RESTORING THE SHORELINE - THE BEST DEFENSE

From the water, the shoreline of Cattus Island County Park shows nature's wear and tear as trees are toppled into the brackish Barnegat Bay their root systems unable to hold them upright, erosion has eaten away at the soil wearing down the coast line bringing with it a threat to natural habitats.

And even though its resiliency has been compromised over time, the 530 acre park off Fischer Boulevard in Toms River Township, remains the most significant salt marsh and the largest breakwater in the northern portion of Barnegat Bay.

Ocean County, in partnership with numerous agencies, has taken important steps to restore the park's resilience at both the shoreline and its infrastructure by advancing the design and conceptual plans for a living shoreline project.

"When you bring experts to the table including representatives from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Ducks Unlimited, Stevens Institute, the Barnegat Bay Partnership, the state Department of Environmental Protection, Ocean County Parks and Recreation, Ocean County Planning Department and add Colliers engineering firm, you know the work to restore and provide resiliency to this area will be done right and will last long into the future," said Ocean County Commissioner Virginia E. Haines, chairwoman of the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation. "This project is moving forward. Its benefits will be long lasting."

Prepared with a lengthy 'to do' list including completing shoreline restoration work, increase recreation areas, protecting the park infrastructure, increase wildlife opportunities, better buffer for the community, become a model for bay restoration and use for educational opportunities, the conceptual design work for the project looks at six different areas and the initial efforts will be focused on Page's Point, the northeast peninsula that has suffered from severe erosion over time.

Haines noted the Cattus Island shorelines have experienced significant erosion and retreat. Some areas of the park have lost more than 300 feet over the past 85 years. This erosion is likely to increase over time, especially if the northeast peninsula known as "Page's Point" is not stabilized. Page's Point itself serves as a wetland buffer and upland forest breakwater that protects four surrounding neighborhoods from tidal flooding and erosion.

Michael Mangum, Director of the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation said the project is now moving from the conceptual plan designed by Stevens Institute of Technology to the design, permitting and bidding process being done by Colliers.

"Cattus Island is known for its trails and wildlife," Mangum said. "But its importance goes beyond that as it acts as a buffer to the many homes and commercial properties just beyond it.

Cattus Island preserves a significant portion of the total remaining natural lands in the northern part of Barnegat Bay, encompassing 530 acres out of over 1,000 acres of preserved public property in the immediate vicinity.

The work to improve the park's shoreline and infrastructure is being funded in part by a \$3 million grant from the DEP for local water-quality improvement projects in the Barnegat Bay watershed.

While the grant project's primary goal is to restore and provide resiliency to public land, the adjacent protected areas include about 7,300 homes and 50 commercial properties with a total estimated value of \$6.4 billion. Experts say marshes are the best defense against storms like Superstorm Sandy that hit in October 2021 providing protection for the surrounding areas.

"This project will help restore the Cattus Island shoreline and the successes and lessons learned in the course of this project can be used in other areas throughout the watershed," Haines said. "We are thankful for the partnerships that have been created as a result of this work and we know the end result will provide numerous environmental benefits."

The project is expected to be completed in phases over a 4-year period.

Breton Woods Property



The Breton Woods property is an approximately 30-acre parcel located off of Laurel Avenue in Brick Township. A joint acquisition with the Township, the property has been subdivided with 6 acres to the Town for a future playground, while the remaining 25 acres shall be permanently preserved open space for passive recreation. An overwhelming amount of public support came forward throughout this acquisition process to advocate for the preservation of the property and prevent a 59-lot development. Covered entirely by deciduous and mixed coniferous forest with a network of trails that some date back to as early as 1931, there is no question why the public wanted to see this parcel preserved. As some of the last remaining green space in the Town, the property has already been and will continue to be a destination for the neighborhood trail runners, dog walkers, and nature lovers to enjoy. The property is located within Atlantic Coastal Habitat, ranked as a special concern habitat for threatened and endangered species. Both the County and Town have applied to the NJDEP Green Acres Program for partial reimbursement on the property acquisition. The program now totals over 29,500 acres of preserved open space throughout the county.

Bird Feeder Bandit or Fantastic Forester?



Eastern Gray Squirrels are mammals that have the knack to delight or dismay. These agile, problem-solving rodents are among a group of more than 200 species of squirrels world-wide. Often best known for their acrobatic antics or seemingly indecisive nature when crossing a road, grey squirrels play an important role in what's known as seed dispersal. As winter approaches, squirrels carry their food and bury it in several locations. They hide more food than they will recover and eat. The forgotten nuts and seeds will eventually sprout leading to a natural method of replanting forests.

Squirrel "Digs"

Gray squirrels will use old woodpecker holes or natural tree cavities as dens to live in and raise young. Gray squirrels will also build large nests composed of leaves and twigs. Generally, dens are made at least 20 feet off the ground. Gray squirrels are often social and will share their nests with other gray squirrels during certain times of the year.

Considered omnivores, grey squirrels primary foods are nuts, flowers, seeds, insects, mushrooms...and let's not forget your backyard bird feeder!

Fun Facts

-Gray squirrels are very vocal animals that use a variety of calls, including harsh squalls, warning barks, chucks, mews, purrs, and tooth chattering, to communicate with other squirrels.


-Eastern Gray Squirrels typically live up to 3 years in the wild, though some wild squirrels have been found to reach the ripe age of 13.

Before You Go Outdoors:

- Know where to expect ticks. Ticks live in grassy, brushy, or wooded areas, or even on animals. Spending time outside walking your dog, camping, gardening, or hunting could bring you in close contact with ticks. Many people get ticks in their own yard.
- Treat clothing and gear with products containing 0.5% permethrin.
- Use Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellentss.

Avoid Contact with Ticks:

Avoid wooded and brushy areas with high grass and leaf litter. Walk in the center of trails.

After You Come Indoors:

Check your clothing for ticks. Ticks may be carried into the house on clothing. Any ticks that are found should be removed. Tumble dry clothes in a dryer on high heat for 10 mins. to kill ticks on dry clothing after you come indoors. Water will not kill ticks.

Examine gear and pets. Ticks can ride into the home on clothing and pets, then attach to a person later, so carefully examine pets, coats, and daypacks.

Shower soon after being outdoors. Showering within two hours of coming indoors has been shown to reduce your risk of getting Lyme disease and may be effective in reducing the risk of other tickborne diseases. Showering may help wash off unattached ticks and it is a good opportunity to do a tick check.

Check your body for ticks after being outdoors. Conduct a full body check upon return from potentially tick-infested areas, including your own backyard. Use a hand-held or full-length mirror to view all parts of your body. Check these parts of your body and your child's body for ticks:

- Under the arms
- · In and around the ears
- · Inside belly button
- · Back of the knees
- · In and around the hair
- Between the legs
- · Around the waist

Preventing Ticks on Your Pets

Dogs are very susceptible to tick bites and tickborne diseases. Vaccines are not available for most of the tickborne diseases that dogs can get, and they don't keep the dogs from bringing ticks into your home. For these reasons, it's important to use a tick preventive product on your dog.

Tick bites on dogs may be hard to detect. Signs of tickborne disease may not appear for 7-21 days or longer after a tick bite, so watch your dog closely for changes in behavior or appetite if you suspect that your pet has been bitten by a tick.

Talk to your veterinarian about:

- The best tick prevention products for your dog
- Tickborne diseases in your area

To further reduce the chances that a tick bite will make your dog sick:

- Check your pets for ticks daily, especially after they spend time outdoors.
- If you find a tick on your pet, remove it right away.
- Reduce tick habitat in your yard.

Note: Cats are extremely sensitive to a variety of chemicals. Do not apply any tick prevention products to your cats without first asking your veterinarian!

While the winter season may have stripped it of its leaves, the Sweet Gum tree (Liquidamber styraciflua) at Mott Place in downtown Toms River still fit the bill of one of Ocean County's big trees.

With measuring tape in hand, Ocean County Commissioner Virginia E. Haines, liaison to the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation, along with Michael Mangum, Director of the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation, measured the tree's circumference noting it was almost 10 feet.

The tree height of 70 feet and the crown spread of 68 feet makes it a perfect candidate for the county's Big Tree list.

"This tree is probably 100 years old if not older," Haines said. "We have big trees gracing lands across this County. We want to know about them in order to preserve and protect them.

"Big trees play an important role in the health of our environment and ultimately our health," she said.

The Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation, in partnership with the Ocean County Shade Tree Commission is asking residents to nominate big trees throughout the County for a Big Tree Registry.

Ocean County has launched the Big Tree Registry, a compilation of the largest native and naturalized tree species in the County. Nominated by Ocean County residents, these trees have environmental and historical value that should be conserved for future generations.

To nominate a big tree, visit the Ocean County Parks Facebook page (@OceanCountyParks), or the Ocean County Parks website www.oceancountyparks.org to find the necessary forms, as well as instructions as to how to measure the tree.

Some of the environmental benefits of big trees include the removal of tons of pollution in the air; combating climate change by removing carbon dioxide; preventing water runoff, erosion and water pollution; preventing flooding; providing wildlife habitats; and the tree roots help filter ground water by absorbing nutrients and toxins.

"Big trees provide up to 600 times the environmental benefits of typical trees," said Ocean County Commissioner Virginia E. Haines, who serves as Chairwoman to the Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation, as well as liaison to the Ocean County Shade Tree Commission. "It is important that these trees are documented to keep them from being removed."

In addition, large trees are also a way to preserve history. Trees that have historic value are also called Heritage or Witness trees.

"Many trees also have historic value and have been around for hundreds of years," Haines said. "The only way for these trees to truly tell their story is for us to preserve and appreciate them for the value and pleasure they bring to the County."

"The Ocean County Department of Parks and Recreation has always taken great pride in educating our residents on proper conservation," said the Director of the Ocean County Board of Commissioners Gary Quinn. "With the help of our residents, we can continue our ongoing conservation efforts and make sure our trees are protected."

Ocean County has been part of the New Jersey Forest Service (NJFS), who oversees the state Big Tree Conservation Program and keeps a record of the largest trees in the state, since the 1930s.

On the NJFS Big Tree Registry, Ocean County has 23 trees listed, with many of them located on the grounds of Georgian Court University in Lakewood Township.

Ocean County Timeline...Fun Facts

- **11,500 BC** Paleo-Indians migrated into what is now Ocean County and lived in nomadic bands hunting and fishing.
- **1000 AD** Early Woodland Period Indians, known as Lenape, emerge as hunters and gatherers. [Note: By 1740, there were only about 200 Native Americans living in New Jersey, south of the Raritan Bay to Cape May.]
- **1600** Dutch navigator, surveyor, and cartographer Cornelius Hendrickson navigated Barnegat Inlet and the Toms River onboard the Onrust, becoming the first European explorer to set foot on what became Ocean County soil. The land, which he claimed for Holland, became part of New Netherlands.
- **1685** After Sir George Carteret died, his land holding in the province was sold off piecemeal to pay his indebtedness. The Proprietors began to buy land from the local Native Americans, which gave title for Ocean County lands to Europeans for the first time.
- **1687** East Jersey and West Jersey was split distinctly into two tracts after land disputes forced a line to be surveyed formally between the two territories. This line became known as the Keith Province Line, which eventually divided Ocean and Burlington counties.
- **1696** Captain William Kidd set sail from New York. Soon, he, with his crew, turned pirate and began working the waters off the Southern Jersey coast.
- **1700** Captain Kidd was captured, taken to London where he was tried and hanged for piracy. About this time small settlements began to be established in the Little Egg Habor (Tuckerton), Goose Creek (Toms River), and New Egypt (Plumsted) areas.
- 1712 First road established in Ocean County..
- 1754 French and Indian War erupted and continued until the treaty was signed between the British and French nine years later.
- **1758** A violent storm opened Cranberry Inlet, which later served a major role in the American Revolution and local history before closing during another violent storm in 1812.
- 1767 Dover Township formally established by charter.
- 1778 Count Casimir Pulaski, a Polish cavalry officer, and his legion were engaged by the British on Osborn Island. Forty troops, massacred by the British in a surprise early morning attack, gained the dubious distinction of being the only men from Washington's Army to be killed by the British on Ocean County soil.
- **1782** A British expedition attacked the Toms River Blockhouse and its compliment of twenty-five militiamen under the command of Captain Joshua Huddy. The British burned the village of Toms River and captured and hanged Huddy.
- Notorious Tory outlaw John Bacon and his men committed the Barnegat Light Massacre, slaughtering twenty local crew of a salvaged British sloop as they slept.
- A skirmish at Cedar Creek (now in Barnegat Township) marked last land conflict of American Revolution.
- **1789** George Washington inaugurated as the first president of the United States. The first local iron forge was built on Lake Horicon (near present-day Lakehurst)
- **1814** A formal New Jersey militia was organized to combat British attacks, especially against coastal and naval interests, during the War of 1812.
- **1820** Over-hunting forces an end to the whaling industry in Southern Ocean County.
- **1845** Joel Haywood of West Creek, wrote a letter to the New Jersey State Legislature urging that a new county, called Ocean, be formed from Monmouth County.
- **1850** Ocean County was set-off from Monmouth County by charter on February 15, becoming the state's twentieth county, the second largest in area. It consisted of six original townships Brick, Dover, Jackson, Plumsted, Stafford, and Union (now Barnegat). The 12-member Board of Free-holders met on May 8 at the Thomas P. Barkalow house in Toms River, the designated county seat, and authorized purchase of land and construction of the Ocean County Courthouse. The first operating budget was set at \$1,800.
- 1855 Cultivation of cranberries as a cash crop begun by Daniel Gowdy.
- **1857-** The third (and present) Barnegat Lighthouse was completed at the northern end of Long Beach Island at a cost of \$60,000. The towering 163-foot structure, made of steel, bricks and mortar, maintained watch over the sea until 1927. It is not only the second oldest lighthouse in the United States, but it is also the tallest in New Jersey.
- **1862** Railroads began service through Ocean County. Trains transported Union troops to and from Ocean County during the Civil War.

- **1871** Congress appropriated funding to initiate professionalization of the Life Saving Service. The life-saving service was formalized by Captain Hugh McClellan on Island Beach (later Island Beach State Park). He took 6 trained uniformed men to New Orleans for the World's Fair to demonstrate lifesaving techniques, which became the national standard.
- 1880 A building boom, including many large hotels, began in Lakewood.
- **1895** A crude boardwalk, consisting of boards laid temporarily on the sand, was replaced by a permanent one built on piling in Point Pleasant Beach.
- **1887** Georgian Court, the estate of George Jay Gould, scion of robber baron and railroad tycoon, Jay Gould, was built in Lakewood during the glorious Gilded Age.
- **1913** The Paul Kimball Hospital in Lakewood opened its doors with sixteen beds and a staff of nine.
- **1915** Ocean County was the only county in New Jersey to support a referendum to amend the state constitution extending suffrage to women.
- **1917** The United States entered World War I.The former ammunition proving grounds in Manchester and Jackson townships was acquired by U.S. Army and renamed Camp Kendrick.
- **1923** Lila W. Thompson of New Egypt (Plumsted Township) was elected to the New Jersey General Assembly, thus, becoming Ocean County's first woman legislator.
- **1924** The Lakewood estate of the financier and railroad magnate George Jay Gould was acquired by the Sisters of Mercy to establish Georgian Court College, a four-year women's educational institution.
- **1927** South Toms River Borough, the last of Ocean County's 33 municipalities and the eleventh since 1900, was formed from Berkeley Township lands. By then, the County had 14 townships and 19 boroughs.
- **1937** The Hindenburg, a huge, luxurious, German-built dirigible, crashed in a fiery blaze at Lakehurst Naval Air Station on May 6. The disaster, killing 37 passengers and crew, was reported nationwide on radio as it was happening.
- **1940** John D. Rockefeller, Jr. offered the family's Lakewood estate, both mansion and property) to the County as a gift three years after his father's death.
- **1941** The Freeholders agreed to accept the Rockefeller gift and establish Ocean County's first park on the estate.
- **1945** Operating under the code name "Bumblebee," the world's first successful supersonic ramjet, traveling 1,500 m.p.h., was fired from Island Beach on June 3.
- 1954 Garden State Parkway opens.
- **1962** A savage northeast storm, which destroyed millions of dollars in property and cost the lives of several residents on Long Beach Island in March, did not discourage rebuilding and future development along the shore.
- **1963** Plans for one of the County's first adult communities, Leisure Village in Lakewood, were unveiled.
- Beth Medrash Govoha, a rabbinal college, was established in Lakewood.
- **1964** The Island Beach estate of Henry Phipps, the steel magnate and co-owner of Bethlehem Steel, was purchased by the State for conservation and recreation, establishing Island Beach State Park.
- Ocean County College, a two-year community college, was established in Toms River.
- ${\bf 1970}$ A 92.6% population explosion in the last decade, mushroomed the County's population to 208,470.
- **1975** The Lakewood Little League team won the National Tournament of Champions in August at Williamsport, Pennsylvania, beating Tampa, Florida, 4-3.
- **1990** The County's population was 433,203, representing more than 60 racial and ancestral ethnic groups.
- **1998** The Toms River East American Little League team defeated a Japanese team in the Little League World Series in South Williamsport, Pennsylvania.


