers do not carry handguns. So, to break that down within weeks of graduating high school our graduates are out there keeping Ocean County safe. That officer was one of the four students last year who I told you reported that he was instructed by one of the administrators at our academy to lie to uniform police. All four of those students who are now police officers stated they're not lying or compromising their integrity for anyone. We forwarded the complaints up the chain, and as usual we were ignored without even a response. Complaints of dishonesty and misconduct and corruption have permeated throughout that district for years. I don't know how much clearer or any other way to say this you cannot demonstrate that line and cover-ups are acceptable at a Law Enforcement Academy. I'm confident when the public sees the facts they will be astounded by how many employees of the Department of Ed officials, including active law enforcement, have been permitted to lie and cover up these complaints without any consequences in the last few years. I know I'm on a limited schedule so next time I'm here I'll start with the initial complaints and explain this cover up step by step so everyone can understand. Thank you for your time."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Bob."

MARY ANN BAGEAC, 73 CRANMOOR DRIVE, TOMS RIVER: "Thank you for your time. I wanted to take an opportunity to acknowledge Ms. Haines characterization of our mayor who is not solution-minded but also to address an issue that, although I did write to my Ward 4, Councilman, I did not receive a response. This is in regard to the proposed homeless shelter overnight or otherwise, in the Ward 4 residential area. While I and many others do not support the concept of an eminent domain regarding the church which does a lot of good work and has for years, we do not support, I do not support, the establishment of a homeless shelter in a residential neighborhood. It is clearly zoned residential. In addition, the benefit to the homeless is very limited in this area as they will not have immediate access to healthcare, mental health services, job counseling or jobs, generally. There is plenty of commercial or retail space where such a facility could be placed. Clearly, we need something in Ocean County and that does fall to the county. If we are going to spend taxpayer dollars on any facility, it needs to be efficiently spent to maximum benefit more than 17 beds with direct access to healthcare, mental health services, substance abuse counseling, job training and jobs. I am disappointed that my councilman chose not to respond, nor did he forward my letter to you, I'm pretty sure. To the extent possible I would ask the county to present your own solutions where our township has not offered other solutions. Thank you."

(Applause)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Again, I'll ask you to stop the clapping. Yes. I'm supposed to call on people to come up."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "Oh, I'm sorry."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "But that's okay. You're here now."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "Good afternoon. My name is Barbara Crystal and I'm a retired Southern Regional High School teacher from Manahawkin, 248 Bulkhead Avenue. I'm speaking in support of New Jersey Citizen Actions proposed resolution for the Ocean County Board of Commissioners to urge our entire State Congressional Delegation to vote against the passage of OBBBA, the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act", aka, the proposed budget reconciliation bill. If passed, this bill will be the largest transfer of wealth from the poor to the rich in recent history and will unnecessarily add trillions to our country's debt. At the last meeting I was very impressed and grateful for the professional manner in which you conducted the event and for your thoughtful and supportive responses. I truly felt that you listened to our concerns and appreciated that you agreed to reach out to our CDII and CDIV Congressmen and to add our resolution to the agenda for your next meeting. I felt that you truly wanted to do what was right and what would protect Ocean County's most vulnerable residents. A later follow-up article indicated that you'd walked back your support for our proposed resolution after speaking with our CDII and CDIV Congressmen. I hope that you'll reconsider your position after again hearing this bill's impending catastrophic impacts on the least of us. Political affiliation should have no bearing on doing what is right and I implore you to do your own due diligence for the sake of your constituents. According to today's CBO, the Congressional Budget Office Analysis of OBBBA, on a national level, if OBBBA is passed, \$2.4 trillion will be added to the deficit over the next decade. 11 million people

will lose their healthcare by 2034, and 4 million children will lose their SNAP benefits. Millions of Pell Grant recipients will no longer be able to afford higher education. Congressman (Jeff) Van Drew and Karoline Leavitt's claim that OBBBA will decrease the deficit by \$1.6 trillion has been debunked by today's CBO analysis, by rightleaning Axios and other reputable sources. States will be forced to cut SNAP benefits to balance their budgets. Nationally, others who are at risk of losing food assistance are 1.4 million older adults age 55-64 without children in their homes due to the increased work requirement age to receive benefits. More than 3 million adults who live with school-aged children due to dependent children's ages dropping from any child under 18 to any child under 7. What about the 7- to 18-year-old children? What will that do to the parents of those children and their families? Also, losing food assistance will be Veterans, people experiencing homelessness and young people who have aged out of foster care. Currently in Ocean County 169,000 residents are covered by Medicaid, 99,000 children are covered by Medicaid, NJ FamilyCare and CHIP. 58,000 residents receive SNAP. Medicaid covers 30% of New Jersey's births and 12 months of post-partum care for mothers and babies. OBBBA will disproportionately hurt children, seniors, pregnant moms, the disabled, the poor and the homeless. Farmers and grocers that supply food for the SNAP program will also be harmed. If congress removes just the estate tax giveaway for the wealthy, that would eliminate the need to cut SNAP benefits. Martin Luther King, Jr. once said, "There comes a time when one must take a position that is neither safe nor politic nor popular, but he must take it because conscious tells him it is right." Now is your time to do what is right for Ocean County, New Jersey, and our nation. Your constituents are depending on you to stand up for them. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Thank you for your comments."

BARBARA CRYSTAL: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Anyone else like to be heard at this time? Please come up."

ANN BARKEY: "Good afternoon. I'm Ann Barkey from Long Beach Island. I am here on behalf of the Joint Council of Taxpayers' Associations of Long Beach Island, also known as JCTA. The JCTA members are the eleven Taxpayers' Associations on the island and collectively we cover an area of over 17,000 properties. I'd just like to briefly describe a very persistent public safety issue that is ongoing in LBI and also suggest a solution for you to consider. Our public safety concern is the following. We are very grateful to the visitors and guests who come on our island. They contribute mightily to our robust economy, but these vacationers are also very much on vacation. And as you know, people when they are on vacation sometimes do things they wouldn't normally do, that includes picking up bicycles. Seeing Long Beach Boulevard, a county road, in all of its flatness. It's all of its beauty and jumping on that bicycle that they haven't been on in 20 years and tearing down that Boulevard also on the wrong side of the street. Not only that, they are competing with walkers, our vacationers, who very rarely have had an opportunity to walk for leisure, and yet, the siren call of Long Beach Boulevard in its flatness beckons and off they go. Also, very often, on the wrong side of the street. So, we have the perfect storm of public safety problems with a wide variety of people, thousands of people, very often creating situations where there are accidents and there are many. And many of them are serious and some of them are horrific and the cause are the bike riders and the pedestrians not following the things we learned in first grade which we can all recite. Walk against traffic, ride with traffic. That's the problem. It's pervasive and it's serious. We offer the following solution, and we ask your consideration. We know the 11 organizations that there's one thing that makes a difference and that is those red and white signs that say, wrong way. Wrong way, little drawing of a bike. Wrong way, little drawing of a person. They change behavior. They make the Boulevard more safe. We ask you to consider funding and installing those signs throughout Long Beach Boulevard from Holgate to Barnegat Light at appropriate intervals on the correct side of the street. It will reduce accidents. It will make our Boulevard and our island more safe. We ask for your consideration."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you and you will get our consideration. Let me just ask you before you go back to your seat if you'll get a card from the County Engineer. We will look at that. Yes, George."

GEORGE GILMORE, 15 CRANMOOR DRIVE: "I've heard a lot over the last, I'd say month, about the proposed 17-bed homeless facility at the church. I looked into this a little bit. It's my understanding that the church is utilizing funds that were provided either directly to the church or through a third-party to the church based on an act of the Freeholders last year. The only thing...I'm not here to criticize or that but what I am asking is it's also my understanding that, that funding expires by the end of this month, June of this year. And the one thing I would ask is that the Freeholders not renew that funding, just let it lapse. And that way the people in the Cranmoor area can feel safe, that they don't have to worry about any issues arising from the homeless shelter. Am I correct on the expiration date?"

COMMISSIONER ARACE: "Yeah, that is true. There is a contract directly with a third-party end homelessness and that contract is set to expire at the end of June."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I would ask the Freeholders, seriously, or Commissioners, seriously consider not taking any action to renew that, just let it expire. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Yes, sir."

DANIEL BAZARIAN: "Good afternoon. My name is Dan Bazarian. I'm an organizer with the New Jersey Nurses Union, Communication Workers of America, Local 1091. I'm going to speak on the same subject as the first and fourth speakers today, specifically from the perspective of a labor union representing healthcare workers. CWA represents 70,000 workers across the State of New Jersey, 5,000 of whom are healthcare workers. So, the impact of

looming cuts to Medicaid on our state can't be overstated. 1.2 million New Jerseyans rely on Medicaid, 639,000 of whom are children. CWA members work in hospitals treating patients who rely on these benefits for care, and they understand first-hand what losing access to Medicaid will mean for this vulnerable population. As dire as the outlook on Medicaid recipients alone is it's crucial to understand that the impact of these cuts will go much further. Cutting Medicaid funding will mean worse care for everyone regardless of whether you're a Medicare recipient or not. Hospitals rely on Medicaid funding to keep their doors open. By providing coverage Medicaid decreases the number of uninsured patients which takes pressure off hospitals and keeps hidden costs from getting passed onto the rest of us through higher insurance premiums. Medicaid also ensures rural communities have access to healthcare. Slashing funding could lead to hospital closures in many rural areas leaving entire communities without access to care while also putting local economies at risk since hospitals are often one of the biggest employers in the area, real anchor institutions for the community. Healthcare workers already face significant staffing challenges on the job. As it is New Jersey is projected to have one of the largest staffing shortages in the country. Proposed Medicaid cuts would threaten staffing levels even further requiring higher patient loads for nurses and other direct care staff than they can appropriately care for. These staffing shortages lead to decrease quality of care, worse patient outcomes, burnout, and many healthcare workers just deciding to leave the field altogether. So, we urge you to consider the impacts that these cuts will have on all New Jerseyans and thank you very much for the opportunity to testify today for CWA, District 1."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Yes, ma'am."

JILLIAN BUCHANSKY, 116 BOWSPRIT ROAD, MANAHAWKIN: "Thank you all for your time tonight and to everybody in the audience for coming out here. I'm going to speak much more simply than person one, four and just now on the proposed cuts to Medicaid. Being a leader means fighting like hell for the people's lives you're leading. Being passive and allowing political jargon to sway you from fighting for people's lives, it's inexcusable. You should not be sitting up there if you're going to let that happen. I have family who are in the healthcare field. I am a person with a disability. If you put requirements on giving people access to healthcare you're killing them. Why, in the United States, and it starts on a local level, are we not fighting for accessible healthcare for everyone? That's a human right. It's not an opinion. It's a human right. And if you want to continue to sit up there without shame on your shoulders you need to fight like hell for your constituents because there's about 170,000 people who potentially could lose access to healthcare. That's serious. People's lives are not poker chips. We cannot be passive about letting people's lives and well-being go to waste. We cannot be passive about that. If you want to be passive about it get in the audience. Don't sit up there. Please, fight like hell. How can I take you seriously as a constituent if I don't see that? If I see you just talk to them once and back down. Please, consider the details of what has been shared with you tonight, and please, feel the weight of the people's lives you will put at stake if you do not fight for us. If you act passive, please remember those 170,000 people who will lose access to healthcare and, much more quickly, die. Thank you for your time tonight."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Yes. I got somebody else already coming up in the back, but you can speak next. How's that?"

PATTY RUSSO, 984 TIFFANY WALK, TOMS RIVER: "Hello. And I just wanted to clarify one point that was made by a lady who has subsequently left regarding the 17-bed homeless shelter. Those services that she said needed to be added are already in place. Those things are already available through the Affordable Housing Commission, on the site already. So, if that was going to sway you in not renewing the bond I would like to just clarify that and let you know that those services are already in place. What else was I going to say? Oh, please consider renewing the bond for the shelter. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

LYNDA FOTE, 22 CRUISER COURT, TOMS RIVER: "Hi. I am the current President of the Ocean County Chapter of the National Organization for Women. And as you can see from all the like, attired people in the audience this is a really big issue for us. But I also want to share with you that it's not just an issue for us. As part of our community outreach, we go to a lot of the town festivals and we have been at two already this season, and we'll be at three more before the end of June. Our petition this year says there are no acceptable cuts to Medicaid, SNAP, Social Security, Veterans benefits, healthcare and school funding. Honestly, I could have written more but I ran out of room at the top of the petition. But the truth is when somebody walks up to our table and we say to them, "Are you opposed to cuts in Medicaid and SNAP?" I don't even get to anything else on the list. Everyone that we talk to is really concerned about this. This is not a concern just for us but so many people who live here are eager to sign the petition, eager to share their stories with us about what Medicaid and SNAP means to them. So, we are singular representatives here, but I think we speak for a lot of your constituents, and I hope you will keep that in mind.

I also want to speak to the fact that one of the ways this bill is telling us they're going to save a lot of money is by cutting undocumented people who get Medicaid and SNAP. You know that the law does not allow the undocumented people to access those services. Even if you are here legally, as an immigrant, it takes five years before you can access those services. So that is not a way to save money because that's already not allowed. But the one thing New Jersey does, and several other states do that makes me very proud is that we in New Jersey do fund Medicaid for children of undocumented immigrants. We take children's lives seriously and this law may make it impossible for New Jersey to do so. So, please consider that. Kids are not responsible for their parents' illegal standing in this country and to take Medicaid away from them would be a real shame. I also brought you a little more research that I will leave for you. Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, madam."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I just want to say something, if I could, real quick. Regarding the homeless shelter, that was ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) funds. They sunsetted in December 31 of (20)24, so there is no way to even renew the contract, and we no longer have access to the funds. Those are gone. So, unfortunately, we have no authority on that matter. Just wanted to clear that up. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Commissioner. Did you already talk? You have not spoken? Okay. You look just like the other guy that we had up here." (laughter)

FRANK OGRODOWSKI: "I spoke a couple weeks ago. Yes, I was...if you recall, I'm sorry. Frank Ogrodowski, 46 Southwind Circle, Jackson, New Jersey. Now, if you recall, I spoke two weeks ago, and I spoke about my little sister, Jenna. She has Down syndrome. She has a heart condition. Medicaid literally saves her life. She uses Medicaid for, not just her serious medical conditions, but also for social programs, you know. She attends a day program four days a week. She is able to do horseback riding, you know, things that actually improve her quality of life. It's super important to her. And she's just one of the 300,000 residents in New Jersey with a disability who relies on Medicaid. Now, I appreciate your support at the meeting two weeks ago. I was very happy to hear everybody stand with us but from my understanding Mr. (Christopher) Smith and Mr. (Jeff) Van Drew may have convinced at least some of you that Medicaid in New Jersey would not be affected. I just wanted to let the record show that they have already lied about this because they said that there weren't going to be any Medicaid cuts, but there are. And so, how can we trust them? I cannot trust that their assurances that these Medicaid cuts will not affect their constituents. And I just want to bring up, real quick, this is from the New Jersey Department of Human Services that states the house approved a bill, shipped \$78 million in administrative costs to New Jersey Counties. There's a breakdown for each county and for Ocean (County) that is \$4,565,000.00 that will be on Ocean County's shoulders due to these cuts. I just want to take a second and ask you again, please reinforce your opposition to these Medicaid cuts. These will affect real people. Real people with disabilities. Real people who will die without Medicaid. As somebody said earlier, people's lives are not bargaining chips. This is real. This has serious consequences, please. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Okay, yes ma'am."

ERIN FITZIMMONS, 25 WATERSEDGE DRIVE, LITTLE EGG HARBOR, NEW JERSEY: "Hello. I am in Congressional District 2 which means I am under the watchful eye of Jeff Van Drew and I'm not very happy with him. I want to speak today on behalf of the 170,000 people in New Jersey that are on Medicaid that will lose their healthcare if this "One Big, Beautiful Bill" does go through. I am very disappointed that the fact that my congressman is not voting in favor of his constituents but again, instead, voting in favor of his political favor. I want to remind congress people and all elected officials that they work for the people that elected them and not those at the top. We deserve to have healthcare because we are, unfortunately, the only developed country who does not have Universal Healthcare and we've kind of at this point feel like we're fighting for the bare minimum. In terms of the specifics of the bill, one of the things that we've heard a lot is the cutting of waste, fraud and abuse. Unfortunately, we have not had any specific instances. We have not been given any examples. We have not been given statistics and anybody who has ever applied for Medicaid knows how impossible it is to even get in the door, let alone try to scam the system. However, many, many providers are actually overbilling Medicaid, sending people to other states because of their insurance. There is something called, 'body brokering' in the addiction recovery community where they are overbilling certain insurances and overbilling Medicaid. So, if we really want to root out waste, fraud and abuse in Medicaid it is not on the shoulders of regular people who are fighting for healthcare and fighting for the bare minimum, that healthcare is a human right and we all deserve to be able to go to the doctor. I feel kind of insane having to say that and if we want to actually fix the problem that we are setting out to fix which is waste, fraud, and abuse in Medicaid, we need to look at providers and not individuals who just want to survive. Thank you.'

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Anyone else? Gary."

GARY BLACK: "I'm still not in good shape yet. Gary Black, Beachwood, New Jersey. I would like to follow up on something with frankly, Ginny Haines said. I brought something up about last week when I referred to the Toms River Mayor and majority council as lunatics. What they are doing is not so much...as far as the homeless shelter...first off, it's 17 beds. It's not going to do squat. It's going to be a burden on them, and I doubt if it's going to last long if it ever gets put up in the first place. Secondly, the idea of government for political reasons seizing a church to eminent domain is a violation of the First Amendment. Second sentence, "Freedom of religion shall not be abridged." This is an attack against our (U.S.) Constitution. And as far as I'm concerned, an attack against what we, as people of the United States, believe in. Frankly, possibly, an attack against the United States. The idea...I thought I'd never see the day but actually, yeah, I did. Didn't I predict this a few years back that this was going to be happening? That governments will be trying to ban religion, seizing buildings, closing them down. How many years ago did I say that one? But what even bothers me a little more...I'm a Republican, as these clowns are doing this in our name. We need to put the breaks on this. I'm going to ask again to actually...I can understand there's some legal issues while the primary's going on about using government resources that will affect the primary. I know that can be used against you if you try to do it until after the primary. Well, we can start on this next month after it's over, is do a resolution condemning Toms River for fighting religion and seizing churches because once that one's done...I know most everybody here goes to church as I do too. I go to Grace and Peace. That'll start a waterfall of church after church after church after church. Eminent domain abuse is not new to New Jersey. Take a site like my church. It's a big site. A developer is going to have a field day with that. When's a matter of time...when's it going happen when eminent domain is used to take that to profit a developer. You know this is happening. This happened in Asbury Park. There's been issues about this. It's been all over the place with people actually... where actually the government is

shutting down whole communities of people to benefit a developer under misuse of a state law saying that it's up to the municipal government to get the top dollar, tax dollar out of every property. This is going on...how many years ago was that? That that was big about I would say 8, 10, roughly."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I can't remember."

GARY BLACK: "Alright. But this is what can lead to this. We need to stand up. We got to put the breaks on it. We've got...One of my main things, again, my number one thing has always been anything against violence of women and children. Another thing is Freedom of religion. How many times did I come up here when I was a Wiccan and a Druid. I would praise you for the prayer and for putting the decorations up which, that I do, actually came from the Wiccans. But I used to say thanks. But I've always supported religion. It's the fundamental right. In the Bill of Rights, it is the first two sentences of the first bill of the Bill of Rights. Looks to me it was kind of important by the Founding Fathers. They didn't want to go into a thing where either you had an English situation where you were mandated to a specific religion. And by the way, there is no separation of church and state in the (U.S.) Constitution. Either next preboard or next one I'm going to have (U.S.) Constitutions for you guys, and I frankly forgot them today. This would have been a perfect day for it too, right? But this is a direct assault on everything our country stands for and we sure as hell don't want it in our party's name. We know Dan Rodrick was a long-time Democrat. He ran for Mayor of Beachwood as a Democrat years ago. Yeah, you know, I follow things. So, this flip over to Republican and I would almost guarantee you that a lot of Democrats switched parties to get him to win that primary. But no, we got to stand up against this. We got to stand up for religion. We got to stand up for America. Put the breaks on this thing. Come out against it. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you, Gary."

BARBARA SHAFER, 70 ELDERBERRY LANE, TOMS RIVER: "I didn't plan on standing up here today, but I've been here a few times in the past advocating for the homeless and we've had discussions as far back as when Freeholder Little was a Freeholder at that time. And he always said that the county would never build or run a shelter but if there was a non-profit or if there was an organization that would build one, acquire one, and an organization that was willing to run it that the county would help to support it in the way of funding. And I know the county does a lot to support people that are having problems and are funding them in other ways. But we currently have a situation where we do have organizations that can run shelters as has been proven by Code Blue for the last seven years. They run them very well. If that could be done in the winter, why not year-round, because we do now have a possibility of a shelter in Toms River. I don't understand how, at this point, it's another roadblock and it's trying to be prevented even though the county has said that they would help in whatever way they can if there was a place and an organization to run it. It's taken 20 years for us to get to this point, so why are we still doing this 20 years after the fact? The homeless need somewhere to go and I just hope that after hearing one of the requests today to not renew funding, and I understand that you said that wasn't an issue, but I thank the county for the monies that they use that do help people in need. And I just hope that, that money is still available to organizations who use it to support and give resources and help the homeless. And I just hope that if we ever find a place in Ocean County where a shelter could be built or could be housing people, that would satisfy everybody, that you would still be willing to support that shelter to help the people in our neighborhood who have nowhere to go. And because of what's going on in the federal government more and more people are becoming homeless. So, it's not going to get any better and people are going to be requiring more because of the state that our nation is in right now. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "We, at the county, have been doing a lot of research on a homeless facility. It's not a matter of just putting a building for people to be in. It's something that was mentioned before by several of you that they need resources. We have gone to classes down in Atlantic City, Commissioner Haines, Commissioner Sadeghi. We all sat and listened to different counties, how they're handling the situation. We're not going into this without our eyes wide open and doing the research so that we can make sure that it's in the right place in Ocean County, but as everyone knows, no one wants it in their backyard. They all know that we need it, but no one wants it. So, we're working on the best plan we can find for the county and for the best thing for the people, all the people. But we are doing research, just so you know. We're not sitting back on this, just letting it pass. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, seeing no more hands, I'll close the ... excuse me. Yes."

ELISSA TIERNEY, COUNTY RESIDENT: "Hi."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Hi."

ELISSA TIERNEY: "I'm Elissa Tierney. I work for a New Jersey Organizing Project in West Creek and I run the "Not One More" campaign to end overdose. And Medicaid saved my life. I graduated Rutgers and I was pretty successful. I worked for the NFL. And my husband, who I met at college started abusing me and over, like one day, he just took...I was on his insurance plan, Blue Cross/Blue Shield, great insurance, and then overnight I didn't have insurance anymore. And Medicaid afforded me the opportunity to get on life-saving medication and I relied on SNAP and I'm doing great. Like, I was on it for one year. Trust me, the minute they knew I made enough they kicked me off and it saved my life. And everyone that I know relies on it, and to rip that away from them when the overdose numbers are just going down, is just...like it's heartbreaking and it's cruel. So, please, just do anything you can because these are the people we love. So, thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "What street did you say you were on in (inaudible)?"

ELISSA TIERNEY: "Excuse me?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "In (inaudible), what street are you on?"

ELISSA TIERNEY: (Inaudible)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, (inaudible) I'm very aware of where that is, right off of Route 9."

ELISSA TIERNEY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Yes, sir. How are you doing?"

JOHN GONZALEZ, 406 WASHINGTON STREET: "I'm doing well. I live directly across the street from this proposed shelter. The issue here is this is become a discussion against religion. This has become a discussion against homeless people. This is become masked in a lot of different things. The issue is incompatible occupancy in an R-150 zone. The fire department, 35 years ago plus, the owner of 310 decided he wanted to sell it to the fire department to build a fire station. The community found out about it. It died before it got any place. I don't care what the occupancy is. It doesn't belong in an R-150 zone. You want to put it in an appropriate commercial zone, go for it. You want to put it in an industrial park, go for it. What we're dealing with over here is we're dealing with a financial enhancement opportunity. Christ Episcopal Church has no skin in this game. They put the cloak of God on this thing. Makes it easy, makes it more palatable for people. AHA, excuse me, EHEG, did not competitively bid a contract. I said, competitively. There were more people in the game. AHA did not take a work order or assume a partnership to lose money. And Christ Episcopal Church did not get into this to become financially troubled. This is about financial gain. Benefit to the homeless – a very select clientele is being solicited for this. That's why there are advertisements for it. Oh, by the way, if anybody has gone to any of the meetings, I've gone to six of them or seven of them, my mind turns to peanut butter over here. They...15 is not acceptable. Any of the shelters that have been proposed, and they use St. John's Episcopal in Hoboken as an example, run by the church, staffed by the church, supported by donations from the church, a direct outreach activity of the church, that's why it flies. This does not fly. It doesn't belong in a residential neighborhood, just like any other non-conforming thing belongs in this R-150 zone. Bottom line...and I was going to sit there and shut up and say nothing until this impassioned speech came along. Again...and someone in a meeting, last meeting as a matter of fact, made a very important point. If you don't live within 10 minutes of that shelter, you have no business telling the people that live in the neighborhood what they should do. That shelter, any homeless shelter, and oh, by the way, the one that you need to take care of, the one that will provide the services for the impaired population, this operation isn't doing it. They don't have the staff. They don't have the training, and this is just a people processing operation. Get him in, get him out, 60 days. And if you think I'm telling you something and making up fake news, listen to Paul Williams podcast. He tapes all the meetings. Read the minutes of the meetings."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Your five minutes are up, sir."

JOHN GONZALEZ: "I made my point."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You did. Okay, I just wanted you to know. Okay, anybody else? Okay, I'm going to close the public hearing here today and ask for a motion to adjourn."

X. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Director Kelly called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:27 PM.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF THE COMMONWEALTH BRIDGE, STRUCTURE NO. 1518-001, LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF MANCHESTER, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$3,250,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,695,619 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, the replacement of the Commonwealth Bridge, Structure No 1518-001, located in the Township of Manchester, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto

SECTION 2 It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the

SECTION 3 There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$3,250,000, including the sum of \$1,554,381 as the down payment, and also including the \$1,695,619 County Aid grant awarded by the New Jersey Department of Transportation to the County by letter dated July 1, 2024, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000,000.

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to accept the donation of properties identified in Addendum A, totaling approximately 8.09 acres in the Township of Manchester.
- 2. It authorizes the expenditure of up to \$500.00 for property tax adjustments as necessary from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The proper officers of the Board are authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents in order to effectuate these purchases.
- 2. The purchase of the property is to be contingent upon the County's acquisition by purchase, deed or gift of the necessary rights-of-way along any County roads bordering the property as determined by the County Engineer.
- 3. The offices of Ocean County Counsel and County Administrative staff are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to consummate this transaction and have the fully executed Deeds or Easements recorded in the County Clerk's Office.

The Stockton University Coastal Research Center (CRC) is pleased to submit this proposal to conduct additional ground truth data collection to complement the aerial drone survey at Cattus Island State Park conducted previously under the USFWS and Ocean County Parks cooperative project. This funding will supplement funding for data collection and analysis from the USFWS COOP agreement between Stockton University and USFWS. The scope of work included within this proposal includes (task one) 2 days for field work by the CRC field crew to gather elevation and position data utilizing a total station and RTK GPS in the 4 identified target areas. This includes marsh elevation and bathymetry within the water bodies and creeks associated with each zone. There are 1-2 days included to collect 6-8 intact 3-4-foot sediment cores using a piston corer at to be determined locations within the target areas. This sediment data will aid in determining compatibility with possible sources of BUDM to be utilized in subsequent phases of marsh restoration. Task two includes data processing and analysis utilizing a variety of computer programs including ArcGIS to create surface maps of the target areas and determine volumes needed to raise elevations to the proposed target elevation range. Task three includes development of deliverables that include draft concept maps and plans to be utilized in developing engineering plans by DU and others for future phases of project restoration permitting and implementation. The final task includes limited funding for meetings and consultation with the team partners on planning future phases of the project restoration.

The CRC looks forward to working with the Ocean County Parks and Recreation Department and all its partners towards identifying restoration needs and developing conceptual projects to enhance the ecological resilience of the marsh at Cattus Island.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey as follows:

1. Section 477-79, Schedule XXI (Speed Limits) of Chapter 477 (Vehicles and Traffic) is hereby amended and supplemented to reduce the speed limit on Bay Boulevard for the entire length, to promote enhanced vehicular and pedestrian safety, as follows:
