A. CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean was called to order on January 19, 2022 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Deputy Director Haines presiding. Members Crea, Quinn and Vicari were present at the call of the roll. Director Kelly was not present.

E. RESOLUTION - PUBLIC HEARING

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "First order of business."

CLERK GUNTHER: "The first item on the agenda today is a resolution for Public Hearing."

 Accepting the recommendation of the OC Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to acquire property identified as Block 1, Lots 1 & 2, Township of Manchester, totaling approximately 20.10 acres located on Ridgeway Road, in an amount not to exceed \$7,450,000.00 plus up to \$15,000.00 for property tax adjustments.

Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. I will talk about this particular property. If many of you may or may not be aware of it it's the campground that's on Route 571 and right now it is a zoned rural agriculture. As was stated it is adjacent to 95 acres of existing Natural Lands Trust Open Space along Ridgeway Road and in the Pine Lake Park area. And it isn't far from Winding River which is a township area as well as other areas that are along there with Camp Albacondo and such. The property includes over 1,000 feet of frontage on the Toms River and will provide significant public access. Nearly 1,000 acres of Open Space has been preserved by the county in Manchester, Toms River and Jackson Townships along the Toms River between Route 37 in Toms River and Bowman Road in Jackson Township. The property owner accepted our negotiated offer of \$7,450,000.00 and has agreed to demolish structures on the property following the closing. Manchester Township has wholeheartedly supported this purchase

and they are contributing \$1,500,000.00 for the purchase. And Mr. (Tony) Agliata who's Director of Planning will show you the spaces - that is the light green. (on map) That is the property we are purchasing. If you see the dark green that is land that has already been...right next to that land is a church. Right after that there's two properties. We understand the owners of those two properties next to it are also interested and possibly the county looking to buy them. Right after that is the Boy Scout property which the Township of Toms River just purchased. And of course next to that is Camp Albocondo which Toms River and the County of Ocean has purchased together. So you can see it's a very wide area of preserved land which will be preserved forever. It will never go into public hands again or developer's hands again. And I understand that there was...this property was possibly planned for a multi-family purpose but now it's going to be preserved land.

This is a Public Hearing. Does anybody have any questions? If you'll come forward. And state your name and address for the record. If you'll come to the microphone. Thank you."

ANNETTE DIAZ, SURF AND STREAM CAMPGROUND, TOMS RIVER: "Thank you. I currently reside at the Surf and Stream Campground as a year-round, full-time resident for the past four years. I spoke to Mr. Quinn's office last week, I think it was Thursday or Friday. He got back to me quickly. So thank you for that. And then everyone is under the impression that it's not a year-round. There's got to be around 100 people or better that live there year-round. So my question, first and foremost, would be, 'What is the plan?' Because we've heard nothing. And, how fast would something like that be? I currently own a park model – purchased it four years ago when I got divorced – left a \$500,000 house and circumstances brought me there. I don't want to find myself homeless and so here I am."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay, well what I understand it is a seasonal campground. What you have with the owner of the property presently that's between you and the owner. But anytime that we buy any Natural Lands all structures are going to be torn down with that being of course at the owner's expense and they'll be nobody living on the property. Is it going to happen tomorrow? No, because it takes a little bit of time, I'm not sure. Maybe Mr. Agliata might be able to have a timeframe about how long it might take before closing and things such as that. But that is something...you know, I feel very bad, you know, that that's happening. I was told it was a seasonal campground. It's not a year-round campground."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Well, I was sold it as a year-round."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "So I understand that and that's why I'm here..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "But unfortunately..."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "...because I just want to verbalize what I was told."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Right."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "I've been paying fees for the last four years. I have a park model that cannot be moved. So I feel like... I almost feel like I'm falling into a wormhole...like an eminent domain wormhole because you are using up the open space, which is great. I'm not here to, you know, to put a kibosh on anything. But where do I fall? And you know, that's basically...I thought maybe I'd get answers here - reaching out to Barry (Bielat) and Ridgeway at Manchester LLC. Currently I have a registered letter currently going out."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Right."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "But you know I saw the meeting is today and I said let me just be proactive and come on down."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, no, you have every right to come in and ask that question but unfortunately that part of it is not in our hands. We have no legal right with it."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That is between you and the park owner."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "But Tony can you just...is there an approximate time frame that you would be able to give these individuals like if they are there and they've been under the impression that it is a...they can stay there for...you're saying it's year-round which..."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Yeah, well we..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We have been told it's not."

ANNETTE DIAZ: We pay year- round."

ANTHONY AGLIATA, DIRECTOR, PLANNING: "And I did speak with you on..."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "I thought so."

ANTHONY AGLIATA: "So again, we still have to do our due diligence. We have to do a survey, environmental reviews. And again, so as far as the time frame it's very tough to say, but we can say anywhere between probably six months to nine months."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay, okay. Yea because I'm paid up until June so I was like, oh boy, you gave me the number for the...okay...so I mean I just...like I said wanted to..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I would suggest possibly maybe going to Consumer Affairs would be something..."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Yup. I got that number as well. He gave me that number as well."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "You know we were talking about this before the meeting and unfortunately it was a summer seasonal plan. But unfortunately, some have year-long leases which you weren't supposed to get."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Right."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "So we were talking about it. We have the Director of Consumer Affairs, Steve Scaturro that would be more than happy that if you want him to review it...we don't know what we can do but before you go to a lawyer, take any action, Steve Scaturro has a lot of expertise."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Steve if you don't mind just raise your hand. Okay, any questions about the lease Steve is going to take care of it."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay, great. Alright, thank you guys."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "After the meeting just wait a few minutes and we'll be more than happy to talk to you about it."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Okay thank you for all your time. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Joe. Thank you. Anyone else like to come forward? Just state your name and address."

REGINA DISCENZA, FORKED RIVER: "I just have a question about the price. How was the \$372,000 per acre arrived at?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That was...we require two appraisals for any Natural Lands that's done and the Natural Lands Committee that goes and looks at it they get the two appraisals and then make the decision on the property."

REGINA DISCENZA: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "The two appraisals is what we do. We never pay more than the appraised value and that's the appraised value."

REGINA DISCENZA: "It's very excessive. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes. Just come forward and state your name and address."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE, 1801 RIDGEWAY BLVD, TOMS RIVER, SURF AND STREAM CAMPGROUND: "I just want to say for the record that I am also a full-time year-round resident and have been for a better part of the year now. So I realize there may be a loophole or there may be a misunderstanding as to if it is a seasonal or year-round campground, but for the record two people have already stated that they are year-round residents and there is a very high number of other year-round residents."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay well as Commissioner Vicari stated I would suggest...I don't know if you saw Steve Scaturro..."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Absolutely. No, I did. I was paying attention."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...raise his hand so if you have any questions."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Yes, thank you. I just wanted to state that for the record."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, that's fine."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. Is there anyone else who would like to come and speak on this?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Is there a problem with people hearing in the back? Okay, there is a problem. Hold on for one second. Is there something we can do to make it louder for the people in the back?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Is it on?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "First of all, is it on? I don't know if the microphone is on. Mr. Ernst can you check it? Thank you for telling us. It is on."

ENGINEER ERNST: "It's on."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Maybe speak closer into it, possibly."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "I'm his wife."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Oh okay."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "How are you doing?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay. Your name and address."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "I'm James Ackerman. This is my wife Dawn."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Address?"

DAWN ACKERMAN, 1801 RIDGEWAY ROAD, UNIT 196: "We have been residents there for two and a half years with two and a half years of receipts of payment on time. We just want to know."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "We want to know what's going on. Where are we going to go? We've been there almost three years. We're upset."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "I had a liver transplant. I'm on social security. I can't get by anywhere else."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "This is the only place we could afford to live. And we're open for... 'Hey are you going to put apartments there? Great, can we live in them?'

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, what's going to happen is it's being purchased through Natural Lands money – Open Space money so all the structures are going to be torn down. Under Natural Lands Law no one can live there..."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...so it's going to be Open Space land preserved. We've been told that it's a seasonal campground not a year-round campground."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "And it is not."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand. I guess you didn't hear when Commissioner Vicari..."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "We just got here."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...that the head of Consumer Affairs is here so you possibly might want to see...Steve you might want to turn around...raise your hand again, Steve. Thank you."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you Steve."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "And you can talk to Steve because he's head of Consumer Affairs..."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "Okay."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...and he'll be able to direct you to what possibly we can do because it's a contract you have with the owner. It is not something that..."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "We're going to be talking to the owner."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "Yeah, we're just wondering what is contingent with their \$1,500,000.00 that they're giving them. What are they giving it to them for? It's not only to just tear down trailers."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We're buying the land. We're buying the acreage is what we're doing."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "Right."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "And you're giving them money to clean the land?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, no, he does that at his own expense. We do not pay for the land to be cleaned under Natural Lands Law it has to be."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "We just want to know how many days we have - what we need to start prepping for because we've gotten no notice. We had to see it on the Patch on Friday, so..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It might be... I think Mr. Agliata who was showing the picture to everyone being the land it could take up to six to nine months for it to be finalized... so in that period of time."

DAWN ACKERMAN: "It's great even hearing it from you because right now we've heard nothing."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "But that's exactly..."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "I brought her here."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Unfortunately... but I think you really do need to speak with Mr. Scaturro after and just see. And I'm sorry that you were led to believe, you know, that it was year-round but we were told that it's a seasonal campground."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Well, it's definitely year-round. I have receipts for the last..."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "When they said seasonal I wonder if the owner is paying taxes on seasonal or all year-round."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "That's what I want to know."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "So I have a feeling that he's paying taxes on revenue – internal revenue – for seasonal campground and the rest of the money he's probably getting."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Well those were the two choices we were given when we moved in - do you want to be seasonal or do you want to be residential?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Well that's a negotiated point that you may have. So just keep that in the back of your mind."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "And just...I'm sure Mr. Scaturro...there are several of you that if there's others that didn't speak but you also want to get information in regards to that, pertaining to this land, please see Mr. Scaturro after with any of your questions."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Alright. It just ain't right for us."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I certainly understand, but..."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Okay, well I'm just trying to understand."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Commissioner Quinn..."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "We still have to figure where we're going to be. Thank you."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Just for all the folks in the audience talking about this...Tony, just correct me if I'm wrong but we don't buy the land unless the land is already vacant of all property owners or people that are renting property. So he would have to do all that work at his own expense."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "To get us out."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Right."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "He's got to get us out."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "That's something that he's got to come to you and make sure you're out. And I think, if I'm not mistaken, the seasonal versus the year-round would be something you would have gotten approval from the municipality on and they might not be aware of the fact that he is utilizing it for year-round."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "I don't think they are aware of it."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "So there could be a problem over there. There's a lot of things that have to be overcome before we would take title of the property. And most of those things have to be worked out between you and the owner of that property."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Appreciate that. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Exactly. Thank you."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "And I'll bet money when you get an approval, a certification, there's one for summer rentals – there's one for all year-round, I bet, I have a feeling, they never got the proper township certifications for certificate of occupancy for an all year-round residence."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Yea, you're right."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Just to give you a bargaining chip when you're renegotiating to try and get some money back – something to look at."

JAMES ACKERMAN: "Thank you."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Can I just say one thing on that?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well come up to the microphone please so this way we have it on the record."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "I just want to say one thing on his point. I almost don't believe that's true because as it's stated in a lot of the talking points, it's a blight. The cops are there. The ambulances are there. It was in one of the articles. So everyone knows that there are year-round residents. The cops know. The township knows. Everyone knows. You know, I mean so I don't know that that's so true because they would have shut it down."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Could be."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Yea, like they would have used that as the point to shut it down instead of waiting for the sale, so... I just wanted to make that known."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "But there's a violation of the consumer law to get three and a half times your money back as a penalty."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Oh absolutely."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I don't know if the police department when they went there for a violation would look at the certification of occupancy."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Right."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "It's something to look at."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "I'm just thinking they would use that like, 'Hey, this is blah, blah, blah...let's shut them down."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "It's possible."

ANNETTE DIAZ: "Yea."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Definitely just make sure you talk to Mr. Scaturro about that. Thank you. Is there anyone else that would like to come and speak? If not, can we have a motion?"

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

W. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:18 PM, Deputy Director Haines received the following comments from members of the Board:

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. We're going to have Commissioner Comments and then we'll open up to the public. Just so that all of you know it might seem like we went through this agenda very quickly but there is a Preboard meeting which is usually the second and fourth meetings of the month and first and third are our Board meetings. At our Preboard meetings all of the items that have been discussed today and voted on were discussed at that Preboard meeting. I don't want you to think that we just went and did a lot of things and it was not pre-discussed about anything...it was. If any of the Commissioners at the time had any questions they were answered for them by the professional staff so that everything that's on there has been reviewed and it's been approved by the professional staff when it's been given to us.

Now we'll have Commissioner Comments. We'll start with Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you very much, if I may. Good news. As you know Ocean County is very proud of many things but most of all by the way we take care of our senior citizens and the Governor of the State of New Jersey has acknowledged that. And we have over 200,000 senior citizens. And someday we will all be a senior citizen. And well they appointed Maria LaFace, who is the Director of Senior Services, part of one of ten in the State of New Jersey that will be on the Advisory Board so we can plan for the future of how to take care of seniors. What is

our concern? To live in dignity - to live in independence and to have all the things that are necessary for working all of their lives, serving our country, paying taxes, taking care of their children and grandchildren, and now, what's the next important thing, of course living a good life in Ocean County and a good quality of life.

But that's only the first part. Here's the second part. We have received from the State of New Jersey with the American Recovery Plan, \$2.6 million. That \$2.6 million...we will start working on Monday morning and we were just notified about that \$2.6 million. And we have now until September 30th, 2024 to spend that money with the plan that's in five different areas. So again, it's good for our senior citizens. The money stays in Ocean County and it provides the services. The total grant was for \$34 million...of that we got \$2.6 million.

So again, it's good news and it goes to show that it's unexpected but we think we are not only entitled to it, but it will go to good use.

The last item is, I'm glad we have a lot of people over here...when you go to the bank, are you tired when you see all these banks closing all in your neighborhood? And what's happening? You're losing the service. Most of the banks throughout the United States and some in New Jersey, have been closing. It's a major hardship. And especially those that are not inclined to have Wi-Fi and have a computer, that are up there in years because of their age. And more and more banks are closing down. As of two months ago, 24% of all the banks in Ocean County have closed. And what it's doing is presenting a really serious problem to our seniors and those on the lower economic level that just cannot get to a bank or have some issues. And a lot of them are using banking services in other areas such as the stores that open up to cash your check. The good news is that this Friday at 1 o'clock the Banking Commissioner will have a call with us in Ocean County. As everyone remembers I wrote a letter September 30th and I just got notified they will have the meeting. The issue is with many of their residents when they call them back they can't get an answer. When you call the bank they say wait on line or call different numbers. I am still waiting seven months to get an answer from my bank. And that's one of our concerns.

So we'll be on the telephone, via telephone, 1 o'clock in room 304 if anyone wants to attend. It will be an open conference because it concerns a lot of people throughout Ocean County. I've met with several banks as far as expanding the services to make it senior-friendly – to make it easier for people to do their banking who do not want to do it electronically. There's a tremendous amount of fraud that's taking place as we know in scams with the electronic banking. Some people want to go into a brick and mortar bank and that's what part of our discussion is going to be. We will have Maria LaFace representing the senior citizens. Steve Scaturro representing the consumer. And of course any other person that can give us a written policy or a plan of what they find is objectionable when they go to a bank. We are not only representing Ocean County but all 21 counties in the State of New Jersey have issues. So I'm collecting information from all 21 counties throughout the state that will be presented to the Banking Commissioner. It's the Department of Banking and Insurance. The Commissioner wrote me a letter personally. And again, I just want to deal with her personally, not with anyone from her office – Marlene Caride is the one that will be present on Friday. So any member of the Board or public or members of the meeting that would like to listen to the conference call while I will present the problems, the concerns, any possible solutions. And again, we don't only identify a problem, we look for solutions.

So again, if anyone has any concerns call my office. Any questions that you may have please let us know. Thank you very much. That concludes my report."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you Commissioner. New Commissioner, Bobbi Jo Crea."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you very much. I have no comments for tonight. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay, thank you. Commissioner Quinn."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Thank you very much. I have one comment. Just as Commissioner Vicari said with regards to senior citizens...we also have the largest veterans population in the entire State of New Jersey living here in Ocean County. And last year we made some changes in that department and I just want to recognize one of the items on our personnel resolution today which was just approved is the fact that we're appointing a new Director in the department – that gentleman is Phil Zimmerman who happens to be sitting in the very back row there. Phil, can you stand up? Phil has been with us for a number of years and he has worked with all the individuals in the department and I'm very happy to say that starting tomorrow morning Phil will be the go-to guy taking over the department making sure that we continue to provide all the services that we have to provide to the vets in the, you know, county itself. Along with Phil we have Ed McBride right behind him. Ed was good enough...Ed works in our Consumer Affairs Department. I want to thank you for your service over the last eight months, you know, covering your department until we got to this point. We were able to move Phil up and do it. And I also see Vinny sitting next to Phil. Another one of our VFO's back there. The veterans services is such an integral part of this county because of the fact that we have so many seniors and I'm very, very happy to see the department now moving in a new direction. And I'm even more so happy to see that with the help of the mayor and the council in Toms River here, gaining the ability to have the veterans new clinic built up on Hooper Avenue in Toms River. We're going to have like a one-stop shop for the veterans in this county to be able to take and get their benefits and work with our staff as well as going over to the clinic. I see Justin's in the back there. You know, working with the Toms River folks, the county folks, and the veterans services and the hospital is only going to be a real benefit for the people that we have living in Ocean

I look forward to working with you. I thank you for taking the position and we wish you the very best and keep up the

good work."

PHIL ZIMMERMAN: "Thank you Commissioner."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Thank you very much. Thank you Commissioner."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. I have no comments but I do want to congratulate Phil and I'm sure he'll do a great job at the Veterans. (services)

X. PUBLIC COMMENTS - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:26 PM, Deputy Director Haines opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "And now we're going to open to the public - comments from the members of the audience. You are limited to five minutes. When you come up and speak just state your name and address for those who would like to come up and speak bring something before us. Rory."

RORY WELLS, 208 OAK LANE, MANCHESTER, NJ: "Hello. Thank you out to the Commissioners and for your service. Just two quick points. This week I just want to officially recognize on the record this week we celebrated Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., a holiday on Monday. If you were fortunate enough to have that day off I hope you reflected on the importance of that work and the contributions we've been going through as a nation, as a community.

The second point, everybody I knew was sick over Christmas and New Year's. I'm very hopeful that we are on the backside of the spike for COVID. I know our Health Department's been doing a great job in terms of getting tests and testing and those sorts of things. But I just wanted to say publicly I hope like everyone feels with the number of people that are vaccinated, with those that have natural immunity, with those that have been sick, that hopefully the spike is on the backside and we can go into the winter and summer session in a good position.

So I just wanted to put those two comments on the record and thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay, thank you Rory. Anybody else? Just state your name and address."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI, BRICK, NJ: "Good afternoon Commissioners. I want to start by asking that my statement and my questions be entered into the meeting minutes. And I also brought copies to submit to the Board as well. And if I do go over time by about 30 seconds I would appreciate if you guys just permit it because I've come here with a very important topic one that I've spoken before and we have some questions.

So on September 14th I stood before this Board and I questioned your decision to contract Dominion Voting machines. At the time the company was the subject of national election controversy, and they still are to this day. I quoted Commissioner Quinn who reassured us that your decision would ensure that Ocean County races would continue to be safe and not fraudulent like they were in other parts of the country. It's incomprehensible that there is any acknowledgement of the existence of election irregularities on a national scale by this Board, yet when it comes to elections in our own county, in your county, you continue to permit our Election Board, which answers to you, to deny us transparency and accountability.

In my pursuit of truth regarding our elections I sought to obtain public records from the Election Board you oversee. I requested footage for all mail-in ballot drop boxes in the county for both the 2020 Presidential and the 2021 Gubernatorial Elections. I requested the records to verify just how secure our elections are in Ocean County. The Election Board continues to make it exceedingly difficult to obtain these records. As you already know they are attempting to slap an unfounded \$4,000.00 price tag on records that are typically free to access. You can imagine my surprise, because this Election Board has been so difficult, but they were very nonchalant in their disclosure that they are blatantly disregarding record retention rules that are designated by both the New Jersey Treasury Department as well as federal statute. So to prevent the illegal destruction of this footage I was forced to file a complaint with the Superior Court of Ocean County, who already has issued me a temporary order of restraint preventing our Election Board from preventing these records...destroying these records, excuse me. The litigation is scheduled to be disposed on February 4th. In the meantime I did write a letter to everybody on this Board with the exclusion of Miss Crea because she is new. And I did request assistance with obtaining this footage. In my plea for help I asked the Board other questions. I asked how the Ocean County voters can have faith in the integrity of the ballot boxes when the Election Board continues to deny the only footage that can substantiate it. And I also asked if the County Election Board is so confident in the manner in which our local elections are run, why are they refusing to be accountable to us, the voting public. Administrator Block just responded to me on January 12th and he said this Board is prohibited from replying, responding or commenting on the contents of my letter because they are the subject matter of litigation in the Superior Court and that communication would be inappropriate.

For the purpose of this meeting I will assume that you are also precluded from communicating, why you all agree that \$4,000.00 is an appropriate fee for the Election Board to charge, which again, are typically free. Nonetheless, I would like to remind this Board that my litigation is civil in nature and the scope of its subject matter strictly pertains to the access of public records.

Many of us here today have assembled to show that we are educated about the unlawful activity you have permitted our Election Board to engage in and we are demanding answers. Today, Commissioners, you have a choice. You can

choose to hide behind the fact that I have a pending lawsuit but it will only confirm our suspicions that Ocean County Government's transparency issues start at the top with every single one of you. You can try to insult our intelligence by acting like you don't know the difference between a civil public records lawsuit and a potential criminal complaint to avoid giving us answers but we do demand urgent and immediate response on this matter. Your silence would just be a very weak attempt at dodging responsibility for the Election Board's actions. You have a choice to be accountable and transparent and that's all we're asking for. We pay your salaries we should not have to beg for free and fair elections. So we want simple answers to simple questions today, none of which, I'll say it again, is the subject of litigation in the Superior Courts.

Our questions are, 'Are you aware of our Election Board's written admission to violating chain of custody rules and laws for both the 2020 and 2021 elections?' I brought copies of their emails for reference even though I sent them to you already.

'Are you aware that Title 52, which is federal law, dictates that all election records be retained and preserved for 22 months from the date of any Presidential Election?'

'Are you also aware of election or custodian who willfully fails to comply with this section should be fined \$1,000.00 or imprisoned for not more than one year or both?'

'Are you also aware that the New Jersey Treasury Department's retention rule for the gubernatorial election, this past election, for those records it's two years?'

'Are you aware of your duty to ensure that our Election Board adheres by all state rules and Federal election laws? Do you understand that if they do not, it is your responsibility to hold them accountable?'

'And do you plan to investigate these matters and hold the Election Board accountable? When and how?'

Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We're not trying to hide behind any legal thing but I'm not sure how much we can answer and I know that our County Counsel will say that if any part of that, that is under litigation we cannot comment on. That we cannot do. So what particular question...I'm not sure exactly what ones are under the litigation because..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Just the records."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I don't have a problem answering anything. I just want to make sure that we're going to be answering without having a problem with the litigation. That's the only reason I'm asking our Counsel."

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "I don't know how you parse certain things from the litigation. There is pending litigation involving the Election Board and involving the allegations that they're not following state law and federal law. That's pending before a judge and my recommendation to you would be, just like any other case, it's in litigation. Let the court take its course. Let the court make its decision. And I would refrain from any comment."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "So this is...my litigation, again, it is a public records lawsuit. We are negotiating the fee. And again, these allegations of criminality are not included in that. This is obviously separate. This was revealed throughout the process of going through requesting the records. I have not filed a criminal complaint to my knowledge. No other criminal complaints have been filed. So I disagree that this is not the subject of the litigation."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand that you're saying that they've committed a criminal...well this is something that we would have to then investigate, I would imagine, to point out exactly, I don't know if Mr. Block has anything..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Director, if I could start with a couple of things..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...because I know he's had conversations."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Let's start with the Board of Elections. Board of Elections actually on election matters is actionable to the state and not to the county. They are Commissioners, two Republican, two Democrat, appointed by the Governor and the only reason the county currently is involved in their record request is that typically legal advice for election matters is given by the Deputy Attorney General. However, when the Board of Elections asked for direction on your request they were told by the Attorney General's office that they don't do OPRA requests, therefore we had to send that to the County Counsel. So in the general (inaudible) when you're talking about the Board putting them under the microscope, if you will, for election decisions, it is the state they answer to, the State Division of Elections. The OPRA came here because they refused to do so.

My understanding is also that is that you have been in communication as I have with the Board of Election's supervisors, there's two of them. One is unfortunately on vacation. The other hopefully is here. And then you had asked for other records which they have produced."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "They have produced logs and chain of custody and as a matter of fact I had my secretary put together a box – but it's a whole box full of stuff over here. So my understanding is that the only...and you can correct this if I'm wrong...I'll stand corrected and please I would love to know that...that the only thing in dispute is the videos."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Everything else has been answered."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "For a matter of transparency everything has been given to you but the videos."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Okay. Now, the videos...and the \$4,000.00, I'll be back to explain. When the state changed the law last year in 2020, they added, first by executive order and then by statutory change...these...let us remember last year in 2020 was an all-mail election and they came up with this idea of the mail boxes and we were mandated to put at least 17 of them in. And we were mandated to put cameras on them. We were mandated to record it, great. This year it was not an all-mail election but they decided to have early voting and added two boxes so we were up to 19 now. Fine, we follow the law. We're not allowed to not do that. So as we went along the direction up to that point was clear whether we agreed with it or not, whether we thought that was a good choice or not. I didn't personally like the all-mail election last year and I'm a former County Official, County Election Official, County Clerk, I thought it was a wrong decision. But you know what? I'm not the Governor. They gave no direction in the changes either in the executive order or in the statutory changes what to do once the election was over. So there was no...in all due respect, there was no state retention, retention schedule, outlined in those changes. So the best you can do is fall back on it and say, 'Okay, well let's treat it as an OPRA request – use the general OPRA criteria.' At which point that's why at the opening of your hearing the judge said, 'Well the county is not disputing...you can have them.' But OPRA does permit that an escrow be established. That the cost of anything other than a typical email or whatever, would allow to be charged whatever the cost was to the taxpayers would be charged to the applicant. Anything unused would be returned. That's where the discussion can't go any further because it is in litigation. But you're at that point, the hearing on February 4th, I believe will resolve that."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "I do just want to say for the record though the Election Board was not willing to produce the records. In fact they said it posed multiple security risks. They said that..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "That was their first response."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "It was not their response during the hearing. I don't believe...again, correct me if I'm wrong, at the hearing you were told that they were available..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Yes, and there was a resolution."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "...as a matter of fact, I think at the hearing which was done by computer and not in person..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "...it was my understanding that you agreed to that but later sent an email which said, 'Even though I agree to it \$4,000.00 is too high."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Yes, I'm not an IT expert so I don't know what the cost..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I agree."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "...for something like that."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "And neither am I. But we're on the same page now. My understanding from our IT Department is that the amount of information that we extracted and was given to you which there was no problem in doing is somewhere just shy of two terabytes which is a significant amount of data to download. They have merely worked up what the cost would be between the time to go and put that on to a device which they can then give to you. Now a video takes a lot of space and that's why it's a lot of time. They've actually timed each camera, each device, because there's now 19 of them. And there are separate systems. They are in the library system as well as our system because the state moves so quick there was no way of keeping up with the speed. The state was demanding without trying to get things organized as fast as we could. Therefore they're going to have to go offsite to some servers – go onsite to some servers. It would take some time. But the fact that, you know, again, I'm not an attorney or the judge, but whatever the judge says I'm sure the County Commissioners are willing to do. So it is not something...any opposition to. The law (inaudible) though because it wouldn't even rise to this level. An OPRA request doesn't come

to County Commissioners, typically, because why should it? The law airs what you're allowed to do and not do. And if there is a dispute you go to appeal... records council where they then adjudicate it."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "I don't think ever in the history of this state there was ever a 30-day retention rule for election records. I mean either way...I was told that it was 30 days in writing for both elections and I don't know where that information was coming from. So that's the issue that we have to address because..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Well, again, the initial response from you I did not know of or hear of until after it was over. So (inaudible) ask that. The other thing is Title 52 that I think you referred to? I believe it's a federal statute. And in questioning County Counsel they're telling me that there are many documents and papers covered by Title 52 in the federal statute but the videos of the drop boxes isn't one. So if it's not covered by the Title then it can't be a violation of it. But, again, it doesn't matter, for 2021 we have the videos, they're here. And retention didn't need...not need... a restraining order to get one because there was no one to get rid of it. I think that's as far as we can go with answering everything else. And I think as a former election official we want everyone to have confidence in the election results and sometimes it's not necessarily an OPRA request but maybe a question, 'Well, how do you do this? Why does it come out that way?' I would have no problem, I'm sure the Commissioners would not. Setting up a meeting with some of the Board of Elections folks to explain, or myself or someone explain...what is the process? What happens? I think there was a comment you made, at one point, the ballots were counted faster this year than last year. Well, that's because last year it was almost a half a million of them and this year there was not even 80,000. So obviously they were done a lot quicker. Number two – there was more scanners available this year because we bought more so it would not affect the speed. And again, because the Commissioners, typically, the Deputy Director, Commissioner Haines, has supported...she's the liaison to the Board of Elections and she wants to make sure they have everything they need to effectuate a fair and safe election."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "I do just want to clarify with (inaudible). I said last year that they had counted them so early and I have multiple eyewitnesses saying that Frank Holman was attempting to close the polls early in my town, in Brick, because he already knew who the winner was. But then this year we had however many extra days in my town...it might have been two days after."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You can't close the polls early. The law is the law."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "I'm saying this is what people witnessed when they were working the polls and what he was saying. So at the end of the day we have all convened here because there is..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Are you talking about the 2021 election that he tried?"

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "That was 2020."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We did not have people at the polls. The only people that would have been at the polls...there was only a small amount of people..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Provisional."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "... and it was a few machines that were used and it was only those that were handicapped."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "And there were still workers who witnessed that. I spoke with them."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, I'm not saying that. I'm just saying you can't close the poll whether he tried to or not he cannot close the polls early."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "No, I know."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It has to go until 8 o'clock."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "That's why it's alarming to hear that testimony from multiple poll workers."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No he did not. And there was 445,000 ballots mailed in 2020 and what we had to do we had to hire...I don't even...we had National Guard come in to help us do the ballots because we had so many and that was just opening them as well as scanning them and just getting to do the process because it did take a long time to do it with all the extra staff. It took three weeks - two shifts a day. It was 21 days for them to just stuff the ballots and mail them – to get them ready to go to the mail. That was just to get it to send to the people in 2020 and then when we received them we were getting them and we were saying we sent out 445,000 which normally if we send out 50,000 or 60,000 for mail-in would be a lot. So there was a big difference in 2020. But if that was the case, as I said, you cannot change the election law. The election law is 8 PM. It's 6 AM to 8 PM and that's what it is. If he tried to do that he was wrong. He can't do it. So I don't see how he could go around saying that but I wasn't there so I can't comment on that but as you know that is not the law that you have to keep the polls open until 8 o'clock. Anyone that is in the polling place at 8 o'clock even it goes after 8 o'clock they have to be allowed to vote. You can't come in after 8 o'clock to vote but if you're in that polling place you can stay in there and you can vote even if they have a line of 100 people in a polling place they all have to give that right to vote. And that's when that polling place would close. So I can't answer for what Mr. Holman may or may not have said because I wasn't a witness to it but

the law is the law and we definitely follow that law."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "And Director if I could add one more thing about counting them early...the state, because of the volume that the Director just mentioned, the state allowed the Board of Elections to start adding them earlier. So if someone said, 'Oh they started counting them earlier.' Yeah, they did. Because the state said there's so many of them and they'll never be able to get them done in time they authorized the counties to start counting ballots sooner than they would which is...we can't start counting until Election Day. But they allowed them to be opened and processed and so forth earlier because it was an all-mail election which was why I didn't agree with it myself because it causes all these ripple changes but that was what was done."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That was just in 2020."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "And you're supposed to (inaudible) there are ballots, this year, there were ballots because they changed the law also that you could receive a ballot, the Board of Elections could receive it and count it, they even said as long as it's postmarked by the day of election. The old law was it had to be in the possession of the Board of Elections by 8 PM on Election Day, period."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "The Governor changed the law."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Done. That's it. And as the Director was mentioning but this year they changed it and you could receive it later as long as it's postmarked before."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Until a week after the election."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "The Board of Election was receiving ballots up to November 5th which was days after the election based on the calendar. So..."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "So is there any surprise that we have such a turnout today? There's a lot of inconsistencies with some of the policies regarding our elections and that's what we're..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand that. And a lot of it as you can see was things that came down from Trenton. It was not any of our doing because if... I would not have had a mail-in ballot. I like going to the polls myself. I don't like mail-in. I'd rather go and use the machine but what the Governor did...he did an executive order and he just said it was going to be mail-in for 2020. And in 2021 he did early voting. It was the first time we did early voting. We did not have as many people go for early voting as I think they thought was going to happen in the State of New Jersey. We did have a majority of the people go to the polls on Election Day and we did not have as many people do as we had in the previous years to do mail-in ballot. A lot of times we get mail-in ballots of people that are usually going to be away, a lot of people that go to Florida for the winter – that type of thing where they're going to be out of town on that particular day. But with the Governor and the Legislature changing the laws on us...it was very quickly handed down, as Mr. Block had stated with different laws that came down and some of them really weren't fully thought about when they did it. Having been in the Legislature I know that many times when they do a piece of legislation there's a lot of things that we think we've covered everything and then they end up not covering at all and then you don't find out until after the fact that, well we should have included this. Well they need to amend many of the election laws that were put down. And that's one thing with the New Jersey Legislature has to do as well as with the Governor has to sign that legislation (inaudible) for it because there was a lot of, I felt, inconsistencies that I did not feel was proper or correct that they should have been doing. But I was only one person and there's a lot more in the Legislature and we have the Governor that has to handle those things so that's where it comes from."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "So what kind of reassurance can you provide, you know, myself and the people who I've invited to this meeting today that this will be confirmed – it will be looked into. Again, I looked on the Treasury Department's website there is a record retention rule. It definitely does not say 30 days so..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You said you have copies for us?"

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Yes."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We'll make sure that we have those copies – each one of us. We will make sure that is all looked into and get back to you. As long as we have your phone number and everything and then we will get back to you with regards to that."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It's not a problem."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Okay. Thank you all for your time."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You're quite welcome. I just need your name."

JOHN LOVERDE, 2206 RIVIERA PARKWAY, POINT PLEASANT: "I just want to make a comment. Hopefully it's entered into a record. Anna Lichnowski just made reference to a Board member that referenced fair and honest elections and all that and I don't know anyone on this Board could ever say that given all the controversy with the

Dominion machines and their software that's included in those machines. The day of voting I was a poll worker. I was not allowed, and I know what you're going to say, it's by law, but I was not allowed to ask anyone for identification. You could come up and say you're 'Putin' you come here to vote and I had to enter you into that so you could get your slip and go vote in the machine.

Last thing I want to say is that, and I did not do this, I was given a thumb drive because my other two coworkers did not want to take the time to bring all the materials to the township. I did. No one made me sign for it. So chain of custody, no one made me sign anything so when someone says it fair, it's honest, it's transparent, it's baloney. I could have ridden around town. I could have taken those thumb drives, brought them somewhere, contaminated them, changed them, zeroed them out, but no I brought them to the town as I was asked to. And when I gave them up no one signed for them. Once they were out of my hands, what happened to them? Just food for thought. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I just want to make a quick comment in regards to...I know as an Election Board employee, because you are an Election Board employee..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "That's correct."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...on the day so you took it there. I would presume that you should sign for it but I'm not sure because I think in the past when I had been a Board worker when you took things back you would have to...I had to take it back to the township. You didn't take it to the County Election Board, you took it to the township but you would have to sign in that you were dropping the books off. That's what we had to do."

JOHN LOVERDE: "That's not the case now."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I asked about...because I went to the classes. I went to the Election Board classes because I wanted to see it because with the new pads that we're doing as well as the new machines. I wanted to see. And the new machines were only, as you know, were only used for early voting. They were not used for the other. I wanted to see how it was going to be done. I asked the question..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "I questioned the iPads. The iPads were used the day of to access the database for the election."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "True, they did. But what I'm getting at is...I asked the question about asking about asking for ID. Under state law we are not allowed to ask. What you could have done is if you did not like the signature of the...this is how it was explained to me...if you did not like the signature that they had written and it was different from the signature that was on the pad that you were looking at, you then could ask for ID but you cannot ask for ID prior to a voter coming up. It is against the law. They have not passed the law in the State of New Jersey to ask for ID."

JOHN LOVERDE: "Correct. As to your point of the signature...the signature...if one or two of the letters match it was okay. This according to the training class that I took. When was it - October, September - whenever they gave it. So you know when someone signs even the signature on the computer pad that they would sign always seemed different than what the County, what the Board of Elections had on file. So it was very difficult, for me as an individual, to ascertain whether that was correct or not. And it wasn't just a simple matter like, 'Okay I don't think that's that signature.' Now you had to call someone over. But I had a coworker that was next to me, and I'm not going to say his persuasion, but he was just turning people away. Don't look the same...don't... provision...just turning them away. Whereas I asked for that person to close them out, let them come to me, and if I had a problem I called the number that I was given. Or, I spent that extra time with that individual and I found that person in the database. Whereas my coworker did not take the time to do that. So I think there's a lot of homework that needs to be done with regards to voting. This whole mail-in ballot is a mess but that's not the point I'm trying make here."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That was not...and also just to mention... I guess I can mention..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "I'm not debating it with you. I'm just bringing up facts and points."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...no, no, no. I just want to mention the Dominion. Dominion...the machines that we used during the General Election are Sequoias. Dominion, for the mere fact, bought the company Sequoia. They are not the same Dominion machine."

JOHN LOVERDE: "So Pepsi bought Coke..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, no, no, you don't know what I'm saying. It's not the same machine that you had that was used in other parts of the country. It is not the same machine at all."

JOHN LOVERDE: "But it's the same company under that same ownership. Coke bought Pepsi or bought RC. That's my analysis."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand that. I asked those questions, you understand. I particularly asked those questions also about the machine. I asked the questions about Dominion. I asked who was the owner. I asked all of those questions and these are the answers that I was given. And that's how it was that Dominion...Sequoia was going under and they bought the machines. Next year we will not be using those machines whatsoever, you will be using the machines that were used in early voting – those are the machines that will be used not the machines that you

saw before. They are totally different. And they are live. As you know when you go in and you register to vote, when you register on the day of Election Board early voting, when you sign that it is live back to the Election Board so that in the early voting you can go to different polling places – we had ten different polling places around the county. So it meant that if you lived in Brick and you wanted to vote and you were down in Tuckerton area you could vote at... I think it was at the Southern Resource Center. You could go there to vote. But it meant that you could not go back to Brick and vote again because it was live at the time and it went right directly so they had a record that you had already voted so you would not be able to vote again. That's how the poll pads, the new poll pads, as you know, worked. So for next year those other machines that we had before are not. So we're using the new machines because the Governor wanted to have a paper trail. So that's why we had the machines that you had to do the paper so that it would be a better audit and with a paper trail. That is what the Governor wanted. We had two machines to choose from."

JOHN LOVERDE: "That's what we had. That is true. But, still the question is, now the new machines...and this is a sidebar, I concur it's not what we were just talking about. The new machines will be on the internet. And I think most of the..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Not the machine itself the poll pad will be. Only the poll pad, not the machine."

JOHN LOVERDE: "What goes out on the internet can come back on the internet. So it's right for all."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well no we also...our IT Department works very close with..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "That's all I do is IT. So if you want to talk IT with me I'll talk to you about IT."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I'm just saying that our IT Department has worked with all of the agencies. And she's here, our head of IT Department..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "Love to speak with her."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...there was a whole list of agencies that she works with to make sure that it's a very secure line that's going. So if you would like to talk to her about that after she is here, Mary Lou Mycoff, she is head of our IT Department..."

JOHN LOVERDE: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...and I'm sure she would be able to answer any questions. Mary Lou, can you just raise your hand so they know who you are? She's head of the IT Department and she'd be happy to answer any questions with regards to that list. There was a list. I met with her to find out exactly...'alright, how do we know it's secure'? And she went down the whole list of all the different areas and proved what department it was and who it is. And every day or a few times a week if it wasn't every day, she was having meetings, whether it was conference calls or zoom meetings with different departments with regards to the security that we wanted to make sure that we had with our voters.

So, I mean, we tried to take every single step that we possibly could take to make sure that this was going to be a fair and secure election. So, I mean, we tried to do everything that we possibly could to do that. And I feel that it was."

JOHN LOVERDE: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Mary Lou is here and I'm sure if you any questions she'd be more than happy to answer them."

JOHN LOVERDE. "Okay. Thank you for your time and thank you for listening to me."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. You may come forward. Just state your name and address."

DONNA NEIL, FORKED RIVER: "I'm a 67 year old grandmother of 8, 9, whatever. I'm losing count. But anyway, I just have to come up because I have to tell you...I retired three years ago and I have not had the time of my life. I cannot believe what's going on in the world and especially in these elections and what's going on with our kids. Part of it...a lot of it is my fault. I take full responsibility. I've been very complacent, naïve, letting everything just fly by me totally not paying attention to whatever is going on. I don't know if a lot of you feel that. If you had felt that way raise your hand because now we're awake. And we're finding out things that we never, ever knew before. I've listened to all this voting. How ironic that things changed in the last year and we didn't have laws put into place. How ironic that we don't have driver licenses for voting when people have to go into Wawa to show their license for JUUL and cigarettes and go into a liquor store for liquor. And yet we have no ID for voting."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I agree with you."

DONNA NEIL: "I got to tell you...I may not know all that's gone on and I may be very naïve but there is one thing about me...I have common sense and none of this makes sense. None of it makes sense and we're waking up and it's starting to make sense. And let me tell you it's not a good place."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I think..."

DONNA NEIL: "And I know you're doing everything supposedly to help but I feel like I've been raped, honestly. My daughter didn't find out whether her vote was counted online until after Governor Murphy was put into office. What happened to her vote? There are a lot of people like that. A lot of people that had their votes... were going online — couldn't find their vote. All of a sudden Jack (Ciattarelli) steps down and Murphy's the Governor. And all these people that voted for Jack their votes weren't even showing up on the computers. How do you explain that? How do you explain that? Voting machines should not be determined by the state. They should be determined by a vote from the people. We are the people. We should decide how we work things. There should be specific things on the voting that we make determinations for. This is not a bureaucracy. This is a republic and at this time, I'm telling you people are starting to really revolt. And that's all I have to say and it's all through common sense. It's not through my knowledge. However, I'm not a dumb person. I was a CEO and I will start learning about politics. And I will start getting involved in my senior citizen life. Amen. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. I don't disagree with you. I think the one thing you need to do because it is the Legislature and the Governor that makes the laws, it is not us, unfortunately."

DONNA NEIL: "We don't believe in these elections."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well I will tell you Ocean County gave Jack Ciattarelli \$100,000.00 plurality. The only county that came close to us was \$23,000.00. There was no other counties that came out and gave the plurality to Jack Ciattarelli because they did feel that he was, obviously, the person that they wanted. The other counties did not feel this way."

DONNA NEIL: "Well Ocean County is a horse of another color. Am I right?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well all I can say is it's the legislature. What you need to do is to contact your Legislature. Now that you..."

DONNA NEIL: "We are."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...but it's not just...how do I say this delicately?"

DONNA NEIL: "We're getting involved."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You have a Democrat Governor. You have a Democrat Legislature, the Senate and the Assembly. So yes, contact the legislators that represent the people here in Ocean County. But it's also important for you to contact the legislators that represent the other parts of New Jersey that are in control. I mean our people can go and put legislation in but it doesn't mean that it's going to get into a committee and be heard."

DONNA NEIL: "I agree. But you know what? We contacted the legislators concerning the masks and the vaccines and the emergency powers. They did not recommend that Governor Murphy's emergency powers be extended. Was Governor Murphy's power extended? Yes, he extended it. So what point is it to contact...we all contacted the legislators? And they agreed with us."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "But the legislators...what I'm saying is the legislators that represent Ocean County, and I'm not trying to make this political, are Republican. Trenton is controlled by the other party. What I'm saying is it's not just contacting your legislators that represent us here in Ocean County. You need to contact...there is a number of you...you need to contact the legislators that represent the other parts. Look to see who the leaders are within the State of New Jersey that are controlling the legislature - your Senate President, your Speaker who is in charge of the different committees. They're the ones that you need to besides the Governor that you need to get in touch with."

ANONYMOUS: "We're questioning they're our representatives in fact. We are questioning they are in fact the representatives to elections."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "They can put the legislation in. What I'm getting at is if a Republican puts legislation in it doesn't necessarily mean that the bill is even going to get to a committee because the Democrats...and I'm trying not make it Republican/Democrat but that is the fact of life right here in New Jersey. It's Republican or Democrat. The Democrats are in control of the Governor and they're in control of the legislature. My point is yes get in touch with your legislators here but also get in touch with the legislators that represent other parts of New Jersey especially the leaders. That is the only way you are going to get any legislation changed. And they need to hear from other people. I mean it's a very nice crowd that we have here today. It's great. But it's not just...if we could change the law, believe me, we would change the law. When I served in the legislature Republicans were in control. We haven't been in control for over 20 years. Ever since Jim McGreevey we lost control in 2002. Unfortunately it's Democrat controlled so you have to go to the leaders of that party to try and get...signed your own and tell them...you know, go to Trenton. Go to the committee meetings."

DONNA NEIL: "But thank you very much. I appreciate your comments."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "But that's the only thing that we can do is suggest for you to do, unfortunately.

Yes, come forward. And just give your name and address."

PATRICK SMITH, 10 TORONTO DRIVE, BRICK, NJ: "You say it was a fair election that everything's handled fair...I moved here from Middletown a few years ago. Right off the bat I've always been a Republican. I come there they tell me I'm a registered Democrat. The woman was very nice. I filled out paperwork so it would be changed. Next time I go there, Adamston Road, I go back there again the next time to vote – same thing I'm still a registered Democrat. I'm fed up. The next time I go I returned three ballots right next door – upstairs. I go there I turn in the ballots. I tell them what happened. She had me fill out paperwork. I just went to Adamston Road last time to vote, I'm a registered Democrat. What's going on? I come back. I'm furious. I go downstairs to the basement. I went upstairs first. They sent me downstairs. I'm wondering what's going to happen next time I get there. Am I still a Democrat?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well hopefully..."

DONNA NEIL: "You don't look it."

PATRICK SMITH: "Hopefully Republican."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: Hopefully it will be Republican. But the thing is I will make sure that we have the name...and I know someone from the Election Board is here in the audience today and I know that he is taking many notes of things that have been stipulated by each and every one of you."

PATRICK SMITH: "But I mean how many times? So my vote wasn't even counted."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "And he probably has your name so I am sure that it will be checked and we will make sure that it is checked and that your registration especially if you filled it out, three, four times?"

PATRICK SMITH: "Four times now."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Four times."

PATRICK SMITH: "The last one I don't know about yet. But three times and I was in that building the third time."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Can you do me a favor before you leave?"

PATRICK SMITH: "Yeah."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Our Administrator, Mr. Block, sir, can you do me a favor? Just triple check everything so it doesn't go wrong again. Your name?"

PATRICK SMITH: "Patrick Smith."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Okay, and..."

PATRICK SMITH: "Brick, New Jersey."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "What is the street so we..."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "What's the street?"

PATRICK SMITH: "10 Toronto Drive."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Toronto Drive?"

PATRICK SMITH: "Toronto Drive."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Toronto Drive. Mr. Smith, it will be taken care of."

PATRICK SMITH: "Thanks."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You're welcome. Come forward."

FRANK SAVANNAH, 907 LINDEN AVENUE, BRICK: "How are you doing? Don't mind my nerves here. The question about the gentleman or that it was alleged...the gentleman at one of the polling places in Brick tried to close it down...what was his name?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Frank Holman."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Can we get it stated on the record that he didn't? Can somebody ask him that?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Oh I'm going to find out."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "We will find out."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Oh thank you. Alright. And the only question I have is so last year...am I mistaken Ocean County purchased \$2.5 million worth of Dominion or Sequoia software?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "The State of New Jersey paid for the machines."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "For Ocean County."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "For Ocean County, yes."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Did anybody receive any campaign contributions from them?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No. They never have. Not one dime was ever received in a contribution by Dominion."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Okay, just double checking, that's all."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Even though it was stated differently by someone that ran for office. It's been proven that not one dime..."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "The Governor himself makes the decision that Ocean County gets the Dominion Software no matter what?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "There was ES&S or Dominion..."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...nine counties chose Dominion and twelve counties chose ES&S. Of the nine, seven were Democrat and two were Republican so it didn't matter. They felt that that machine was going to be the better machine, just the machine not the poll pads. The poll pads...that's a whole separate argument. That was a different company."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "I just want...I remember early on last...when the pandemic broke out and the Governor stated that the Constitution was above his pay grade."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes, he did say that."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "And I wondered where he was getting his guidance from at that point. I'm honestly thinking there really needs to be much more pushback on the Governor and I know you guys will say you agree with me but..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I do."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "We really, really need to take more stance. And I know there's a couple Board of Education members here...maybe this isn't the place...I'm not sure. But God help us for what they're doing to kids. With everybody here...well virtual...almost all of us are maskless and kids are still wearing them. These townships have to tell the mayor...the Governor..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It's the Governor."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "Yeah, and let him deal out whatever punishment he's going to do. Courage is contagious and the more towns...Middletown wrote a letter saying we're not going to hold back. So what did he do? Of course he sent a letter back saying whatever punitive actions he was taking against the town and they folded. And for the life of me, I can't understand why they just don't have a pair, pardon my language. Really there has to be more pushback."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Director if I could. During that sudden pause the simplest fact I think I can explain it is any county in New Jersey, all 21, can neither purchase or use any machinery unless it's certified by the state. The State of New Jersey Office of Elections actually tests and certifies the equipment. There is a certified list that's online and we're only allowed to use one of those. So the choice is not anything you'd like it's only that which is certified by the state. Sorry, I didn't mean to interrupt."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "And Mr. Smith before you sit down just so you understand the declaration card...he'll get it straightened out for you but the declaration that you have does not matter when you walk into a polling place in the General Election — whatever you vote that day you're not required to...as in the primary you have to vote either Democrat or Republican, but the day of General Election your vote..."

FRANK SAVANNAH: "They told me it would only be counted if the race was close."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "No, no. Your vote took place and he will make sure tomorrow the Board of Elections will get that squared away."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes, just name and address."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD, LAKE BARNEGAT DRIVE, LACEY: "You're all Republicans. You have the power to do a forensic audit of Ocean County. I sent information to all of you last year from Seth Keshel who's a retired military intelligence officer. He did an analysis of every county in the nation after the 2020 election – statistical analysis comparing past elections to 2020. He found fraud and Ocean County had significant fraud according to his analysis he stated in his report that Ocean County would be a prime place to do a forensic audit because you're Republican you can cooperate. You can do it. You have the power to do it. It's not a recount. It's a forensic audit. And you can find and uncover the pattern of fraud in New Jersey. I think you should do it for 2020. We know what happened in that election. We know the purpose of those mail-in ballots. We know what those machines do."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We gave President Trump \$100,000.00 plurality. We're the only county that did that."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "I don't care about that. There was still fraud."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It showed that we..."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "He uncovered fraud. Maybe Trump had a \$500,000.00 plurality."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We don't have \$500,000..."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "Well I don't care. I don't have the numbers, okay. I'm just someone you serve. You sit above us but you serve us. And I think you forget that sometimes. You do need to do a forensic audit."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "This gentlemen, does he do this or is this just something that he does?"

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "This is something he did after the election. He analyzed every county in the country..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That's Seth Keshel."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "Seth Keshel. I sent it to Mr. Quinn. He said he'd pass it along to because you're the liaison to the Election Board. I've heard nothing. Ocean County has done nothing. But we can uncover the fraud in New Jersey if you would do the forensic audit. I brought this up to Chris Connors. He laughed in my face and he told me Trump lost. And that the forensic audit in Maricopa County...well no, he called it a recount because I guess he doesn't know the difference – that Biden actually got more votes after that audit in Maricopa County. So you say contact our Republican Legislators and the...he doesn't care. He's a shoe-in every year and no one challenges him. And this is what's happening with all of you but we're waking up. When Connors laughed in my face it made me sick. He stood back arrogantly and said, 'No, he didn't win.' No, Trump did win. The election was stolen from us, the people who voted him in. And you need to do a forensic audit to uncover what has happened. To look up Seth Keshel's report. I'm not a statistician. That man is and you can see what happened. And he will meet with you. He will talk with you. He has his contact information all over his sites."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "And you can do an audit, not a recount because a recount you're just counting the fraudulent and the good votes all over again. A forensic audit will tell you whether or not they were real votes or how many of these ballots were just stuffed and filled out by who knows who. Check in to all those people that died in nursing homes in the beginning of COVID when our Governor forced those nursing homes to take those people in that are sick. And then he gave immunity to the nursing homes. Look up all their names and see if they voted. Thousands and thousands of seniors dead because of what that Governor did. Maybe you can investigate that. Maybe you can investigate the hospitals now that are giving Remdesivir to patients and killing them. (Inaudible) But they're giving Remdesivir...look it up what it is doing. It shuts your kidneys down. It fills their bodies with fluid and then they're saying, 'Oh but they died of Covid pneumonia, sorry.' No, they're killing them with Remdesivir. This is serious business here."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Oh it is. I lost somebody that got COVID in the hospital."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "Yea, okay. Did they give them Remdesivir?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I don't know. I wrote it down because..."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "And you survived."

Anonymous: "I survived."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "Many people are dying from it."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I did write it down because..."

ELIZABETH HENWOOD: "It's an experimental drug and it was an experiment, they used it for Ebola. Over 50% of the people that they gave it to in Africa died. And it killed the most people in all the studies of those drugs. And what does (Anthony) Fauci pick? He picks that drug to use as the protocol in the United States only to get the death rate up. You know what's happening and we know what those mail-in ballots were for. And we know why COVID came. And now we're dealing with Joe Biden as our President. It's not even funny. We want a forensic audit. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It's not funny."

TONY ALMEIDA, 74 ROCHESTER DR, BRICK: "Two comments. So I worked also in IT for 35 years – retired now. Worked for Ma Bell in all the different Bell Lab-type companies. And the one thing I know about is computers. That's how I made my living. And as far as the process being secured the minute you centralize everything, as soon as the files go through one central location all it takes is a couple lines of code and now you can modify the file. So the election is only secure when it's centralized as long as the entire process is secure. The minute you leave that file unattended or let the wrong hands get in there, or you open it up to the internet, whatever, electronic means. That data just bits, just zeroes and ones. You modify it quickly, efficiently, doesn't matter. So when you talk about lines of communication being secure and all that that's great but you have to have the entire process be secure. So that's one comment.

The second comment is about our vote. So I left my country because of my parents. I was a kid and they left because of bad government. And one thing I swore when I got to this country I wasn't going to be chased out of any other country again because of bad government. For people that are immigrants, yeah you might end up in a better position but you leave your entire life, entire families behind. It's not necessarily a pleasant experience. So I've been volunteering for probably over 30 years in Essex County and Hudson County because that's where I lived and I saw what happened and I volunteered for every single position – never got a dime from government. All the time I put in was just volunteering for poll workers, challengers. I give out literature. I showed up for every election. I did what I could as a citizen but as a citizen I have a full time job and I can't make a living out of being a politician. But I did my part as a citizen more than the average citizen probably. But it was always with that in mind that I wasn't going to have what happened in my country happen in this country. And now after 30 something living in those two counties, frankly, our vote there is a joke. Yeah you have majorities but you also have a lot of fraud. In fact, people tell me, 'Well prove to me there's fraud.' And I would go to my office, pull out the envelope. People that have left the country over 35 years ago, dead for many years, they're still receiving a ballot to this day. So I just show them the ballot. They have to know the person is a relative. I show them the ballot. I go...do you know the name? Do you recognize this person? How did they get this ballot? So when you say Ocean County had a plurality well if the cheating is going on at unimaginable levels in all the other places it means nothing. All you have to do is cheat in Newark, Jersey City, Camden – you're done. The rest of us can fake the process any time you want. So, you know, I looked at that ballot and then I tried to figure out, well which Republican can I find the law in to change that I can actually show that ballot to. I put it online. I told my friends. I did whatever I could. But living in New Jersey and that being a Hudson County ballot there's not a single Republican between that person and no one up to President...since now it's Biden, there's really not a single Republican that would ever see that ballot. And all it would take is someone to just sign it and mail it in. I mean you mailed it to everybody's houses even if they didn't live there for over 30 years. Not you, the New Jersey Governor."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I understand what you're saying."

TONY ALMEIDA: "So we can all make believe that we're actually participating in government but if everybody's cheating everywhere else, your vote is diluted by those phony ballots. So I don't know where to take it to. I swore that when I moved here I wasn't going to get involved in politics. When Anna and I...don't please. But I'll do my part but it has to be said yeah you think you're actually taking part of the process but the cheating is happening down the street somewhere else. So if they cheat by whatever, 100,000,500,000...I mean if you could cheat on one why are we going to stop there (inaudible.) So they're going to cheat as much as they can and we just have years after the elections and they were telling me how they cheated and it was a big laugh. I never thought it was funny but they wanted to brag about how good a job they did. That was back 30 years ago. Now I just saw what happened in Hudson and Essex being repeated throughout this entire country. So I hear that you might be on a different side but people like us have nowhere else to go in this state. And literally we really have nowhere else to go up the chain, right? Because I wrote to my senators, they wrote me back saying, 'No the elections were perfectly fine.' So, you know, I don't know where else to go. I do tell you that when you have to move out of your country because of bad government it won't matter that you held office or not you're going to leave everything behind and it's not a pleasant thing. So, beware, and don't let it happen to you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you."

LISA CONTESSA, PORTABELLO RD, TOMS RIVER: "Good afternoon. I have a quick story of...I keep getting mail-in ballots to my home for my deceased brother who died in 2009 and has never lived at my address. I have sent the death certificate. I've called the Clerk's Office and said I know a primary election was coming and I hadn't gotten my son's mail-in ballot who wants one because he was then going to college, and I said, 'My brother keeps getting ballots here. He's never lived at this address. He's deceased. I've given you all the information. Can you please check because I don't want to get a ballot for him?' She checked and said, 'Yup, we have him as deceased. He will not get a ballot.' Three weeks later I get a ballot for my brother. Every single time I still do. Do you have the power as a body to direct the clean-up of the voter rolls of Ocean County?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We have talked to the Election Board on this matter and I have been told that they

are going through the rolls that they are making sure. You did contact them with the death certificate. Unfortunately many people do not go and let the Election Board know that somebody has passed away from their family. So unfortunately ballots are still going out. We are doing our absolute best. I have asked them...both sides because you have equal number of Republican and Democrats that work in the Election Board because that's how the law states. It has to be a state law."

LISA CONTESSA: "But you set the salary and...who's their boss? Who tells them what to do?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You have four Commissioners that are appointed by the Governor – two Republican and two Democrat of the Election Board."

LISA CONTESSA: "Okay."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "They in turn have their supervisors, Republican and Democrat - Republican side - Democrat side. And anything that they do they have to do together if they're going to...just for an example, going to a ballot box – you have to have a Republican – you have to have a Democrat - go in a van to go to the ballot box to retrieve ballots. You cannot send a Democrat alone. You cannot send a Republican alone. I will make sure because there is an Election Board person in the room today...I will make sure that they...I'm sure he has taken many, many notes today of everything that has been stated to make sure that is going to be done. It has been an issue for a while. I have talked to them many times about it to see what we can do. They say things are getting done. I just lost my sister. I have to check to make sure hers..."

LISA CONTESSA: "Well perhaps you can do..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...was done because I'm going to double check because I lost a sister December 10th. So I am going to check to make sure that her name is off."

LISA CONTESSA: "But since this is such an important..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "...because then I will be able to see...I will go over there personally to make sure it's been done."

LISA CONTESSA: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Now she used to work at the Election Board many years ago."

LISA CONTESSA: "Right. Now since this is such an important issue for everyone perhaps you can do multiple press releases, TV commercials, something telling people, 'You want a fair election? You need to report the death of a family member. The change of your address.' Like constant, in people's faces so they do it."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Right. The other problem we have Lisa what has been reported to me is that many people they go and they get married. And a woman will go and she's registered as, say, Lisa Smith. So then she goes and gets married and her name is Jones so she keeps Lisa Smith Jones. She doesn't let the Election Board know that she is now married so she's getting a ballot that's going to be under Lisa Smith and then she's going to get a ballot, many of them, I'm not saying everyone, but there's a lot that don't, but you have to let the Election Board know that you're filling in..."

LISA CONTESSA: "Right. Well I did that and I have a hyphenated name and when I changed my driver's license at the DMV to request my proper name I thought that is where I did that – updated my Republican..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You have to do that at the Election Board."

LISA CONTESSA: "I don't remember doing it at the Election Board and my name is correct in the books."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well I know that they do register people at the DMV so it's very possible that was done. But unfortunately there are many that don't get corrected and I know that for a fact but it's something that I have mentioned. I go to the Election Board many times and I don't...I'm only a liaison. I cannot tell them what to do. I cannot...you have Commissioners. I can only suggest things, that they need to do certain things. That's all you can do."

LISA CONTESSA: "Who can tell them to do it?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I tell the Commissioners and then of course...but I will be talking to the Republican/Democrat supervisor to make sure that the entire staff that handles that particular part of the election process...because not everybody handles all registrations, voter registrations, that comes into the department. There are certain individuals that's all they handle. I will make sure that if they don't feel that they know enough that they're fully trained again to make sure that's what it is doing and we will definitely do something with regards to doing a press release out there. And of course when we do the...we do a TV thing periodically."

LISA CONTESSA: "Good."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "And that we'll make sure that a part is done just informing those individuals that if somebody has passed away or moved that they need to...now when they move and they register someplace else usually that area that they have registered lets the other area know that they have changed their address and they're now voting there. That's supposed to be done but that's where the Election Boards are supposed to be working together. But unfortunately, things do slip through the cracks because people are human, but unfortunately I am going to make sure that...because all the issues, truly, that have been brought up today are things that I talked to the Election Board about when I've gone over there, you know, when I go to the meetings. But thank you for doing that and I will make sure that we do something."

LISA CONTESSA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "More so."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Just one comment. What you were talking about with regard to somebody gets a ballot and that person has been deceased, if that ballot wants to cheat they're never going to turn that ballot in, they're never going to turn that name around so..."

LISA CONTESSA: "But it's odd that it came to my address."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Oh yea, yea, that's very unusual..."

LISA CONTESSA: "He never lived at that address."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "...but the young lady that was speaking before, you know, and the gentleman, about the only way we're ever going to correct this is to have voter ID when you walk in to the ballot box areas.

(Applause)

We're all for voter ID and we've been trying to get it. We know we can push it in Ocean County but the bottom line is the revolt that we folks are talking about is great because if you take that revolt and bring it outside of Ocean County and bring it to the other counties, push it around the country, that's the only way you're going to get change because there's two parties and one party is going to do everything one way and the other party's going to do it the other way. We want to see a change. We want to see voter ID and we want to see everybody vote that's legally able to vote and walk into that ballot box and make it a fair election. But thank you very much."

LISA CONTESSA: "Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you. Just state your name and address."

JOHN FIORE, 139 W BEARDSLEY AVENUE, BRANT BEACH, LONG BEACH TOWNSHIP, NJ: "First I want to thank you all for having this group here today. We didn't know it was going to be here and when I spoke to Anita she said, 'You better come early if you want a seat.' So she knew something was going on that I didn't. I'm here representing the Brant Beach Taxpayer's Association so I didn't come up here with the same agenda but I certainly appreciate listening to it. Just as a point of reference, my dad was a Sergeant of Arms at the 1932 National Republican Convention. He was Senator Kean's secretary in Washington, D.C. – a Republican senator. And I served in the military in Vietnam."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Thank you for your service."

JOHN FIORE: "The reason I'm here is that our source of information of who our homeowners are we can get from our township but only in printed forms. So for us to download 1,000 names somebody has to sit there and type it all out. So we got it from the county and we got it from the IT Department. They would send us the information. It was a penny a person. I think it was one cent per person. We paid about \$12.00 for it. You out contracted the IT Department now and without explanation they sent us a bill for \$250.00 to get 1,100 names. We've asked them numerous times, 'Can you tell us how this breaks down? What... is this for all of Long Beach Township? Or just Brant Beach section? Because that's all we're interested in.' No response. The IT..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "What department did you contact with regards to getting...?"

JOHN FIORE: "I have all the information here."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "No, I mean what was the department that said they went...you said we outsourced it."

JOHN FIORE: "Your IT Department. I called them. They had provided us this information in the past. As a matter of fact they gave us pre-printed labels to put on envelopes which, in the day, that's how we communicated. And we still do for the most part. So we represent...there's 1200 homeowners in the Brant Beach section. We have almost 400 who are active members. Out of the 400 there's over 300 that vote in Ocean County and what we're trying to do is expand our footprint to reach the other owners, to get that information, again, I can get it from the township but it's pretty laborious to type out a list of 1200 names and home addresses..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "So this is a list of everyone that lives in the town or just votes?"

JOHN FIORE: "No, it's everyone that pays taxes. It's the taxpayer list."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay. That would be under..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "If I may...this sounds like it may be relative to the fact the Tax Board just changed their computer system from VITA to BRT."

JOHN FIORE: "BRT."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "There you go. Maybe in their transition they didn't make the combination or they just have to check it out. They did just switch in the last couple of months from VITA to BRT."

JOHN FIORE: "Yes. They just said, you know, last month we could have given it to you now we can't so..."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I think we can check that."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That will definitely be checked."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Just for your information, we'll check that tomorrow."

JOHN FIORE: "I appreciate it. Thank you. And I appreciate what you do. I do. Thank you very much."

KATHLEEN MALLOY, 1801 RIDGEWAY ROAD, 194: "And I just wanted to let you know that I live there permanently. I don't live there as a camper. And that's what I wanted to let you know."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Okay, well I don't know if you were here for the beginning of the meeting but we are purchasing the property. We have been told that it is a seasonal campground. There are many people here that told us today that they are year-round residents there. The Director of Consumer Affairs is here. It's probably going to take six to nine months before we close on the property because when we close on the property all structures will be gone and there will be nobody living there because that's under the Natural Lands Trust Law because it was purchased with Open Space Natural Lands money. But I would like you to talk with Mr. Scaturro because we've been told that it's a seasonal campground, not a year-round campground that people can stay the year-round. You're not the only one that's come before us today with a problem that they have a lease and they have been a year-round...for one, two, three years, whatever the number may be so..."

KATHLEEN MALLOY: "And there's more people that live there year-round..."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I know. We're finding that out today but that is not what we were told. We've been told that's it's a seasonal campground. So the thing was...but under Natural Lands we are not allowed to have anyone living there or any structures. They're all going to be torn down when we close but it's going to take six to nine months. There's a few steps that need to be done in order for us to be able to close on the property. But I would suggest...there's several people here that are going to talk with Mr. Scaturro."

KATHLEEN MALLOY: "Is anybody going to help us?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "That's why we're going to ask you to talk with Mr. Scaturro who's the head of Consumer Affairs. Steve, raise your hand again so she knows who you are."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "What I would suggest too if the township knew about it they should have some accountability. For an example, were you given a CO (Certificate of Occupancy) for a seasonal apartment or a 12-month seasonal all year-round?"

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "There was never any Certificate of Occupancy's ever given."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "You were never given any?"

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "No."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Okay. Was the township aware you were living there?"

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Pardon me?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Was the township aware..."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Absolutely they're aware. There's no question that they're not aware. You know whether it's official and documented on paper...that's probably not the case, but it is definitely for sure that they are aware that there are permanent residents, year-round residents."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "What I hear you saying is you want some kind of compensation to help you out in the meantime in the interim."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Not so much to help us out. In the meantime where are we going to go from here when you guys..."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "So you want someone to help you go someplace else."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Well they need...yes, so that's..."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "So maybe the township...you want the township to help you get another apartment or another place? You want to relocate, of course, in the town...you want to be in Manchester. You want to move from where you are now to someplace in Manchester."

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "I'm open to whatever suggestions are available from the county/township."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Okay. So we have to get the Manchester Township people involved. You agree?"

CHRISTOPHER PAYNE: "Okay. I understand."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "So just see Mr. Scaturro. As I said..."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "And we'll see what we can do."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "... there are several people that are going to be meeting with him after and he'll be able to guide you about the next step to do and then we can try and see what we can do with what's going to be available. We don't really...unless you're on Board of Social Services we don't really place people in housing. If you have a house or if you're capable of paying rent – things like that so...but I'm sure amongst us we will talk about things to see what possibly we might be able to do."

KATHLEEN MALLOY: "Okay. Thank you."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "There's no guarantee that we can do it but we can always try. Thank you.

Yes."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN, 8 SHENANDOAH DRIVE, LAKEWOOD, NJ: "I'm calling in regarding there was a resolution on the agenda about a garbage, a waste transfer station on Cedar Bridge Avenue in a residential area. So we were actually...we as a neighborhood we actually had a petition signed online...I'm not sure if you were familiar...we had 1,000 signatures, actually, almost 1,000 signatures signed against it because of the toxic and the smells and the quality of life. And we actually had a lawyer reach out to the Commissioner."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "It would have gone out to our Planner, Mr. Agliata, in the back. You're talking about the resolution that we had a couple of Public Hearings on it and the township itself has requested a transfer station because of the tremendous amount of traffic in the town during the day and now they want to get the..."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN: "We actually, the neighbors who live within a half a mile from it, which is right there, we were not aware of any Public Hearings. We weren't told about a Public Hearing."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "They're usually advertised."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN: "Well, nobody knew about it. The only reason why we found out about it was there was a little article in the Asbury Park Press that it was already passed. That's how we found out about it."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Tony, can they still submit written comments from their attorney to the DEP?"

ANTHONY AGLIATA: "The written comment period is closed at this point. But again, this is the initial step of the process and now the application will be forwarded to DEP, which, again, there will be additional opportunities for public comment."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Why don't you...I know everyone is going to be sticking around after the meeting, except for us, we're going and leave you all talking, but why don't you talk to Mr. Agliata. He can give you the actual procedure (inaudible). It is a very long process that they go through."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN: "Correct. We're just concerned about the neighborhood and we weren't told about it. And then we spoke to the township people and they said it's up to the county and the county said it's up to the township and we were just being thrown back and forth like a..."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "The towns have Public Hearings as well but I don't know if..."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN: "No, I understand but they were throwing us here."

ANTHONY AGLIATA: "Commissioner, again, we had a Public Hearing for this Board but also there were two Public Hearings in Lakewood Township."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "In the town, so, yeah. So just grab Tony before you leave and he'll give you the information you need. And we'll help you through the process wherever we can."

JOSEPH ELLENBOGEN: "Correct. Thank you."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "You're welcome sir."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Is there anyone else? Can we have a motion to adjourn?

Director Gary Quinn opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Commissioner Little shared the latest coronavirus statistics for Ocean County. There were 189 new cases totaling 85,411. There have been 2,229 deaths, which was an increase of 3. There were 20 long term care facilities with at least one positive COVID-19 case this week. The County has administered 118,604 COVID-19, and 2,185 flu vaccinations at Toms River North and Southern Regional Middle School.

Mr. Agliata and Commissioner Haines notified the Board of three properties the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended for acquisition. The first is a 15.44-acre property located on Maple Avenue in the Township of Plumsted, bordering the Crosswicks Creek. The owner accepted a negotiated offer in the amount of \$385,000.00. The next is a 0.28-acre property located on Ivy Court in Berkeley Township. This property will add to the 13-acre Jeffreys Creek project area. The owners accepted a negotiated offer of \$150,000.00. property is adjacent to Giffords Mill Bog and is in close proximity to approximately 350 acres of Ocean County Open Space along Nugentown Road.

Commissioner Kelly and Ms. Tarrant gave a presentation on the American Rescue Plan, which is the newest federally funded program. In order for the County to use the funds, the Board of Commissioners must develop a spending plan, schedule a public hearing, and submit the approved plan to the US Department of Treasury. Commissioner Kelly said that the guidelines for the program are very broad. Mr. Block stated that the parameters for CARES funding were much more specific. *The presentation is attached.

Commissioner Vicari would like to compile a direct mailing for seniors in our community describing programs and resources that are available to them. He will discuss this with Maria LaFace, the Director of Senior Services.

Commissioner Vicari also discussed the importance of shopping locally this holiday season. Many of the County's small retail establishments and locally owned restaurants suffered during the pandemic, and need the support of the community to rebuild their businesses. Commissioner Vicari urged the community to patronize these establishments rather than ordering gifts online or using Department Stores.

Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for the construction of a traffic signal at the intersection of Pinewald-Keswick Road (C.R. 530) and Congasia Road in Manchester Township, and for traffic safety improvements along Cedar Bridge Avenue (C.R. 528) from Martin Luther King Drive to Vine Avenue in Lakewood. Mr. Ernst recommended Lima Charlie Construction, Inc. from Freehold, NJ be awarded the contract for improvements to 125 Washington Street Parking Lot, Block 665, Lots 3,4, and 13 in the Township of Toms River in the amount of \$674,400.00. There were also ten traffic signal revisions that were performed due to previous construction projects. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the December 1, 2021 Board meeting.

Director Quinn thanked Commissioner Kelly and John Ernst for the recent improvements to Manchester Avenue in Lacey Township. Residents are also very happy with the upgrades and new traffic signal allowing pedestrians to safely cross Lacey Road when travelling on the Barnegat Branch Trail.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 1, 2021. There were no questions or comments.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about two properties recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. The first is an 8.48-acre property located off Progress Place in Jackson Township. This property will add to over 750 acres of existing County and State Open Space in the West Turkey Swamp Area. Ocean County acquired properties within the Good Luck Point section of Berkeley Township for flood mitigation purposes through the Natural Lands Trust Fund program. Some of these properties included structures scheduled for demolition. Two single family ranch homes are in good condition and can be repurposed. 12 Beach Avenue and 23 Dorrance Drive were purchased solely with Natural Lands Trust Funds. Berkeley Township has requested that the County donate these two homes to the Township so they may work with a nonprofit for their relocation to Manitou Park to be used for affordable housing. There would be no cost to the County.

Commissioner Vicari and Mr. Agliata attended an NJDEP meeting where the DEP Commissioner Shawn LaTourette discussed the rising sea levels in NJ.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Agliata discussed the Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst Regional Compatible Use Study. Paulus, Sokolowski, and Sartor, LLC was selected as the most qualified firm. The cost of the selected firm's services is \$477,428.08. Ninety percent of the total survey cost will be paid through a grant from the Department of Defense with a ten percent cash match from Ocean County. A similar study was conducted in 2009. The results of the current study will build on the findings from the 2009 version. The study will begin in January and will be complete in May. Commissioner Kelly would like Mr. Agliata to reach out to Burlington County to request a cost share of the ten percent.

Commissioner Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for Stormwater Management Contract 2021B to address drainage issues in various townships throughout the County. Commissioner Kelly asked Mr. Block and Mr. Ernst to speak with the Mayors of Ship Bottom and Long Beach Townships to discuss an issue regarding the 28th Street traffic light in Ship Bottom. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the December 15, 2021 Board meeting.

Director Quinn stated that there were 319 new COVID-19 cases totaling 88,940, with 2,248 deaths which was an increase of 4. There were 22 towns with at least one case. Brick had 57 new cases, totaling 12,201. Toms River had 54 with a total of 14,408, and Jackson had 43 bringing the total to 8,596. There were 19 long term care facilities with at least one case, which was an increase of 1. There have been 5,620 long term care facility residents who have tested positive thus far, and 738 deaths, which was an increase of 1. Ocean County has performed 121,014 COVID-19 vaccines in total.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of December 15, 2021.

Commissioner Kelly would like all the 2021 Ocean County employee retirees to be honored on the December 15, 2021 Resolution. There were no questions or comments.

The Commissioner added that with over 40 miles of the Garden State Parkway running through Ocean County, our residents will be amongst the hardest hit by the toll increase.

There were no additional comments.

Mr. Block notified the Board that the final two non-profit organizations have been approved for CARES funding reimbursement. Also, six buildings in the Ocean County Library System will be eligible for air filtration upgrades under CARES funding.

Ms. Gunther read the resolution to move to closed session.
