RESOLUTION September 20, 2023

- WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and
- WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Commissioners to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Commissioners; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 63, Lot 15 in the Borough of Tuckerton totaling approximately 40.6 acres located on Route 9/East Main Street; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Borough of Tuckerton has agreed to partner on the acquisition, contributing up to \$1,125,000.00 to the overall purchase price; and
- **WHEREAS**, upon acquisition, the County shall subdivide approximately 9 acres of upland property to the Borough in exchange for their monetary contribution to improve the adjacent public works property; and
- WHEREAS, the remaining 31.6 acres of property shall be retained by the County under the Natural Lands Trust Fund Program; and
- WIIEREAS, two professional appraisals were authorized to determine the fair market value; and
- WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and
- WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for a purchase price not to exceed \$2,060,000.00; and
- WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Commissioners on September 20, 2023 as required by PL 1997, c24.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:
- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire property identified as Block 63, Lot 15 in the Borough of Tuckerton totaling approximately 40.6 acres located on Route 9/East Main Street.
- 2. It authorizes the expenditure for an acquisition price not to exceed \$2,060,000.00 plus up to \$150.00 for property tax adjustments as necessary from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

1. The proper officers of the Board are authorized and directed to sign all necessary documents in order to effectuate these purchases.

- 2. The purchase of the property is to be contingent upon the County's acquisition by purchase, deed or gift of the necessary rights-of-way along any County roads bordering the property as determined by the County Engineer.
- 3. The offices of Ocean County Counsel and County Administrative staff are hereby authorized to take all actions necessary to consummate this transaction and have the fully executed Deeds or Easements recorded in the County Clerk's Office.
- 4. In the event the seller(s) seek to claim a charitable contribution credit, the County Administrative staff may execute the completed IRS form 8283, confirming the sale to Ocean County.
- 5. The Borough of Tuckerton has supported acquisition of this property by resolution #142-23.
- 6. Copies of this Resolution shall be made available to the Ocean County Administrator, Planning Department, Finance Department, County Auditor; County Counsel; County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee; the Borough of Tuckerton; and the landowner.

- WHEREAS, coastal counties are more prone to serious weather conditions including hurricanes, nor'easters and most recently tornadoes, which can result in power outages, utility poles down and a host of safety issues, and
- WHEREAS, Ocean County residents have experienced the likes of Hurricane Irene in 2011, Superstorm Sandy in 2012, Tropical Storm Isaias, an April 1, 2023 tornado, and widespread summer power outages in the summer months dating back to July 2003 that devastated the height of the summer tourism season, and
- WHEREAS, any type of lengthy power outages especially during the tourism season, which produces \$7 billion in revenue for Ocean County alone, can result in many residents and businesses, both full time and seasonal, experiencing a financial loss due to having to discard food and medication, and loss of wages; and

Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari opened the meeting by discussing the 55th Anniversary of the Ocean County Airport. The general aviation airport located in the pinelands of Lacey and Berkeley Township was the first County owned airport in the State. The Fixed Base Operator, Ocean Aviation signed their first lease agreement in 1971. The current FBO, Ocean Aire, has been the Operator since 1998, who with the County has worked to adapt the airport to accommodate private pilots, corporate jets, state agencies, aviation agencies, and MEDEVACs. The Airpark includes 955 acres, encapsulating the 822-acre County Airport, a County Dog Park, the Ocean County Fairgrounds, and several County Facilities. Mr. Agliata added that there will be a rehabilitation of the taxi ways, and the sixth T Hangar will be built. Since 1990, the County has received over \$32 million in funding from the FAA and NJDOT to support various improvements.

Commissioner Kelly notified the Board that the County received a letter from the Federal government confirming the allocation of \$11 million in Federal funding for the future construction of the Route 539 overpass which will allow military personnel to cross Route 539 under the bridge. The concept design was completed five years ago. The County will cover the remainder of the cost, and will apply for funding when the time comes. Commissioner Kelly would like Monmouth and Burlington Counties to share in the cost, and also suggested contacting NJTPA as well.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included two items recommended for advertisement.
