The Organization Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean was called to order on January 4, 2023 at 3:30 PM, Room 119, Ocean County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey by the Temporary Chairwoman, Clerk of the Board, Michelle I. C. STATEMENT OF DETERMINATION

CLERK GUNTHER: "The first order of business today is the Statement of Determination for the 2022 General Election which was held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022 and invite Ocean County Clerk, Scott Colabella and Chairman of the Board of Canvassers, George Gilmore to come forward and present the Certification."

1. Statement of Determination for the 2022 General Election held on November 8, 2022 from Ocean County Clerk, Scott M. Colabella and George R. Gilmore, Chairman of the Board of Canvassers.

SCOTT COLABELLA, OCEAN COUNTY CLERK: "Happy New Year everyone!"

GEORGE GILMORE, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF CANVASSERS: "Happy New Year, Scott, and everyone else!"

SCOTT COLABELLA: "So we've done this a few times, Jack and I. I've lost count. But in any event, it never gets old and it's always an honor and a privilege. And I'm sure the Commissioners always agree what a great day this is as we start a new year and see so many familiar faces.

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "We're going to do one at a time."

CLERK GUNTHER: "I apologize."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I'm going to invite my son and daughter up here to hold the bible for me. It's only fair that Jimmy comes here today with me because I was at Eagleswood School Board Meeting last night to see Jimmy get sworn in."

Jimmy and Dawn Marie join Commissioner Kelly for the Oath of Office.

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you so much, Jack. Thank you all for being here today. I really appreciate it. It's a big crowd.

We had a great election last November with the Sheriff who was the top vote getter. Ginny and I each received just over 70% of the vote. And where were you? At 74%? Show off! (laughter)

We had a great election. And I give that to the people of this county who said to us, we appreciate the efforts that you give every day. I wish that the Congress of the United States would understand that they have a duty to do and do their duty. And if you can't elect a Speaker of the House, I don't know how you're going to get anything done this year. (applause) So what is happening down in Washington, D.C. is an affront to all of us. And it is tarnishing the brand of the Republican Party.

In a few minutes we will elect a new Director for this year. Now I was the Director in 2022. And what you will find is that I will nominate Joe Vicari to be the Director for 2023. It is something that this Board comes together to do to run our county in the best way we can. We promise you that we're going to work hard for all the people of this county, not just the Republicans and Independents that voted for us, but every single person that calls Ocean County home. We will work in their best interests.

Thank you all and that's my two minute speech because that's all I ever do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "The first order of business is to nominate the Deputy Director that will serve with me for the year 2023. I open up nominations from the floor."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Director, it would be my honor to nominate Gary Quinn as the Deputy Director for the year 2023."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "And it is my honor to second the nomination of Gary Quinn to be Deputy Director of the County of Ocean."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any other nominations? Seeing no other nominations, I move to close nominations. Roll call please."

On motion duly made by Commissioner Crea, seconded by Commissioner Haines, Commissioner Quinn was nominated to the position of Deputy Director for the year 2023."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I would like to say congratulations to Commissioner Gary Quinn who will serve as Deputy Director for the year 2023 and I look forward to working with you. So passage unanimously. Five 'yes' votes."

CLERK GUNTHER: "We will note that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the nomination for Deputy Director."

H. COMMENTS FROM THE DIRECTOR

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will now as Director, the first official thing I will do is ask everyone to turn their nameplates over. Make sure it's the right one. If it's correct, I will continue with the rest of the meeting.

Okay, the first order of business is a few comments I'm going to make serving you as Director of the Board for 2023. First of all, Happy New Year for this year, 2023! It's going to be a very challenging new year. I appreciate you voting for me and giving me an opportunity to represent the Board. And the first thing that we do is to serve the people of Ocean County. For those who voted, for those who did not vote, I think it's very important to have the correct image of trust and loyalty to the people that we serve.

I also want to thank those on the professional staff and the employees. Many times we thank the professional staff,

but it's the rank and file, the entry-level workers that are here several years coming out during storms, working during COVID-19. And they are there 24/7. The County of Ocean never closes. We're always here to serve the people of Ocean County.

Ocean County is very unique. It's 10% of the entire size of the State of New Jersey. We are number 5 in population – 670,000 people in the winter. Summertime – it's 1.3 million people. And we work hard together to make sure we provide the services that are so necessary and so important.

One of my main goals this year is of course to produce results. There's always one thing we do - it's not just access to government - it's getting people results. And we're here not only to work together as a team, but also we have great leadership in Ocean County. It's the best place to live, to work and retire.

I also want to thank our Chairman, George Gilmore who is here today, who lead Ocean County in not only this campaign, in many campaigns. And also is considered one of the strongest Republican Organizations not only in the State of New Jersey, but in the United States. And George Gilmore is Chairman of the Election Board. We want to thank you for doing a fantastic job, for pulling us together. You have four Legislative Districts and five Commissioners plus three members of the Constitutional Officers and you do a great job. The main thing is not just being Republicans and following Republican policies, but it's also doing something else, it's putting the people first.

So whether it's the Roads, the Parks, Senior Services, the Veterans, the College, the Vocational School – we deliver results. You look at any one of our departments, any liaisonships that we have, we do the very, very best as possible. And I use the word results because as a lifelong educator – since I got into education in the 1960's – I can appreciate the need for measurable results. We do things for the people of Ocean County that you could measure, that you know exist. We set our goals. We set our goals very, very high. We have people that work hard. We have excellent department heads. But the residents of Ocean County can look to this Board for the best results possible. If you come to our public meetings, and I wish more people would come, you would see there are very few complaints about our services. And when there are, we welcome them. We want to hear about the things that you like in government and things that you don't like and the things that we can improve. We know things are changing rapidly. As you turn on the TV and you see what is taking place in government you see a lot of unrest that's taking place. Well, today you are not going to see that. You're going to see a Board that works together with one common goal.

For another year – 7 years straight – we have continuously reduced the tax rate. Remember not to far ago, looking back Superstorm Sandy devastated Ocean County. We had to rebuild. We built back stronger, better and more resilient. And we're going back to the way that we were at one time.

But there are certain programs that are extremely very, very important to us. For an example, Home Delivered Meals on Wheels. There are many senior citizens that cannot afford to feed themselves. One day in the hospital or a nursing home – we can feed a senior citizen for one full year. Our goal is to keep them out of the nursing homes, to keep them out of hospitals, to give them food that is nutritional, and we work hard with that. Recently we just got a grant last week to purchase five new vehicles to deliver food to our senior citizens. Remember we are 10% of the State of New Jersey and it's very, very difficult. Our senior citizens are no longer 70 or 75, 85, 90, 100, 105! Last week we had one 108 years old! Those programs are very, very important to us.

We also have the largest number of veterans in the entire State of New Jersey – some World War II, some Korea, that are getting old – and we want to make sure we give them everything that's totally necessary for them. We continuously petition the State of New Jersey to increase our aid that are coming in here to different departments that are very, very important.

We're building right now as we speak and it's going to be ready in the next several months, a new building at 1027 Hooper Avenue. It will consolidate services. So when you come in it's a one-stop area where we solve problems whether it be Senior Services, Veterans, Consumer Affairs, or Human Services all located in one central place. And what's been happening is that the needs of the people have expanded. And as they expand we want to make sure our building expands and that's in the process of doing so and in the next six or seven months it will be opened. And again, it's results, so the employees that work for us can deliver services better, so the people that come in and have a problem we can serve better, and we do produce those results.

Fortunately for us we have several sites. One in Manahawkin and one in Lakewood, of course the County Connection, where we have these centralized services so people can come and talk to a person. We found out that people want to talk to someone. They don't want to use a computer. They want to see someone face-to-face. They want that personal relationship. They want that networking and we have continued to do so. Technology is good. Technology has its place. But sometimes the population like Ocean County when you have 200,000 senior citizens and many caregivers it's not possible. So we understand what's taking place. So we want to do it in two ways. We want to have an outstanding computer program and online program and we also want to maintain the services that we've had for years.

The lifeblood of Ocean County, and we're very fortunate to have 44 miles of coastline, is tourism and small businesses. Do you realize it's \$7 billion a year just in Ocean County? 98% of all those businesses are small businesses. The American Dream! Small businesses where two or three people get together – mostly families – and they say you know something? We believe in the free market system. We believe in capitalism. And we want to start a business. Virtually every business that was destroyed in the Superstorm (Sandy) has opened up bigger and better and more resilient. The number of people coming to Ocean County from all over not only New Jersey, from the United

States, has increased substantially. Why? Because they want to come to Ocean County. They have good memories and they get value. 44 miles of the best coastline you'll find any place in the United States – very, very important.

And I think that's one thing that I have learned being a teacher for many years. When I graduated college in Jersey City - St. Peter's College, a Jesuit institution - was you have to give something back. The human values. There are certain things that are very, very important. And one of the things that I've found being a teacher for many years is you have to listen to the people. And when a person comes before this Board we don't say are you Democrat or Republican or an Independent or if you believe in this government. There are more and more people who are falling away, and especially younger people, which we try to get more people into different political organizations and volunteers to become part of the process. And sometimes I think we're losing that. And sometimes I think that we have to do more than to listen and to perform something and that's why the services that we perform are very, very important. And again, what do we give? It's always one thing, the word is results. People want results. We don't point the finger to someplace else and say 'Well, it's not our job. It's not our agency. It's the State of New Jersey or someplace else.' People no longer want to hear that.

At this time there are several needs that I think we need more help from the state and federal government on. And that is also things such as more assistance for our senior citizens. It's getting to a point where it's getting very difficult to provide the resources for our seniors. We need more money from the state and federal government for our beaches, for Barnegat Bay, and surrounding wetlands and to provide a reasonable program to protect our wetlands – very, very important.

One of the things I've learned, coming from a different part of the State of New Jersey and I learned basically from my dad, second generation. I'm second generation in the United States. He was first. He served in World War II – 100% disabled – fought in the Battle of the Bulge, was one key word he always said and I remember the day I took office, is humility. Always be humble. Always be humble. It doesn't make any difference how much money you have in your bank account or how much money you have or what position you hold, it's being humble. And many times we had many discussions with other people. The biggest problem that you have sometimes with what's taking place on TV and I was talking to several Commissioners today, is hubris. It gets clouded in a way of people that should do the job and should do the job the best way possible. By this Board, working together, and I will do my best to do so, the whole is greater than the sum of its parts and it's very, very important and that's what we should do.

You know growing up in a different part of the state and being eventually a history teacher, there were several people that I listened to – Presidents of the United States. At that time we respected Presidents. When I was too small to vote or really to know what was going on and I would listen to the policies of Eisenhower. When I was in grammar school I remember John F. Kennedy. And one person I think most of us here would say did an outstanding job and one of the best Presidents of the United States was Ronald Reagan. A traditional Republican, believed in America, believed in America working hard, thinking, being independent and those are things that are very, very important. Those are things sometimes I think back and say you know something? What would they do if they were in this position?

There's one quote that I have in my office and in my house by a great President, did a great deal for the United States, saved the world in World War II – Chief of Staff of the American invasion forces – Dwight D. Eisenhower. He said something that was very, very important. 'If a political party does not have its foundation in the determination to advance a cause that is right and that is moral, then it is not a political party; it is merely a conspiracy to seize power.'

That's what I'm going to end with, with that quote. I think if you think about it, it makes a lot of sense. I think that's what we're all here for. Not to seize power, but to serve the people that we represent, to continue to make Ocean County the best place to live, to work and retire not just for ourselves, not just for our children, but for our grandchildren. Thank you very much for attending today. We appreciate it. It's a great honor for me to serve you not only for another year but also as Director of the Board of Commissioners. Thank you very much and God bless you and your family. Thank you."

I. COMMENTS FROM THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Comments from the Deputy Director."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Good afternoon everyone. And thank you Director, you did a great speech. He told me I have a five minute rule so we'll make this a little bit quicker.

But let me just start out by thanking Reverend Occhipinti and Rabbi Heineman for being here today. We truly appreciate it. And every year you take time out of your busy schedules to come here and do the benediction, do the opening prayer, and we truly do appreciate that.

I want to congratulate Commissioner Haines over here and Commissioner Kelly on their re-election because I've been here for a few years now and I've had the opportunity to work with both of these people and they truly have their heart and soul working for the people of Ocean County and I couldn't be happier to see them return to this Board and have the ability to work with them again moving forward into the coming year.

I also want to recognize somebody that as Commissioner Haines said was elected in November, just like the two of them were, who likes to fly under the radar and not have any real ceremonial things in the public and if you would stand up for a minute Sheriff Mastronardy. (applause) And I know I'm going to get in trouble for that. He'll be

texting me at three o'clock in the morning tonight just to wake me up. But the Sheriff was sworn in yesterday in a private ceremony and he is with us again for a few more years which I couldn't be happier. You are probably the greatest Sheriff in the entire country and you have done so much for the people of Ocean County. I look forward to working with you and continue to build on what we built on the last couple of years.

Director Vicari, congratulations on becoming the Director of the Board. I've been here when you've been Director. You certainly do a great job."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "You're a little long-winded sometimes, Joe, but we'll get past that. You know Joe is very articulate and likes to really take and make people aware of what Ocean County is and that's very important because we do have an outstanding county here. We're all very proud of it and we're all here working as hard as we can to continue to make it better. And I know, Joe, as Director, you are going to continue to do that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "I also want to thank, moving forward, the rest of the people sitting up on this dais. Commissioner Crea over there, you know, number one you are my running mate. We've done so much together and I certainly can't thank you enough. Over on the end there Michelle, Clerk of the Board, Michelle keeps us in order and makes sure that everything is done right — that we're following the rules as we go through the process. Of course our Counsel, Jack Sahradnik, who has been with us many years and he's got more knowledge than anybody I think when it comes to government in Ocean County. And of course Mike over here, our Administrator, and TJ sitting out in the audience who really are...these people are the nucleus of what this whole thing is all about. You know we get a lot of recognition, we do a lot of stuff and get recognized for it, but there are so many people behind the scenes that really take and make this county what it is.

In the audience today we've got a tremendous amount of elected officials and I promise you I'm not reading off the list so if anyone is missed it's on Joe. But in the last couple days we've been to a lot of reorganization meetings throughout the county and at the end of the day we are all elected by the people in this county to do a job. And I know each and every one of the people that are elected in the organization really put their heart and soul into it. And I couldn't be more proud of everybody. We all just have to always remember we are all part of the same team whether we're, you know, some towns are...well, for the most part its mostly Republican, but Democrat, Republican...we all represent every single voter in Ocean County – every single person that lives in this county – and we always have to make that the number one priority because people come to Ocean County because of the great things that we offer. And whether you are a municipal leader, whether you are a mayor, whatever your position is, always keep that in mind that we have to do everything we can to continue to let people enjoy the quality of life that they all came down here for because it's very, very important.

I know I said it at the last meeting as far as, and I just said it again, as far as us looking good – it's really truly because of the people whether you are a municipal official, whether you are a county official, or state official, whatever it is – the people on our teams at any level of government are the ones that really make everything work. We don't have a magic wand to make things work on a daily basis. We have people that work for us – our directors, our staff – everybody from the top all the way down. I don't care what the person does – whether you are out there on grounds, whether you are in the administration building – every single person that works for us does an outstanding job and that's what truly makes this government in Ocean County run as well as it does and I can't be more proud to be part of the overall organization. I've had the opportunity to sit up here now for a couple of years and I certainly have enjoyed it.

So I just want to really end it by telling everybody to try to consider the fact that we are all here as public servants. Do what we have to do, you know, continue to work as hard as we can. And at the same time I want to wish everybody a very Happy New Year! A prosperous new year. And hopefully for all of our sakes, a very healthy new year. But I truly appreciate everyone coming out today and look forward to working with the rest of the team up here over the next twelve months and really accomplishing a lot just like we have in the past. Thank you very much Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. I would like to thank personally Gary Quinn, Commissioner, Deputy Director, for working with me for 2023. I think we work extremely not only well together, but we come out with solving problems and putting the interests of the people of Ocean County first."

J. COMMENTS FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Next I would like to really thank Jack Kelly, former Director, for doing an outstanding job in 2022. He put a lot of time into it. He put a lot of effort into it. He had a terrible loss as you probably know of losing his wife and it was very difficult. He had a very difficult time. Jack has not only been a friend, but he's the second senior member of the Board of Commissioners. The wealth of knowledge that he has, knowing the people in his departments, and having the best departments in the State of New Jersey, and making very difficult decisions, and keeping up-to-date with the current policies in the State of New Jersey and the state legislation changes in the criminal justice system. Jack."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you Mr. Director. I look forward to continuing to work with our staff. Ocean

County has 1,800 employees that provide the services that we brag about all the time. We certainly can't do all the work. The work is done by all those and you see many of them around this room today – whether they are maintaining our roads, having senior services, Board of Health issues, Social Services issues, county parks – all those different services provided by the Board of Commissioners. The work is done on a daily basis by those 1,800 people that work for you, the people of Ocean County, and I think they deserve a hand. So if we could just give a hand. (applause)

I look forward to working in the future again with our Comptroller, our County Engineer, our Clerk of the Board, our Attorney, and all of our administrative staff. And I particularly look forward to working with my colleagues on this Board. Thank you so much."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Bobbi Jo Crea, the newest member of the Board."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Ready for me?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Okay. Good afternoon everyone. As most of you know, I just completed my first year as an Ocean County Commissioner and I truly enjoy the work that I do with my colleagues and the departments that I am liaison to and it was quite the experience.

And with the expertise, I'm going to mention a few names so bear with me. With the expertise of Tracy Maksel and her staff of Human Services and Meredith Sheehan with her staff from the Board of Social Services, we've been able to provide assistance to many of the residents in Ocean County in need.

And I'm very proud that Tony Agliata, he's here somewhere in the crowd...there he is! Thank you Tony, the Director of Planning and Solid Waste and along with his staff and the investment of the County Commissioners into our recycling material processing facility, resulting in a profit-share with our municipalities for the first time since 2017. And most of you may have known that if you live in those municipalities.

Also being a member on many boards has given me the opportunity to work with some of the most professional individuals and I'd like to thank all of you and all of the employees of Ocean County for all that you do for our residents. Coming in here and not having the fullest understanding of what the county does on the county-level was an eye opener. And I thank every one of you for taking me under your wing and teaching me how it is all done. And God bless you all for being able to put up with me.

And I also want to say a special thanks to my assistant, Noriko, because she keeps me on time, makes sure I have to be where I have to be, and she's shaking her head because I've now embarrassed her, but that's okay.

In 2023 I look forward to working with my colleagues, making sure that we give you the best services that we possibly can and most importantly, I look forward to working with all of you because you've made me the happiest and most contented person. I drive that Parkway every day and maybe one day you'll have an answer why everybody drives like a nut up that Parkway. And if you don't, I'm so sorry.

And I wish you and all of your family a Happy and a Healthy New Year! God bless you all and God continue to bless America."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Commissioner Crea."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you very much Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Ginny Haines and we're very fortunate to have her on the Board. She is the state and national committeewoman. She served in government for many decades and she can give a different perspective of county government. She gives us a lot of information. Commissioner."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. Good afternoon everyone. I'd like to thank you all very much for joining us here today at the Ocean County Board of Commissioners 2023 Reorganization Meeting. I wish you all a very Happy and Healthy and Prosperous New Year.

I also want to thank Jack Ciattarelli for being here today. It is really special for me that you are able to attend. And a special thanks goes out to my family that is joining me here today. My brother, Bill...everyone knows I am very emotional! My brother, Bill, which you know. Of course my nephew, Grant, who is the son of my sister, Joan Kaplan. Many of you may have remembered Joan. She worked for the Election Board for about 25 years. And his wife, Darlene. They came up and they held the bible. But what many of you don't know, which I'm very proud of, that he is a retired Marine. He was a Gunnery Sergeant in the Marines. And if anyone happened to be going to join the Marines and you happened to be in San Diego around '87 or whatever, he was your drill instructor. And he was a drill instructor for about four years. And even though he went to Camp LeJeune or Paris Island himself and then he ended up being a drill instructor in they say the 'easy place' over in San Diego. But I'm very happy that they were able to be here today as well as many of my friends – John, Pat, Louise and Tom, Tim and Laurel – all of you, that you are able to attend plus many of you that are here today.

To my colleagues on the Board – Jack, Joe, Bobbi Jo and Gary – I look forward to working with each and every one

of you in the new year. Together we will continue to provide the good government for our residents.

Every new year provides us with an opportunity to look back and we have to reflect and to look ahead, to grow and to improve on what we already have. It also gives us a chance to be stronger and better than the year before. I am looking forward to working with the Ocean County departments that I serve as board liaison as we continue to provide the best programs and services to our constituents.

Tens of thousands of our residents and visitors use our parks each year. The staff of the Ocean County Parks Department – I know Mike Mangum is here, our Director and Mary Jane Bavais, Deputy Director are here today – are dedicated to making certain our parks are well-maintained and safe. In addition, our recreation programs offer something for everyone throughout the year.

This year we will continue to grow the Ocean County Natural Lands program and I know Mark Villinger who is in charge of that is right there in the back room, adding new pieces of land. Thank you Berkeley Township because we do an awful lot of land from Berkeley Township to continue our efforts to preserve and protect Ocean County's fragile environment. We continue to look for willing sellers that meet our criteria. With voter approval 25 years ago, this program has helped us preserve almost 30,000 acres in Ocean County. Many don't realize, but 60% is preserved. That includes your federal, state, county and local (land). You may not think so because many people visit the central part of Ocean County, but they don't realize how much really is preserved and we are going to continue to do that. If you go from our farm belt in Plumsted Township to the Forked River Mountains in Lacey Township, our Natural Lands program is a true legacy of this Board and the open space we preserve today will be here long after we are gone. It is something we should all be very proud of.

This year we will continue to support our award-winning Vo-Tech Schools and Ocean County College. Both provide excellent learning experiences in this county. The leadership of both of these schools along with the staff need to be commended as they provide world-class opportunities to our students. This is the future of Ocean County and from what I have seen it is bright because of these educational experiences.

While these are a few of the departments I work with directly as liaison, it goes without saying, that every single one of our departments have a profound impact on our residents – from Roads and Bridges to Public Safety, from Senior Services to Transportation, and from Social Services to Solid Waste Management – each helps to fulfill the mission of this Board.

Since I was first appointed to the Board in 2016 I have done my very best to serve the residents of this great county. Of course, I don't do this alone. I do it with my Board colleagues and the professional staff and hard-working staff that keeps this county moving forward every day. I want to extend my appreciation to our Administrator Mike Fiure, our CFO Julie Tarrant, our Assistant Administrator Tristin Collins – most known as TJ – and all of our department heads and division directors. As was said by my colleagues here, each and every one of you make us look good but if it wasn't for you, this county would not be run as well as it is run.

Being re-elected to this seat is both humbling and a great privilege that I do not take lightly. I know that during these approximately 2,555 days that I have been here, we as a Board have made a collective difference in countless lives of the people of Ocean County. And that is why we are here to serve the public whether they voted for us or not. Once we get here we serve everyone. Serving as an elected Commissioner is truly an honor. An honor to be a small part of this magnificent county. May God bless each and every one of you. May God bless our men and women serving in the military. And may God bless the United State of America. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Anyone else who would like to make a second comment from the Board? Deputy Commissioner."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yes, just briefly. I apologize, Julie. Julie is part of our A team. Julie is the one that manages the money. The one that keeps us with our AAA Bond Rating and truly you do a great job.

The other person that is part of our team and we meet with on a regular basis, all these folks – Mike, TJ and everyone that comes in on a weekly basis – is Rob Greitz who I don't know if he is here."



INTRODUCTION

The New Jersey "Local Fiscal Affairs Law", specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14, as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997, requires that every local unit shall adopt a "Cash Management Plan." This plan lists the GUDPA approved depository banks, any broker/dealers, and the approved investment instruments selected by the local unit's governing body.

In addition, the cash management plan is to be adopted by resolution, usually at the reorganization meeting, or the first meeting of the year and will guide the investment of a local unit's idle cash during periods that it is not needed to meet obligations.

The County of Ocean has a formal Cash Management Plan which was initially adopted on July 6, 1983 and revised on February 4, 1998.

The purpose of the current revision is to modify the procedures currently followed under the current Cash Management Plan to comply with the provisions of P.L. 1997, c.148 as enacted on June 30, 1997.

This new act revises and expands the responsibility of the governing body and the role of the Chief Financial Officer in cash management as well as expanding the range of the allowed investment vehicles used by a local unit to invest its idle cash.

I. GENERAL AUTHORITY

The Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean authorizes the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean to administer the Cash Management Plan in order to deposit and invest the County of Ocean's idle cash pursuant to the stipulations contained in the Cash Management Plan.

II. ELIGIBLE DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS

Eligible depositories for County funds are New Jersey banks or savings and loans specifically approved by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance under the Government Unit Depository Protection Act (GUDPA) and maintain a banking presence in the County of Ocean. Deposits of County funds in institutions other than those covered by GUDPA are prohibited by law.

As part of the County's Cash Management Plan, annually The Board of Commissioners shall adopt a list of the approved depositories for the County (ATTACHMENT A).

RFP - Request for Proposal

While P.L. 1997, c.148 formally exempts banking services and investment purchases from the bidding provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11, all investment and banking services for the County of Ocean may be selected through a Request For Proposal (RFP) process.

When the need for banking and investment services exists, the County Chief Financial Officer may solicit RFP's from the eligible banking and investment institutions.

Upon receipt of the RFP's, the County Chief Financial Officer will then review each proposal. After the review, the County Chief Financial Officer will make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners. If necessary, the County Auditor may be asked to aid in the review process.

Once an investment or banking institution has been selected, the County's Cash Management Plan will be revised and adopted by resolution by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean.

III. **CASH MANAGEMENT POLICY**

It shall be the policy of the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean to adopt the Cash Management Plan by resolution at the annual reorganization meeting or during the year as deemed necessary to reflect changes in laws, depositories, investments or funds.

The Chief Financial Officer for the County of Ocean is directed to invest and deposit funds pursuant to the cash management plan as adopted by resolution of The Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean.

It is the objective of the Cash Management Policy to maximize the investment and interest income earned on idle County funds while providing adequate liquidity to meet the obligations of the County.

Timely Deposit of all County Funds:

As required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15, all monies collected or received from any source by or on behalf of the County or any board or Department thereof shall be paid to the "Treasurer, County of Ocean", who shall deposit all such funds within 48 hours after receipt, to the credit of the County of Ocean in one of the designated legal depositories.

All deposits forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean shall be accompanied by a revenue transmittal form listing cash and individual checks and will include a revenue account to which funds will be credited upon deposit.

Deposits to Interest Bearing Accounts:

It is the explicit policy of the County of Ocean that all funds be deposited into interest bearing accounts except as noted below.

All Departments and/or agencies of the County who collect monies for the County in the normal course of its activities must deposit said monies in an interest bearing account until such time as these monies are turned over to the County Treasurer or designee.

Exceptions to Interest Bearing Account Requirements:

The following types of funds are not required to be placed in Interest Bearing Accounts:

- 1. Petty Cash and Change Funds under \$5,000.00
- 2. Cash drawn from a Federal agency under a letter of credit, which cash is to be paid out within 5 working days to a vendor.
- 3. Amounts derived from the sale of bonds or notes, only to the extent that a specific written opinion of counsel states that the earning of (full) interest would result in the bonds or notes being classified as an arbitrage (not federally tax-exempt) issue pursuant to Federal regulations. To the extent that some interest is allowable, it shall be deposited at such a rate if such a rate is obtainable.

Treasurer's Report:

It shall be the responsibility of the County Treasurer to provide to the Board of Commissioners a Treasurer's Report on a monthly basis which shall detail the following information as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14.e. as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997:

- 1. All investments made or redeemed over the past month;
- 2. Each financial institution holding local unit funds;
- 3. The amount of securities purchased or sold, class or type of securities purchased, book value, earned income, fees incurred, and market value of all investments as of the report date and;
- 4. Other information that may be required by the Board of Commissioners or deemed appropriate by the Chief Financial Officer.

Cash Flow Analysis:

An important part of establishing the County investment program includes detailed study of "cash flow" - when money comes in, when it goes out, and how much cash lies available for how long. Such an analysis provides the information needed to plan a viable investment procedure, including the projected length of time that funds can be invested in order to take full advantage of maturity periods with the highest yields.

Analysis of cash flow will alert the Treasurer to possible rescheduling of payments that will result in extending the life of short term investments. The Treasurer's calendar, compiled by the Division of Local Government Services and the Division of Taxation is an excellent source of specific dates regarding the above information. (1)

Reconciliation of Cash Deposits:

On a monthly basis, the Chief Financial Officer or designee shall forward revenue reports to all departments and agencies of the County of Ocean who collect monies for the County detailing cash deposits made to their revenue accounts.

The individual departments and agencies are required to then reconcile the County's reports to the records maintained by the departments.

A form provided by the Chief Financial Officer will be returned by the department or agency either agreeing with the County's records, or listing any discrepancies to be researched by the Chief Financial Officer or designee.

Bank Reconciliations:

It is the policy of the County of Ocean that all bank statements be reconciled to the County's records when received or within a reasonable time thereafter.

IV. **INVESTMENT POLICY**

The investment objectives of the County of Ocean, listed in order of importance from greatest to least, are as follows:

- 1. The ability of the investment instrument to provide for the security and safety of County funds.
- 2. Liquidity of the investment instrument necessary to provide for County operations and obligations.
- 3. Yield or return on the investment instrument (only after the first two considerations are met).
- 4. Investments requiring the payment of a premium should not be purchased without the written consent of the Chief Financial Officer.

Therefore, with these objectives in mind and in compliance with the allowable investments detailed in N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 as modified by P.L. 1997, c.148, the County Chief Financial Officer will decide on the investment vehicles to be included as approved in the County's Cash Management Plan adopted by resolution by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean and reflected in ATTACHMENT B.

Additionally, the County Chief Financial Officer will select approved investment vehicles to achieve the maximum rate of return while minimizing costs and fees and providing for investment portfolio diversification by spreading idle County funds among a number of these approved investments as listed in ATTACHMENT B.

ATTACHMENT B

Approved Investment Vehicles

Any investment instruments in which the security is not physically held by the County of Ocean shall be covered by a third party custodial agreement which shall provide for the designation of such investment in the name of the County of Ocean and prevent unauthorized use of such investments.

Any investment not purchased and redeemed directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, local government investment fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, shall be purchased and redeemed through the use of a national or State bank located within the State of New Jersey or through a broker dealer, which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967, c.93 (C.49:3-5) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

Securities which may be purchased by the County include:

- 1. Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America. This includes instruments such as Treasury bills, notes and bonds.
- 2. Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase, and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- 3. Bonds, notes or other obligations of New Jersey municipalities, local authorities, including fire districts and school districts of which the County is a part.
- 4. Any other bonds, notes or obligations with maturities not exceeding 397 days, as permitted by the Division of Investments. This includes Certificates of Deposit.
- 5. Local government investment pools, such as New Jersey CLASS, and the New Jersey Asset and Rebate Management Program.

- 7. Government money market mutual funds in compliance with the following conditions:

 - B. Be rated by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization, i.e. Standard & Poors.
 - Have their portfolio limited to U.S. government securities as C. defined in 17 CFR sec. 270.2a7 and repurchase agreements collateralized by such U.S. securities
- 8. Repurchase agreements, 30 day maximum term, (repos) of fully collateralized securities, subject to conditions discussed in detail below:
 - A. Repurchase Agreements collateralized by U.S. Government Obligations, as described in Sections 1 and 2 above.
 - B. Custody of the collateral is transferred to a third party. This means the bank must contract with a trusted third party to hold the collateral to insure that it is not pledged against other investments.
 - C. The maturity of the agreement is not more than 30 days.
 - Underlying securities are purchased through a GUDPA bank. D.
 - E. A master repurchase agreement providing for the custody and security of collateral is executed.

Note: At no time shall investments contrary to the intent of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15, et sequential be allowed.


