

- 1. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability
- 2. Liability, other than motor vehicle
- 3. Property Damage, other than motor vehicle

WHEREAS, revisions to the current Smoking Policy are required to ensure conformity with law and regulation, and

WHEREAS, the prohibition on the use of e-cigarettes and other vaping devices is not set forth in the current Smoking Policy, and must be addressed to ensure the health, welfare, and safety of address County employees and visitors and guests to any County property; and

WHEREAS, certain other revisions to the previously adopted Smoking Policy are necessary at this time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on this 6th day of August, 2025, that the *County of Ocean Smoking and Vaping Policy* which is attached to this Resolution is hereby adopted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution, and the County of Ocean Smoking and Vaping Policy, shall be sent to the County Administrator, all Department Heads, all collective bargaining majority representatives, and provided to all current and future County Employees.

# COUNTY OF OCEAN SMOKING AND VAPING POLICY

Adoption/Issue Date: August 6, 2025

Purpose: This policy is adopted to revise, update,, and expand the Smoking Policy adopted in August 1986 and to ensure compliance with the New Jersey Smoke-Free Air Act and all other applicable Federal and State laws. Further, this Policy shall establish the prohibition on smoking and/or vaping in County buildings, facilities, and vehicles, and shall further establish where smoking and/or vaping may occur outdoors on County property.

II. SCOPE: This Policy applies to all County of Ocean employees, interns, volunteers, and outside vendors and/or contractors doing business with the County of Ocean, as well as any guest or visitor to any County building, facility, and/or structure.

### III. DEFINITIONS

- A. <u>Smoking</u>: As used in this Policy, the term smoking shall mean and refer to the use of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe or any other matter or substance which contains tobacco and/or other similar products.
- B. <u>Vaping</u>: As used in this Policy, the term vaping shall mean and refer to the inhaling of aerosol from an e-cigarette, a battery-operated device that heats e-liquid, which contains items such as, but not limited to, nicotine, flavorings, and other chemicals.

# IV. POLICY

- A. Smoking within any County building, facility, structure, and/or vehicle is prohibited.
- B. Vaping within any County building, facility, structure, and/or vehicle is prohibited.
- C. Smoking and/or vaping may occur outdoors on County property only if there

- is a distance of 25 feet between the location upon which the individual is smoking and/or vaping and the County's building, facility, structure, and/or vehicle.
- D. Smoking and/or vaping outdoors more than 25 feet from the building is prohibited where smoking and/or vaping will result in migration, seepage, and/or recirculation of smoke and/or vaping fumes/odors into an indoor public place or a workplace.

# V. PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY

- A. Any guest or visitor who is observed to be smoking or vaping shall be advised of the policy. If after being advised of the policy the guest or visitor does not immediate cease smoking or vaping, the guest or visitor will be required to leave the County property.
- B. Any vendor and/or contractor, or agent thereof, who violates this Policy shall be required to immediately leave the property. Failure to comply with this Policy is grounds for termination of any contract between the County and the vendor/contractor.
- C. Any volunteer or intern who violates this Policy shall be instructed to cease the conduct violating the Policy and shall also be subject to the termination of the volunteer or intern position.
- D. Any County Employee who violates this Policy is subject to discipline, which shall include for the first offense a minimum of a five (5) day suspension. Subsequent violations are subject to more severe penalties, including possible termination.
- VI. NOTICE: The County shall take reasonable steps to place in every public entrance to all structure signage indicating:
  - A Smoking and/or vaping is prohibited therein
  - B. Any smoking and/or vaping that occurs outdoors must:
    - 1. Be a minimum of 25 feet from the County's building, facility, and/or structure:
    - 2. Be in a designated area(s), if one is clearly marked; and
    - 3. Even if 25 feet away from the building, must not be in a location that would allow for migration, seepage, and/or recirculation of smoke and/or vaping fumes/odors into an indoor public place or a workplace
    - \* Lack of signage does not eliminate required compliance by County employees, volunteers, interns, vendors, and/or contractors.

# VII. DISSEMINATION

The County shall make this Smoking and Vaping Policy, or a summarized notice of it, available to its employees, including part-time and seasonal employees. This Policy shall be provided to all new employees upon start of employment. Further, this policy shall be posted on the County's online Employee Portal.
