H. COMMENTS FROM THE DIRECTOR

COMMISSIONER CREA: "If I can just take a moment please and make some comments.

Good afternoon everyone. It is my honor and pleasure to welcome all of you to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners 2024 organization meeting. Let me first extend my best wishes to all of you as we enter a new and promising year.

I want to thank my colleagues on the Board for giving me this opportunity to serve as the 2024 Director of the Board. It is humbling to receive this kind of support. I look forward to a very productive and successful year, working with all of you seated on this dais.

I'd like to congratulate Frank Sadeghi on being sworn in to his first three year term on the Board. I remember the pride I felt when I raised my right hand and took the oath of office just a few years ago. There is nothing like it. I am certain Frank felt the same.

Commissioner Sadeghi brings with him a wealth of experience and knowledge from both the private sector and public office all of which will benefit the residents of Ocean County.

This Board is successful at providing good government because we work together collectively delivering valuable assistance through our programs and services to our taxpayers. Each of us also serves as liaison to various county departments throughout the year.

Since being elected to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners, I couldn't be more proud of the many accomplishments achieved by the departments I have overseen.

County government or any layer of government for that matter is most beneficial or most crucial when constituents need our help and that help comes in many forms.

Last year I successfully advocated for the establishment of the Homelessness Trust Fund. Not without controversy, it was a topic that had been discussed in the past but didn't come to fruition. I am so very grateful that after much review and consideration, I was able to get this done.

More than 65,000 people in Ocean County are living in poverty and this includes families and children. Ocean County helps countless numbers of people every day through its established social services programs, and yet more needs to be done.

We established the fund because this Board realized that there was a need to help our residents that are struggling. These are single moms and dads, senior citizens, trying to make ends meet, to keep a roof over their heads and food on their tables.

This trust fund provides added financial assistance, so we don't have to rely on just the state or federal programs. This county expects to raise anywhere from \$275,000 to \$390,000 annually. These funds are not the final answer in helping our citizens, but an important first step. I look forward to the day when we can make our first disbursements from the fund directly helping our most vulnerable residents.

Ocean County is also working hard on helping those affected by drug addiction. No one wakes up in the morning saying I want to be a drug addict. Addiction is a terrible disease.

As liaison to the Ocean County Opioid Advisory Council, I have worked closely with our Department of Human Services and other County agencies to make sure the funds distributed from the National Opioid Litigation Resolution against pharmaceutical manufacturers and distributors have the greatest positive impact on our ongoing efforts to address the opioid epidemic.

We are using the money to raise public awareness and to educate, we are working with prevention programs and early intervention, care management and workforce development.

This council is staffed by dedicated workers and volunteers who have set priorities that benefit the men and women in our communities that need it the most.

For all of you in this room today that are residents, you know that Ocean County has some of the most beautiful attributes in the state. From the Atlantic Ocean to the east to our farmlands in the west, our beautiful parks to our open space, this Board has made protecting our environment a priority.

As the commissioner who oversees the county's award winning recycling program run by our Department of Solid Waste, I am aware of the many environmental and financial benefits we provide through the numerous recycling programs and services embraced by our residents and our municipalities.

It's rewarding to me to work with such a department that is innovative and forward thinking always improving traditional programs and finding ways to implement new services that will ultimately protect the environment.

In this past year, my work with the Ocean County Department of Solid Waste Management and its Director Tony Agliata and his staff, resulted in the creation of a new recycling program to properly and safely dispose of boat flares. I am excited and proud to announce that as a result of this new program, Ocean County is the winner of the 2023 Governor's Environmental Excellence Award in the sustainability community category.

Tony, on behalf of the County, thank you very much for your program. And in fact, this is the first time that that award has ever been issued. I applaud Tony and his staff for being recognized by the State of New Jersey for their outstanding efforts.

Moving forward, as Director of this Board my goals are to work with my colleagues on the Board to maintain a stable county tax rate and the county's AAA bond rating. For the last 7 years, the county property tax rate has decreased. I anticipate it will remain stable in 2024 or continue to decrease.

Also our fiscally conservative approach to budgeting will allow us to maintain our AAA bond rating which gives us the ability to save tax dollars while still improving and maintaining the county's infrastructure.

Ocean County is unique in many ways. It is important to me to understand the needs of each community and to be able to provide them with the tools to succeed. It is imperative to me to make certain that through my services on this Board, Ocean County continues to be the best place to live, work, raise a family and retire.

No one works alone. I am fortunate enough to be working with outstanding Commissioners who dedicate their time, energy and experience to benefit the people of Ocean County. Our ability to work together in a professional manner has allowed us to accomplish so much.

Commissioner Quinn, over the past two years, I have had many questions and you are always there to take time with me and answer my questions thoughtfully. I probably will have many more and I thank you for your help.

Commissioner Kelly and I are from the southern part of Ocean County and he and I have known each other for many years. He's a good friend and mentor to me and I appreciate his many years on the Board and his knowledge and experience that he brings to the table.

Commissioner Haines, you have accomplished so much as a public servant, from serving in the State General Assembly, as the Director of the New Jersey Lottery, to being the second woman elected to the Ocean County Board of Commissioners. I'd like to thank you for all you have done and all you continue to do.

Commissioner Sadeghi, I look forward to working with you this year and to see the great things you will accomplish as a member of this Board.

Simply put, I want to thank each of you – your dedication as public officials is second to none.

To repeat what I said earlier we cannot do what we do alone. I would be remiss if I didn't mention the county workforce that is the backbone of our government.

Ocean County has the best senior staff and Department Directors. I'd like to thank you all for your professionalism and your dedication to Ocean County. Without your hard work and efforts we would not be able to accomplish so many of our goals, improving the lives of our residents. And to all the county workers, I extend my appreciation for the work you do every day, for once again I repeat, we cannot do it alone.

Every new year comes with great opportunities. It's a new page for all of us. It's a day to look ahead and embrace the good that surrounds us all – and there is an abundance of it – and also to prepare for all the good we will do. I look forward to working with all of you throughout 2024 making this new year the best ever.

I. COMMENTS FROM THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Now I'd like to take a moment and ask, Deputy Director, do you have any comments to make?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Actually you took all my comments out of context, but just a couple of brief comments

First of all, thank you to everyone that's here today for coming out on this special occasion. It really truly means a lot when we sit up here and look around the room. I think every political person in every single one of our municipalities is here today. So nobody is getting anything done today in their towns, but we do truly appreciate you all being here.

I want to congratulate Commissioner Crea for becoming the Director because she certainly has done a great job on her two years here on the Board. She has been very easy to work with. We're all part of a team up here. We work together. We might not always agree on everything that we deal with, but at the end of the day we make sure that when we come out to this dais we do what we have to do and stay unified. And I think that's the best thing for the County moving forward. We accomplish a lot. We certainly have had great years in the years that I've been here. I think I'm going into my sixth year now and it's really been very rewarding for me. But Bobbi has certainly done a great job and I know leading us as Director this year, she is going to continue to do a fantastic job moving forward. So I congratulate you and thank you for taking the position so I didn't have to take it.

The second thing I want to do is congratulate Commissioner Sadeghi. Frank, it truly is very rewarding to have you on this Board. Joe was a great guy. We miss Joe. And you know 42 years is a long time. He left quite a legacy. But I think like Chairman Gilmore said, it really means a lot. You're new. You're coming in with new ideas. You're a business man and that to me is very important because government is a business. You involved as mayors or council members all know that you have budgets you have to deal with, you have issues you have to deal with on a regular basis, and having a business background is certainly going to be a real asset to you moving forward and I really truly look forward to being able to work together with you and accomplishing great things.

Ocean County is growing drastically. Over the years, it just continues to grow and we're going to continue seeing that. You know, thirty-three municipalities is a lot of towns to oversee and we as Board members up here have to take and realize that we deal with each and every town. Frank, I know you've been through a lot of the towns over the last couple of months and it gets overwhelming sometimes, but the rewards that come back with the feeling that you're able to get out there and help people and make a difference in their towns really is truly very good. And I thank you for, number one, stepping up and deciding to run and number two, for winning because that's even more rewarding."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Commissioner Haines and Commissioner Kelly have been fantastic to work with. I think you'll see the whole Board is a great group of people that really works very well together. And I look forward, Ginny, to continuing to work with you. But we all as a Board, the five of us do a great job, but we couldn't do it without Jack Sahradnik, Michelle, Mike Fiure and the administration that we have here in the county because the administration is really the key. We can make decisions but everything we decide gets put into play by our administration. So thanks to each and every one of you for all that you do. Jack, keeping us out of trouble. That's very important. But it's a team effort and I think everybody sees that from looking in from outside how hard it is sometimes to be able to accomplish everything.

I want to truly wish everybody a very, very Happy New Year, a healthy new year, and certainly a prosperous new year for everybody. But really today is very important to see so many great people here and so many friendly faces whether you're an elected official, whether you're just a resident that chose to come out and support this Board. Frank's joining the Board. Bobbi taking over as the Director. It really does mean a lot to us and I thank each and every one of you. I'm looking forward to a great year and at this point I'll turn it back over to the Director."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you very much."

J. COMMENTS FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

COMMISSIONER CREA: "We'll now take comments from the members of the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Sadeghi, do you have any comments to make?"

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Sure. I want to thank everyone for coming out and participating in this ceremony. It has been a long journey. We started this, I think it was Scott Tirella and I and George had indicated that, 'Hey you know what? If you have any interest, Joe Vicari is talking about retiring so get your resume in.' And I reached out to my advisor, Scott Tirella, and I said, 'What should I do?' And he told me what to do. He said, 'Get your resume together and submit it and let's see where it goes.' So we started that I think it was like December of 2022.

But I also want to thank Lauren Plump, my partner in life and my biggest supporter. Lauren always has my back. You can't have a better partner than Lauren. Sometimes I think if I just get up and announce that I want to rob a bank, Lauren will just say, 'Okay, let me get comfortable shoes on and we'll go do it.' (laughter)

My kids Morgan and Braden – Morgan is here today. I appreciate the support throughout. You put up with all the crazy ideas that I have and I appreciate that.

Obviously, my appreciation for the friendship and the support that Scott Tirella has shown me throughout this journey. At times I wasn't sure if I was the candidate and he was the advisor or I was the advisor and he was the candidate. And again, sort of by happenstance you became the campaign manager. I don't know how that came about, but you did a great job and I appreciate it. I appreciate all the hours.

Special thanks to George Gilmore, tireless individual. I don't know how he does it. He's go, go, go, He'll call me at ten o'clock at night and (say), 'I'm in Hunterdon County. Do you want come down?' I'm like, 'No, I don't want to come down. I'm watching the game.' But I appreciate everything that you've done and do for the organization and all of us

A debt of gratitude to Senator Singer. Where is Bob? I can't say enough, Senator, for the counsel and the guidance and the advice.

He would call me and rant for twenty minutes and go, 'Okay have a good day' and hang up the phone. (laughter) I don't know what was going on with that.

We should also mention Commissioner Vicari. Obviously he has given the better part of his life -42 years - to the dedication that he's shown to the citizens of Ocean County. But I can assure you my speeches are going to be much shorter than Joe Vicari's which you can probably say that about anybody on the planet. But nonetheless...

And obviously a special thanks to the voters of Ocean County for having faith in me, voting for me, and we won by a big margin last year.

I can't promise that you will always agree, as you mentioned that or maybe it was Commissioner Quinn, always agree with my opinions, but I can pledge that I will always do what's right and good for this community that we all love. All of my decisions will always begin with the gateway question: Is this the right thing for Ocean County, for the people of Ocean County?

As I embark on this new job, two things are clear to me:

I said this I think it was at the Victory Dinner the night of the election, that Ocean County...it doesn't take a genius to recognize that Ocean County is changing. And I stand by my prediction that Ocean County will have a million people by 2050. I think county government needs to recognize that change, rise to meet the challenges of that change, and be bold in thinking about the future, the solutions, the innovations that we need to implement in Ocean County and Ocean County government. That's going to make us better.

We must recognize that the promise of our community relies on providing the education and this is important to me. It's the only thing and I'll touch on quickly how I got here and my journey, my life's journey. But education is important to me because it's the only thing that I had that I could, as they say, hang my hat on to get me to where I am. And I don't mean that in terms of success and things like that, but in terms of having a family, raising two good kids, productive kids. Those are the things that I am proud of.

But I think there is no higher priority for us as elected officials than to ensure that our kids have a chance at a bright future. A future that they can afford and find here in Ocean County. We don't need our kids to move to Florida, Arizona, or North Carolina because there are better opportunities out there. Obviously as an engineer and we have a construction company where we build houses, I am more than committed to making an investment in the physical infrastructure of Ocean County. That's absolutely needed and I think the county hasn't pivoted quickly enough to realize those needs. We have a population explosion and the growth, and we're fortunate by the way, with that comes wealth, comes younger people, educated people to this community and we need that. But along with that physical infrastructure, I am also committed wholeheartedly to investing in the intellectual infrastructure for our kids.

To make that a reality, we need to seize the opportunity that's in front of us. To that end, I feel an urgency, I feel an energy, a passion, hopefulness about the future of our community here in Ocean County. I'm ambitious about the future of Ocean County. Maybe I'm reaching too far, but I don't think so.

As I sit here today, I think we can close our eyes and think about what would Route 9...what would this do to our community if Route 9 if in fact the State had done its job and widened Route 9 into four lanes like we have on Fischer Boulevard with a lane in the middle. Why does it take 45 minutes to go from Toms River to the northern part of Lakewood? Unacceptable. Same thing if you are going south. Why does it take 45 minutes to go from here – Jerry Dasti knows – going from his office in Toms River to Lacey probably takes him a half hour to 45 minutes when there's traffic on Route 9. That's unacceptable. I think through a partnership with Ocean County with the municipalities that are affected – Toms River, Lakewood, Berkeley Township – we can come together and we can solve this problem. We're not going to take no from the State.

Imagine if there was an Ocean County Improvement Authority where smaller townships – I've talked to Joe Buckelew about this. I've talked to Senator Singer. I've talked to George Gilmore about this. Smaller towns, Boards of Education, fire districts could partner with the county for their bonding needs and get much more favorable rates on their bonding. Why haven't we done this before?

Imagine if there was no waiting list to enroll in programs that the Vo-Tech schools offer. What answer do I have to

the parent that comes to me and tells me that the young lady, 16 years old, his daughter, is trying to enroll in the Medical Assistant program at the Vo-Tech and they're telling him there are 100 kids on the waiting list. What answer do we give to those parents? We haven't done our job. We're grateful that these kids actually have a direction. Usually the government makes the investment on that side of it where you teach the kids, show the kids, that in fact you have so much potential and you can do so much. The parents have done that for us. I was talking to Steve Scaturro who is on the Board of the Vo-Tech and I said, 'Is it instructors that you can't get?' And he said, 'No, we can get instructors.' I said, 'What's the problem?' He said, 'Facilities.' That's unacceptable. These goals may seem far-fetched ideas, but so was the idea that a young man, still a teenager, could leave his birth country with \$70.00 in his pocket. George tells this story and I think soon it's going to be a movie."

GEORGE GILMORE: "We have copies for sale, \$9.99! (laughter)

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "I landed at JFK Airport. I worked odd jobs, found a place to live, put myself through engineering school, started a family, started a business and I'm proud that with Lauren we've been able to grow that business where we have hundreds of jobs and we support the trades that also buy and live in Ocean County.

When I was a teenager, I made a promise to my father. I left on very unfortunate circumstances. I was 17/18 years old and my father passed away two weeks before I was planning on coming here. And I went to see him the night that he passed away and I asked him if he wanted me to stay and take care of my family. I'm the oldest child. And he had so much wisdom. He said, 'You need to go to somewhere where you have freedom, where you can have a good life. But the only promise that you have to make to me is that you won't forget about your mother and your siblings.' I have three siblings. That journey at times was difficult. It's hard. It's hard when you're that age and you don't have support, you don't have a family, you don't have friends, and at times it was discouraging. But I've been homeless. I tell everybody I've been homeless, foodless, without friends and family, but through it all the one thing was, I was never hopeless. I felt that hopefulness the moment that I landed at JFK Airport. It took me two days to figure out the phone system to call somebody to come and get me. So I wasn't the sharpest tool in the shed. But nonetheless. And I feel that hopefulness every day in my mind, in my heart. Every day that I wake up there are opportunities out there. That's what I love about this country. It's not the country, it's the idea. That American Dream that everybody is talking about is that hopefulness. And I've achieved that version of it and I made sure that I didn't forget about my mother and my siblings. They live productive lives here. I think the whole family are a bunch of engineers. I'm an engineer of course.

If I can transmit some of that hopefulness to the next generation, to our kids and their kids, that's what I'm talking about. If I can do that for even a dozen kids, I'll think I've accomplished what I need to accomplish in life. I know my Dad is proud looking down on this event today and someday soon when I meet him on the other side I will embrace him and tell him that I kept my promise. Thank you again."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Miss Director. Good afternoon everyone. I want to wish everyone here a very Happy and Healthy New Year.

I want to congratulate our newest member Frank Sadeghi and do I look forward to working with you, Frank, and want you to know my door is always open. I have a quote that I've always had in my book that I take to my meetings and to me it fits perfectly with you. 'Take pride in how far you have come. Have faith in how far you can go. And find joy on your journey.' And just by listening to what you just said you can really take that because you have definitely done that."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Thank you."

I could not be more proud of the work by our Department of Parks and Recreation. Tens of thousands of our people come from all over besides our own residents to visit our different parks that we have. We have 27 parks in Ocean County and hopefully we'll be starting our 28th park if we've gotten the DEP approvals. The staff of the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation are dedicated to making certain our parks are well maintained and safe. In addition, our recreation programs offer something for everyone throughout the year.

This year, we will continue to grow the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Program, adding new pieces of land in

order to continue the efforts to preserve and protect Ocean County's fragile environment. We continue to look for willing sellers that meet our criteria. In 2023, we preserved an additional 430 acres. And to date, the program has helped us preserve over 30,000 acres in Ocean County. And for those who may not know, 60% of Ocean County is preserved. That includes your federal, your state, your county and local. A lot of people do not realize how much of Ocean County is preserved. We go from the farm belt in Plumsted Township to the greenbelt that we have created in the central area of Ocean County. The open space we preserve today will be here long after all of us are gone. It is our legacy and we take pride in it.

This year, we will continue to support our award winning Vo-Tech Schools and Ocean County College. Both provide excellent learning experiences in this County. This is the future, as Frank had said, of Ocean County and from what I have seen it is bright because of these educational experiences.

This year will be my first to serve as liaison to the Ocean County Library system. It's the largest public library in the state and I look forward to supporting the many programs and services that our libraries provide.

While they are a few of the departments I work with directly as liaison, it goes without saying that all of the departments of Ocean County have a profound impact on our residents, each helping to fulfill the mission of the Board.

Since I was first appointed to the Board in 2016, I have done my very best to serve the residents of this great County. Of course, I don't do this alone, I do it with my fellow Board members and the professional, hardworking staff that keeps this County moving forward every day. It's the staff and the people that work for Ocean County that make us, the Board sitting up here, look good. The hard work that they do for the people of Ocean County, not just us.

I want to extend my appreciation to our County Administrator Mike Fiure, our CFO Julie Tarrant, and our Assistant Administrator Tristan Collins and all of the department heads and division directors. No matter how large or small, every day we make a difference.

Once again I want to wish you a happy and healthy new year. May we always remember the brave men and women serving in our military. I want to wish and God bless each and every one of you. God bless, as I said, our men and women in the military and may God bless the United States of America. Thank you."

But let me tell you something, Frank will be a representative similar to Joe Vicari. What can I do for the people that elected me? Not what I can do for myself. And congratulations Frank. Happy New Year."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Thank you so much, Fred."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Happy New Year."

FRED PENNACCHIO: "Oh, let me just mention one thing. I go back with the Board a long time ago because at one time every member on the Board had a first name that started with 'J' and I nicknamed them the 'Five J's'. I don't know if some of you remember this."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Oh yeah."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Oh yeah."

FRED PENNACCHIO: "How are you doing Michael? Anyway, I just want to congratulate Frank. Happy New Year everybody and Merry Christmas."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Happy New Year to you too."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "All the best to your wife too."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Is there anyone else from the public that would like to speak? Speak up now. Okay, that is it?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I would just, if you wouldn't mind Miss Director."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Absolutely."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I just happened to read in the newspaper and many of you probably know Dick Strada who had been a Mayor of Toms River. And I saw that Mr. Strada had passed away. And he was also a professor and in the administration at Ocean County College. I know many of you probably do know Dick and I would just ask if you would keep his family in your prayers in regards to the passing of Dick Strada. He was a longtime member of this county and Toms River."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you, Ginny. May he rest in peace. Okay, in closing Rabbi Heineman was going to give the Benediction, but unfortunately Rabbi Heineman sends his regrets to the Board as he is unable to attend today, this Organization Meeting, as he is attending a funeral in Lakewood. So would Reverend Occhipinti kindly come up to the microphone and give the Benediction. Thank you."

Keep us safe. Let this be a holy year ahead of us, Lord, this leap year. 366 days. In the name of our Lord, amen.

INTRODUCTION

The New Jersey "Local Fiscal Affairs Law", specifically N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14, as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997, requires that every local unit shall adopt a "Cash Management" Plan." This plan lists the GUDPA approved depository banks, any broker/dealers, and the approved investment instruments selected by the local unit's governing body.

In addition, the cash management plan is to be adopted by resolution, usually at the reorganization meeting, or the first meeting of the year and will guide the investment of a local unit's idle cash during periods that it is not needed to meet obligations.

The County of Ocean has a formal Cash Management Plan which was initially adopted on July 6, 1983 and revised on February 4, 1998.

The purpose of the current revision is to modify the procedures currently followed under the current Cash Management Plan to comply with the provisions of P.L. 1997, c.148 as enacted on June 30, 1997.

This new act revises and expands the responsibility of the governing body and the role of the Chief Financial Officer in cash management as well as expanding the range of the allowed investment vehicles used by a local unit to invest its idle cash.

I. GENERAL AUTHORITY

The Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean authorizes the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean to administer the Cash Management Plan in order to deposit and invest the County of Ocean's idle cash pursuant to the stipulations contained in the Cash Management Plan.

II. ELIGIBLE DEPOSITORIES FOR PUBLIC FUNDS

Eligible depositories for County funds are New Jersey banks or savings and loans specifically approved by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance under the Government Unit Depository Protection Act (GUDPA) and maintain a banking presence in the County of Ocean. Deposits of County funds in institutions other than those covered by GUDPA are prohibited by law.

As part of the County's Cash Management Plan, annually The Board of Commissioners shall adopt a list of the approved depositories for the County (ATTACHMENT A).

RFP - Request for Proposal

While P.L. 1997, c.148 formally exempts banking services and investment purchases from the bidding provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law N.J.S.A. 40A:11. all investment and banking services for the County of Ocean may be selected through a Request For Proposal (RFP) process.

When the need for banking and investment services exists, the County Chief Financial Officer may solicit RFP's from the eligible banking and investment institutions.

Upon receipt of the RFP's, the County Chief Financial Officer will then review each proposal. After the review, the County Chief Financial Officer will make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners. If necessary, the County Auditor may be asked to aid in the review process.

Once an investment or banking institution has been selected, the County's Cash Management Plan will be revised and adopted by resolution by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean.

III. CASH MANAGEMENT POLICY

It shall be the policy of the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean to adopt the Cash Management Plan by resolution at the annual reorganization meeting or during the year as deemed necessary to reflect changes in laws, depositories, investments or funds.

The Chief Financial Officer for the County of Ocean is directed to invest and deposit funds pursuant to the cash management plan as adopted by resolution of The Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean.

It is the objective of the Cash Management Policy to maximize the investment and interest income earned on idle County funds while providing adequate liquidity to meet the obligations of the County.

Timely Deposit of all County Funds:

As required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15, all monies collected or received from any source by or on behalf of the County or any board or Department thereof shall be paid to the "Treasurer, County of Ocean", who shall deposit all such funds within 48 hours after receipt, to the credit of the County of Ocean in one of the designated legal depositories.

All deposits forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer of the County of Ocean shall be accompanied by a revenue transmittal form listing cash and individual checks and will include a revenue account to which funds will be credited upon deposit.

Deposits to Interest Bearing Accounts:

It is the explicit policy of the County of Ocean that all funds be deposited into interest bearing accounts except as noted below.

All Departments and/or agencies of the County who collect monies for the County in the normal course of its activities must deposit said monies in an interest bearing account until such time as these monies are turned over to the County Treasurer or designee.

Exceptions to Interest Bearing Account Requirements:

The following types of funds are not required to be placed in Interest Bearing Accounts:

- 1. Petty Cash and Change Funds under \$5,000.00
- 2. Cash drawn from a Federal agency under a letter of credit, which cash is to be paid out within 5 working days to a vendor.
- 3. Amounts derived from the sale of bonds or notes, only to the extent that a specific written opinion of counsel states that the earning of (full) interest would result in the bonds or notes being classified as an arbitrage (not federally tax-exempt) issue pursuant to Federal regulations. To the extent that some interest is allowable, it shall be deposited at such a rate if such a rate is obtainable.

Treasurer's Report:

It shall be the responsibility of the County Treasurer to provide to the Board of Commissioners a Treasurer's Report on a monthly basis which shall detail the following information as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14.e. as amended by P.L. 1997, c.148 on June 30, 1997:

- 1. All investments made or redeemed over the past month;
- 2. Each financial institution holding local unit funds;
- 3. The amount of securities purchased or sold, class or type of securities purchased, book value, earned income, fees incurred, and market value of all investments as of the report date and:
- Other information that may be required by the Board of Commissioners or 4. deemed appropriate by the Chief Financial Officer.

Cash Flow Analysis:

An important part of establishing the County investment program includes detailed study of "cash flow" – when money comes in, when it goes out, and how much cash lies available for how long. Such an analysis provides the information needed to plan a viable investment procedure, including the projected length of time that funds can be invested in order to take full advantage of maturity periods with the highest yields.

Analysis of cash flow will alert the Treasurer to possible rescheduling of payments that will result in extending the life of short term investments. The Treasurer's calendar, compiled by the Division of Local Government Services and the Division of Taxation is an excellent source of specific dates regarding the above information. (1)

Reconciliation of Cash Deposits:

On a monthly basis, the Chief Financial Officer or designee shall forward revenue reports to all departments and agencies of the County of Ocean who collect monies for the County detailing cash deposits made to their revenue accounts.

The individual departments and agencies are required to then reconcile the County's reports to the records maintained by the departments.

A form provided by the Chief Financial Officer will be returned by the department or agency either agreeing with the County's records, or listing any discrepancies to be researched by the Chief Financial Officer or designee.

Bank Reconciliations:

It is the policy of the County of Ocean that all bank statements be reconciled to the County's records when received or within a reasonable time thereafter.

INVESTMENT POLICY IV.

The investment objectives of the County of Ocean, listed in order of importance from greatest to least, are as follows:

- 1. The ability of the investment instrument to provide for the security and safety of County funds.
- 2. Liquidity of the investment instrument necessary to provide for County operations and obligations.
- 3. Yield or return on the investment instrument (only after the first two considerations are met).
- 4. Investments requiring the payment of a premium should not be purchased without the written consent of the Chief Financial Officer.

Therefore, with these objectives in mind and in compliance with the allowable investments detailed in N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14 as modified by P.L. 1997, c.148, the County Chief Financial Officer will decide on the investment vehicles to be included as approved in the County's Cash Management Plan adopted by resolution by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Ocean and reflected in ATTACHMENT B.

Additionally, the County Chief Financial Officer will select approved investment vehicles to achieve the maximum rate of return while minimizing costs and fees and providing for investment portfolio diversification by spreading idle County funds among a number of these approved investments as listed in ATTACHMENT B.

Approved Investment Vehicles

Any investment instruments in which the security is not physically held by the County of Ocean shall be covered by a third party custodial agreement which shall provide for the designation of such investment in the name of the County of Ocean and prevent unauthorized use of such investments.

Any investment not purchased and redeemed directly from the issuer, government money market mutual fund, local government investment fund, or the State of New Jersey Cash Management Fund, shall be purchased and redeemed through the use of a national or State bank located within the State of New Jersey or through a broker dealer, which, at the time of purchase or redemption, has been registered continuously for a period of at least two years pursuant to section 9 of P.L. 1967, c.93 (C.49:3-5) and has at least \$25 million in capital stock (or equivalent capitalization if not a corporation), surplus reserves for contingencies and undivided profits, or through a securities dealer who makes primary markets in U.S. Government securities and reports daily to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York its position in and borrowing on such U.S. Government securities.

Securities which may be purchased by the County include:

- 1. Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America. This includes instruments such as Treasury bills, notes and bonds.
- 2. Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase, and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- 3. Bonds, notes or other obligations of New Jersey municipalities, local authorities, including fire districts and school districts of which the County is a part.
- 4. Any other bonds, notes or obligations with maturities not exceeding 397 days, as permitted by the Division of Investments. This includes Certificates of Deposit.
- 5. Local government investment pools, such as New Jersey CLASS, and the New Jersey Asset and Rebate Management Program.
