ORDINANCE #2014-24

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CENTERLINE RUMBLE STRIPS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$1,250,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,250,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. There is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the County of Ocean as a general improvement, the construction of centerline rumble strips at various locations, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

SECTION 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the improvements or purposes, the estimated cost of the improvements and appropriation therefor, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes authorized are as follows:

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,250,000 for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. No down payment is required as this bond ordinance involves projects funded by State grants and other similar programs, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c).

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,250,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of \$1,250,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the

County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, other than the grant described in section 2 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

SECTION 8. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, architects' fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses, and other items as provided in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 shall not exceed the sum of \$1,250,000.

SECTION 9. The Capital Budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency and amendment, the resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 10. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

A. The improvements or purposes described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are improvements or purposes the County may lawfully undertake as general improvements,

and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property benefited thereby.

B. The average period of usefulness of the improvements for which the obligations authorized by this Ordinance are to be issued is ten (10) years.

C. The supplemental debt statement provided for in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-10 was duly filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Ordinance on first reading, and a complete executed duplicate of such supplemental debt statement has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County as defined in N.J.S.A. 40A:2-43 is increased by this Ordinance by \$1,250,000 and the obligations authorized by this Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 11. In the event the monies set forth above for any purpose is not necessary for said purposes, then such monies shall be for the completion of any of the other purposes provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 12. The full faith and credit of the County of Ocean shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and notes authorized by this Ordinance, and as long as any of said bonds or notes are outstanding, an appropriation shall be included in each annual budget of the County hereafter adopted in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds or notes maturing in each year. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the County, and the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the County for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 13. After passage upon first reading of this Ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is hereby directed to publish the full text of the Ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this Ordinance.

SECTION 14. 

WHEREAS, the County has been notified by the State of New Jersey Division of Family Development that it will receive an additional \$20,000,000 in SHRAP funding for a total of \$68,967,400 in SHRAP funding; and

- WHEREAS, 25-year-old United States Marine Sgt. Andrew Tahmooressi served two tours of duty in Afghanistan and received a meritorious battle promotion to the rank of Sergeant while serving in Afghanistan's Helmand Province with the 2nd Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment; and
- WHEREAS, following his service to our nation with the United States Marine Corps in Afghanistan, Sgt. Tahmooressi was diagnosed with Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder; and
- WHEREAS, Sgt. Tahmooressi moved to San Diego, California to receive treatment for PTSD from the United States Veterans Affairs Medical Center San Diego in La Jolla, California. While driving on March 31, 2014 he mistakenly crossed the border into Mexico after taking a wrong turn; and
- WHEREAS, Sgt. Tahmooressi placed a call to 911 to report his error, informing the 911 dispatcher that he had three legally registered guns in his possession because he kept everything he owned in his Ford F-150 truck; and
- WHEREAS, Sgt. Tahmooressi was arrested at the United States-Mexican border on March 31, 2014 and was charged with weapons trafficking. He is still being held in the El Hongo 11 Prison in Tecate, Mexico; and
- WHEREAS, Sgt. Tahmooressi alleges that abuse during the beginning of his incarceration and poor prison conditions led him to attempt suicide; and
- WHEREAS, PTSD can result in hyper-vigilance, memory and cognition lapses and depression. Sgt. Tahmooressi's reported actions of aggression and physical selfabuse are likely manifestations of his PTSD; and
- WHEREAS, Sgt. Tahmooressi's immediate release would allow him to enroll in medical treatment at a clinic specializing in combat-related PTSD in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders is outraged that a United States Marine Corps veteran who has served two tours of duty in Afghanistan remains wrongfully imprisoned in Mexico.


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
Summary of Pre-Board Meeting of May 28, 2014

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari thanked the Forest Fire Service for all they do; stating that this Board is committed to the cross wind runway at Robert J. Miller Airpark for the safety of our residents, pilots and the Fire Services who use the runway. The Director introduced Brian Corvinus, John Writh and Michael Achey of the Forest Fire Service to provide an update of the recent fire and the training that the Forest Fire Service does at the Robert J. Miller Airpark.

Mr. Corvinus stated that the Forest Fire Service used the new runway this season which he advised was a great resource for tools and equipment the Service uses. Mr.

Corvinus gave a powerpoint presentation to the Board on the April 24 fires in Beachwood and Berkeley Townships. Mr. Corvinus advised that earlier this spring, the Service strategically placed aircraft for the upcoming forest fire season. Mr. Corvinus noted that before the new runway, the Service had safety issues with the north / south runway, noting that an east / west runway was needed. This unsafe situation required the Service to move aircraft to another area in the State. With the new runway complete, Mr. Corvinus advised that the Service brought the aircraft back on April 4, 2014 for this forest fire season which was an added benefit in fighting the recent fires.

Mr. Corvinus' power point presentation provided area maps of the resent fires. The first fire started near the intermediate school in Beachwood. Mr. Corvinus noted that the conditions that day were very dry with 40 mile an hour winds; large aircraft made several water drops and the close proximity of the aircraft to the fire made a big difference. Helicopters came from Burlington County which was not as quick. The second fire started in Berkeley Township. The aircraft that flew that day made 31 missions, dropping 19,000 gallons of water on the fires. Tankers were brought in to supply water. Mr. Corvinus stated that the Forest Fire Service maintains a hangar at the Robert J. Miller Airpark and the Service was able to resupply water quickly to put the fires out.

Freeholder Kelly noted over the last ten years the area has had significant snow packs and not that aggressive fire seasons. Mr. Writh noted that they always expect fires in the Spring and there have been a lot of historical fires in Ocean County, he did agree that there have been less aggressive fire seasons of late. Mr. Writh noted that during the recent fires, staff was upped because of the weather conditions. The first truck was at the fire in four minutes but was unable to catch it because of the high winds and Mother Nature.

Director Vicari noted that press releases are done each year by the County around this time to alert residents to fire dangers. The Director noted that most new cars do not have ashtrays and cigarettes are discarded out windows which is a fire danger during hot, dry conditions.

Freeholder Lacey questioned if the fire towers are still manned in Lakewood? Mr. Achey advised that all towers were staffed on the day of the April fires and that both fires were reported immediately. Mr. Corvinus stated that the second fire would have been significantly worse without the fire towers. He noted that entry level Forest Fire Service members start out working in the fire towers. Mr. Writh stated that the new runway has worked out very well, noting that planes flew to other fires in Burlington County out of Robert J. Miller Airpark as well. Freeholder Kelly noted that the Forest Fire Service has come a long way over the years. The Freeholder stated that the County has a long history with the Forest Fire Service and a great working relationship and the County appreciates the work that the Service does. Mr. Writh thanked the Board for its support and help it has provided over the years and stated that a lot of training takes place throughout the year, noting that the Service is far more advanced here in Ocean County.

Director Vicari stated that the crosswind runway is the only runway built in 30 years. This was built for safety. Mr. Corvinus stated that the pilots appreciate the runway. The Director thanked the Forest Fire Service for their presentation.

Freeholder Lacey reviewed the Municipal Recycling Grant Program with the Board, noting that the County created this program in 2001 to help municipalities. The County will award 10 grants totaling \$137,411 this year. The Freeholder noted that the grants range from \$2,600 to \$37,680, the largest award went to Ocean Gate for \$37,680 for a municipal recycling center. Ocean Gate is starting from scratch. Ernest Kuhlwein, Director, Solid Waste Management was in attendance and stated that it is great to see that Ocean Gate is doing a recycling yard in their municipality and that they were able to put this together. Freeholder Lacey stated that the County did not have this program for a few years and it is great to have it back.

Freeholder Bartett stated that there are two parcels recommended for acquisition by the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Board. The first is 155 acres in Jackson Township adjacent to properties already preserved by the County. The parcel is owned by US Home Corp and the negotiated price for the 155 acres is \$340,000. Freeholder Bartlett stated that his is a very good price for this acquisition and it fits in with other land preserved in the area including Patriots Park in Jackson Township. The Freeholder noted that a lot of this land was developable.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the second parcel recommended for acquisition is .37 acres located in Beachwood Borough. The Freeholder noted that this property is an inholding within the Pinewald Road acquisition area. Freeholder Bartlett noted that the County purchased property from Mr. Lipton a few years back and there are a few other lots within the property owned by others. As those pieces become available, the County has been picking those up as well. The Freeholder stated that these property owners would have to put a road and sewers in to develop them and it does not pay to do so. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this .37 acres parcel is a donation to the County and that he appreciates the owner's donation.

Both of these acquisitions will be listed for Board action on June 4, 2014

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the June 4, 2014 Board meeting.

Freeholder Little advised that the stormdrains along Route 72 going up to the bridge are completely filled with sand, noting that the drains are not working at all. The State has not maintained them.

Director Vicari stated that the State of New Jersey has not mowed the grass along the median on Route 37 and the jughandles. The Director advised that he reached out to them and they have not done the mowing. Mr. Scarantino will contact the NJDOT again about the stormdrains and the grass.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of June 4, 2014. Freeholder Kelly noted that Item 21 is the 1962 facility. This was not part of the addition to the jail. This is for renovations to the 1962 jail and also relates to the existing elevators. The Administrator noted that the elevators no longer meet standards for the jail. This has needed to be done for a number of years. This will also increase capacity for the jail in the future. Freeholder Kelly stated that the 1962 jail renovations will keep population at the jail in check for years to come. There were no questions or comments.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that Berkeley Island Park now has a small portion open for fishing. The Freeholder stated that the pier needs some structural work done and no fishing is permitted near the pier yet. Freeholder Bartlett advised that there is now some availability at the park for this summer. The County is now in the design phase of what needs to get done and the County has received a couple of grants for Berkeley Island Park.

Director Vicari stated that he attended the ribbon cutting for the Seaside boardwalk on May 23, 2014. The Director noted that putting people to work, increasing property values and working with business and the tourism industry is key to getting tourism back. The Director noted that an article in the newspaper stated that the boardwalk was not ready. Director Vicari stated that this was the worst time for an article to appear like this. The Director noted that the boardwalk will be done for the July 4, 2014 holiday. The Borough of Seaside Park put a lot of money into the boardwalk. The Freeholder stated that the good news was that it was an excellent Memorial Day weekend and that Sunday and Monday were beautiful days.

Director Vicari stated that Long Beach Island did excellent business over the holiday weekend. The County needs to support and stress the "Jersey Shore." The Director noted that the County spent \$40,000 on advertising and it needs positive cooperation, stating that the County's press releases were not printed in the newspapers. Director Vicari noted that the Barnegat Bay is clear and located in Ocean County is 7 miles of boardwalk. The Director stated that WOBM has been very supportive and thanked Tom Mongelli.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little stated that this Board has a network of organizations that are faith-based which provide homeless services to the poor and needy. Freeholder Little advised that a church in Lakewood will be having a grand opening in June for a faith-based Samaritan House which will provide housing for 9 people.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Lacey, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:55 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Director Vicari stated that the Defense Enhancement Commission (DEC) is extremely important and vital to the economy in Ocean County. The Director stated that Ocean County has a very active military and this DEC will set the foundation this year for the BRAC next year to make sure that our Base stays here. Director Vicari stated that he attended a Mayors Association meeting several weeks ago where Congressman Saxton also gave a presentation. Freeholder Kelly stated that this Board has always shown strong support for our Base, noting that when Navy Lakehurst was a stand alone Base, the New Jersey Defense Enhancement Commission was formed. Freeholder Kelly also stated that the Base is a vital part of the State and County's economy. Freeholder Kelly introduced the Congressman.

Congressman Saxton thanked the Board for inviting him to come to the meeting today and advised that Lou Nagy who was the Burlington County Economic Development Director years ago, was here as well as and Michael Warner, former Commander of Fort Dix.

Congressman Saxton stated that they share a strong interest in Joint Base McGuire, Dix, Lakehurst (JBMDL) with the Board of Chosen Freeholders to help support the activities of the Base as well as help it grow. Congressman Saxton stated that the JBMDL meets monthly and the next meeting is Monday, June 16, 2014. The Congressman noted that the Base has survived several closures since 1989 and the DEC continues to work to make life better at the Base and help resolve problems the Base may have with the State. The Congressman reviewed a power point with the Board.

Congressman Saxton stated that there are 21,364 active military and reserve military on the Base with 19,000 civilians working on the Base. At Navy Lakehurst, 1,650 people work at an average salary of \$98,000 a year with 200 contractors making \$85,000 a year. The total salaries generated are \$191.28 million a year. Congressman Saxton stated that this is good news for Ocean and Burlington Counties; however, the bad news is that military spending has significantly decreased, and it is expected to continue to drop. The Congressman stated that BRAC is not the only threat to the Base; 60 percent of the fleet will go away with another sequester; the KC10 planes will be retired; the long range plane is to replace the KC10's with the KC46 which is being produced for the first time this year, by 2017 there will be 17 available. Congressman Saxton stated that the DEC has been able to work with the Lt. Governor and the NJ Military Installation and Growth and Development Task Force. These efforts have been very successful. The Congressman noted the DEC's website www.decni.com.

Freeholder Kelly stated that it is important that the State legislature provide funding to keep the Bases open. The Freeholder noted that in 1995, we proved how effective this Base is for the national defense of the Country. The Freeholder thanked Mike Warner for his help to Ocean County in the past and noted that he is happy that this Board is working towards keeping the Bases open. Freeholder Kelly stated that resolutions will be listed on the Board Agenda supporting the DEC to enhance New Jersey's military installations and for financial support from the State for the defense of the Bases. Director Vicari thanked the Congressman, Mike Warner and Lou Nagy for attending the meeting. The Director noted that County staff is working with this and is very sensitive to the needs of the Base. Freeholder Bartlett thanked the Congressman for all his service and stated that he appreciated all the work he is doing on behalf of JBMDL and his friendship to the Base and the County.

Freeholder Bartlett gave the Board an update on the 2014 Budget. The Freeholder noted he had good news. The State recommended that the County include \$9 million as an item of revenue in the 2014 Budget for the Community Development Block Grant Essential Services Grant; however, the County can not do this until the federal government approves the \$9 million which would flow through the State. The Freeholder noted that the \$9 million was awarded competitively. The award is for essential services to replace what the County lost in tax ratables from Superstorm Sandy. Freeholder Bartlett advised that 75 percent of the amount (\$12 million) was received last year and this year's award is \$3 million less.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that the County received a letter from the State noting that: the County surplus is at a reasonable level and the State applicated the County for this; the

County has constrained personnel costs, salary increases less than 2 percent for all employees; and the County's shared services with the storm response providing debris removal services to municipalities was a unique endeavor. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the State noted that because of this, the County was deserving of the \$9 million.

Freeholder Bartlett noted that at the next regular meeting of the Board, June 18, 2014, the County will introduce a required budget amendment, noting that the budget amendment will increase the budget by \$35 million because the County has been the recipient of another grant, the SHRAP grant. On the expense side the Freeholder stated that these funds will be expended for Superstorm Sandy (SSS) related services. Freeholder Bartlett stated that he was very happy to receive the \$35 million from the federal government for SSS relief efforts. The Freeholder stated that the tax rate will remain the same as when the County introduced the budget at 34.1 cents. On June 25, 2014 the County will hold a special meeting for the amended budget. Freeholder Bartlett thanked Governor Chris Christie for seeing Ocean County's need and recognizing the extraordinary things Ocean County has done.

Freeholder Bartlett advised the Board that Ocean County is now only due about \$5 million from FEMA for the debris removal from SSS. Municipality payments to the County are due on July 1, 2014. The Freeholder stated that Ocean County has been through a financial roller coaster during this process.

Director Vicari commended Freeholder Bartlett for the clear summary of the budget and the budget amendment and for the County's fiscal conservative policies. The Director stated that no one could anticipate the downturn in the economy and Superstorm Sandy as well as maintain our Triple A bond rating, and be able to fund the \$100 million for debris removal. Director Vicari stated that it is a compliment to get this letter from the State of New Jersey.

Freeholder Lacey stated that without Freeholder Bartlett constantly attending to the budget, the County would not have had the money. The Freeholder noted that when the County was going through the storm process and 17 towns didn't have the ability for storm debris removal, they were able to get help from the County who was able to meet their need and follow contractual law. Freeholder Lacey noted that the bottom line was that the bonding agencies saw what Ocean County did. Director Vicari stated that Ocean County was able to do this because of its surplus. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this was a lot of hard work done by Julie Tarrant and Carl Block.

Freeholder Lacey stated that a contract was awarded to Clean Venture for the Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program at a cost of \$.37 a pound. The Freeholder advised that there will be five locations throughout Ocean County starting June 28, 2014. The collection will run once a month from June to October. Freeholder Lacey stated that last year the County collected approximately 237,000 pounds of hazardous waste and the costs for the collection was \$92,000. Freeholder Bartlett noted that this material is being safely disposed of. Freeholder Lacey noted that residents should always only buy what you need

and dispose of it properly. Residents can go to any site to drop off material. The Freeholder stated that it is all about the environment.

Director Vicari noted that materials kept in garages during Superstorm Sandy were displaced all over. Residents have learned that they need to store materials three foot above ground. The Director also noted that the County holds a prescription program where residents can turn in old medications. Ernest Kuhlwein, Director of Solid Waste Management was in attendance and noted that information on the HHW Program can be found on the Solid Waste website.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board a Natural Lands Trust Fund (NLTF) parcel located in Barnegat and Stafford Township recommended by the NLTF Advisory Committee for acquisition. The parcel is 272 acres and the negotiated price is \$1,250,000 located near the Warren Grove Range. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the Department of Defense has expressed interest in this parcel; however, they do not have the funds to guarantee reimbursement at this time. The State may at a future date purchase this property for inclusion in the State's land system. This parcel is located adjacent to the Bass River State Forest, New Jersey Natural Lands Trust property and in close proximity to the County owned Cedar Bridge Tavern property. This acquisition will be listed on the Board Agenda of June 18, 2014.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the June 18, 2014 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of June 18, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari acknowledged William Braden, Transportation Advisory Board, who was in attendance at the meeting. Director Vicari stated that Ocean County has spent millions of dollars trying to get rail service in Ocean County. The Director noted that if all the money spent on studies was used for the rail line, some of the rail line would be done already; stating that if part of the rail line was done it is better then nothing. Mr. Braden addressed the Board stating that half a loaf is better than none, stating that Ocean County can not hold out for the Monmouth Junction Route. Mr. Braden stated that focus should be on what we can get done. Mr. Braden noted an article in the Asbury Park Press today that New Jersey Transit is going to run four round trip trains from New York City to Ocean County, stating that Ocean County needs to be prepared for this. Freeholder Lacey stated that it would be nice if this was run year round. Director Vicari noted that he hopes that in his lifetime we see this done.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Bartlett stated that he received a call before the meeting from Mayor George Nebel, Mantoloking Borough, to thank the Board for its help from the Road

Department in tearing down Town Hall for a very reasonable price under Schedule C. The Freeholder stated that Mayor Nebel was very appreciative for all the help to Mantoloking Borough through out and after Superstorm Sandy.

Freeholder Little stated that he and Freeholder Kelly represented the Board at the opening of the Samaritan House in Lakewood Township, a new homeless facility. The Freeholder noted that is was a very touching ceremony and he wished them the best in providing a shelter here in Ocean County.

Freeholder Little stated that he received a call from clergy stating that he had a homeless person in his office and said he could not get anything done. Freeholder Little stated that he advised that this individual was provided ten days shelter and that the homeless person was requested to sign up for SA1 but refused to comply with the requirements. Freeholder Little noted that this is the side of the story that does not get out and the County can not explain.

Freeholder Little stated that over 4,000 people are sheltered in Ocean County every night by the Board of Social Services (BOSS). The BOSS helps pay rent, back mortgages, provide utility payments, etc. The Freeholder noted that over \$600 million of tax payer dollars from federal, state and County money is provided to clients at the BOSS. Director Vicari noted that this does not include private churches and food banks that provide services to people in Ocean County.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Lacey, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 5:15 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
