# **E. PRESENTATIONS**

CLERK GUNTHER: "Director, there is one presentation on today's agenda, recognizing the recipients of the 19th annual New Jersey Clean Communities Awards."

1. To the Recipients of the 19th annual New Jersey Clean Communities Awards.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much Madam Clerk. At a recent Sustainability in Motion Conference in Atlantic City a number of exceptional individuals were honored for their outstanding contributions to environmental stewardship. I am pleased to have with us today the three honorees that were there from Ocean County. Their work is making a significant difference in protecting our environment through the creation of proactive and educational tools, leadership and innovative projects that make people aware of our natural surroundings and the importance of protecting it. It is my pleasure to call up the honorees to be recognized with certificates from the Ocean County Board of Commissioners. I would like first to read a brief description of each of their work and then call them up to join me on the dais.

Landon Hoberman is a freshman at Point Pleasant Beach High School and a resident of Lavallette who is recognized with the New Jersey Clean Communities Excellence in Education Award for his tireless efforts in reducing plastic pollution along the New Jersey shore. As the sole Student Environmental Advocate Leader (SEAL) in Ocean County,

Landon's leadership has been instrumental in implementing initiatives like the #Reduce by Request Campaign which has made significant strides in reducing plastic waste in local eateries. Landon, would you please join me on the dais?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "Our next honoree is our very own Tanara Hall, the Ocean County Clean Communities Coordinator who we celebrated with the Clean Communities Innovative Program Award for her visionary art sustainability project which transforms recycling "igloos" into colorful and captivating installations promoting litter prevention and recycling. Strategically placed across Ocean County parks, beaches and marinas, this project helps to tie waste reduction outreach to encouraging residents, boaters and shore visitors to recycle and keep our beaches clean. Tanara, would you please join me on the dais?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "Also with us today is Phil Preston, the Clean Communities Coordinator for Stafford Township who was honored with the Clean Communities Municipal Coordinator Award for his exceptional collaboration and leadership in enhancing the environmental quality for the community. Phil's initiative such as overseeing the Lagoon Maintenance Department and implementing educational programs and adopt-a-program initiatives have not only improved the cleanliness of Stafford Township but have also inspired regional environmental improvements. Phil, could you please come up?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "Now I would like to call up our youngest award recipient to say a few words. Landon, you wanted to say a few words."

LANDON HOBERMAN: "Hi. My name is Landon Hoberman and I'm extremely honored to be here. I am a freshman at Point Beach High School and went to Lavallette for eighth grade. I received this award in recognition of my #Reduced by Request Campaign and my Ocean Conservation Presentations to Lavallette School. I'm also excited to be the first student from Ocean County accepting the Clean Ocean Action Student Environmental Advocate and Leadership Program. It's hard to ignore the amount of plastic packaging that the foods and snacks aisle have come in, but when I moved to the shore the issue became increasingly clear. As I worked in a local restaurant, I saw first-hand the amount of single-use plastic utensils that are placed in to go and delivery orders. They are likely going to people's homes where reusable cutlery was already available. I found in my campaign, #Reduced by Request, where I partner with restaurants to reduce the environmental impact by making single-use plastic utensils only available upon request for to go and delivery orders. To date, all year-round restaurants in Lavallette Borough have joined and we have helped eliminate over one million single-use plastic utensils from entering the environment annually.

In addition to making a difference with local businesses, I wanted to inspire other students to get involved. On February 29th I presented to 175 Lavallette students and faculty on ocean conservation. I narrated a book called 'Sea Change' by Joel Harper to grades K through 2. This book brings awareness of the issues of waste in the environment and leads to a school-wide beach sweep. In addition, I created my own presentation for grades 3 through 8 that focuses on the points of protecting the ocean, why plastic pollution is a threat, and how everyone can make a difference in their daily lives. I will also be creating an annual school-wide, beach sweep event for Lavallette School. As I work to drive awareness of ocean conservation and reduce the use of single-use plastics, I realize that most students want to help but they don't know what to do or how to get started. Therefore, I created my student environmental ambassador program, Ocean Action Sea Program that contains three actual tool kits that will empower and guide students today on how to better the environment tomorrow, and their business community through the extension of #Reduce by Request, local community through town clean ups, and school community through ocean conservation presentations. The success of my initiatives lies not only in their immediate impact but also in their potential for scalability and sustainability. Through collaboration and shared knowledge, we can affect meaningful change on a much larger scale. I'd love all of your support and collaboration to educate, empower and enroll Ocean County students and businesses and inspire them to make a difference. Thank you for your time and the recognition."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Oh, thank you."

These remarkable individuals exemplify the spirit of environmental stewardship and serve as inspirations to the communities across New Jersey and especially our magnificent Ocean County. Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. I'll turn it over to Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Ms. Director. As you can see up on the map all the green is all county property that's saved and the light yellow, that is the property we're talking about right now. And as was stated the property is approximately 50 acres on Atlantic City Boulevard and is being donated by Berkeley Township. The property is directly adjacent to the Florence T. Allen Extension II, former Blackbeard's Cave, which we just had about a month or two ago that we acquired that property, and is immediately adjacent to the 745-acre Natural Lands Trust Fund property known as the New Jersey Pulverizing and Barnegat Branch Trail which everyone knows how popular the Barnegat Branch Trail is and we're just very happy that we're able to get this piece. And you can see just in this particular area (shows on map) how much. We have over...just a little thing that I do like to say is 60% of Ocean County is preserved. A lot of people don't realize it but that includes your federal, state, county and some local. And Ocean County has approximately 30,000 acres of natural lands that are preserved, about 5,000 acres in parks and about 3,300 acres in farmland and it's just continuing. And of course, this donation was given by Berkeley so they're very, very supportive of this. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. I'm going to open this to the public. Is there anyone from the public that would like to speak on this resolution, only? Is there anyone that has anything to say? Okay, seeing none..."

No comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Commissioner Haines?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you, Ms. Director. As was stated it's really hard to see the little yellow sliver that's up there (shows on map). Again, all the green that's around there and, of course, that's all property that's been preserved. It is 0.17 acres on Radio Road in Little Egg Harbor Township. It's adjacent to 31 acres of existing Natural Lands Trust Fund Open Space along Radio Road. The property will add to 31 acres of Osborn Island North. The property is not impacted by freshwater wetlands, however, the site is identified as a potential habitat for threatened and endangered species. And the property owner accepted our negotiated offer of \$70,000.00. And of course, the township is supportive of this acquisition by resolution."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. This is open to the public for discussion. Would anyone from the public like to say anything about this particular resolution? Seeing none, is there a motion?"

No comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

#### (Applause)

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I'm really very privileged to be here especially because I'm the liaison to the Ocean County Parks. And I realized just before coming down I have known every single Superintendent of the Parks System since Aubrey Clayton who lived at the house when you pull into Ocean County Park. That was our first park that the Rockefeller family had given to the County of Ocean. And I knew Aubrey very, very well. And I knew everyone all the way through right up to...and we had many different...we had Andy Grosso. We had Mr. Murray. My father was, at one point, an acting Superintendent of Parks many years ago. So, I've known every single one of them, and I will honestly tell you every single one gave dedication, no matter how many parks we had, no matter how much Natural Lands we might have had at the time, they gave true dedication to the Parks System. But Mike Mangum has given so much because he started as a naturalist. And I remember meeting him in 1980 when I was working for John Bartlett. And I met him, and Shaun O'Rourke were the two naturalists that worked for the Ocean County Parks Department at the time. And he showed true dedication then. He has never stopped one time. His love of Ocean County and his love of Ocean County Parks and our Natural Lands is second to none. I mean he has shown us day in and day out. And I have been able to work with him for all of my years. I've known him...this will be my ninth year of being on the Board. And of course, I've known him for many but my years as being liaison, and the many, many meetings I've had with him. The many driving around on the county roads to every single park, all the Natural Lands, all the areas that were of importance that he wanted to make sure...Cedar Bridge Tavern and Cloverdale and the Cox House, what we're redoing. The one thing there is the dedication that Mike has always given. I think every one of us and every Ocean County resident can be extremely proud of Mike Mangum knowing that he has done nothing but the best. And I know I see a lot of the staff members that are here today. I'm very happy that you're here because you also know the dedication that Mike gave to this county during his, 50 years? 50 plus years for the people of Ocean County and I just can't thank him enough. I know I'm going to miss you because we've had many talks because I'm chair of the DAR, the Daughters of the American Revolution, another thing we have in common of the Captain Joshua Huddy Chapter and Mike is of the Sons of the American Revolution. I think it's in the southern part of the county..."

# MICHAEL T. MANGUM: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "...so we sort of share that same type of title, male and female type thing. So, it's really been a true honor, you know, to know you because we both love Ocean County. We both love the Parks System and there is no other county in the State of New Jersey has the best Parks System than this county right here. And I just want to thank you and continue...I know you will not stop because we're having a vacancy on the Natural Lands, and I've already said that since we're going to have that vacancy that's the perfect spot to bring Mike Mangum back to continue to be devoted to the people of Ocean County."

MICHAEL T. MANGUM: "Thank you Commissioner Haines. I really appreciate the kind words. I want to thank all the Commissioners. I mean, without your support we couldn't do what we do. Our park staff is second to none. Without them, their dedication, hard work, they care about what they're doing, we couldn't get the job done. Also, one of the things Freeholder Bartlett always said was, county government you get things done. The state government you can't get anything done. County government you can get things done because we're the right size. We cut through the red tape. We get things done. All the departments I've worked with over the years we couldn't get what we do in parks without all the departments. Everybody works together really well in this county, and we do get things done. So, thank you everybody."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Mike, I want to congratulate you because I know what the proclamation says is so true. You have dedicated so many years of your life to what we have here in Ocean County. You continue to take and make the parks better each year. You continue to make the parks expand every year. I truly have been honored to be able to work with you. I have to say one thing when they said you started in 1973, I actually feel young because I was still in high school in 1973. That was probably one of the highlights of your proclamation. I can't say enough because what you said about the staff. We have such a great staff here in the county, Parks Department, all of our departments. And you all work so much hand-in-hand and that's truly a testament to yourself as a director of that department as well as all the other directors here. You moving out now and hopefully starting to enjoy the next chapter of your life not just continuing to serve on the Natural Lands Committee and give all your time there, we do want you there, but we're certainly looking forward to you being able to do it but you've left us in such a good spot because Mary Jane (Bavais) who's going to be taking and replacing you is not going to miss a beat because the two

of you have worked so well together. We're very, very lucky to be getting her and your mentorship in putting her where she's at is really going to make it such a good transition for the county. I truly appreciate it. I'm honored to be able to be here today and celebrate this. I won't be able to make your party tomorrow, but I'll see you on Tuesday over at Cattus (Island County Park). Get out there and start enjoying yourself. Thanks Mike."

MICHAEL T. MANGUM: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "If I could just take a minute. I had the opportunity to work with you on a local level and we had some fun doing what we were doing, and we worked hard. Then I got the opportunity to come here to the county and work with you here. You are an absolutely amazing individual. Thank you for what you did and thank you to your staff for helping you and all working together to accomplish what you had for this county. God bless you and enjoy your retirement. Thank you very much."

MICHAEL T. MANGUM: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "I was talking to Mike outside before we walked in. I was trying to talk him into staying another 10 years, but he said he's not doing that. And he said he was actually...when he started here, they were building this building, I think. This building is 50 years old. In a weird way I want to know at which point you decide you're going to be a naturalist when you're a kid. You decide I'm going to be a naturalist. But, great job. All the best to you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "He made that decision when he found out how much it pays. (Laughter) I started my own career in Ocean County in 1982 in the Parks Department and Mike was already there at the time. And my first job was as the Manager of Berkeley Island Park, which at that time was a brand-new reconstructed park. But in the wintertime, there wasn't a lot to do at Berkeley Island Park. So, Andy Grosso, the then director, asked me to go on two days a week to Berkeley Island Park. Well, Mike's partner out there was Shaun O'Rourke, and he left a little note for what I should be doing. He wanted me to cut up mice to feed to the snakes which I did not do. I said those snakes can go hungry until you get back here in a couple of days. You remember that?"

MICHAEL T. MANGUM: "I do."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "That's a true story. And I wrote a note about it that I wouldn't do it. And Tom Rankin who was the supervisor of the recreation part of Parks and Recreation called me in and laughed like hell that I wrote that note and said I wouldn't feed the snakes either, so I don't blame you. But Mike is from down my way. He lived in Parkertown at that time. I knew his first wife very good, and Mike, and they both were with the Parks Department. And Mike was always, always a hardworking man. He really was. He has been as our director, but I will tell you he also was as a naturalist. And I'm glad to have known you all these years, Mike. You're a good man and I wish you well in your retirement."

And you gave me that freedom to learn and understand and I think because of you and your guidance of me it assisted me to end up where I am today. ## T. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:30 PM, Director Crea received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. We will now go on to Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Sadeghi."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "I just wanted to talk about this gas tax. I think actually the Legislators voted on this yesterday, George?"

GEORGE GILMORE: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "But the governor hasn't signed it?"

GEORGE GILMORE: "Not yet."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "If you go back to 2016 we're not talking about the 60's. We're not talking about 50 years ago when Mike started here. 2016, eight years ago, the gas tax was at 14.5 cents. Within a year that gas tax was increased to 37 cents. And back then we were told that the money was going to be used by the state for the Transportation Trust Fund. They call it the TTF. And that was going to take care of all the roads and bridges for years to come. Now the proposal is to increase that tax to 50 cents, probably one of the highest in the nation. Now, I wouldn't have a problem with that. I wouldn't have any objections to that except the money...we know Ocean County is a commuter county. Most of the folks that live in Ocean County have jobs up in North Jersey so they travel that parkway up and down. Obviously they use gas. They use the tolls and such. And don't forget, that's just the gas part of it. There was actually a 15%...there was a 3% toll increase that was put in place recently. On top of that there was a 15% fare hike for the riders on New Jersey Transit. So, this just gets worse and worse. And if they use that money within the county and use it for our roads and improving our roads, again, it's painful but we'll accept it. Route 9, and I know Commissioner Kelly is diligently working on this trying to get some funding for the improvements, much needed improvements for Route 9, that road has pretty much stayed the same for the last 90 years. I don't know, maybe I should have looked this up to see what the population of Ocean County was 90 years ago, but you can

imagine the number of cars, the change, and the increase in the number of cars over time and nothing has been done.

So, that's the only thing that...and I think we actually have a resolution prepared, Mike, for the Commissioners to vote on?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes, Commissioner. After our meeting today we're going to prepare a resolution, a draft version, to include not only the toll increase, the gas increase and also the transit increase because this year it seems we were hit with a triple whammy as far as transportation costs and as you had noted to us Ocean County is a commuter county and it would have a big impact. So, we'll have that prepared for next preboard."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "I think we have a great opportunity this year and next year to try to ask for some additional monies and ask to get some attention for the roads in Ocean County. We have Commissioner Kelly who's been involved with the North Jersey Transportation Planning Authority. He's the chairman this year and next year. And I know he has requested meetings with the stakeholders at the state level so we could discuss with them and explain to them and maybe take them out there and show them what the traffic looks like, specifically and especially on Route 9. That's all I have."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you, Commissioner. Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you. We've talked about Route 9 very often but I will tell you we're working on much more than that in Ocean County. We have flooding problems throughout Ocean County on almost every road. And we always think that it's just along the shore but the fact of it is there's much flooding problems inland also and we are working very hard on that. In fact, we have meetings coming up to talk about a county-wide plan on flooding. Town after town wants us to raise the road up. Maybe that's the right answer, maybe it isn't, but I've asked our Engineering Department to review this and come up with a game plan, not only for those towns that have called in and asked us to look at it, but a county-wide program to look at the flooding issues throughout the county because there are many. And it changed dramatically since Superstorm Sandy. The whole bay has changed and the tidal flow in the bays have changed and now that has changed the issues that we're dealing with on these flooding problems. I tell you as I sit here today, I don't know the full answer to that. And I don't know if there is a full answer to it, but we are going to review that and come up with our best answer that we can take action on in the years ahead. That's just one more item added to what we're doing with Route 9. And Frank (Sadeghi) gave me a lot of credit on Route 9 but Frank has been, since he came onboard in January, right next to me every step of the way on what to do about Route 9. And we will also be taking care of that and we have many meetings scheduled, right Mr. Engineer? On Route 9 and what to do with it.

So, that's just two issues. But, I will tell you, you have to understand, we have over 600 miles of county roads in Ocean County and there are many, many issues that we have to deal with. You might have noticed on today's agenda all the new traffic lights that we're putting up. And that might not seem a lot but it's a quarter of a million dollars apiece to put these traffic lights in place. And I'm told this morning by John Ernst that we have 40, 40 of those traffic lights on the agenda to put in and establish over the weeks ahead. So, there's a lot of work we're doing. We continue to do it. There's a lot more that I haven't even talked about today and the roads in Ocean County require a lot of money. I bring this up because two weeks from today we're going to adopt a budget and you will see a lot of money in capital and most of that money is going to go towards road improvements in Ocean County. It's important and it's important that we address it and this entire Board is addressing it. So, thank you very much for the chance to comment."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Oh, thank you very much. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Ms. Director. Just to go along with what Frank was saying since he said he didn't know how many people were here like 90 years ago or whatever, in 1950 there were 50,000 people that lived in Ocean County at that time. We now have close to 650,000 that live in Ocean County and that was just about, maybe, 74 years ago. So, there has been a very big growth. So, it is very, very unfair to the people of Ocean County especially if you travel the Garden State Parkway. Most people that drive...we have more of the Garden State Parkway in Ocean County than any other county in this state. And, of course, we have many people in Ocean County that do travel whether it's either to the next county, Monmouth County, or farther up into North Jersey or going into New York. So, there's an awful lot of people in Ocean County that travel so it's going to be a very big added expense to these individuals along with everything else that's going along with the family budget that people are facing.

And, also, I don't know if it's still in the legislation, but I know when they did the legislation before for the gas tax every October 1st if they do not feel they have raised enough money for the Transportation Trust Fund they can increase it. And that was in the legislation that was first done. I don't know if it was changed with this piece of legislation or not. I don't know if Mr. Gilmore knows whether or not it was changed but October 1st they can change and increase the gas tax if they want to every single year. So, here we're going from...it was...whatever it was...23 cents, I think, the first time and now I think you said it was like 50 cents. It is becoming infallible for the people of Ocean County to have to face these types of increases that we're having. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you. Deputy Director?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "I'm going to pass because all my comments have been taken over by all the other Commissioners. It's seriously a real problem. I think what Frank touched on though with regards to the gas tax and the toll increases and you know, like Ginny said, all the inflationary items that have been hitting people in their

pocketbooks and making it very, very difficult for people to continue to live a normal life and be able to afford every month it's okay, what bill do I pay now because they just don't have the available cash to be able to continue to afford the lifestyle that we've all been used to down here. People moved down here years ago to take and get away from North Jersey, have a little bit more open space for their families, have better school systems. Ocean County always offered everything positive to the buyer and it made them come down here. But now it's like they're all being punished for living down here. Like Commissioner Kelly said the majority of the money comes in it all goes to North Jersey. That's why it's so good to have Jack sitting as a chairman this year up there on the Board because at least for the next two years Ocean County will have a voice and have somebody fighting for us at the head of the table, hopefully, to be able to bring something back. The Route 9 issue has been kicked around for years. I know well before I got on to this Board it was something that has been attempted to be solved by many, many Commissioners and many, many Boards. And will it ever be solved in our lifetime? I don't know for sure if that's going to ever happen but at the same time unless we start somewhere and really start fighting like hell and do everything we can it's only going to get worse for our children, our grandchildren and everybody else that's going to continue to live down here. So, I think it's very important the comments that were made here today because it really... it's going to put the light on a lot of things that people in Ocean County are really starting to get angry about. So, thank you Director."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You're very welcome. You know, I just want to echo a little bit about what you said because I take that Parkway every day and I know that someday I'm going to...the answer to my question is, whoever taught those people how to drive on that parkway? But it really is a concern. And now that my work has moved to the seniors of our communities, I begin to realize that they too have issues that need to be addressed. And so, our task is multifaceted. And I thank you Commissioner Sadeghi for your work that you're putting together with the roads. Thank you for what you're doing, for your concern about the people. And thank you for everybody that you're working together to get this done. So, that will be the conclusion of my comments. Go ahead."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Before we move on, I just want to add something..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Go ahead."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "...to what Ginny said about the population of Ocean County."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Surely."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Just looking at where we live, Bobbi Jo, right now, just between Stafford Township and Little Egg Harbor Township, there are over 60,000 people in Ocean County. And Ginny talked about in 1954 there was 52,000 in the whole county. I went to Little Egg Harbor Elementary School. And when I was in the fifth grade the Principal, Norman Levinson, came door to door because he was also the sixth-grade teacher to let us know that that day Little Egg Harbor Elementary School went to 100 students. That was how big Southern Ocean County was at the time. Tuckerton was the big town because they had 900 people, not 900 students, 900 people that lived in their town. In fact, my brother graduated from Tuckerton High before there was a Southern Regional High School that was replaced in our end of the county by Pinelands Regional. So, it was a lot different county. It was a lot smaller. And in my view, a better county. I liked it that way. I remember the one guy that stopped at our local gas station he was from out of state and asked one of the guys who was a clam digger that was sitting there, how do you guys put up with the greenheads? And his answer was because they're a lot better than you people." (Laughter)

DIRECTOR CREA: "I always say they were here before we were."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Yeah, they were."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Exactly."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "If we're going to reminisce about when we were in elementary school, when I was in my elementary school, Mike Mangum was the principal of the school." (Laughter)

DIRECTOR CREA: "Oh, that's tough."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a time limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:43 PM, Director Crea opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Okay, thank you. Next, we'll move on to Public Comments. Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of 5 minutes per speaker. If anyone wishes to speak, please come up to the microphone and provide your name and address for the record. Is there anyone that would like to speak to the county tonight? Please, yes sir, right here. Your name and address, please, for the record."

DALE CRANDALL, 4 SPRING MEADOW DR, LAKEWOOD: "Thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak to you briefly. As a resident of Ocean County, I am interested in fair and transparent elections as I know each of you are. Many are now considering paper ballot only, hand counted on Election Day. For example, Shasta County, California, Australia, Canada, Finland, France, Germany, Japan, Netherlands, Norway, Spain, Sweden, Thailand and the UK have switched to this method and they have the results the same night. I'm not here to ask you to consider this now. I am trying to analyze the financial impact that has switched from ESS voting machines to paper ballots would

have on the taxpayers of Ocean County. In broad terms I feel like the biggest factors would be the current cost of the voting machines and the county staff cost of fulfilling OPRA requests related to reports generated by the usage of voting machines. Some of the OPRA requests I assume would not be needed by the cast vote records, ballot reviews, ballot images, event logs, tabulator tapes and tabulator summaries. On the PDF, page 38 of the 2024 Introduced Budget, sheet 13-D, general appropriation operations, there are line items for election expenses, other expenses, and for Election Board salaries and wages. My questions are as a citizen of Ocean County do I have access to the annual cost of the voting machines and a rough estimate of the annual expense of fulfilling OPRA requests related to the use of voting machines? If so, what is the process? Thank you so much for your consideration of my request. I appreciate your time. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Yes. Let me answer your question. The answer is yes, you do have access to the cost."

DALE CRANDALL: "Okay, so who would I contact?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Julie (Tarrant), you can get him the answer, can't you?"

JULIE TARRANT, COMPTROLLER: "Yes, as long as he..."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Director, the only thing we would ask so there's a proper record that Michelle (Gunther) can respond to following the proper guidelines, if you could go on either to our website or if you could wait until after the meeting we'll give you our website. We have the link to where you would file an OPRA request."

DALE CRANDALL: "That's what I wanted to know. It's OPRA?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes, and that way it creates a record of your request, and it puts us on a track where we have to comply with it in certain time frames. So, you know...but that would be the format."

DALE CRANDALL: "I know about OPRA. I didn't know if this was OPRA or not."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "And I do apologize depending on what information it is. If its financial cost that is something that the county has in our budget and our information. If its actual election items, I believe, Chairman, that would have to go through the Election Board. They have their own Custodian of Records, but we will help guide you through that process."

DALE CRANDALL: "Right. I've gone to one of their meetings. I didn't know which is which. I figured that we have to start here because the finances."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "We'll make sure depending on your question which Custodian of Record it properly goes to."

DALE CRANDALL: "Okay, great. Thank you so much. God Bless. Have a good day."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. Anyone else? Yes, sir. Good Afternoon. Again, your name and address for the record, please."

RICHARD BANACH, 983 GREEN HILL BOULEVARD, TOMS RIVER: "I've been a resident of Ocean County for most of my life. I raised my family, three children. I now have seven grandchildren. And I'm up here I'm not getting paid a penny to do what I'm doing. I'm just telling you something that may be of importance to our county. And this is what I'm thinking about. I've been an appraiser for over 50 years in Ocean County. I appraised over 5,000 commercial properties in Ocean County, some even for members of your Board. So, I was a Commissioner in Toms River also in the Parking Authority. I was also State Director of our appraisal association. I was partners with a guy down in Union Township, if you remember that, it's now Barnegat Township, Rick Hall. And I started my own business in 1977, '78. There's a property now that popped up and became available for sale and I felt as though this property may be a real benefit to people in Ocean County. The map I gave you showed two areas in the county. I have them marked. One, of course, LBI, which stands for Long Beach Township. And we also have another island that was started in 1925 when they finished the canal called Barnegat Beach Island, BBI, but it's never been identified very much for different reasons I didn't know about. But as you come over the Seaside Bridge, on the (Route) 37 bridge, heading eastbound, towards Seaside Heights, there's a property now that is available for sale. The property is a two-story building. It's around 2,400 square feet. The original building that was on the property was knocked down after Superstorm Sandy. This property was rebuilt. It's raised up off the ground on pilings to support it. The building itself is approximately, I guess, 10 years old. It's around 26,000...oh the lot. The lot is around 26,000 square feet. It's on the bay. As you come over the top of that bridge and you look down as you're heading down the ramp or the bridge, you'll see the property on the right-hand side. A view that there's no obstruction as far as that property is concerned. It has a large wall on one side that could be made for a sign. Some kind of a sign that could change. The parade. Maybe they're having a parade in Seaside Heights or they're having something up in Point Pleasant or they're having something down in the park. This is a picture of the building. I'm just going to show you if you haven't seen it. Of course, we have other pictures of it, and I felt as though this building would be a real benefit to the people of Ocean County.

Now, part of the things that got sparked about it is the fact that since I was a State Director of our association I would hear from a lot of other appraisers and they would say to me, 'Why doesn't Ocean County have a visitor's

center? Why?' We have one going into Ocean City. It's beautiful. We have one going into Cape May providing commerce to the people that are there. They have one going into Wildwood. What we have is a sign, a banner every once in a while, that goes up, but we don't have a place that's special, that allows people to come and find out about what Ocean County is about. The building is large enough also to have...you could have an environmental center in the building. If you look out the back windows at night, you'll see the lighthouse pop on. It is absolutely beautiful. It will have over 390 foot of frontage on the highway. There's eight on-site parking spots with the availability to put another eight to ten on the other side which they never completed, and I felt as though it'd be a real benefit for everyone in Ocean County to have their own visitor's center. As a matter of fact, you could also turn around maybe even to call it, you know, another special name from one of the Commissioners. Thank you very much for listening to me."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You're welcome. Thank you. Thank you for taking the time."

ROBERT GILLIS: "Boy, I have to bring Rich on all my sales calls because he's better than I am. But anyway, my name is Robert Gillis and I'm with the firm of Bielat, Santore & Company. I'm a commercial real estate agent and I have the property listed that Rich was just talking about. I don't think with all these people that it's the proper forum for me to give you a full sales pitch, but I would like to have the opportunity to present the information to you maybe via email or whatever. And I think the usage that Rich has mentioned is perfect. The location at the base of the bridge could not be a more perfect location for this promotional type of usage. The property itself is zoned residential. It's now a nautical-themed commercial store so I think that there's a kind of ambiguity as to its usage. My idea was to call both the municipality, the county and the state to offer this property for some kind of usage and Rich happened to call me. We thought it would be a great opportunity. So, I have sent some information, Mr. Quinn, via email. So, maybe I can...I had printed out additional information as well that I could provide to all the Commissioners for your consideration."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I would suggest that you also deal directly with the County Administrator who deals with all five of the Commissioners. You can certainly also talk with Commissioner Quinn. He's quite capable. But in order to get the information to all of us I would go through the County Administrator. It's his job to communicate with all of us."

ROBERT GILLIS: "Great. I'd love the opportunity."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "So, if you could just wait around until the end of the meeting. I don't have a card on me but I'll give you my email address and phone number and if you can send me whatever information you have."

ROBERT GILLIS: "Great. Thank you for your consideration."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You're welcome. Thank you for coming. Anyone else? Yes, ma'am."

REGINA DISCENZA, FORKED RIVER: "As a Navy mom I would like to say that I appreciate the prayer before each meeting for our military. All their jobs are very difficult, and many are separated from their families for long periods of time. It's much appreciated.

The agenda today seems quite a bit longer than the one that was handed out last week. So, I'd like to ask if it went from four to seven pages do you really get that many items to add in a week's time?"

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Director, maybe I'll offer some information."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Yes, please go ahead."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "So, as you know, because I believe you're in attendance, we do have a Preboard meeting a week earlier than this meeting."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Yes."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Most of the items that you will find on the agenda at Preboard have been submitted by the individual departments through their Commissioner Liaisons and they are added to the agenda. If you were there, and I can't remember if it's a closed session or not, John (Ernst), I don't believe it is, but when the Engineer does his report..."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Yes."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "...he has his own engineer's agenda which may have upwards of 20 to 30 items on it. Those items are then added to this agenda afterwards with the permission of the Board. So, that's why you're seeing the expansion from that Wednesday to this Wednesday because it's all the engineer items that come on the agenda."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Oh, okay."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "We don't, as a matter of practice, add, unless it's an emergency situation, other items to the agenda without it first appearing on Preboard."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Alright, because I thought it was a very short agenda."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Yes. And as you heard Commissioner Kelly state earlier, John (Ernst) had about 20 traffic improvements that were put on so right there you have another 20 items. But those are the only items that appear between Preboard and Board."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Okay. So, I was at the last public meeting two weeks ago of March 6th and tonight, or this evening I also heard Mr. Sadeghi had to abstain on several items. And I don't know if it's already been asked but since he's new could we get an explanation on the reasons for all the abstentions? Possibly? Because I don't know you that well as I know most of the other Commissioners."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "If you could submit something to Mike Fiure I'll give you a detailed list of...there are certain towns that I'm involved in that I abstain on anything that has to do with those towns."

REGINA DISCENZA: "I see. Okay. So, it's by locality more than anything."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Yes."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Okay, that's..."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Manchester Township is one, Plumsted."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Okay, that's what I was interested in knowing. Locality is fine. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Is there anyone else from the public that would like to speak tonight? Okay. Yes sir, I'm sorry. Good evening, sir."

JOHN FIORE, BRANT BEACH, LONG BEACH TOWNSHIP, LONG BEACH ISLAND: "I was here several months ago and we got to meet all of you and I appreciate the time you gave us then. I represent the Joint Council of Taxpayers. We have over 10,000 members. We have over 5,000 that pay dues and we're an active group on the island. When I came last time, we talked about EMS services and the need to support those services. At that time, you told me about things you were doing. Tonight, we have a little different. And I just want to say with all the things the county has to do one of things that I heard tonight was if you want to get the job done don't go to the government, don't go to Washington, don't go to Trenton, come here. We have a problem in Trenton. The problem affects all of us that have anything to do with waterways. I can't speak for the northern bays, but I can tell you from Barnegat Light South, we don't have any more channel markers. The channel markers, the red squares and the green triangles that are on poles that lead into the sub-channels that come off the main channels haven't been replaced so it's a guessing game. If you're an experienced boater and you know where the channels used to be you could probably get around. If you don't, you're going to run aground. It's become a serious problem. It's been both a safety and an environmental problem where we've had boats run aground and those problems, we know what they lead to. Unsafety is obvious if the boats traveling fast enough.

We've contacted the state because it, by the way, comes out of Ocean County, out of Forked River. The boats that take these markers to put them out there, the boats are gone. They weren't budgeted for. So, now the state is telling us that without the budget they can't get the boats back. They can't hire the people to go on the boats so we're going to do without these channel markers. Now, there are some. I'm not saying its 100%, but the channel markers get put in sometime in July, if they get put in, and they're very, very scarce. The more serious channels that have had a problem we've actually had accidents because you don't know left and right. You don't know port and starboard. I haven't been a boater for 10 years. I've been out on boats during those 10 years, but I was a boater for 40 years before that. So, I get the importance of these markers. We have one person that's leading our efforts. She's from Randolph, New Jersey. She's a Commissioner now. She's been mayor there twice. She also is on a new league program for the state and she's going to be rallying us to get the entire coastline of New Jersey behind this effort. We've written to our local government, our local representatives here that are in Toms River for the state and they're behind this. It's the environmental, the state environmental department that we have to wake up.

I would like to provide you with the information that we have so that you know what direction we're going to be moving in and if the county can look at it and say... if you back us is what I'm asking for, support us. I think that would help. But we have to figure out how we're going to take this. I think it's a billion-dollar industry. I don't know that number. It's a multi-hundred-million-dollar industry, marine industry, in New Jersey, and Ocean County is a big part of it, of that industry. We've got to get these markers back in place."

DIRECTOR CREA: "I'm listening to what you're saying because I got a phone call not too long ago about a marker and we did some, didn't we not, do some research on how to get the markers in. So, we may have some information for you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "If I could, when it comes to what you're talking about, John, because I do boat. I have a boat. I do go out in the Barnegat Bay quite a bit, out in the ocean a lot. And I live in Forked River, and I'm so used to driving down the river and seeing those boats at the end of the river down by the state marina, but I did not know that they had taken them away. Because that's not only a concern to me when it comes to the triangular markers but even a lot of those buoys that are out going across to the channel into the inlet, they shift."

JOHN FIORE: "They do."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "And if those things aren't readjusted based on the depth of the channel it's going to create even more serious problems because those boats going across the bay, they're flying. I mean, they're not traveling any speed and that water can go from 12 feet in the channel to 6 or 8 inches if you get outside that channel. So, to me the ambulance issue is a top priority to me and that's something I'm really concerned about. This is just as important because they're going to need those ambulances to be transporting because you're going to see a lot of very serious accidents going forward. If I understand you want us to come up with a resolution or something to show our support which is..."

JOHN FIORE: "Correct. And I'll get you all the information, so you'll see what we're doing, who we've reached out to, and what their response has been."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "By all means. Yeah, yeah. I mean I'm speaking on my behalf but I'm sure the whole Board will probably be on the same page."

DIRECTOR CREA: "I'm a boater too."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "You know we would definitely be interested."

JOHN FIORE: "We did do the research and it starts with the Army Corps of Engineers and the Coast Guard. The primary channel is their business."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Right. Right."

JOHN FIORE: "It's the state's business to put the markers out. I live on the bay in Brant Beach. The boat was there this week putting in the sub-buoys, not the main buoys but the sub-buoys for the branch but no stick buoys we call them or stick markers. They don't take them out necessarily. They used to take them out years ago. They leave them there. Well, you know what happens when the ice comes. The ice moves and takes it with them. Well, now you're buying a new product. You have to put a product back out there plus the old product is half in the water and half out. So, there's a lot of issues but it starts with if you don't have the equipment and you don't have the personnel it's not going to happen."

DIRECTOR CREA: "It's not going to work."

JOHN FIORE: "And by the way it's not just our bay. It goes all the way around into the Delaware River. So, they have the same problem there. But, we're not going to get involved in that. We're going to focus on the East Coast."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Can I ask you just one question?"

JOHN FIORE: "Sure."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Because I did hear you say that you did speak with state representatives. Was that Senator Amato?"

JOHN FIORE: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "The new senator that was just elected?"

JOHN FIORE: "And we have a letter from him supporting this and sending it to the state saying that they are in support of our issues being addressed to the environmental department in the state. And I'll include that in the information that we're going to send you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Okay, very good."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "But, John if you're talking about waking up DEP, I think you're going to need more than the Board of Commissioners in Ocean County. You need the Giants. You've got to recruit the Eagles and the Jets to tackle DEP. I mean, they're in..."

JOHN FIORE: "I understand exactly what you're talking about. Trust me, I do."

DIRECTOR CREA: "If you could get it down to the Administrator we'd appreciate it."

JOHN FIORE: "Yes."

ADMINISTRATOR FIURE: "Before you leave."

JOHN FIORE: "We share confusion of names."

DIRECTOR CREA: "I understand that. I heard that."

JOHN FIORE: "Alright, well thank you very much."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You didn't have to ask him how to spell it."

JOHN FIORE: "Well, that was my original spelling. I really want to thank you. The things that I heard tonight, for instance. I've been here to a few meetings and the number of people, unfortunately, that are retiring, that have been here for a long time, speaks volumes of this county."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

JOHN FIORE: "So, thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you, John."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you. We appreciate that. Is there anyone else? Okay, seeing no other hands. That's it?"

There being no additional comments received, Director Crea called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:04 PM.

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey proposes a \$20 million cut to 18 county colleges throughout New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County College could see a \$1,211,866 reduction in state aid for the 2024-2025 school year; and

WHEREAS, such a substantial cut would severely hamper OCC's ability to serve its student body effectively and provide accessible education and vital support services to all students; and

WHEREAS, such a reduction in aid could lead to higher tuition costs and place a greater financial burden on students; and

WHEREAS, the college could be forced to cut some vital programs and student support services, leaving students with fewer resources and opportunities to thrive; and

WHEREAS, job losses among faculty and staff could occur, leading to larger class sizes, decreased student-faculty interaction, and diminished academic support; and

WHEREAS, funding for Ocean County College, the first community college to open in the state of New Jersey is derived from student tuition, an appropriation from the Ocean County Board of Commissioners and the state of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners is expected to appropriate more than \$18 million to Ocean County College in 2024; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey only provides about 20 percent of the funding for community colleges even before this additional decrease, putting it among the top five most underfunded systems in the nation. The State of New Jersey has never met its funding obligation to Ocean County College.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY strongly urges Governor Murphy and the state Legislature reconsider the proposed reductions to the state's vital community colleges and move toward providing the full 20 percent of the funding as continued support and investment in higher education are crucial.

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has proposed over \$100 million in school aid cuts to districts throughout New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, many Ocean County school districts have once again had their state aid reduced by the state Department of Education for the 2024-25 school year; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County school systems could see a combined reduction of over \$17 million dollars; and

WHEREAS, the current school funding formula unfairly treats suburban school districts while favoring urban districts; and

WHEREAS, changes in school operations have also resulted in operational costs not factored into the current school funding formula such as school security; and

WHEREAS, seventeen (17) out of twenty-nine (29) public school districts in Ocean County will see their state aid reduced in the coming year; and

WHEREAS, some of the largest reductions impact Jackson Township, which will lose \$4,459,769; Lacey Township, which will lose \$3,205,902; Toms River Regional Schools, which will lose \$2,798,243; Pinelands Regional, which will lose \$1,980,813; Barnegat Township schools, which will lose \$1,964,903; and Little Egg Harbor schools, which will lose \$1,562,692; and

WHEREAS, these cuts will negatively impact both the education of our students and the amount of local money taxpayers will be asked to pay for schools in the coming year; and

WHEREAS, these 17 impacted school districts may be forced to cut important educational and extracurricular programs due to a lack of funds; and

WHEREAS, the State has created an atmosphere of volatility and unpredictability for the school districts, students and taxpayers of Ocean County.






