CLERK GUNTHER: "Thank you Director. The first item on today's agenda is a presentation proclaiming the month of October 2023 as 'Cybersecurity Awareness Month' in Ocean County, and I have the proclamation to read into the record."

Clerk Gunther reads the proclamation into the record.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'll now turn it over to Commissioner Haines. Is there anyone to accept? Or is this going to be given out at a later date?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Oh no. We have Mary Lou (Mycoff) is here with her staff."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Mary Lou, okay. And your staff."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I'd just like to say I don't know where the proclamation is. It wasn't in my office."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Proclamation will follow."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Anyway, I just think it's very...everyone come up. We'll still just take a picture. I'll

hold this. But anyway, all of us in this room is affected that uses the internet. And the one thing I can say about our team here with the IT Department and these individuals walking up, they realize the importance of not only what needs to be protected for the County of Ocean but also to make sure that our employees are educated to the fact that Cybersecurity is important because we know too many times people are getting hacked. I do online banking. I do a lot of stuff online like many people do. And it's really important to make sure that you have the best possible security on your home computer as well as... this team here definitely makes sure that we have the best security that we possibly can have that is out there on all of our computers because whether it's the elections, whether it's the County Clerk's records, whether it's anything to do with the Election Boards, whatever it might be, it's important that we have. And many of our departments have things that really, the public, there are certain things on there that they shouldn't see because it might have different information on there pertaining to an individual – their social security numbers and things like that, that we have in personnel. And this, you know, this department, I think we all should really thank them because for them they are making sure that we're very secure here in the County of Ocean. And they went to go look for it (the proclamation) because it wasn't brought to my office, and I apologize for that. But at least we'll have a picture taken with all of you. Mary Lou, you just want to mention anything about it."

MARY LOU MYCOFF, DIRECTOR, INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY: "Well, this is our cybersecurity team in IT and this team keeps the data secure for the County behind the scenes. So, we're not telling you what we do to keep it secure, but we do. But this campaign is actually to educate all of our employees on how to keep the county cyber safe as well as you in your home life and with your home and family as well. So, we will be putting all kinds of emails out, tips, newsletters, all kinds of things this month."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Just mention exactly what you do when it comes to our elections because as you know many people are always questioning, 'How secure is our elections? How secure is all of this?' And I do know that this department here, Mary Lou and the individuals that work with it they are in constant contact, not just with our Board of Elections. So, if you just talk a little bit about what you can say that we do."

MARY LOU MYCOFF: "Right. We keep very close contact with...we work very closely with the NJCCIC, which is their state cyber team, security Cybersecurity Department – departmentally security. We are also part of a membership of the MS and EI-ISAC which are federal, multi-state, as well as the election infrastructure. So we are part of those organizations. We keep in touch with them. We follow all of their standards and the recommendations for security. We meet with them regularly. We meet with the Elections Department. Behind the scenes we're also with many measures of security as well based on their recommendations and their system."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Okay. Thank you. You want to say who the people are?"

MARY LOU MYCOFF: "Okay. John Farro, Denise Gibson, Pete Lisowsky and Ken Hankins."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you. Thank you for all what you do."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just want to add something else to it with cybersecurity. As you know the county has been the leader in the State of New Jersey as far as making sure banks do not close down. We believe in brick-and-mortar banks because a large percentage of our senior population and we had several press conferences with the news media with Maria LaFace and Consumer Affairs as far as protecting our consumers. Banks are the gatekeepers for many people. Many people do not have the facilities and they don't have the mobility to use banking with their cellphone or on their cyber connection and they feel safer going into a bank. As you know, last week, more and more banks are closing throughout, not only Ocean County, but throughout the State of New Jersey and the United States. So, we've been asking the state to make sure in Ocean County...Carmen Amato, the Mayor of Berkeley, with a campaign on one of the largest banks in the county was on Mule Road and it closed down. And what it did is two things. It created a difficult environment for our seniors to go and do banking. They entrusted other people and there was a great deal of bank fraud. So, again, what the banks are doing, I met last week with OceanFirst and I spoke with the CEO's and they all agree. They all say the same thing. Bank of America said the same thing. And all of the banks... that's a problem. They said, well, times are changing. I agree. But for the next ten years or so it should be phased in. And in areas that are very sensitive to fraud like Ocean County they should delay closing any bank. We said this 18 months ago and, in the meantime, they've still been closing banks because the bottom line is that it's cheaper and easier for them to have people go online. That's all it is. We're saying one thing – for our senior citizens we need the protection of having brick-and-mortar banks. So, again, I thank Commissioner Haines for bringing it forward and an opportunity again to restate with Consumer Affairs and Senior Services the importance of brick-and-mortar banks. Thank you. Any comments from members of the Board before we move on? If not..."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Next on the agenda is one resolution for Public Hearing."

Accepting the recommendation of the OC Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire property identified as Block 837, Lots 1, 3, 8, 13, 14, 15 & 16 in Berkeley Township totaling approximately 26.67 acres located on Route 9, in an amount not to exceed \$5,900,000.00 plus up to \$22,000.00 for property tax adjustments.

Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, I'll now turn it over to Commissioner Haines. I'll turn it over to you."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Mr. Director. As was stated by the Clerk, this is the Florence T. Allen Ext. II. The property is approximately 26.67 acres located on Route 9/Atlantic City Boulevard in Berkeley. It is adjacent to over 800 acres of our existing county-owned Open Space known as the New Jersey Pulverizing Site which I happened to tour that the other day and it is a gigantic piece of property. Acquisition would provide key access to the site from Route 9. The property is the home of the former Blackbeard's Cave Family Entertainment Center. The township has agreed to donate...now besides the property that we're purchasing which is the 26.67 the town is donating 49.9 acres of land. So, you're talking close to 80 acres is going to be purchased. It's not going to be just the 26.67. Just add those together that we're going to be acquiring. And the township, thankfully, has supported the acquisition of this by resolution. And the property owner did accept our negotiated offer of \$5.9 million. Thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Any other questions from members of the Board? Okay, before I open it up to the public, I had a question going back to the last several days about this that first of all I totally support it. As you know as former Superintendent of Berkeley Schools for many years, I know the area extremely well. I think that the county should purchase the property. I have no questions about it. No reservations. The issue came up, and I spoke to our professional staff, Tony Agliata, the attorney, members of the governing body...I'm getting numerous calls from the business community as far as the price of \$6 million. Now here's the issue, and I'm not in the real estate business. The question the residents have is not the assessed value. I understand it's \$169,000.00. It is two things. As I spoke to John Bacchione before who's also on the committee, is that the appraised value is highest and best use. It's fair market value. And I'm trying to have the relationship between both. I think County Counsel made an excellent suggestion that next week at an executive session we're going to bring in the appraisals to discuss how we purchase property. For example, what took place the last several months is totally different. Interest rates went from 2% to 8%. Commercial property, it's 10%. The issue is the following. What's the correlation between highest and best use and fair market value? The people I spoke to...I was very clear today to our professional staff. I spoke to about a dozen people today is the people that are in business, in the real estate, saying, 'Wait a minute. The property price is too high.' I don't know. Before those (phone calls) when I heard it last week, I was going to vote for the \$6 million. I just need to answer the questions to the following. What is fair market value in Berkeley Township at this particular time?

If it's \$6 million, it's \$6 million. But here is what it comes down to. And, again, I'm not the expert. Is there a willing person to buy the land to go before the Planning Board to get the approvals and to develop it? I don't want to look like we're taking land off the market, so the other land is inflated for other builders or developers. I don't want to be in a situation to say someday well why is it people in the community that owned this land. I know there's only 195 feet on Route 9. I know from talking to people that it's very difficult to collect the rents right now because of the business climate in this area. I know that talking to people that they will not put cars on the road because it's not a destination point. So, again, I'm not saying no, what I'm saying is I think after we meet next week then we should come and bring it back to another formal vote.

And again, I know we have several members of the public before we make that decision and vote on it. So, again, I totally agree that we should buy the land. And I want to thank Mayor Amato for donating the land next to it, in the back, on the side. I know as former superintendent how the school system is. You do an excellent job. We have capacity in the school system for extra housing and I know that people across the way that built a dozen houses for \$750,000.00 sold for \$920,000.00. \$920,000.00. And I know they don't have an impact on the school because most coming into the high school and they add to the school because the students do a great deal, and they excel in many different areas. So, the school is not the issue. The township did a great job on the Council on Affordable Housing. Affordable housing needs are being met. I know in Ocean County, and I have to thank the mayor because they did a great job in the development taking place with 89 affordable housing units. You did a great job. But we know something else in Ocean County, the public school system has lost close to 10,000 students. And our schools are saying if we don't get the students, we get less in state aid. Fortunately, in certain areas they receive more money. Some got less money. So, you have to look at the total picture. A lot of what I have said, I can't go into detail, that over the last several years on this piece of property a lot of paperwork came through my office that I believe it's confidential but I cannot expose it now where the owners were looking for help from our departments as far as they're going to lose the land and they were going to sell it for substantially less money. I want to be fair. They should get fair market value. They should get reasonable money. But \$6 million of taxpayers' money has to be questioned. So, I'm looking for more transparency. I'm looking for an opportunity to address the concerns that I do have with the residents. And I know the mayor is here. I spoke to John Bacchione before. So, I want you to know you not only have my total support, but I just want to make sure the value is there. And thank you again for making your contributions. So, will the county purchase the land? In my opinion, yes. But when the residents have questions that have businesses there, that work in the construction business, that work in the town hall, that are volunteer fireman and they called me up. They contacted me because they weren't aware of what was taking place until several days ago. I just want to address those questions. And, again, talking to County Counsel, he will arrange for those who did the appraisals to come in and talk to us next week and then we will vote for it later on. So, is there anyone from the public who would like to make a comment?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Mr. Director, before we go..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "...I would just like to also explain a little bit which I failed to do in the beginning. You'll see up on the map it's all that green is preserved county land. And then of course if you can see it, it's the yellow that is what we are purchasing and then across from that is the Florence, the first part of it, the Florence T. Allen Conservation Area. And then the donated property goes down the other side over there, so you'll get to see what it is. And I should explain now when people get in touch with the Planning Department or us and they say that they want to sell their property, what happens then? I contact the Planning Department or whoever else may get the call. We contact the Planning Department, and they send in an application. They fill out the application and then we receive it, it goes on the agenda for a month and then the Natural Lands Committee, which John Bacchione fortunately is a member of that, and they sit, and they discuss it. Because I go to every single Natural Lands meeting, and they discuss it. Once it's been discussed they make a decision. Do we want to do a site selection? This is something that we want to do. Is this a piece of property that we want to purchase? They go and they make that decision. If they are going to do it, they do a site selection. When it comes back, the following month or so, when we get the final report, then they make a determination. And do they feel that this is a piece of property that the county should purchase? And if they say yes, then we go and we ask for it to get appraisals. That might take a couple of months and then it comes back. Then it goes before the Natural Lands Committee, and they make a decision whether this would be a worthwhile piece of property that the county is doing. We do not purchase or take property from anybody that does not want to sell it to us. And then once they have approved it then they do a resolution and then it comes over to the Commissioner Board and then it's brought before the Commissioners at a Preboard and then we go and then we bring it before the Board for the Public Hearing which we are having today. I should have mentioned that earlier and I do apologize. I just want to make a clarification of exactly how we get to this point on every single piece of property. And we have just a tiny bit less than 30,000 acres that Ocean County has preserved, and we've done over 3300 acres of farmland preservation. And of course, 60% of Ocean County is preserved which includes your federal land, your state land, your county land and municipality land. A lot of people are not aware of how much property is preserved in Ocean County because they really only see this general area in here but there's a tremendous amount -60% of Ocean County property is preserved land which means it will always be preserved land. And it's because the people have wanted us to purchase the land, or it has been donated. Whether it is donated by a township, or it's donated by an individual that has donated many pieces of property to us. Thank you, Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you. Again, I would like to thank Commissioner Haines for giving an overview. It's absolutely correct. When, and I am sure Jack Kelly will say something, Commissioner Kelly, when we decided to have this program after several years of studying it with our good friend John Bartlett and Jim Lacey, we decided that

we would not condemn land a willing seller – at a fair market value. And at that time, it was any land that is sensitive land, beneficial. It was not to take land from building houses or anything else at that time because we know there's a great need for housing for working class people. So, that's not the issue. The issue is...I totally support it. I think it's a smart thing to do. New Jersey Pulverizing, is of course, in the corner over there. (Shows on map) We thank again the town for donating land and there's a good green belt. There's no question about it. What I'm saying is we must review the cost factor of how we pay for it. The difference between highest and best use which we know the Planning Board, in most cases, will not upgrade it in most cases. And we know fair market value. And citizens throughout that particular area are concerned to ask and I'm asking the question now. I'm not saying no. I think we should buy it and I'm willing to make that commitment. Wait until next week. And I want to hear from the counsel people here and the public if \$6 million is reasonable. If it is, I have no problem in doing that. But the question as far as some of the information I have that I received over the last several years must be reviewed in executive session.

So, I'll now open it up to members of the public who would like to ask a question or make a statement. Councilman, John Bacchione."

JOHN BACCHIONE, COUNCIL PRESIDENT, BERKELEY TOWNSHIP: "I want to thank this Board of Commissioners for this consideration of purchasing this property. There is a value to it. I know an appraisal is it appraises an opinion of what the value is based on information that he or she has gathered. But there is another value to purchasing this property and preserving it and it's Route 9. Route 9, there's no way it's going to be able to handle the matter of traffic coming out of a plaza that would be developed on this property if it would be a commercial piece of development. Just north of that our town center is going to be developed and that's going to have enough impact on Route 9 that we don't need any more. So, I really appreciate your consideration in purchasing this property and hope that you guys vote yes on it. So, thank you."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Bacchione. I appreciate those comments. I know the town center is very important to you. I know, and we've been fighting ever since I can remember, Route 9 is the same since 1929. It's unfortunate the State of New Jersey has not kept their commitment. And when you and the mayor who we went shoulder to shoulder fighting with the state, with the gasoline tax, and they made a commitment that if the gasoline tax went in, they would make an improvement to Route 9, and they haven't done so. So, we're still fighting with them. The town center is very important. I know it will have an impact. But I don't want this to distract from it at all. The main thing is that the county, I believe, there are five votes to purchase the property and I want to purchase the property. I just want to make sure it's a fair and equitable price. Anyone else who would like to make a comment or make a statement? Mayor Amato. Thank you very much for coming."

MAYOR CARMEN AMATO: "Mr. Director, and our distinguished members of the Commissioner Board, thank you very much for your ongoing support of purchasing land in Berkeley Township - very, very, very important. Because of the job that you're doing here in Ocean County, Ocean County is a desirable place to live. And there's been a lot of development over the last few years especially post pandemic. And any type of a piece of property that we can preserve as Open Space we need to act on it now. Back in 2019 we adopted a general resolution with varying parcels throughout the Bayville section of town. And your Board, through Commissioner Haines, has been outstanding. Just about every piece of property that we've identified as a large parcel that we like to see preserved to stop overdevelopment has been purchased and preserved. And this parcel was a long-term land lease from the Johnson family. And then during the pandemic the owner of Blackbeard's Cave fell ill. And obviously during the pandemic everything got slow so the property has been in disrepair for many, many years. The property was subsequently sold and there was concern about multi-family housing being built on this location which Councilman Bacchione had mentioned, would be catastrophic to the Route 9 corridor to have more multi-family housing. So, we appreciate the Board doing their due diligence and preserving this property. And it's just something that, as Commissioner Haines had mentioned, is contiguous to Fisher's Pit in the New Jersey Pulverizing. And with the contribution of the township's Open Space it's just almost another 100 acres which is great to be able to do that. And we appreciate the Board's funding of the program, support of the program and of course purchasing of Open Space so it can be preserved so we don't have any future development in these areas. Thank you so much for your time."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you very much Mayor. Now as I spoke to you about many times before we share your viewpoint as far as preserving land in Berkeley Township. You did a great job with your Council on Affordable Housing. You did a great job with your school system that can handle extra students and as far as the gifted and talented students. And we look for some good developments in Berkeley Township and you haven't said no to development but special kinds of development, which is very, very important. Anyone else who would like to make a statement or ask a question on this particular piece of land? If there are no other questions or comments on this land, I close the Public Hearing."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I move the resolution."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Now before we make the resolution, I just want to make sure everyone understands that next Wednesday, at 4 o'clock we'll be talking about the procedures on how we assess property to pay values as far as fair market value. So, I totally support this, but I do not support paying the \$6 million until...I spoke to County Counsel and Tony Agliata... until next week when they can come in and we've been talking about this for many, many times as far as Cedar Creek. I think it's an excellent program that you bought Cedar Creek for \$6 million. I think it's an asset to Berkeley Township. I think it's an asset to the county. I think it's a very important thing. As Commissioner Haines said before we have preserved 60% of all of the land in Ocean County. If you look at the land and water, we are the largest county in the State of New Jersey. But I think you have to look at the total picture as far as the cost factor. And, again, I'm not the expert. This is from the residents of Ocean County and a motion has been

made. And, again, I will support it but I will not support the \$6 million. A motion has been made. Is there a second? I ask for...and again if I can make an amendment to it to wait until next Wednesday to vote on the \$6 million. So, the question is to purchase the property, and I'll refer it over to County Counsel, is it possible to put a stipulation in there to vote yes without the \$6 million until we have the meeting on Wednesday at 4 o'clock?"

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "You can't vote contingently to purchase it. You either have to vote on it today or vote to hold it over. But you can't make it contingent upon additional information coming in after you exercised your right to purchase."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay, so I can so there's no misunderstanding. I can't understand. I'm being disrupted. Wait. I don't understand what he said because...I'm not being sarcastic or anything else. Jack, can you say that again?"

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "You can't vote to approve it contingently upon something that's going to happen next week. You've had your hearing. Your hearing's been closed. And it's up to the Board either to vote on this resolution or to hold it over but you can't vote today and have that vote count subject to additional information coming in next week."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Can we do it as far as after the meeting? Vote on it so when we get the information...as I said before I don't feel comfortable because I need some clarifications and I need some more information on it."

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "Commissioner, I mean that's up to the Board. I mean the bottom line right now you've gone through your process and the motion has been introduced and you can do a second to purchase it today or you hold it over to the following meeting. But you can't vote yes to purchase today subject to additional information coming in next week."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. So it's up to Commissioner Haines as far as..."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I made a motion."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "...if she wants to withdraw it."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No, I don't want to withdraw it. I would like to..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Let me just speak because I understand where you're coming from Commissioner. But I've been in the real estate business for 45 years and the appraisers are licensed individuals that take and when they come for an appraisal their license is on the line. It's based on the fact that they have comparable sales. They have all these different variables that they have to come up with in order to meet the number that they have. And a perfect example would be what Donald Trump is going through right now. They have to show because if a lender puts money on that property the lender wants to make sure that the appraisal is done properly. I've always had the utmost confidence in the Natural Lands Committee as well as the professionals that they hire that what they're doing is being done right keeping in mind they're just as persistent as we are when it comes to spending dollars because it's not their money. It's not our money. It's taxpayer money. But I think what we have here is a situation where even though you don't have a huge amount of land on Route 9 you do have a piece of land that has a tremendous amount of potential if you were to take and put in multi-family which I believe this area is permitted to have multi-family built on that property if I'm not mistaken.

So I think being that we're here today we're at the voting stage of it I think that it's something that, in my eyes, it's a good fit because we can tie up a lot more of the property in that area as being non-buildable. And even though we're not going to agree on this I am going to second the motion."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "But I didn't say I didn't agree. I'm saying is that I do agree to purchase it but I need more information as far as fair market value."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "No, I understand that."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I agree with you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yeah, I understand that, but I think..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "You understand what I'm saying?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "...yeah, but I think at this point to question an appraiser's ability to do the appraisal I don't want to go there and open that door for everything that we do moving forward in the future. I just think that we've done our due diligence. We appoint people to these boards, Natural Lands, and all the different boards we have here, because we believe that they're making the right decisions and it goes through the boards. It goes through the Planning Department. All the different people we have working for us they can review it and when it gets to us it's just a question of whether we believe that they've done their job properly and that, you know, we can stand up and make a decision based on the information that's been put forth."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That's not the question. I'm not questioning the people on the Advisory Board. I think they do a great job like John Bacchione. I'm not questioning about those people."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "No, No. You're questioning the price but I..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I'm questioning the price because I don't understand it."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yeah, but I..."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "So, what I'm saying is as a courtesy, out of respect, I just need until next week to ask more questions and to show them the information I received from the owners over the last several years. And, again, it's up to you. There's a motion and there's a second but what I'm saying is I need more time. I feel very uncomfortable about it. From what I've heard from many officials, from people that are in business there and I cannot answer the question. And all I'm asking for is to wait until next Wednesday, a week from today. If you want to it's up to you. Each one has one vote. Each one is equal but when the press release goes out it will reflect that I don't support the price, but I support purchasing it. I think it makes a lot of sense. And the reason being is because I need more clarification. I need more information. And I really didn't have enough time to walk the site as Commissioner Haines did which I will do. And if I had a day or two more to look at it \$6 million is a lot of money. And since one of the founders with Jack Kelly, and John Bartlett and Jim Lacey when we first started this, we said everyone has to feel comfortable with it to make sure it's the best thing for, not just Berkeley Township, but for the other 33 towns. And again, I respect what the mayor said, and the Councilman Bacchione, and I agree. There's no question about it. But I do have some questions I would like to ask. And I spoke again, before the meeting, to the Attorney, Jack Sahradnik, to Mr. Agliata, to our professional staff, and I said these are the concerns that I do have. And again, if I had more time. And again, usually in the past we had more time to look at it and to analyze it. And again, the County of Ocean I am willing to make that commitment that we should immediately purchase the land. I don't want anything else to be built there. I think a green belt is excellent, but I think the price has to be explained. I didn't say it was too much. I said I have a question with it. And there are five equal members on this Board that have a right to express themselves. So, I don't want to be an outlier, lying or anything else with this I just need more information. Anyone else? A motion has been made and a second. Any comments? Commissioner Kelly? Any comments before we vote?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I'll comment when the vote comes."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Commissioner Crea?"

COMMISSIONER CREA: "No. I have no comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Okay. Any members of the professional staff before I call for the vote? A motion has been made by Commissioner Haines and seconded by Commissioner Quinn. Roll call please."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Commissioner Kelly?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I will just agree with Director that this is a lot of money. But I've also had conversations with the town and this is an extremely important purchase to the town. It just feels like the amount of traffic that could come out of this onto Route 9 where there's already major problems is a problem for the town. And it's over \$200,000.00 an acre so it is a lot of money. All that being said I vote yes."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Commissioner Crea?"

COMMISSIONER CREA: "I just want to point out that this has gone through a process and the process has been done through the Natural Lands. It has been done through the Planning Department and everything else and I believe in their calculations. My vote is yes."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Commissioner Haines?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Yes."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Commissioner Quinn?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yes."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Director Vicari?"

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I will abstain because I need more information. As you know I was the Superintendent there for 10 years – direct contact with the businesspeople, with the parents, with the students. And I am totally in favor of purchasing the land. I question, as Commissioner Kelly said before, \$6 million is a lot of money. And again, I do not question the appraisal process. I voted for them for many years – dozens of years, but I just need more information to question it. There is no urgency in my opinion to vote on it today. We can do it next week on a Wednesday. And there has never, in the history that I know of, where an elected official on this Board, whether it be a Freeholder or a Commissioner, asks for more information, more clarity, more time, has not been granted that. If I had more time with it and made a few more phone calls, I need one more day, 24 hours, to walk the site as Commissioner Haines did, to ask some questions to the appraiser and again for information. So, I think it will stand as four yes, one abstention. And let it be noted that in the press release that goes out that I do support purchasing the land. I have a serious question as far as the cost factor and I think a reevaluation in difficult times like this when the Federal Reserve has

raised interest rates, when there's a question as far as traffic, when there's a question as far as what's taking place as far as land developing in Berkeley Township, that I have to listen to the people, the business people, those that pay the taxes in Berkeley Township, those that serve in the volunteer fire department. Long-term residents have many concerns and I will feel better if I had those concerns addressed which they will be on Wednesday. So, it's four yes, one abstention, not on the purchase, as I said before, but on the cost factor. And as far as the formula, as was said before, maybe we should reassess it. Maybe we should look at. I think fair market values makes a lot of sense.

Any other questions? Seeing none, thank you very much."

On motion duly made by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Quinn, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution was adopted on final reading.

#### **U. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS**

At 4:42 PM, Director Vicari received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR VICARI: "That concludes the business portion. Any comments from members of the Board of Commissioners starting with Commissioner Crea?"

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Yes, thank you Mr. Director. There was a previous time when the Boat Flare Disposal Program was scheduled and we, unfortunately, had a great deal of rain over the last week. Anyway, the new Disposal Program will be rescheduled for October 21st. So if anyone has any flares that they would like to have disposed of it will be between 9 a.m. and noon at the Ocean County Training Center on Volunteer Way in Waretown. Appointments for the proposed September date will still be honored on the new date and flares will be accepted from Ocean County residents only. Flares for marinas and businesses will not be accepted and residents can drop off a maximum of ten flares.

And secondly, I don't know if the pictures is going to be up but there was a discussion. This past week, or actually it was last week, I had the privilege along with members of the Ocean County Board of Social Services providers and Social Services staff celebrated the arrival of the first Mobile Outreach Unit for Social Services in Ocean County during a ribbon cutting ceremony on September 26th. The unit will be staffed by professionals from the Board of Social Services who are knowledgeable about the numerous programs the agency implements. The Mobile Outreach Unit is another strong example of our commitment to the most vulnerable residents of Ocean County. This is a fully functional office on wheels. It will be available to attend special events in the community and to partner with other providers on a regularly set schedule. The Mobile Unit was dedicated to the late Assemblyman, Ron S. Dancer, who served on the Board of Social Services from 1997 until his passing of July 22, 2022. He was the Chairman of that Board. And the saying on the Outreach Unit states, "As individuals we are one drop and together we are an ocean." This will make it a whole lot easier for people who do not have access and cannot come to Toms River. This unit will be going to them. Thank you, Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Thank you Commissioner Crea. Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "No comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Quinn."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "No comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "No comments."

DIRECTOR VICARI: "I just want to highlight three fast things. We have the new Director of Consumer Affairs, and we know during the superstorm that I called it over the several weeks, numerous cars throughout Ocean County, New Jersey, probably the Jersey Shore, have been damaged with water damage. We found out that people that owned those cars want to sell them without telling the people there was three or four feet of water that covered it. We're in the process now of sending out a press release to notify the State of New Jersey that if someone sells a car or turns in a car that's under lease the person should have full knowledge that the car was in water and damaged by the water. So, I appreciate you taking over doing that.

I want to commend Commissioner Crea for the Outreach Program. We had Maria LaFace for the last three years trying to do one for Senior Services and David Fitzgerald has been working hard. They say it's a supply issue. I don't know anywhere there's a supply issue in the car industry right now. What we want to do...Maria LaFace wants to bring it to the 200,000 senior citizens as far as people on there with Consumer Affairs' issues, veterans' issues or Senior Services issues or banking issues. So we go there and serve them. It's very difficult to do so. We were the first in Senior Services and with Commissioner Crea to do so because Ocean County is 10%. I mean it's a large percentage. It is the largest county in the State of New Jersey, and we cannot get it out. And we try to get it, and every time they say next month, next month, next month. So, we'll see what's going to happen. And again, the Board is very supportive of this Christmas tree list. For an example, Ocean County receives nothing. Camden, according to the resolution, \$64 million, Union County, \$57 million. Well, the courthouse is \$91 million. I think we deserve \$20 million. We deserve something for it. The parking garage is an absolute \$4 or \$5 million. We have it to do it in two or three phases. I want it based on merit and I want it based on need. The people of Ocean County...the population is not just almost 700,000, it is, in the summer, it's 1.3 million people. They all pay taxes. And we are ignored. That's why the Board supported it again. The alternates on the Board of Public Utilities, very, very important. When we sent out the press release that there was \$100 million for boardwalks. It wasn't just boardwalks. We were never notified of that. And we have many needs in Ocean County as I mentioned before. And I looked at it again, playground equipment, all in our parks. Special needs playground equipment they're getting all over the State of New Jersey in certain areas. The library rooms, sport complexes, open spaces. I mean, the list goes on and on and on. Fire departments receive money. Everyone received a substantial amount of money. We have dozens of pages of that on the report. And again, so a copy of the resolution we sent, tomorrow to all 33 municipalities and to our Legislative Districts. And we know it's pure and simple politics. And I'm sure after the meeting our Assemblyman, which I mentioned many, many times before, will address those concerns. That it's just unfair. It's not right. And the people of Ocean County deserve better. Any other comments from members of the Board or professional staff before I open it up to the public?"

#### RESOLUTION

#### October 4, 2023

WHEREAS, Ocean County's year-round population continues to grow along with the needs of its residents; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County is one of the largest counties in the state land wise with one of the largest county road networks, and is also home to the largest body of water in the state - Barnegat Bay - a national estuary; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County, which is a premier tourism destination bringing in large sums of revenue to the state of New Jersey, doesn't get the same financial help or benefits as other areas of the state, including many northern and urban cities and counties; and

WHEREAS, as an example, Ocean County once again was excluded from the state's annual "Christmas Tree" list receiving no extra state funding for projects that fall outside of the normal budget; and

WHEREAS, in the meantime, millions of dollars have been allocated to towns and counties in predominantly urban regions, without a comprehensive list of appropriations and no way to easily access information on how all the money is being spent; and

WHEREAS, media reports on the "Christmas Tree" list, a fund for legislators' pet projects and other expenses that normally fall outside the line items of the annual budget, revealed that Ocean County received zero dollars in 2023; and

WHEREAS, urban and city legislative districts received the bulk of the \$661.6 million that lawmakers earmarked for projects in individual counties or towns; and

WHEREAS, included on the list was funding for a new marina, swimming pool and a dog park in Northern New Jersey, Camden County received \$64 million for new infrastructure projects and Union County was second with a \$57.5 million award; and

WHEREAS, in the absence of additional funds for Ocean County, the Route 9 corridor continues to present a traffic bottleneck, as do other state roads in the County. Additional funds could also help with the construction of a new justice complex annex to house state courts, substantial repairs to the county parking garage, to fund recreational programs, transportation services, needed assistance for our seniors and veterans, to protect Barnegat Bay and to help the 33 municipalities that make up the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Ocean County Board of Commissioners encourages our state legislators to provide fair and equitable distribution of discretionary spending appropriations in the annual state budget for key programs that will assist not just Ocean County residents but the thousands of people from across the state that visit the County annually.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata discussed a recommendation by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Board to acquire a 40.60-acre property located on Rt. 9/East Main Street in Tuckerton Borough. The Borough has agreed to partner on the purchase of the property, contributing \$1,125,000.00 to the overall purchase price of \$2,060,000.00. Upon acquisition, the County shall subdivide 9 acres of upland to the Borough to be utilized to improve their adjacent public works yard.

Commissioner Crea and Mr. Agliata spoke about the Ocean County Housing Rehabilitation Program which allocates money to bring low-moderate income dwellings to state and local building codes. Each year Ocean County receives Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME funding from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. The CDBG program limit is \$25,000 per dwelling, and the HOME Housing Rehabilitation program limit is \$50,000 per dwelling. Each household applying must meet the HUD income requirements. Michael Mangum and Scott Binkley provided the Board with an update of the Ocean County Golf Courses. Mr. Binkley, the County Golf Superintendent, said in the last ten years, the County courses have become increasingly more popular, especially since COVID. In 2013, at Atlantis through the month of August, there were just 13,510 rounds of golf played which made \$471,000.00. Over 30,000 were played this year generating a revenue of \$1,031,859.00. At Forge Pond through August there were 14,546 rounds played generating \$329,000.00, while this year there were 26,818 generating \$773,000.00. Atlantis accommodates over 200 golfers on average per day. The courses are very well maintained, the greens and irrigation systems have all been upgraded. Atlantis is working on a five year Master Plan with architect Stephen Kay.

Commissioner Kelly said that Vo-tec students will be building a home for Habitat for Humanity. The Road Department has offered to clear the trees from the lot, and will cover the cost, but Vo-tec will not be charged. The Board agreed.

Commissioner Kelly and Mark Jehnke reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the reconstruction and resurfacing of Princeton Avenue from Post Road to Barnegat Bay in Brick Township. The recommendation to award the contract for the Central Avenue and 28th Street Stormwater Pump Station in the borough of Ship Bottom to Earle Asphalt in the amount of \$501,313.13 was also discussed. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board agenda for the September 20, 2023 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of September 20, 2023. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

There were no additional comments.
