ORDINANCE #2022-1

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS ENGINEERING, ROAD, AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS, AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$5,000,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,750,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, various engineering, road, and bridge improvements, at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$3,325,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Commissioners of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, on May 15, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy issued Executive Order No. 144 ordering and directing each county to "procure at least 5 secure ballot drop boxes" to be placed at locations readily accessible to the voters within the county; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 144 also mandated that the security of the drop boxes "shall conform with the standards set forth by the Secretary of State"; and

WHEREAS, on August 14, 2020, Governor Phil Murphy issued Executive Order No. 177 increasing the number of required ballot drop boxes to 10 per county and mandating that the Secretary of State establish guidelines for the placement of the ballot drop boxes and the security of the ballot boxes; and

WHEREAS, on September 25, 2020, the Secretary of State issued a "Guide to Ballot Drop Boxes" providing guidelines for County election officials concerning the placement and use of ballot drop boxes and the schedule for ballot pickup from the drop boxes; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2021, Governor Phil Murphy signed into law an amendment to P.L. 2020, c. 72 codifying the order concerning ballot drop boxes; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to P.L. 2020, c. 72 requires all ballot drop boxes be available for use by voters at least 45 days prior to an election; and

WHEREAS, the amendment to P.L. 2020, c. 72 requires all ballot drop boxes be available for use by voters 24 hour a day and be equipped with security cameras that allow for surveillance of the ballot drop box; and

WHEREAS, the 24 hour surveillance of each ballot drop box creates a record of each location for 45 days, requiring a massive amount of digital storage and security; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order Nos. 144 and 177 along with P.L. 2020, c. 72 are silent as to the retention of these records; and

WHEREAS, the video requirements set forth in the "Guide to Ballot Drop Boxes" state that each ballot drop box location must have a video system "robust enough to capture and store video for the full time ballot drop box(es) are open to receive ballots during an election."; and

WHEREAS, the video requirements set forth in the "Guide to Ballot Drop Boxes" states that "videos are considered an election record, and must be retained, at a minimum, until the period to challenge the election results has passed"; and

WHEREAS, the lack of clear and concise guidance in the Executive Orders and Ballot Drop Box law has created confusion and contradictions within other record retention rules and regulations including but not limited to retention schedules of the Open Public Records Act; and

WHEREAS, in order to instill our residents of Ocean County and the State of New Jersey with confidence in our election process, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners are requesting the State review the existing ballot drop box law and clarify access to the storage of the ballot drop box security footage; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners are also requesting the State review the existing ballot drop box law concerning the costs associated with daily retrieval of ballots, frequency of retrieval, staffing requirements and public access to live security feeds.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that we request the State review the existing ballot drop box law to clarify access to the storage of the ballot drop box security footage and consider the costs associated with daily retrieval of ballots, frequency of retrieval, staffing requirements and public access to live security feeds.





WHEREAS, due to a scrivener's error, a revision to the Revised Rules and Regulation is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE OCEAN COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The amendment to the Revised Rules and Regulations for Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff's Officers, attached hereto as Exhibit A, are hereby adopted. This amendment shall supersede any existing Revised Rules and Regulations.
- 2. The Board of Commissioners does hereby request permission of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to pay expenditures related to the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Officers, in accordance with this amendment to the Revised Rules and Regulations, attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 3. A copy of this Resolution shall be made available to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, County Auditor, Chief Financial Officer, County Counsel, the Employee Relations Department, the Office of the Sheriff, and any applicable majority representative.

EXHIBIT A COUNTY OF OCEAN

REVISED 2/16/2022

Rules and Regulations for the Outside Employment of Off-Duty Sheriff Officers *Effective: February 3, 2022*

1. Extra-duty employment of Sheriff's officers

- A. To accommodate those persons and entities requiring the services of offduty Sheriff's officers and to authorize their off-duty employment, the County hereby establishes this policy and procedures.
- B. Sheriff's Officers deemed eligible by the Sheriff to do so shall be permitted to accept law-enforcement-related employment from nongovernmental employers and school districts only during their off –duty hours and at such times as will not interfere with the efficient performance of regularly scheduled or emergency duty for the County.
- C. Persons or entities wishing to employ off-duty Sheriff's Officers must make their request through the Sheriff. The Sheriff may grant such request when, in his/her opinion, such employment will not be inconsistent with the efficient functioning and good reputation of the Sheriff's Office and would not unreasonably endanger or threaten the safety of the officer(s) who will be working the assignment(s).

2. Requests for Services

- A. Any person or entity seeking to employ off-duty Sheriff's officers shall first obtain the approval of the Sheriff or his/her designee. The Sheriff or his/her designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the applicant for services needed, which agreement shall set forth the specific nature of the services to be performed, the location, dates and hours of service, payment arrangements mandated herein, number of officers needed, insurance coverage and/or any other provisions required by law or regulation of the State of New Jersey. The applicant must first file a request for services with the Sheriff's Outside Employment Unit ("OEU"). The applicant must include in the request for services evidence that the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the local municipality is unable or unwilling to provide off-duty officers.
- B. Any Sheriff's officer, when so employed by any person or entity, shall be treated as an employee of that person or entity. Any and all wages earned for outside employment shall not be applied toward the pension benefits of Sheriff's officers so employed, nor shall hours worked for outside employment be considered in any way compensable as overtime under the

Fair Labor Standards Act or compensable in any other manner that requires the County to pay the officers by County funds through its payroll system. All Sheriff's officers shall be subject to the policies, procedures, directives, rules and regulations of the Sheriff, the Ocean County Prosecutor's office and the Attorney General's Office of the State of New Jersey.

3. Billing/payment schedule/escrow_accounts

Billing periods. Billing and payment practices for persons or entities contracting for the provision of security services by off-duty Sheriff's officers shall be conducted in accordance with local finance laws and regulations promulgated by the Local Finance Board.

- A. The County has established an escrow account dedicated to the payment of off-duty Sheriff's Officers for outside employment by private contractors. Any prospective contractor must apply to the Sheriff, requesting off-duty police services. The written application shall include the following information:
 - i. The dates that off-duty police vehicle(s) will be needed.
 - ii. An estimate of the number of hours the contractor anticipates using the off-duty police officer(s) and, if appropriate, police vehicles.
 - iii. A check to cover the cost of the off-duty police services and use of any County vehicles based on the estimated number of hours shall be submitted before the start of off-duty employment in accordance with state and Division of Local Government services regulations.
- B. Prospective contractors who continuously request off-duty police service, or anticipate a need for periodic or long-term off-duty police services, may request to deposit monies with the County on an ongoing basis to be depleted as such work is performed. Funds on deposit shall not earn interest.
- C. If the contractor's needs exceed the estimated sum in the escrow account, the Sheriff, or his designee, shall immediately notify the contractor that the funds in the escrow account are insufficient to pay for continued off-duty police services. The contractor shall then either replenish the escrow account with a check sufficient to pay for continued services or the Sheriff shall immediately terminate provision of the off-duty police services to the contractor.

- D. If the contractor's estimated costs exceed the actual costs incurred, then the County shall, upon proper notice to the County Chief Financial Officer, refund the remainder of the escrow account.
- E. No sheriff's Officer shall accept any payment in any form from any person or entity other than the County, and unless that payment has been formally and permanently documented by the Chief Financial Officer of the County. No person or entity shall give or channel any form of payment or gratuity to any Sheriff's Officer in connection with the services of off-duty officers, but shall use the escrow account described in subsection A.

4. Rates of compensation; administrative fees; payment for services

Rates of compensation for contracting the services of off-duty Sheriff's officers shall be as follows:

- A. Rate The rate of compensation for the contracting the services of off-duty Sheriff Offices shall be set as follows:
 - Effective February 3, 2022, a rate of \$85.00 per hour for each officer, of which \$15.00 per each hour shall be an administrative fee retained by the County; and
 - b. Beginning in January 2023, the Board of Commissioners shall adopt a resolution setting forth the rate of compensation for each year which shall be effective January 1st of each year, and shall be based upon the following formula:
 - 1. A determination of the average hourly salary of sworn officers whose titles are represented by majority representatives as of December 1 of the prior year, multiplied by 1.5, and then rounded to the next highest five dollar increment, plus a \$15.00 administrative fee.

Example: On December 1, 2022, the average hourly rate for officers whose titles are represented by a majority representative is \$48.25. This \$48.25 is multiplied by 1.5, and equals \$72.38. This is rounded to \$75.00, and a \$15.00 administrative fee is added. Thus, the hourly rate effective January 1, 2023, would be \$90.00, which represents \$75.00 officer compensation, and a \$15.00 administrative fee retained by the County.

2. The rate will be reset, if necessary based upon the formula set forth above, at either the final meeting of the Board of Commissioners in December, or at the reorganization

meeting of the Board of Commissioners, but shall be effective January 1st, provided that the rate will not decrease from the prior year.

B. Minimum assignments

- 1. <u>Four-hour minimum.</u> All assignments shall have a four-hour minimum per Officer contracted. Sheriff's officers are entitled to the four-hour minimum if the assignment is cancelled upon their arrival at the job site, without prior notice. Sheriff's officers who begin an assignment that is cancelled before its completion shall be entitled the four-hour minimum or actual worked, whichever is longer.
- 2. <u>Two and one-half for Non-profit & schools.</u> All assignments for non-profits and/or schools shall have a two and one-half (2.5) hour minimum per Officer contracted. Sheriff's officers are entitled to the two and one-half minimum if the assignment is cancelled upon their arrival at the job site, without prior notice. Sheriff's officers who begin an assignment that is cancelled before its completion shall be entitled the two and one-half minimum or actual worked, whichever is longer.

5. <u>Contractor obligation and limitations</u>

Persons or entities contracting for off-duty law enforcement services are placed on notice that the Ocean County Sheriff is the primary employer of Sheriff's Officers and, in contracting for such services, expressly agree to the following conditions:

- A. <u>Police-related work.</u> Sheriff's officers providing law enforcement services shall not be required to perform non-police-related tasks. Police-related tasks typically involved crowd/traffic control and site security.
- B. <u>Uniforms.</u> Unless specifically authorized by the Sheriff, Sheriff's Officers shall be in uniform. Requests from persons or entities for Officers to work in a plain clothes' capacity shall be made in writing to the Sheriff, who in his/her sole discretion may approve or deny such a request for any or no reason.
- C. <u>Cancellations.</u> Persons or entities that have contracted for off-duty Sheriff's officers and wish to cancel must provide a minimum of two hours' notice or be subject to the four-hour minimum for each officer contracted.
- D. State of emergency. The Sheriff or his/her designee shall, at all times, have the authority to order any Sheriff's officer engaged in off-duty assignments to respond to an emergency situation. The Sheriff or his/her designee shall also have the right to order any off-duty assignment terminated whenever

said assignment creates an unacceptable risk to the health, safety or welfare of the off-duty Officer and/or the citizens of Ocean County.

6. <u>Insurance requirements</u>

- A. Persons or entities contracting for off-duty law enforcement services are responsible for providing all insurance coverage as required by law. Each applicant shall provide the Ocean County Sheriff with appropriate certificates of insurance naming the County of Ocean and the Sheriff's officers as additionally insured and evidencing that the Sheriff's Officer and Ocean County are covered by general liability coverage of at least \$1,000,000 for each occurrence with respect to the services to be provided.
- B. The certificate of insurance or the policy shall contain the following language: "The Insurer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County of Ocean and Ocean County Sheriff, their employees, agents, servants, officials and administrators from and against any and all claims, or actions at law, whether for personal injury, property damage or liability including any costs of defense incurred by the County of Ocean and/or Ocean County Sheriff which arise from any acts or omissions of the insured, their employees, agents, servants, officials or administrators arising out of or related to the use of off-duty Ocean County Sheriff's officers"

7. Indemnification

- A. The person or entity contracting for off-duty law enforcement services and the applicable insurer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the County of Ocean and Ocean County Sheriff, their employees, agents, servants, officials and administrators from and against any and all claims, or actions at law, whether for personal injury, property damage or liability including any costs of defense incurred by the County of Ocean and/or Ocean County Sheriff which arise from any acts or omissions of the insured, their employees, agents, servants, officials or administrators arising out of or related to the use of off-duty Ocean County Sheriff's officers.
- B. This indemnification and hold harmless agreement shall apply in all instances, whether the County of Ocean and/or Ocean Sheriff are plaintiffs, defendants, direct parties to the initial action or claim or are subsequently made parties to the action by third-party in-pleading or are made parties to a collateral action arising, in whole or in part, from any of the issues from the original cause of action or claim.

WHEREAS, the County is satisfied with the results of the auction and desirous to complete the sale of the properties.

Assignment Judge Marlene Lynch Ford thanked the Board for committing to executing this much needed addition. Director Kelly expressed his thanks to Judge Ford for her cooperation in the planning process.

Director Kelly mentioned that 10 buildings will be vacated upon completion of the addition, indicating a great deal of savings for the County.

The Board agreed to move forward with the Justice Complex Annex project, authorizing a resolution to be added to the February 16, 2022 Board agenda, giving notice to proceed.


