WHEREAS, at that time she became one of the first National Board Certified black female obstetrician-gynecologists in the country, ultimately being awarded the Medal of Freedom and 14 honorary degrees; and

WHEREAS, her retirement brought her to Lakewood where she continued her work to improve the lives of the frail and the vulnerable; and

WHEREAS, while in Ocean County she worked with the Office of Senior Services, the Board of Health and numerous outreach service organizations, being recognized by many of them including the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders, now the Ocean County Board of Commissioners.

- 1. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability;
- 2. Liability, other than motor vehicle;
- 3. Property Damage, other than motor vehicle;

- 5. Public Officials Liability/Employment Practices Liability; and
- 6. Environmental Impairment Liability.

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE OCEAN COUNTY INSURANCE FUND COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean (the "County") and its boards, agencies, authorities and commissions (collectively referred to as "Interagencies") presently purchase insurance or self-insure against risks of damage to persons or property of third parties, workers' compensation claims, and claims against public officials; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined that cost savings and administrative efficiencies can be achieved if the County and its inter-agencies share the cost of insurance; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:10-6 authorizes a governing body of any local unit to establish an Insurance Fund for the purposes provided by law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to law, the County shall appoint three officials to serve as Insurance Fund Commissioners for a term of 2 years or for the remainder of their term of public office, whichever shall be less, and until their successors shall have been duly appointed and qualified; and

WHEREAS, establishment of the Insurance Fund will require execution of documents as may be required by the Fund's by-laws; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined it would be in the best interests of the County to authorize the establishment of an Ocean County Insurance Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Ocean County Board of Commissioners on this 17th day of February, 2021, as follows:

- 1) An Insurance Fund to be known as the Ocean County Insurance Fund Commission (hereinafter the "Commission") is hereby established, effective 3/1/2021, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:10-6 for the following purposes:
- a. To insure against any loss of damage however caused to any property, motor vehicles, equipment or apparatus owned by or under the control of the County or any of its inter-agencies.
- b. To insure against liability resulting from the use or operation of motor vehicles, equipment or apparatus owned by or under the control of the County or any of its inter-agencies.
- c. To insure against liability for any acts of negligence attributed to the County and its officers, employees and servants and those of its inter-agencies, whether or not compensated, who are authorized to perform any act or services, but not including an independent contractor within the limitations of the "New Jersey Tort Claims Act" (N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq.).

- d. To insure against any loss or damage from liability as established by chapter 15 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes.
- 2) Any of the County's inter-agencies by resolution may enter into an agreement with the Commission to participate in the Insurance Fund (referred to collectively with the County as "Participating Agencies").
- 3) The Ocean County Board of Commissioners shall appoint three officials to serve as Fund commissioners ("Fund Commissioners").
- 4) The Fund Commissioners shall hold office for 2 years or for the remainder of their term of office as officials, whichever shall be less, and until their successors shall have been duly appointed and qualified. Vacancies in the office of Fund Commissioner caused by any reason other than expiration of term as a public official shall be filled for the unexpired term. Fund Commissioners shall serve without compensation.
- 5) Following their appointment, the Fund Commissioners shall organize for the ensuing year by electing a Chair who shall serve for the year.
- 6) The Fund Commissioners shall appoint a Secretary who shall serve at the pleasure of the Commission. Vacancies in the position of Secretary shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment. The salary of the Secretary shall be set by resolution as authorized by the Ocean County Board of Commissioners.
 - 7) The Fund Commission shall have the following powers and authority:
- a. Assign, following consultation with the County Administrator, the necessary County employees to assist the Secretary in the daily operations of the Commission.
- b. Invest all assets of the Insurance Fund in such cash, cash equivalents and securities as they shall deem best suited for the purposes of the Commission.
- c. Adopt rules and regulations for the control and investment of funds of the Commission.
- d. Maintain sufficient funds and investments for the payment of losses of any buildings or property of any of the Participating Entities, liability resulting from the operation of motor vehicles, equipment or apparatus owned and/or controlled by any of the Participating Entities, liability resulting from the acts of the officers, employees or servants, whether or not compensated, of the Participating Entities.
- e. Fix reasonable rates of premium for all insurance carried by the Commission and provide this insurance by self-funding the coverage and/or by purchasing the coverage with any insurance company or companies authorized to do business in this State.
- f. Premiums for insurance, whether self-funded by the Commission or purchases from insurance companies, shall be assessed by the Commission to each of the Participating Entities.
- g. All insurance maintained for property owned or controlled by any of the Participating Entities shall be purchased by the Commission.

- h. The Commission may provide in its duly adopted rules and regulations that the Secretary or Commission's designee shall be entrusted with the daily operation of the Commission and shall submit a monthly report to the Fund Commissioners.
- 8) The Ocean County Board of Commissioners shall appropriate all the monies necessary to affect the purposes of this Resolution.
- 9) The Ocean County Board of Commissioners may designate the maximum or minimum amount of investments and reserves held by the Commission and from time to time provide for the disposition of any excess over and above the maximum amount fixed, or of the interest or profits arising there from when the Fund shall have reached the established maximum limit.
- 10) Procurement shall comply with the Local Publics Contract Law and all other applicable New Jersey rules and regulations regarding public procurement.
- 11) The Commission shall be required to submit an Annual Report to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners detailing the overall performance of the Commission. The Annual Report shall address cost, coverage, financial results and other matters regarding the overall operations of the Commission. The Annual Report shall be submitted to the Board of Commissioners no later than ninety (90) days after the end of each calendar year.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Ocean County Board of Commissioners intends to appoint three officials to serve as commissioners ("Fund Commissioners").

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be made available to the County Administrator, Chief Financial Officer, County Counsel, the Employee Relations Department, the Ocean County Insurance Fund Commission, and the New Jersey Counties Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund.
