WHEREAS, April 1, 2020 has been chosen as National Census Day; and

WHEREAS, the Census has taken place every 10 years since 1790, as mandated by the U.S. Constitution - an effort to count every person living in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County established a Census Complete Count Committee in 2019 bringing together partners with local knowledge and resources to raise awareness and educate residents on the importance of the Census and to promote the Census through locally based, targeted outreach efforts; and

WHEREAS, the importance of all Ocean County residents being counted in the upcoming 2020 Census is critical to ensure the county receives all of the federal funding it deserves; and

WHEREAS, Census data directly affects how more than \$22.7 billion per year is allocated in our state; and

WHEREAS, this equates to about \$2,548 per New Jersey resident for important infrastructure improvements, senior services, public health, education, transportation, and block grant programs; and

WHEREAS, Census data helps determine how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives and is necessary for an accurate and fair redistricting of state legislative seats, county and city councils and voting districts; and

WHEREAS, information from the 2020 Census and American Community Survey are vital tools for economic development and increased employment; and

WHEREAS, the information collected by the Census is confidential and protected by law; and

WHEREAS, "Snowbirds" that spend the colder months out of state should complete the Census in Ocean County, where they live for the majority of the year.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH H. VICARI, DIRECTOR, of the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on behalf of this Board, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, April 1, 2020 as:

ORDINANCE #2020-7

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE RECONSTRUCTION AND RESURFACING OF VARIOUS ROADS ALL LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$12,772,128 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$12,772,128 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: the reconstruction and resurfacing of various County roads, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment, and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$12,772,128, including the \$12,772,128 County Aid grant awarded by the New Jersey Department of Transportation to the County by letter dated July 26, 2019, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. No down payment is required as this bond ordinance involves projects funded by State grants and other similar programs, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c).

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$12,772,128 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1

hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$12,772,128. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$0.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance

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Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE REPLACEMENT OF THE LAKE SHENANDOAH SPILLWAY AND BRIDGE, STRUCTURE NO. 1514-012, LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LAKEWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$3,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,325,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, the replacement of the Lake Shenandoah Spillway and Bridge, Structure No. 1514-012, located in the Township of Lakewood, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment, and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,325,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there

is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$3,325,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Freeholder Director Vicari thanked the Board for their support in moving the Performing Arts Academy from the original site at Lakehurst Naval Base to the new site at Ocean County College, while staying below the 2% cap.

Freeholder Haines said that many parks were destroyed during Super Storm Sandy, and many have been completely remodeled. The Information Technology Department keeps each department's computers and phone systems running smoothly. The Freeholder also told the Board that New Jersey Institute of Technology will be partnering with Ocean County College in the near future.

Freeholder Little said Ocean County has the largest library and park system in the State. The County's Road Department successfully maintains 618 miles of County roads, 1600 vehicles, and \$75 million in road and bridge maintenance and construction projects.

Freeholder Quinn thanked the Board for meeting with Department Heads and addressing issues they may have. He said that Freeholder Bartlett would be very proud of the 2020 fiscally sound budget. Freeholder Quinn also thanked John Ernst and Tony Agliata for keeping up with the growth in Ocean County and the escalating recycling issues facing the County. The Freeholder also commended Human Services for their efforts with the Code Blue Program that cares for homeless residents on cold nights, and the Transportation Department for safely transporting residents through Ocean Ride.

Freeholder Kelly said there are some new positions in the budget. The Sheriff's Department needs 6-10 new officers, and of the 15-20 new hires, many of them are allocated to the Sheriff's Department. The County budgets \$75 million to keep our residents safe through Law and Public Safety.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for Stormwater Management Contract 2020A, which will address drainage issues in 4 different locations in 3 towns. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the February 19, 2020 Board meeting.

Freeholder Director Vicari opened the meeting by reminding the Board that 27 years ago the first bombing of the World Trade Center occurred, causing over \$500 million in damages.

Director Vicari notified the Board that he received a letter of commendation from the State indicating an excellent performance by our Consumer Affairs Department, and the department Director Stephen Scaturro. Stephen Scaturro said the department started in 2006 after the Consumer Fraud Act made violations a fourth degree punishable crime. Consumer Affairs works with the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, and was responsible for 65 indictments in 2019, which recouped \$390,000 for the residents of Ocean County.

Mr. Agliata told the Board that he has been involved with many meetings regarding the 2020 Census. Mr. Agliata expressed the importance of being counted. The Planning department has been preparing for the Census for many months already, and will continue to promote the importance of it through the schools in hopes of the children encouraging their parents to participate. Informational flyers will be sent through the mail. The 2020 Census will run from April 1 through the end of the summer.

Freeholder Haines discussed the Hurricane Branch in Manchester which is a property recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. This is a 251.98-acre property located on Route 539 and Route 70 adjacent to the Joint Base. The landowner accepted a negotiated offer of \$405,000.

The Ocean County Agricultural Development Board and the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee have recommended the acquisition of a development easement on the 9.12-acre Hankins Farm located on Brookside Drive in Toms River. The landowner accepted an easement value of \$146,000 per acre, or an estimated \$1,331,520, pending survey verification of acreage.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. The Engineering Department will be conducting a review of the electrical agreements for traffic signals in Brick Township and Lakewood. Battery backups and generator backups will be added as an optional item for municipalities through Schedule C. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the March 4, 2020 Board meeting.

Ms. Cilento reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of March 4, 2020. There were no questions or comments.
