Office of the Director Proclamation

August 2, 2023

WHEREAS, Ferragosto is a public holiday celebrated on August 15th in all of Italy. It originates from Feriae Augusti, the festival of Emperor Augustus, who made the 1st of August a day of rest after weeks of hard work on the agricultural sector; and

WHEREAS, it became a custom for the workers to wish their employers "buon ferragosto" and receive a monetary bonus in return. This became law during the Renaissance throughout the papal states. As the festivity was created for political reasons, the Catholic Church decided to move the festivity to the 15th of August which is the Assumption of Mary, allowing them to include this festivity; and

WHEREAS, this festivity was also used by Mussolini to give the lower classes the possibility to visit cultural cities or go to the seaside for one to three days, from the 14th of August to the 16th, by creating "holiday trains" with extremely low cost tickets for this holiday period; and

WHEREAS, food and board was not included, this is why even today Italians associate packed lunches and barbecues with this day. By metonymy, it is also the summer vacation period around mid-August which may be a long weekend (ponte di ferragosto) or most of August; and

WHEREAS, up until 2010, ninety percent of companies, shops and industries closed, but with growing influence from other non-Catholic countries, and the fact that closing an entire country's industry for a whole month meant an incredible loss of money and backlog of work, most companies now close for about two weeks forcing all workers to take imposed vacation similar to the 25th of December.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JOSEPH H. VICARI, DIRECTOR of the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, on behalf of this Board, do hereby proclaim August 15, 2023 as:

FERRAGOSTO DAY

in Ocean County and join with Italian American citizens of Ocean County in celebrating this event.

ORDINANCE #2023-24

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PERMITTING AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE COURTHOUSE ANNEX LOCATED IN TOMS RIVER TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$92,000,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$85,000,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The following is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as general improvements: permitting and construction of the Courthouse Annex in Toms River Township, in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, including, but not limited to permitting and construction, and all else necessary therefor or incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, down payment and estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$92,000,000, including the sum of \$7,000,000 as the down payment, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets.

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$85,000,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$85,000,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$16,000,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefitted thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is forty (40) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$85,000,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. After final adoption of this Ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19.

SECTION 15. The Board of Commissioners of the County hereby covenants on behalf of the

County to take any action necessary or refrain from taking such action in order to preserve the tax-exempt status of the bonds and notes authorized hereunder as is or may be required under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder (the "Code"), including compliance with the Code with regard to the use, expenditure, investment, timely reporting and rebate of investment earnings as may be required thereunder.

SECTION 16. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

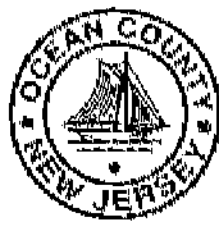



Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari opened the meeting by discussing the Ocean County Airport Fixed Base Operator Lease Extension. Monmouth Aircraft Services d/b/a Ocean Aire of Bayville, NJ performs daily airport maintenance and will remain the FBO at the Ocean County Airport until August 31, 2028.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about two Open Space acquisitions recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Council. The first is a 24.83-acre property located on Pasadena Road in Manchester Township. The property owner accepted a negotiated offer of \$250,000.00. The second is a 27.50-acre property located on Miller Avenue and Bowman Road in Jackson Township. The property owner accepted a negotiated offer of \$715,000.00.

Commissioner Crea and Tracy Maksel discussed the Homelessness Trust Fund which will be generated by a \$5.00 fee on each document recorded by the Ocean County Clerk's Office and deposited into a County Trust Fund to support ongoing programs which aid homelessness issues. Based on the number of documents filed over the last three years, the fund could raise from \$275,000 to \$390,000 annually. The funding cannot be used to build a homeless shelter, but can be utilized for support services, acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of housing projects that supply permanent housing to those

at risk of homelessness. A task force will be established to oversee the fund, which will serve as an advisory board to the Board of Commissioners. A public hearing will be held at the Board meeting on July 6, 2023.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to award the reconstruction and resurfacing of County Route 539 from Horicon Avenue to Route 528 in Manchester, Jackson and Plumsted Townships to Earle Asphalt in Farmingdale, NJ in the amount of \$2,490,313.13. This award is contingent on NJDOT approval. Mr. Ernst also discussed the recommendation to award the Ocean County Underground Storage Tank Removal and Upgrade Project at the Transportation Garage and Administration Building in Toms River to T. Slack Environmental Services from Kenilworth, NJ in the amount of \$998,905.00. Mr. Fiore mentioned that the Board agreed to add a resolution to the agenda requesting the State add a left turn lane to the intersection on Kennedy Blvd onto Route 9 in Lakewood. Commissioner Kelly, Mr. Ernst, and County Officials have met with Lakewood, Brick Township, Toms River, Manchester and Jackson Township to discuss any roadway issues that they may have as well as County planned traffic improvements. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the June 21, 2023 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of June 21, 2023. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Haines mentioned that the Board will add a resolution to the agenda in support of Prosecutor Bradley Billhimer's request to be reappointed to a second five year term. The Commissioner commended the President of Ocean County College, Dr. Jon Larsen on his retirement after 23 years there. Dr. Pamela Monaco will be succeeding him.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Quinn, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:45pm for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Michael Hanrahan of Clarke Caton Hintz gave a presentation to the Board on the Ocean County Justice Complex Annex project. The goal of the Annex is to create a functional, size appropriate, cost effective space that will accommodate the needs of the court, while eliminating the need for additional rental buildings. The project is projected to break ground in April 2024, and will take approximately two years to complete.

*A copy of the presentation is attached.

Maria LaFace, the Director of Senior Services, spoke about the difficulties seniors in Ocean County are having regarding rent increases and possible eviction. Social security benefits have not increased in line with the cost of living, leaving seniors in financial danger. Suggested solutions may be municipal rent control ordinances, and state/federal subsidies that may assist tenants with rental payments.
