DIRECTOR KELLY: "Very good. We will move on to today’s main item of business which is the introduction of the 2025 County budget and Accompanying Resolutions. Today is the introduction. In four weeks from today we will have the public hearing, and that date is April 16, 2025. We’ll have the actual... but today we will introduce the budget. I’ll call on Frank Sadeghi to give us a report on the budget.”

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: “Thank you, Commissioner. As Commissioner Kelly indicated the public hearing, and its scheduled adoption of the budget formally is scheduled for 4:00 pm on April 16, (2025). But the budget documents will be available online for anybody who's interested to go through them and if you have any questions, let us know and we’ll try to address your questions and concerns. The 2025 Budget totals \$608,759,015.00 which is an increase over the 2024 Budget of roughly \$43,714,505.00. The amount to be raised by taxation is \$497,909,182.00 which is an increase of \$42,000,000.00. The amount of surplus used in this budget is \$38,500,000.00. Funding for capital improvements in the budget is \$93,567,306.00 which is an increase of roughly \$22,000,000.00. We talked about this at the Pre-Board Meeting last week and we all know that the county is going through a growth. It’s a great thing. Ocean County is certainly on the radar, as one of the up-and-coming counties. Everybody wants to be down here. We have the quality of life. And now we have commerce and economy going on in the county. With that comes the responsibility as commissioners to make sure that we set aside adequate funding to provide for widening of roads and bridges and address the drainage issues. And there is a lot more that we do, and I’ll try to cover some of those. So, the welcome news here is that the 2025 ratable base is \$176.5 billion. Sleepy Ocean County. \$176.5 billion is the evaluation of the properties which will help us maintain a stable Ocean County property tax rate at 28.2 cents per \$100 of equalized property value. So, the rate stays the same and if you’ve been paying attention and been ... actually my predecessors and the Commissioners and the Freeholders who have been here were actually able to reduce the tax rate last year and I think two or three years prior to that, every year two cents. The evaluations are stabilizing, so we want to get ahead of that and make sure that we have some reserves. Again, that we can use for those improvements and such that we have to put in place and make sure that we're judicial about it. We have included charts in this presentation that will show you where the funds come from and where they're going to be appropriated to. Again, last week we talked about ... at our informational introduction of the budget we talked about needs to increase the capital funding in order to meet the needs of the growing population. As our population grows, we have to be... we have to pay attention to the needs and the changing needs of the community. As of right now the population of Ocean County is roughly about 650,000 residents. Based on the projections, and I think we’re going to place a bet on this, my projections are a little more aggressive than Donna Flynn’s projections, but we’re going to put a couple bucks on this. I think that in 25 years we are going to be about a million people. More people here in Ocean County than Bergen County. And more residents mean the needs for services, facilities that need to be expanded, and those services and also more opportunities become available. We have to make opportunities more available to our residents. In order to respond to this future growth, this budget increases capital spending by more than \$22 million. At first blush when you look at that and the fact that we’re actually increasing the capital budget to roughly \$93.5 million it seems, it sounds like a huge sum. But I think Mark Jehnke, our County Engineer is here, \$11 million of that is going to go towards widening just one road, Cross Street. That’s the reality of what things cost now a days. So, this is basically an investment in our future, the future of Ocean County. And while you will see funds appropriated for key infrastructure improvements like roads and bridges, we’re also cognizant of the improvements and the investments that we have to make in Vocational Technical Schools and Ocean County College.

We have to provide funds for economic development investments, especially at our airport. We have a gem in that Miller Airpark, and I've been talking to our Administrator, Michael Fiure and Anthony Agliata whose department oversees the airport. There are endless possibilities and opportunities at that airport, and we’re going to explore those. For example, \$11 million is being appropriated for improvements to Cross Street. A major thoroughfare in that area that connects Lakewood and Jackson, both growing communities. \$12 million will help fund Route 539 overpass in Plumsted Township, which will bring needed safety improvements to everyone using the joint base. \$25.2 million is being appropriated for the expansion of our M.A.T.E.S. (Marine Academy of Technology and Environmental Science) Academy. These are the few home-grown Ocean County home-grown future astronauts, heart surgeons, doctors, engineers, and attorneys. We are so fortunate and, in the past, we didn’t have the facilities to accommodate all the kids. We’re trying to do that. Now that we have some of these funds available, we’re fortunate that we can address those needs. We’re also appropriating more than \$13 million for renovations to two other Vo-Tech centers. Again, all of these projects provide opportunities to enter into well-paying careers after high school. One of the biggest responsibilities that we have up here as commissioners is to make sure that we provide those opportunities for younger people, the next generation, and the generation after that, right here in Ocean County so they don’t feel compelled to move to Florida or Colorado or Arizona. We want to keep them right here. More than \$6 million will be used at Ocean County College to renovate instructional facilities for dental hygiene program and radiology and veterinary labs program, very innovative ideas.

We’re also focusing on the economic development in the Ocean County Airport in Berkeley Township, which is a

great hub for commerce. So, we're making an investment there in particular for new hangars, where there's always... believe it or not there's a waiting list for hangar space at the Miller Airpark. We can't build them fast enough. The budget includes funding for all essential county services including programs for seniors, home delivery of meals. If you haven't done that, if you haven't been involved in Meals on Wheels take a trip and just see the wonderful things that they do. Those drivers are really saints. Road improvements that provide safety upgrades for drivers and pedestrians, \$27.7 million. Social Services programs, \$19.1 million. Parks and Recreation, we like our Parks and Recreation facilities, don't we? \$9.6 million. Transportation programs including Ocean Ride. So many people call me and rave about that service that the county provides, \$4.1 million. In addition to the \$3.1 million that we get in grants. Law and Public Safety, we can have the best beaches, the boardwalks, we have those charming downtowns in certain communities. We can have all of that, but if we don't have police involvement, you don't have the people that keep us safe, how can we enjoy them? So, we have to make the investment and make sure that they're there. Those are just to name a few of what this budget includes. This budget, also it's important to say that it allows us to maintain our AAA bond rating which enhances our long-term economic goals. It allows us to borrow money if we have to bond for something at a much lower rate. All of our annual budgets meets the State mandate. On top of that you have to be a gymnast to be able to do all these things because on top of everything else we have that mandated, state mandated 2% cap. I don't know how Julie (Tarrant) does it. You have to be an acrobat really in finance to do a finance acrobat to make all of these things happen. These closing charges recapped at 2025 budget introduction presentation and as noted last week I believe this budget addresses our current needs and moves us soundly and decisively into the future. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Do we have any other comments from the Commissioners? Ginny."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I would just like to thank Julie and her staff and everyone that worked on the budget, and of course, all the directors of the different divisions. I know you might have wanted more money but maybe next year. I just want to thank you for the hard work that you did to put this budget together and enable us to continue with providing the services expanding them and then keeping within the 2% cap. And of course, not increasing our tax rate. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Commissioner Bacchione."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I want to first say that Commissioner Sadeghi was able to give a great detail of some of the projects that we're working on that are very important to the county and appreciate Dr. Monaco coming from the college. One of the things that Commissioner Sadeghi kept mentioning is our investment in our future and our county. And some of the other things that we're doing in the county also that I think he missed a few. He mentioned a lot which is fantastic. We have to continue to maintain the current roads that we have. We have the beach replenishment. How many shore towns we have in Ocean County is ... if we don't keep up with the beach replenishment than we have no beaches. Again, very costly that we have to maintain. We have such a diverse county, from the beaches to the farmlands in Plumsted, that we have to keep up with all the needs from all the different townships. So, it makes for a lot of money spent, but again thanks to Julie and her team, we're able to keep the tax rate flat so we can continue to improve the county and keep up with the growth and stay within our means. So, thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. I want to thank Frank Sadeghi for making the presentation. I asked him to do it instead because this is my last year that I will be a member of this board. And I wanted Frank to kind of get the experience of giving this report on the budget. You did a great job, and I appreciate it. I've been doing it for the last several years. He talked about all the different investments we're making. So often we talk enough about the tax rate and that is extremely important. We held it stable this year, and yet there are new investments are being made in education, Law and Public Safety, in the roads and the bridges that we have. All very important items for the quality of life that people have come to expect in Ocean County, and I am very happy with this year's budget. Very happy with the amount of work that was done by our administrator, our comptroller, county engineer, and others who have helped to put this budget together. And that includes all the department heads as Commissioner Haines spoke of. So, it's a good budget. We will have a public hearing on the budget as we said in several weeks, and we'll go from there. And today during public comments anybody who wants to comment on the budget may. That'll be in just a little while. So, we'll move on now to a ...."

DEPUTY CLERK BENVENUTO: "Director, I do have a statement to read into the record for the budget. If I can read that in?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Go right ahead."

Deputy Clerk Benvenuto read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Who’s going to present that?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "I’ll say a couple things about this. This is obviously the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust for the past… I don't know how many years. They’ve been very active using the 1.2 cents, I believe on the open space tax, very diligent. The Commissioners attend the meetings on a regular basis whether it’s folks that approach the Natural Land Trust members with properties that they think should be acquired or sometimes the municipalities or sometimes we … the Planning Department actually have people out there actively looking at properties that make sense for open space land acquisition. This is one of those properties. It’s on Lighthouse Drive, Lot 2, Block 127 in Ocean Township, Waretown. It’s 2.89 acres in property located as I said on Lighthouse Drive in a preserved area. The lot offers roughly 550 feet of frontage on Main Street, 230 feet on Lighthouse Drive. It’s in a mixed zone area with residential dwellings and we’re trying to preserve the land. And it’s an ideal … we had some targeted areas where we're very active in acquiring properties, and we always make sure that we get the resolution from the municipalities that the property is located in to make sure that they understand that the county is buying the properties and make sure they are on board with that. So, this was supported by the folks at the governing body in Ocean Township and the property owner has accepted the offer of \$220,000.00. Anything else to add?"

ANTHONY AGLIATA, DIRECTOR, OCEAN COUNTY PLANNING DEPARTMENT: “That’s good Commissioner. Again just… our Fire and First Aid Academy is right to the left and again we continue on the green space that we’re developing in the area.”

Director Kelly opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

U. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:27 PM, Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. We'll move on to Commissioner comments. Commissioner Bacchione."

COMMISSIONER BACCHIONE: "I would like to talk about something that is going on right now at the library, The Prom Dress Giveaway. I had the opportunity of going there on Monday for the first day and it's a great way to see that anyone can get to go to the prom and get a dress. It's also great for the environment. We're recycling. Most of these have only been worn once if not at all. So, what a fantastic event. There were a lot of people there and it was really good to see. All the teens and their moms checking out the dresses. So, that was fantastic. Also, the library made the news. We had someone return a book that was 99 years late. So, the only bad thing is we waived the \$18,000 fee, right, Director? So... but that's alright. But it was fantastic. It went national all the way to Australia with the news of that. That was a really great thing and kind of fitting for the library's 100 years. So that was exciting times for the library. That's all I have. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It sounds like Jerry Seinfeld." (laughter) Ginny?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "The only thing I have is this morning I had an Ocean County College Foundation Board Meeting, and at it, Dr. Monaco was not able to be there because she was at the New Jersey Legislature for the second year in a row that she went. She did bring students. And I had asked her how it went, and she said the students really, I mean, they're always hearing from the college president on things, but she said, again, the one individual that did speak, I think you said there were nine students that went, and it really does make an impression with regards to the legislators because they're not just speaking to college presidents, because they know they're going to ask for money and things like that. But, by bringing the students, which I think is a wonderful idea when Dr. Monaco did it last year and this year, to bring them because they're really hearing from the heart of what the college is about and why it's so important for them not to reduce, to bring the money back in because as we know Governor Murphy and his budget address have reduced the monies that was going to the county colleges. And I just want to thank her again for going and hopefully it will be reinstated a little bit more money into the budget for that. Other than that, I have nothing else. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Deputy Director."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR SADEGHI: "I don't have any comments, Director."

V. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:30 PM, Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. We'll now move on to public comments. Anyone wishing to address the governing body may do that. We have a five-minute time limit on the comments and ask that you identify yourself by name and address. Anyone like to address the Commissioners at this time? Come right up, please, to the microphone."

ANN BARKEY: "Thank you very much. My name is Ann Barkey. I live on Long Beach Island in Loveladies, an oddly named Boro but that's the name of it. I have two questions, if you don't mind. Number one is on the traffic safety improvements, number 20, authorizing the revision of the traffic signal at the intersection of County Road #7 Route 607 Long Beach Boulevard and 80th Street in Harvey Cedars. Could you say a little more about that?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Sure. I'm going to address that to the County Engineer."

MARK F. JEHNKE, COUNTY ENGINEER: "Yes. That is located in Harvey Cedars. The town had requested us to add push buttons to that traffic signal, so the push button is actually for pedestrians crossing the road."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Which we're doing in numerous locations on the island."

MARK F. JEHNKE, COUNTY ENGINEER: "And those upgrades are occurring right now as we speak."

ANN BARKEY: "That is very good news. And lastly, number 12, under Resolutions, authorizing the Ocean County Administrator to send the required notice of termination to the Hackensack Meridian Health Jersey Shore University Medical Center related to the OC Emergency Medical Technician Training Program. Are we really backing off from that?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "No. We're really changing it to make it better. This will allow us to do more training in-house."

ANN BARKEY: "In house? So, this was a..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're also still going to do some with the hospitals but we're moving it also in-house so that we can train additional volunteers. We are then going to reach out to the county-wide community asking for more volunteers. So, this is an important part of our step forward to make the facility even better."

ANN BARKEY: "Thank you for clarifying that. And when you say in-house, that would be?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Right at the facility in Waretown. Fire and First Aid Training Center."

ANN BARKEY: "Very good. Thank you very much. I appreciate your time."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you for your questions. Anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Yes, ma'am, please come right up. You'll be next, sir."

DR. PAMELA MONACO, 967 EDINBURGH DRIVE TOMS RIVER: "I wanted to thank the Commissioners for always supporting Ocean County College. As Commissioner Haines said, I've been here for two years. Two years I've had to take students to Trenton to petition the Assembly to understand the value of community colleges to our state. And last year we were successful. This year we're asking for \$32,000,000.00 to be restored to the 18 community colleges. We have never, ever, had to ask you to restore funds. You have been extremely generous, and you understand the value of education and the value of the college to this community, and our ability to help put people to work. So, thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The entire Board supports the college, but I have to give much credit to Ginny Haines who has been our liaison to the county college for a number of years and does an outstanding job over there. Thank you again for your comments. Anyone else at this time? You had your hand up. Come right up."

JOHN FIORE, BRANT BEACH, LONG BEACH ISLAND: "I just want to say thank you for all the support you've given the development of the new VA (Veterans Affairs) facility on Hooper Avenue. It's terrific. I'm up there two or three times a month and it's a great program. I hope it stays there. I will say that it was a little disappointing this winter and even to this day to see that the heating air conditioning system is inadequate in this brand-new building, where they actually have free standing units in the hallways to try to add to it. And in the offices that the doctors actually work, they have to take from home heating units plugged into the wall. And I would just think ... and I realize this is not at the county level. I understand that. But I just want to make the county aware of it and I'm making the federal government aware of it for sure."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Very good. Have you talked to Congressman Chris Smith's office?"

JOHN FIORE: "I'm sorry?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Have you talked with Chris Smith's office? Congressman Smith?"

JOHN FIORE: "No, I have not."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It would be good to do that. He's very instrumental in helping the Board and others to get this where it is. There's a lot of funding for it. Call his office too, and you have already told us. Building and Grounds is here, somewhere, I know... there you are. He's heard what you've said, and he'll look into that. And we'll talk with the people from the facility."

JOHN FIORE: "The other thing is I fully support what we're doing with the EMS (Emergency Medical Services) program. It's really needed, and we know that Ocean County changes its population in size during three months out of the year. When you live on Long Beach Island it's even greater in terms of that. So, anything that ... Long Beach Township has a program where they're adding lifeguards to the program. They're a step ahead, but the idea of the equipment itself is very expensive. So, anything that we can help maybe move some equipment around during the summer months, but that's probably..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "It's less of an issue with equipment and more an issue with personnel."

JOHN FIORE: "I understand."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The training is so tough these days that it's hard to get the volunteers to get the training. By the time they get the training they are good enough to be paid employees. And a lot of times they go through the training, and they do it as volunteers for a period of time, like what they're doing, and then get a job working somewhere for a salary. So, that's the issue that we've been dealing with. That's why we're going to go on television, talk about it, and try to get more people to be willing to volunteer their time. The equipment, that's easier to handle. Not that it's easy, but it's easier than the personnel."

JOHN FIORE: "The other thing is that I will say that I'm going to say 20 years ago, I watched this show on TV that was about colleges and people's feelings about their college, and this one psychologist said the day that we hike up the community college flag, not just Princeton and Rutgers, is the day we've succeeded. So, let's get a flag."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay. Thank you, John. Thank you for your comments. Would anyone else like to address the Board at this time? Seeing none, I'll close the public portion and ask for a motion to close the meeting."


**WHEREAS**, there are approximately 400 children in Ocean County's foster care system making Ocean County one of the largest counties in terms of children in foster care; and


**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Pine Beach boasts a rich and proud history where residents hold fast to ongoing traditions to beautify and enhance their community; and

## BUDGET MESSAGE

It has always been the policy of the Board of County Commissioners to provide quality services to the residents of the County while maintaining a stable tax rate for the taxpayers of the County. The 2025 County Budget has been developed with that theory in mind along with fiscal conservatism.

The formulation of the Budget was accomplished through a series of budget sessions with the assistance of the County Officials over a three month period. These sessions included budget conferences with various Departments and Agencies of the County.

With this 2025 County Budget, the Board of County Commissioners will maintain the tax rate of .282 cents per \$100 of equalized property value.

The budget totals \$608,759,015, up \$43.7 million.

The amount to be raised in taxation is \$497,909,182, up \$42,011,431.

The County will use \$38,500,000 from its surplus to support the 2025 Budget, \$1,000,000 more than it did in 2024.

With the passage of Chapter 78 of the Laws of 2011, local government units were required to institute specific formulas for the calculation of employee health benefit contribution. The formulas are based on the type of coverage, base salary and cost of coverage. The 2025 County Budget includes an appropriation for Group Insurance for Employees in the amount of \$60,611,796. This amount was derived by subtracting the estimated employee contribution to be collected of \$7,840,506 from the calculated cost of \$68,452,302.

COUNTY OF OCEAN - 2025

The Ocean County Board of Commissioners, with the assistance of the County Administrator, Office of Management and Budget, County Engineer, County Planning Board and the County Comptroller, has developed this six-year Capital Improvement Program and Budget. The Capital Improvement Program was developed with the cooperation and consideration of recommendations of the various County Departments.

The County's continuing growth requires that the Board of Commissioners anticipates and plans for the increasing demands for County facilities and services. The Capital Improvement Program was prepared to guide County investment in land, facilities and equipment through 2030. The Program and Budget will be adjusted each year to reflect changing conditions including new Federal and State legislation, variations in the general economy, emerging demands of the public and modifications in the growth rate which may result in changes in revenue patterns and demand for new facilities or services. The Capital Improvement Program is realistic and attainable within the financial capabilities of the County and it provides for the future needs of Ocean County residents.

The accompanying forms which comprise the Capital Budget and six-year Capital Improvement Program have been completed in accord with regulations adopted by the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey pursuant to powers authorized by NJSA 52:27BB-10, NJSA 40A:4-43 to 45. The Capital Budget forms list all projects scheduled for startup for the 2025 Budget year and the source of funding for each project. A summary of Anticipated Funding Sources and Amounts is also included. Please note that this summary shows funding needed for new capital projects. It does not include previous appropriations for projects to be continued in 2025. For this reason, the funding summary differs slightly from the total cost shown for the Capital Program.

The total cost of all Capital Improvement Projects over the six-year period is \$401,914,860. Many of the projects will be funded under State and Federal Grant Programs or through the annual Budget on a "pay-as-you-go" basis. The larger projects will be funded by short-term borrowing. Bonds will be issued at the most advantageous times to secure low interest rates.

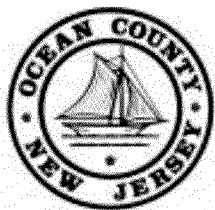

WHEREAS, based upon a review of the Local Budget Law provisions, County Counsel and the Chief Financial Officer have determined that the law requires the County to adhere to the tax cap levy provisions established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.4 and 40A:4-45.45.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean, that the County does hereby adopt the 1977 tax levy cap provisions provided for in the aforementioned statutes and that said provisions shall govern the enactment and enforcement of the Ocean County 2025 Budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services.

**WHEREAS**, the Ocean County Narcotics Strike Force conducts confidential, undercover investigations; and

**WHEREAS**, ELRAC, LLC (Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Inc.), the successful vendor was awarded a lease agreement for the provision of said vehicles with the term of agreement effective July 1, 2024 until June 30, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, ELRAC, LLC (Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Inc.), in its proposal provided to the County of Ocean with the option to renew the existing agreement for an additional period of one (1) year with no increase in cost to the County of Ocean; and

**WHEREAS**, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office is requesting approval to extend the current contract for the additional one (1) year as mentioned above and ELRAC, LLC (Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Inc.), has agreed to such terms in writing; and

2. This contract is awarded as an exception to the requirements of the Local Public Contracts Law pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A 11-5(1)(g) as such vehicles are to be utilized in confidential investigations, in accordance with proper approval from the State Attorney General.
3. The Ocean County Prosecutor shall execute an agreement on behalf of the County of Ocean with ELRAC, LLC (Enterprise Rent-A-Car, Inc.), Neptune, New Jersey, for the lease of vehicles for the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, for an amount not to exceed \$219,309.00 for the first year of the contract, July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026. Said contract will also have the option to extend for one additional year with no increase in cost to the County of Ocean.

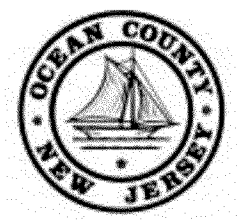

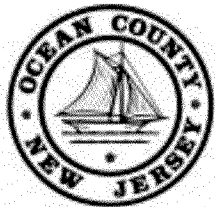
