SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements, various engineering, road, and bridge improvements, at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$6,500,000, including the sum of \$400,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued

pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$2,500,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is twenty (20) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$6,100,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

WHEREAS, the economy of Ocean County, as well as all coastal counties in New Jersey, are dependent on clean, healthy ocean waters and a thriving coastal ecosystem lush with marine mammals, fisheries and aquaculture; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Commissioners has consistently and strongly opposed any plans to use the Atlantic Ocean for the disposal of problem materials and the disruptive use of the coast and ocean floor for various activities because of the troubling impact of these actions on the marine environment and coastal tourism; and

WHEREAS, most recently the Board of Commissioners called upon the state and federal government to implement a moratorium on offshore wind energy projects until all concerns, especially regarding marine life, are fully addressed, along with any additional concerns that may arise, before construction of offshore windfarms are allowed to commence; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County is home to 44 miles of Atlantic Ocean coastal beaches, that serve as the heartbeat of Ocean County and the State of New Jersey's tourism industry, generating \$7 billion annually for Ocean County alone; and

WHEREAS, the tourism trade generates jobs, supports businesses and provides tax revenue, all of which could be endangered should offshore disturbances whether exploratory or testing, be allowed; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's \$2.5 billion annual fishing industry continues to thrive, providing numerous economic benefits including employment opportunities; and

WHEREAS, any consideration given to an activity that may disturb the coastline in New Jersey could pose a significant threat to the environmental and economic benefits derived from this coastline; and

- WHEREAS, for years, Ocean County has called upon the appointing authority in the State of New Jersey to choose a resident of Ocean County to sit on the BPU in order to provide a needed voice to represent the unique characteristics and challenges faced by communities located along the coast of the State; and
- WHEREAS, the population of Ocean County continues to grow with both full-time and seasonal residents increasing the need for assurances by utility companies to provide uninterrupted service and to make certain equipment is maintained and adequately updated; and
- WHEREAS, Ocean County currently has a year-round population of 650,000 residents with the number steadily increasing in the summer/warm weather months to more than 1.3 million people; and
- WHEREAS, it is imperative that with the increase in population, energy and utility demands are met without interruption of service, and our residents, visitors and businesses are confident in all utilities working properly and available for their needs; and
- WHEREAS, coastal counties are more prone to serious weather conditions including hurricanes, nor'easters and most recently tornadoes, which can result in power outages, utility poles down and a host of safety issues; and
- WHEREAS, Ocean County residents have experienced the likes of Hurricane Irene in 2011, Superstorm Sandy in 2012, Tropical Storm Isaias, an April 1, 2023 tornado, and widespread summer power outages in the summer months dating back to July 2003 that devastated the height of the summer tourism season; and
- WHEREAS, any type of lengthy power outages especially during the tourism season, which produces \$7 billion in revenue for Ocean County alone, can result in many residents and businesses, both full time and seasonal, experiencing a financial loss due to having to discard food and medication, and loss of wages; and
- WHEREAS, adding to the concern, Ocean County also is home to more than 200,000 senior citizens, that is often more reliant on medical devices that use power for their health needs, and are on fixed incomes that do not allow for extra money to replace food and prescriptions spoiled by power outages or any challenges posed by utility issues; and
- WHEREAS, utility interruptions can also create safety hazards for residents and visitors along with the additional strain emergency responders are tasked with in assisting during these times; and
- WHEREAS, the current sitting members of the Board of Public Utilities are from Essex, Camden, Morris, and Somerset Counties; and
- WHEREAS, without a voice on the BPU, Ocean County and similar coastal communities, face an uphill battle with the utility companies in getting help for residents and businesses; and
- WHEREAS, coastal counties like Ocean have unique characteristics from its land size, population shifts based on time of year, both economically and geographically that the current members of the BPU are not as familiar with as a resident of Ocean County would be; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of a member from Ocean County, the BPU in the meantime, should designate one of its current members as liaison to the area in order to address concerns.

Director Vicari and Anthony Agliata discussed the 2023 Forest Fire Services operations that resumed at the Ocean County Airport following the construction of the Crosswind Runway in 2014. NJFFS has been stationed at the airport during the height of fire season (March-May) each year since 2014, where they use a "Fire Boss" tanker plane capable of delivering 800 gallons of water to precision targets. During the 2022 season the NJFFS was on duty for 30 days, responded to 2 fires, made 3 drops, and logged 101 minutes flown. Many of the County's inland communities are threatened by the hazard of forest fires, especially during dry periods and high winds. Having the NJFFS stationed at the airport is invaluable to the safety of countless Ocean County homes and businesses.

Sheriff Mastronardy provided an update on the conditions of the forest fire that was burning in Lakehurst and Manchester Townships. A temporary shelter was available for the residents who were evacuated. The fire was 60% contained.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata discussed properties recommended for Open Space acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. Berkeley Township has memorialized a partnership for the property located on Wheaton Avenue,

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Grant Concourse and Route 9 totaling 46.51 acres. The property owners accepted a negotiated offer of \$1,900,000.00 for Block 1014, Lots 15, 27 & 29, and \$1,050,000.00 for Block 1013, Lot 2 and Block 1014 Lot 28. Another 1.75-acre acquisition located on Dover Road in Lacey Township, adjacent to 1200 acres of County Open Space, has been recommended at a negotiated price of \$175,000.00. The NLTFAC has recommended Block 44.222 Lots 16 and 22 for donation by Stafford Township, and is located on Mallard Road. Two additional parcels totaling 2.51-acres within the Mallard Road Project Area, while be acquired as well. Block 44.222 Lots 10, 19, 20 and 21 for \$90,000.00 and Block 44.222 Lot 12 for \$22,500.00.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included rejecting the Bid for the On-Call Test Pit Contract at Various Locations 2022, because all of the Bids came in too high. Commissioner Kelly mentioned that the County will be meeting with Lakewood officials to provide an update on pending Lakewood projects. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the April 19, 2023 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of April 19, 2023. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari notified the board that the furniture for the new BOSS building should arrive by September, 2023.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.
