

IMPORTANT! ATTENTION VOTERS! NEW IN-PERSON-EARLY VOTING IS AN OPTION - STARTS SAT. OCT 23 THRU SUN. OCT 31

As a result of legislation enacted into law this year the State of New Jersey will be offering in-person early voting on a machine during a nine day period. In addition to providing early voting, registered voters will continue to have the option of voting by mail or in-person at their polling place on Election Day. Below is a sample copy of the ballot that will appear on the new voting machines at the 10 early voting sites throughout Ocean County. New electronic poll books will be used to sign-in voters. Poll workers will be available to assist all voters in using these new devices. The early voting locations are listed below. Hours for early voting are Monday-Saturday, 10am to 8pm and Sunday 10am to 6pm. It doesn't matter where you live in Ocean County - registered voters can go to any of the 10 sites and conveniently cast your ballot on a voting machine.

<p>CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO PERMIT WAGERING ON ALL COLLEGE SPORT OR ATHLETIC EVENTS</p> <p>Do you approve amending the Constitution to permit wagering through casinos and current or former horse racetracks on all college sport or athletic events?</p> <p>Currently, wagering is prohibited on college sport or athletic events that take place in New Jersey. Wagering is also prohibited on an event in which a team from a New Jersey college participates.</p> <p>INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p>Currently, the State Constitution prohibits wagering on college sport or athletic events taking place in New Jersey. It also prohibits wagering on an event in which a New Jersey college team participates. This amendment would allow the Legislature to pass laws permitting wagering on any college sport or athletic event. It would permit wagering even if a New Jersey college team participates in the competition. Such wagering would be permitted only through casinos and current or former horse racetracks.</p>	<p>CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ALLOW CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS AUTHORIZED TO CONDUCT GAMES OF CHANCE TO USE PROCEEDS FROM THOSE GAMES TO SUPPORT THE ORGANIZATION</p> <p>Do you approve amending the Constitution to permit all groups that are allowed to conduct bingo or raffles to use the net proceeds from those games to support their groups?</p> <p>Currently, only veterans and senior citizen groups may use the net proceeds from those games to support their groups. All other groups that are permitted to conduct bingo or raffles may only use the proceeds from those games for certain purposes. They are not permitted to use those proceeds to support their groups. The amendment would allow the other groups that conduct bingo or raffles to use the proceeds to support their groups as well.</p> <p>INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT</p> <p>The Constitution permits certain groups to conduct games of chance such as bingo or raffles. Those groups are veterans, charitable, educational, religious, fraternal, civic, and senior citizen groups; volunteer fire companies; and first-aid or rescue squads. The net proceeds from those games of chance may only be used for educational, charitable, patriotic, religious or public-spirited uses. However, veterans and senior citizen groups may also use the proceeds from those games to support their groups. This amendment would permit all of the groups authorized to conduct games of chance to use the net proceeds from conducting bingo or raffles to support their groups.</p>

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS TO EARLY VOTERS:

1. Insert the voter card provided to you from the poll worker to activate the screen on the monitor. To make the selection of your candidate choice press the box containing that choice; the oval to the right of your choice will fill in black.
2. To change a selection press the box marked with your choice to deselect. The filled in black oval will be removed and you may make a new selection.
3. If you wish to cast a write-in vote go to the **PERSONAL CHOICE** column and press the box within the office containing the word **WRITE-IN**. Using the keyboard displayed, type the name of the person you wish to write-in, one letter at a time. To make a correction, press the **DELETE** or **CLEAR ALL** button and re-enter your write-in choice. Once you are satisfied with your write-in choice, press the **CONFIRM** button to record and display your choice. Verify your write-in choice is in the correct contest. Repeat this step for any contests you would like to cast a write-in personal choice.
4. Press the **NEXT** button located at the bottom right corner of the screen to view the other side of the ballot and vote on the public questions. Press the box containing "YES" or "NO" to vote on the public questions; the oval to the right of your choice will fill in black.
5. After ALL selections have been made press the **REVIEW** button located at the bottom right corner of the screen. Take this opportunity to complete a final review of your selections. If you would like to make a correction press the **BACK TO BALLOT** button located at the bottom left corner of the screen to return to the ballot and change your selections. If you are satisfied with your selections, press the **PRINT** button at the bottom right corner of the screen. Press the **PRINT YOUR BALLOT** button to print your ballot.
6. You must wait until the printer has completed printing both sides of your ballot (paper must pass thru printer twice) before removing ballot from the printer.
7. Remove your voter card and retrieve your ballot from the printer. Take the printed ballot to the voting tabulator for scanning and return the voter card to the poll worker.
