The auxiliary is currently comprised of spouses, sisters, brothers, daughters, granddaughters of veterans. Director Kelly opened the Public Hearing on Ordinance #2022-11 to receive the following comments from the public.

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. I'm going to open the Public Hearing on this Ordinance, but we are first going to hear, Joe, if you will introduce."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you Mr. Director. You know it's a great pride that this belongs to all five members of the Board of Commissioners. We've been waiting several years for this. And it is the replacement of the Stafford Township Library. I appreciate the Mayor coming here today, Greg Myhre, who is doing an outstanding job communicating with the local residents – very important - not just of Stafford Township, Lacey Township and the neighboring towns will use it. Long Beach Island will use it. Little Egg Harbor will use it.

It is located, of course, in Stafford Township, but it's going to be used by everyone in Ocean County. It is part of the largest library system in the State of New Jersey. We have 21 branches. What we have is a rendering, of course, as you can see on each of the TVs in front of you. But we want to make it as transparent as possible and let people know in Ocean County what government gives them. When they pay taxes, they expect to see something for it. They like the roads. They like the parks. They love our libraries. As Susan Quinn, who is here today, our Director, does a great job with the Chairman, Henry Mancini and many people from the staff that made this possible.

And again, it will be almost 20,000 square feet. It will be substantially larger. Fifty percent more books. What we like with the library system, it brings people together. It unites the community. What it is going to do is it's for intergenerational space for senior citizens that enjoy the library continuously, new teen areas, study rooms, maker space for STEAM – which we know what that is, Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math – educational activities, and a sensory room.

Now the sensory room is expanding. This will be our second one thanks to the hard work of our library staff in the United States, maybe there is another two or three. But this sensory room is taking place not just with autism and Alzheimer's as I said before, but 'Field of Dreams' - that we opened up last week - they have sensory areas and it's all in conjunction with what we do. Community Medical Center is following the same principle. And again, we are part of a great movement that is taking place.

Fortunately for us as you will see in a few minutes, we have the second largest grant from the State of New Jersey which means we don't have to pay it back, \$4.8 million. And I just want to leave this probably so that people that are really more responsible than anyone else that's over here today, is to say thank you for the Library Foundation, the people that use it. We have the most library cards that residents have in the entire State of New Jersey. We have special programs. 85% of the library is automated. There are so many things. But to hasten what is taking place I want to turn this over with the permission of the Commissioners in this Public Hearing to the Mayor of Stafford Township who worked hard for many, many hours working with the community. Mayor, if you could come up to the microphone so we have it on tape and we say thank you on behalf of all the residents of Stafford Township and of course the County of Ocean."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And Mayor you are on tape as Joe said and this is part of the Public Hearing on the Ordinance."

GREG MYHRE, MAYOR, STAFFORD TOWNSHIP: "I wouldn't have it any other way. I want to thank you Commissioner Vicari and the entire Board – all the Commissioners – and everybody that supported this project. And I know it goes a ways back certainly before my time in office.

Having a library in Stafford Township has been so important to all our residents and as you mentioned, to residents of greater Southern Ocean County. And I like to tell people that Stafford Township is the capital of Southern Ocean County. I say it because it is. So it will be used by, I think, a lot of residents of Ocean County. A lot of times I come up here to Toms River to use the library here. I bring my kids here. I've visited, I think, about probably ten of the branches. So sometimes you can't find what you need at one or there is a different program. So it really is a great, great system. You don't have that I don't think anywhere else, certainly anywhere else that I have ever been. So it really is a huge benefit to the community. And I've become a big library advocate as a part of this project.

But I think in conversation that I've had with Administrator Block, former Mayor Block as well, he mentioned about this grant that was coming up through the state – the grant opportunity that was supported by over 60% of New Jersey voters in 2017 and also over 60% of the residents of Stafford Township voted for that as well. It essentially is a once in a generation opportunity if it ever comes up again. I think the previous one was in the late 1990's which was

used to build the Toms River branch if I'm not mistaken. So it would just make no sense if we didn't try to take advantage of a great opportunity like that. And particularly with the borrowing environment with getting a nice low interest rate on the bonds just made perfect sense. And it was time. It really was time to get an upgraded library in Stafford Township.

A librarian, Theresa Foster, she talked to me about maybe getting a new library before I even knew it was on the radar. And the Friends of the Library have also been true friends at bringing this project to where it is today. So I'm very happy to be here. I'm very happy to have your support. And most importantly, I'm really happy just for the current generation and future generations that are going to use this facility.

The Commissioner mentioned the sensory room. We're upgrading all of our parks. We've actually got a playground being built right now. It should be done in a couple of weeks. And it's all ADA compliant. It's going to have a nice hard core rubber surface so that it is wheelchair accessible. And they can go all the way to the top of the facility. And we are having some type of sensory boards there as well. So we're trying to have them through all of our parks through our township. And that's something you need to recognize the needs of the community, which you've done with this project. So much thought has gone into it and I really think it's going to be something that people don't realize they're going to use it. They're going to find that it's something they needed and they're just going to get used to it being there. They'll be happy to have it.

So I want to thank all of you and I also want to thank the voters of the State of New Jersey for approving that \$125 million referendum five years ago. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Mayor, we appreciate having you here today. Henry Mancini, do you want to talk on behalf of the Library Board?"

HENRY MANCINI, OC LIBRARY COMMISSION: "Thank you Mr. Director. Forgive me, I am getting over a cold. Forgive my voice a little bit, but I will try to as a former Freeholder would say, 'I will speak loud and clear to the best of my abilities."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "We have special sanitizers so don't worry about it for your hands or the microphone."

HENRY MANCINI: "No, I'm all better, just a little raspy in the voice. So it's an honor to be here today. This has been a long time coming. I remember speaking to Carl Block about this on a baseball field about 15 years ago in Stafford Township on Opening Day. It's been a long effort and a really wonderful collaborative effort that I've never really witnessed before where we have a municipal government, a county government and then we were able to get \$4.8 million from the state to get this really worthwhile project off the ground. And really it's going to be such an asset not only to my hometown of Stafford Township, but all of Southern Ocean County and Ocean County in general.

We are really proud of our library system. We very much appreciate the support of the Commissioners. We appreciate the support of Stafford Township without which this would not have happened. But I would be remiss if I didn't thank the staff of Ocean County Library. Susan Quinn who heads that up does a tremendous job. Sara Siegler, our Assistant Director does a tremendous job. And they really worked hard on this grant application. It took two tries, but they were really super diligent on it and the proof is in the pudding, if you will, that we got the second largest grant in the State of New Jersey. It's a real asset to everybody. And just a win, win project for everybody. So I thank everybody and it's a really exciting day. I'm really happy to be here. So thank you all for your support. Sue, do you want to come up and say a couple, if that's okay?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Are you the Chairman now?"

HENRY MANCINI: "I am not the Chairman. No, I'm just a local representative. But I'm happy to be here and..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Are you going to pick the name? Henry, I'm just kidding with you."

HENRY MANCINI: "...like I said, my players, because I was a coach as you know, Jack, in Little Egg and Mayor Block at the time was there to throw out the opening pitch and before the opening pitch was thrown he comes walking over to me and my players were like, 'You know this guy?' I said, 'A little bit.' And then we ended up chatting about the acquisition of the site. And then ultimately this thing coming to fruition. But that was 15 years ago. So here we are today, a really happy day. And again, I'm very happy and thankful for everybody's support. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're thankful for you. Susan?"

SUSAN QUINN, DIRECTOR, OC LIBRARY: "Thank you. It's hard to follow the Mayor and Henry Mancini, but just truly thank you. We truly appreciate this. When we promised the people of Stafford when we applied for the grant that we would work really, really hard and we would to use a sports term 'leave it all on the field'. And we did. And it's thanks to everyone in this room, to yourselves, the Township of Stafford, our Library Commission, all of our library staff, the county professional staff, and it's the foundation – The Friends of the Stafford Library – and the people of Ocean County. The library is the peoples' university. We serve everyone. We're very excited. I'm just here to say truly grateful and thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Susan."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "And if I may add to Susan Quinn that even though during COVID-19 which was a very difficult time not only in Ocean County, but in the history of the United States in the last 100 years, it was difficult times. We modified the operation of it but we realized that the people of Ocean County in difficult times had to be served and one thing that we've always done with the library and with the technology is to reach out and build a better community. This has been a most difficult time. We are still recovering as far as mentally and physically from the COVID-19, but you did an outstanding job and we just want to recognize that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Freeholder. Anyone else that wants to make comments on this please come up. Just give us your name for the record please."

MARY MALAGIERE, FORMER CHIEF LIBRARIAN, OC LIBRARY: "I am currently serving on the Foundation Board which we, of course, serve the entire county. It's good to see you, Mr. Block. Good to see all of you. And I want to thank you again on behalf of all the residents of Ocean County. We work very closely with the Library Board and Commission. We are a volunteer board and we raise funds for those items that are not covered by our tax dollars. So we are very diligent about and excited to raise some extra money to see this project go to its full potential. So thank you very much. And I want to see you all at that library. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Would anyone else like to comment on this. Yes ma'am. Please come up."

THERESA FOSTER, BRANCH MANAGER, STAFFORD LIBRARY BRANCH: "I grew up in Stafford Township. I'm a lifelong resident. My family lives in Stafford Township. And I'm really proud to be the branch manager for Stafford. And it has been a long time coming. I've heard about this library since I was a little girl. We have the schematic rendering at the branch right now and I can't tell you how many customers and community groups come in and see it and tell me how excited they are. They see the design. They see what's coming to Stafford Township. And it's been a great experience and I thank you very much."

At one time we had several large libraries to serve the county and it was Jim Mancini who debated with other members of the governing body to say that we need local libraries. And we now have a local library system. This is one more of those. There already is a library that we are going to close when we open this one in Stafford Township. But you have one in Little Egg. You have one in Tuckerton. You have one in the real capital of Southern Ocean County, Eagleswood Township. (laughter) So it really was a great thing. You really should be proud of your dad because it's his vision that bought us the library system we see today."

HENRY MANCINI: "Thank you very much. That was very kind."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Henry. Anyone else to be heard on the Ordinance? Seeing no further comment, I'll close the Public Hearing and ask for a motion to adopt Ordinance #2022-11."

No further comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

And it was a 2-2 vote for a long, long time. I'm not going to tell you who broke the tie. But I'll tell you the best thing is that what is part of the quality of life and we thank your dad and his hard work and I think it's basically vision. And so I proudly, with the direction of and I worked closely with Commissioner Crea on this to second the motion, I will make the motion to support this Ordinance."

T. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:30 PM, Director Kelly received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I will now open up to Commissioner Comments starting with Commissioner Crea."

COMMISSIONER CREA: "Thank you very much Director. I just want to point out, as most of you probably already know that today is the beginning of the 'ban the bag' day. So good luck everyone when you go to the ACME or

Costco or wherever it is you shop. Make sure you bring your recyclable bag with you. As Mr. Agliata pointed out, we all have to do what we need to do to make sure we bring the bags with us. If not, you're going to carry your things with you to the car like we do when we go to Costco or BJ's. So have a good day with that.

And I also just want to point out to the woman who is the member of the American Legion. I am also a proud member of the American Legion Auxiliary. Thank you very much. (Auxiliary) 493. Thank you for all you do for the members of the American Legion. I appreciate that.

And for anyone in the audience to whom it may apply, Happy Mother's Day this weekend. Thank you all. That's all. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "No questions or comments at this time unless you want to introduce another ordinance for another library. I don't think that's going to happen today. But I think it's a great day for all of us that voted not only for it, but the public support. And again, the credit goes to those who not only use the library, that are part of the library system. And we say thank you on behalf of all of us in Ocean County. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Commissioner Quinn."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Thank you Director. Just in regards to the library, Susan, Henry, everyone that's here today – thank you for all the hard work that you do because the library...we can provide the buildings, we can give you the tools that you need, but really it's the folks in the system itself whether it's the board itself, or whether it's the staff or yourself Susan as the Director, you are the ones who make it work. You are the ones on the ground. You are the ones that take and work on a daily basis to take and provide the services so hats off to you. Like Commissioner Vicari said, we're not giving you another library today but you really have built a great system and I can see it going a lot further in the future as things go forward. So please thank all the board members, all the staff, for all the hard work they do.

With regard to what Commissioner Crea said, I've been shopping in Stafford for the last three months so I know I never get a bag down there so if you want to get used to it, you should have started down there three months ago. The Mayor and the Committee down there changed it a while back and it's working out very well. The people – it's going to take some time to train to get yourself used to the fact that you have to bring bags with you, but it is an item that is really going to go a long way as far as helping some of the problems we have here in the state. Especially Commissioner Crea, she is (liaison to) Recycling and I remember when I was doing Recycling those plastic bags cost us a fortune to take and undo when it came to the system being clogged up with them. So there is a good reason for it. Change is never something that is easily accepted, but I think in the long run, Bobbi, I know you are out there educating the public and really getting the word out there. Tony is here today. I know Tony and his staff have done a great job. So if there are any hurdles to overcome over the next week or two and people are complaining, we're sending all the calls to you two. Other than that, I think it's going to be good moving forward.

Just two other things I just want to touch on. Kind of following up with the American Legion, again congratulations. 100 years of service is fantastic. This past weekend we had the opportunity – I said I was someplace else on was it Sunday morning?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Sunday."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Sunday morning."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Saturday and then Sunday."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Yes, Sunday morning we were down in Waretown. Waretown actually dedicated a new veterans park down there which has been in the works for probably the last 2 or 3 years. It was supposed to have been dedicated last year, but unfortunately with COVID everything was kind of put on the back burner. But we were down there for – you know, a couple of Commissioners and myself – Ginny was there, Bobbi was there. It really, truly is nice to see our veterans parks expanding throughout the county. We have so many different parks throughout the county in different towns and just seeing the crowd there on Sunday, all those proud veterans that were there participating in the ceremony, and truly deserving of all the honors that were given to them on that day. But I want to thank Waretown for doing what they did, for putting this thing into play. It's a beautiful little park. If you have the opportunity to go down there to see it, it's right on the road right by Town Hall there. It sits out on the main road itself. They've got flagpoles with all the different services up which they are honoring every service member that has served in this country. They're all lit up at night. And they have an eternal flame going in the front. They have a little monument there. But it's just really a nice thing to see that towns are stepping up and doing everything that they can do to take and recognize the veteran population here in the county. Like it's said over and over again, we have the largest veteran population in the entire State of New Jersey and we never want these individuals to go without being recognized. We don't want anyone to ever take it for granted that the freedoms we have are because of things we do ourselves. The men and women who have served this country have put us into that situation. And that's really a nice thing to see.

On the other end of it, we also Saturday had an event that we attended over in Winding River Park. Brad Billhimer, our Prosecutor, put together...this is 'Crime Victims' Awareness Week' and we're trying to take and put an emphasis

on the rights of a victim that's gone through some sort of a crime whether it be the victim itself, the family, anybody that has been involved in a situation like that in the county. And Brad does a tremendous job with different programs like this putting the spotlight on things, bringing people out and making sure that people realize there are a lot of different services available to people in this county that I don't think everyone is really aware of. But Brad does this as well as other functions throughout the year. This was a 3K or a 5K?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "They said 5K."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "5K, okay. Well, just in fairness, I'm recovering from being sick also and so I nominated Ginny to walk. So Ginny was good enough to do the walking."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I did it."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "I was happy to do the speaking and get up at the podium, but after that Ginny did get out there and walk. But it was a beautiful day. It was just nice to see. It was very well attended. Again, the Prosecutor and his entire staff was there making sure that people realize that there are services available. You might go through a tragedy in your lifetime, you might have to deal with something you never imagined you'd have to do, but there are services available whether it be stuff like Brad's or whether it be veterans services. This county offers a tremendous amount and we try to instill in people, if you need help, you have a problem, reach out to us because we will find some way to help. Thank you very much Director."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Deputy Director."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Mr. Director, I will echo Gary's comments on the war memorial in Waretown. If you get an opportunity to go there it is on Railroad Avenue. It is absolutely beautiful. It is one of the nicest war memorials I've ever seen and it's really, really...and they had a wonderful crowd of people that were coming not just from Waretown that were there, but people from all over mostly the southern part of the county were there.

Also with regards to the American Legion, one of my older sisters who just passed away in December, she was the Chaplain for the Lakewood Post for many years and very active in that. So I congratulate you on your 100 years. It is really wonderful.

And the library, I was always very partial to libraries growing up. I would probably spend a lot of Saturdays going to the library. And of course with the library we have here, I know working with Susan I was able to learn how to download my books now. But it is just the place that anyone can go to and it's really very, very well needed. I think we have 21 libraries. It's not in all 33 municipalities, but we're pretty close. And I'm just really happy that we're going to be doing that.

The other thing was two weeks ago on Wednesday, in fact it is two weeks today, we had the 'Holocaust – Courage in Remembrance', which we left here after our meeting and we went over to the Mancini Room. It was held outside the Mancini Room first for the speakers and we had a survivor from the Holocaust that was there and that would have been Esther Feder-Lesell who spoke about her childhood. And of course, then her daughter, Rita, spoke about it. And one of the things that she had mentioned and I had mentioned this last week was that her daughter going through her father...her father had a box of items and going through it after he passed she found what looked like a passport, but what it was is a booklet of all the places that he had gone to and it was all marked down in this booklet. To them that was extremely important to them – the family – because they had nothing else. They had nothing else from their childhood whatsoever, from the father's and/or the mother's childhood because as anyone would know they lost everything besides family members in the Holocaust. And we're very happy to have had Michael Cohen who was from the Simon Weisenthal Center that was down here. And of course many of you may remember when Michael was here a few years ago when we had done a resolution against anti-semitism and such here in Ocean County.

And the last thing I want to talk about which is Forked River Mountains is one of our largest Natural Lands that we've purchased which is close to 8,000 acres in Lacey Township. On April 23rd...every year we do a cleanup at the Forked River Mountains. I just want to give some of the highlights about it because a lot of people don't realize exactly in one year what can accumulate. The Forked River Mountain Coalition is a nonprofit organization that works to conserve, maintain, protect and restore the natural culture and historical resources of the Forked River Mountains. The Forked River Mountains area comprises over 20,000 acres of mostly public preserved property. Of course the Natural Lands Trust Fund acquired the largest piece in February of 2019. The County has been working cooperatively with the Forked River Mountain Coalition for 25 years to clean this area, in those 25 years even though we did not purchase this land until 2019. In those 25 years, it's hard to believe, 706 tons of trash or 1.4 million pounds of trash has been removed from the Forked River Mountains. The County Department of Parks, Solid Waste and Roads have worked together with the coalition and Lacey Township to make the cleanup happen every single year.

And I just want to mention the organizations that participate because they have been participating for many years and they really need to be recognized:

Bamber Lakes Volunteer Fire Company, Bob's Square Deal, Boy Scout Troop #56 of Lacey, BrickWall Corp., Forked River German Butcher Shop – everyone likes the German Butcher Shop, Forked River Mountain Coalition, Holtec International, Hometown Builders, Lacey Liquors, New Jersey Conservation Foundation, Ocean County Clean Communities, Ocean County Department of Parks & Recreation, Ocean County Department of Solid Waste, Ocean

County Landfill Corporation, Pinelands Preservation Alliance, Rotary Club of Forked River, ShopRite of Lacey, Township of Lacey, and the U-14 Girls Lacey Soccer Club which are called 'The Wildcats'.

And just to mention, the Ocean County Landfill which is a private entity in Manchester Township and the BrickWall Corp. in Lacey Township accepted the debris and the concrete at no cost for this cleanup whatsoever.

So these organizations and clubs that did come out and help are individuals that should really be thanked all the time because they probably not only help here for the Forked River, but I'm sure they go out in other areas of Ocean County doing the same thing. And I just want to thank them and I just think they need to be recognized today for what they have been doing for all of these years. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you. Okay that concludes the comments from the Board."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** – "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:42 PM, Director Kelly opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public:

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We now open up to public comment. I ask you to give your name and address and limit your comments to five minutes and no more so everybody gets a chance. Would anyone like to address the Board at this time?"

GEORGE GILMORE, 15 CRANMOOR DRIVE, TOMS RIVER: "I'm back on the same two issues. I've been here in March, April and now May. The first one deals with the drop box at the Brick Township Municipal Building in regards to the elections in both 2020 and 2021. And there were a lot of issues raised in regard to that, but the biggest issue was how many ballots were placed in that drop box for the 2021 election? Because that was a close election for a Council seat and we've asked for that information and I hope we have it."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We do."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Good! It took two months, but that's better than nothing."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes it is, George. Very, very good. In 2021, there were 2,088 ballots deposited into the ballot box in Brick Township."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Which is more than enough to change the outcome of the election."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "You do understand that not just Brick itself, they are not the only ones, it is very, very possible that other towns or people that may be driving by can just like we have..."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Absolutely."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "We have 19 ballot boxes, 17 locations. So I'm just saying yes, all 2,000 could have been Brick Township, but..."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I would think we can assume that the majority were Brick. Not all."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "It very well could be, but never assume George. You know what that does."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Yes I do. Same as last time."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes."

GEORGE GILMORE: "And in regard to reporting the malfunction of the electronic surveillance, have we sent that to the state? I've raised that at both the March and April meetings."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "What do you mean? We let this go? No."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Well, we had a failure of the system."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes we did."

GEORGE GILMORE: "And did we report that to the state? When I was here before I asked that question and I was told it would be looked into and it would be reported if necessary. And I'd like to know if it was looked into and it was reported."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "I'm just checking my notes here because I do know...and also, before I forget I just want to mention for those of you that might be interested, there is an Election Board meeting on Tuesday at 2:00pm because we are going to be there. But I think a lot of your questions that you have could be something that they probably would be able to answer a lot better than we can. But since you know, George, very well that is the County Election Board Commissioners who are appointed by the Governor are the ones responsible for everything that you ask us of. We're only responsible...we are only responsible for the budget of the County Election Board and

we also approve the hiring of the employees. But everything else we will answer. I do believe that...I'm just trying to go through my notes..."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I would just request that your response is not deducted from my five minutes because I feel like I'm in college..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Don't ask questions."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Very good, Jack. I believe it was, but I'm just trying to...because I wrote notes down. I'm just trying to see where... Our Senior Deputy Attorney General, George Cohen, received a complaint from Anna informing him of the system issue experienced by Brick and the unavailability of the recording. That was what I was able to find out on this."

GEORGE GILMORE: "So a complaint was filed, but the County itself did not report that."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes."

GEORGE GILMORE: "The Election Board didn't report that."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Exactly. The Election Board did not report that. Yes."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Alright, I will move to my second topic which is the hiring of an Assistant Administrator if, in fact, the current Administrator and Assistant stay in place we won't have to address that. But I brought up at the March 16th meeting about Tristan Collins and I have transcripts of the meeting now. So I think the most important things in government are transparency and honesty. And at that meeting I asked if Tristan Collins was being considered for Assistant Administrator. And I can read the answer if you require me to."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The answer is yes, he is being considered. He has been interviewed."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I was told at the time, no, we didn't know. But then I find out that a month before that meeting..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Don't point your finger at me."

GEORGE GILMORE: "A Commissioner wrote a letter, note, to at least three of the remaining four Commissioners saying 'Here's his resume. I think he would be a perfect person to put in as Assistant Administrator.' If that's not being considered, I don't know what is.

My second question is, and I don't need a response to that. My second question is are we going to advertise?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "No."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Alright. We're not going to advertise. So we have Tristan Collins that we know is who some people want to appoint even though we didn't do anything on it. We have, I think, one or two other people. How many people have submitted their resume?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "So far I have interviewed five people with the interview committee. We have two more interviews to go."

GEORGE GILMORE: "And how do those seven people know to submit their resumes? If they work for the county that's a different story. In other words, if you have somebody and they do a great job..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I believe it was five that we said. Wasn't it Gary?"

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Five from the county, yeah."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Five from the county including some very talented people."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I'm glad to hear that because I like to see promotions from within."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Four. Now the Director of Employee Relations is telling me four."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I think it's important. See I still am convinced you're going to hire Tristan Collins. I think, not you, but he will violate the law of the State of New Jersey by taking it because it's clear he submitted and was looking for that appointment to that position before he even retired from the State Police. So we will continue this saga as we go on until it's resolved."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Well, you're making an assumption that Tristan is going to be the one that we hire and I don't know that yet and I've been conducting the...chairing the committee that has so far interviewed five very qualified candidates, more than one of which I've been very impressed with as I can tell you Gary Quinn has been because I've asked him. And we have a couple more to go. At that time we are going to bring back what we consider the top two or

three candidates for a second interview to the committee and then the Board is okay to interview those same candidates."

GEORGE GILMORE: "I hope I'm wrong, but I think I'll be back here saying 'I told you so.' But along those lines, I don't think you should be replacing Carl Block. He's done a tremendous job. Gary Quinn said that at the last, not the last, two meetings before. He's a tremendous Administrator and I understand three beats two, but it's not right."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you."

GEORGE GILMORE: "You're welcome."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "And see I gave you your extra time for answering a question."

GEORGE GILMORE: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "But it's just funny that you ask questions and then don't want to wait for the answers off of your time. Okay, would anyone else like to address the Board? Mary, you've got to have something to say."

MARY BUCKLEY: "Me?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI, ROSE MANOR COURT, BRICK: "Hello Commissioners. So I am also here with comments and questions about the lost Brick footage for the 2020 and 2021 elections. I do know that it is the Election Board's responsibility, however, it is in this very room that Ms. Haines you did say that this Board, the Election Board and the County Sheriff work together as far as the conduct of our elections are concerned.

Speaking of conduct, the responsibility of security and integrity is of the utmost importance and included in that is record retention responsibilities. And back in January, Jason Varano, one of the supervisors at the Election Board, emailed me the guidance from the Secretary of State. This document, 'Guide to Document Drop-Boxes', which was issued September 25, 2020, the state did not specify an exact timeframe for the election retention, the footage retention I should say, for the ballot boxes. However, it did set a very clear expectation for communicating retention requirements in the case where these boxes were at a third party, in this case Brick Township. So I submitted an OPRA request to Brick and I asked them how you all communicated those requirements to them. And the head of the Brick IT Department said that verbal instruction was given to retain the records of the ballot boxes longer. That is the exact verbiage that was used. So they took it upon themselves to set the retention period to 90 days. Obviously, this was all prior to their system failure. But my problem is that your claim that you didn't receive guidance which I can see in the document and there's no responsibility being taken for getting the correct guidance from the state. But for some reason it was found appropriate to perpetuate the same vague instruction to Bricktown. So whether it was you or the Election Board or the Sheriff, it doesn't matter. Is it not all three of your duties to get those answers from the Secretary of State before advising a municipality like Brick? Don't you also think it's a little hypocritical to use the state as your excuse for not knowing the retention rules after you provided the same vague guidance to Brick? Were you aware that there is a record schedule published on the Treasury website that has been effective since 2010? Granted this is in relation and it specifically says 'the vote-by-mail ballots and the applications'. And those retention guidelines say anywhere from two to five years. So with your election background, you have been running elections in this county for a very long time, why would you think that the footage that records chain of custody, delivery, whatever, would be something like 30 days as communicated to me by the Custodian (of records) at the Election Board? And if there was a livestream of all of this footage directly to the Sheriff's Office, and I know that it wasn't monitored, but I still don't understand how you didn't know about it until after Brick's system failure and after it was recovered. And that is what they had told me that you were told in November of 2020 about the system failure.

And another thing I don't understand is why the communication, the guidance, wasn't investigated at that point so that you could, in anticipation of 2021, give clear guidance as to how long they were being retained. So those are just some of my questions. And I did have a request because I have spent some time reviewing the footage. It shouldn't come as any surprise that there was one anomaly I came across. Again, there's a lot of footage as it is. This was right in the Toms River Parking Garage where the ballot box was not locked after 8:00pm after they were collected and somebody dropped off ballots at 8:35pm. I'm not saying that that's going to make a difference in the election, but it's an inconsistency that invalidates the argument that they were secure because something like that is a very insecure action.

I'll leave my opinions about the lawsuit out of it, but at the end of the day the limited footage that is now public was from an OPRA request that was dated November 18, 2021. What I'm asking is that you work with the Election Board to have all of the footage published because I do have two prior OPRAs that were completely dismissed in my lawsuit even though they're on the record and I did make it a point to say these are all the subject matter of the lawsuit and it will show that I requested all the hours and all the footage. So again, my request is that you just work with them to publish the rest of the footage and if I can be given updates. There are people who are making it a point to go review the footage. We would like to see it all and I'm just asking that you work with the Election Board to make that happen."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Well my understanding is that everything that is available is in the library and can be viewed. And now it's not only in the Toms River library, but also in the Brick library. So it is available for review."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Well all the records, the entirety of the records were supposed to be preserved in accordance with the Temporary Restraining Order."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "That really should go to the Ocean County Board of Elections. It is their duty to preserve the record."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "If I do that, is there any kind of guarantee I can get that you will also work with them because they have made it very challenging just to get these records and you guys were kind enough to work with them in publishing it. But remember, they didn't even want to give it to me without me paying something like \$300.00 anyway for records that are owned by the people as it is."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "If you're available on Tuesday at two o'clock, possibly you might want to attend the Election Board meeting. I will be there. Possibly if you can, if your schedule allows you to be there, you can ask them those questions. There's four commissioners that would be able to be there. If you can."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Okay. I can consider it."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "If I understand your question, you want to know if we will advocate for you to get the information."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Correct. So that I don't have to go back to the courts because I am not confident that if I ask they will actually cooperate."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Right in front of you I will instruct the County Administrator to work with the liaison to be an advocate and work with you."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Okay. So I will follow up with you then?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Follow up with the Administrator if you would."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you for your comments."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "I think Susan Quinn is trying to get your attention."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Susan, I'm sorry."

SUSAN QUINN, DIRECTOR, OCEAN COUNTY LIBRARY: "Director, I just wanted to clarify that currently the tapes are available in the Toms River branch, not at Brick at the moment. But I just wanted to clarify that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Carl, you told me in my office that it was available in Brick. Now the library is saying it is not."

SUSAN QUINN: "I think it has been requested but we are not ready. I just wanted to clarify for you that we do have it in the Toms River branch at the moment."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "I had a conversation with the IT Director to prepare one and put it in there. I sent a memo to Susan Quinn before I left for vacation. Whether it is operational today or not, I do not know. But it is on its way, if it's not."

SUSAN QUINN: "I just wanted to make sure that nobody goes to the library..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Do you know when it will be available in Brick? Susan, when will it be available in the Brick library?"

SUSAN QUINN: "We are evaluating locations and..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "How many people have viewed it in Toms River library so far?"

SUSAN QUINN: "I'd have to get you that information. I don't have it at the moment, but I can certainly do that."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "The last information I got, which could be incorrect again, was one person. Is that incorrect and there's more now?"

SUSAN QUINN: "It's just one. It's still just one?"

ANONYMOUS: "Just one."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "That's incorrect. There's two people here who went there as well."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Somebody signed in."

ANONYMOUS: "I would like to see it myself again."

SUSAN QUINN: "Okay. For everyone..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, I'm just letting you know that I get different information than you have sometimes because the information that...because I look into these things that are said at the meetings..."

SUSAN QUINN: "Correct. I know it's a write-in sign-in."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "But in any event I just wanted to let you know that this thing is not overwhelming the system. There is not a whole line of people waiting to see this. Because it is, as you know because you've been doing it, very monotonous to look at three months of tape which 90% of the time is nothing happening at all. So not everybody is jumping to do that. But I did ask that we have it in Brick also because that was a request that came in."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "So if I could just add one thing."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yes."

ANNA LICHNOWSKI: "The movie "2000 Mules" came out that revealed a lot of the reasons as to why I even started this process."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I think you are doing what you should be doing. It's up to the public to keep us in line and you're doing that and I appreciate it. Okay, anybody else like to...yes. Mary, I knew you would come up."

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "Director, if you will, I will get back to you on the date that it will be operational in Brick."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, get back to Anna, if you will."

MARY BUCKLEY, 514 AZALEA DRIVE, BRICK: "I just wanted to ask, is there a reason why you have to sign in to see the films?"

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Susan, can you answer that? Why do you have to sign in to see the film?"

SUSAN QUINN: "Yes ma'am, in order to use the computers in case there is a wait we ask people to sign in. In case there is a wait list to use the computer, we have sign-ins at all of our computers throughout the library system. So that's the reason why. We're just following our standard protocol to use library resources. We just want to make sure everyone has the same opportunity to share and have access. So I hope that answers your question."

MARY BUCKLEY: "Yes. I just wanted to know if it was something particular for this or if it was..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "You know what? Until that answer just came out, I couldn't have told you. I didn't know the answer."

SUSAN QUINN: "Yes, actually that is just a standard protocol."

MARY BUCKLEY: "Thank you."

SUSAN QUINN: "You're welcome."

MARY BUCKLEY: "I want to know if there's any way that it could be streamed so that people would be able to see it online."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "We're looking into that right now. I don't have...you don't have an answer on that yet, do you?"

ADMINISTRATOR BLOCK: "No, Commissioner, there was a demonstration. We are evaluating systems."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Yes, and that's why, let me make sure this is on (microphone). That is one of the items that are going to be discussed at the Election Board meeting. Myself and Mary Lou Mycoff who is the IT Director will be with me. We will be discussing it with them because it's their decision. We will provide the funding, but it's up to the commissioners of the Board of Elections if they will do it. I am making a presentation to them, myself and Mary Lou are making a presentation to them on Tuesday at 2 o'clock about that. And giving them what the cost is and we will pay for it, but it's up to them. It's their decision because, as you know, the commissioners of the Board of Elections are fully in charge of all of that. They do all the policy. But we are willing to pay for it, but we just need to know if they are okay with it."

MARY BUCKELY: "Do you think that this might be something that would be carried through to the future so that

we would have more transparency with our elections?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "If we do this, if they agree, approximately the cost to us each year is going to be about a little more than \$300,000.00 for us to do this. So we are willing to do that, but just as long as the Board of Elections...it's up to the commissioners of the Election Board."

MARY BUCKLEY: "And I really think that most of the public would be very in favor of voting for that amount of money to have more secure elections.

I have another question. It's about plastic bags. Is there a way to get rid of plastic bags anymore?"

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "A lot of this...I'm sorry Bobbi. A lot of stores have barrels as you walk in the store."

MARY BUCKLEY: "I have found that they are not doing it anymore."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Well, they are phasing that out because they don't want those bags any more than anyone else because now they can't get rid of them themselves. So it's just a matter of time before the population of bags that we have are just going to become non-existent.

The downside to the plastic bag thing which I think people haven't looked at and we talked about it this morning with Dan Regenye who is here from the Board of Health, when the Legislature...the state put this into effect...Governor Murphy decided that this was something that was going to go into effect a couple of years ago, the downside is we have a lot of people that have animals, dogs, that use those bags to pick up dog waste. And we're trying to educate people to make sure you find another way, you might have to buy something, some sort of bag or something. But if that's not still done the same way because pet owners are very concerned and they are really responsible, but if they are not doing that now in the future, all that waste is going to feed into our storm drains and ultimately feed into the waterways that we have here in Ocean County which is going to be really bad for the county. So there are a lot of kinks that still have to be figured out but as of today, no plastic bags."

MARY BUCKLEY: "I was just wondering because I have tons of them that, you know, I've saved and then I tried to recycle them or whatever – take them to a grocery store – and nobody is doing that anymore. So what do you do with them? You don't want to just put them in the garbage."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Take them out of state and put them in the garbage cans." (Laughter)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Mary."

COMMISSIONER QUINN: "Did I say that out loud?" (laughter)

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Anyone else like to address the governing body at this time? Seeing no further comments...yes, okay sir. Your name and address for the record."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ, 789 VAUGHN AVENUE, TOMS RIVER: "It's the first time talking with you guys. And I know some of you will be onboard with me and some of you will be like wait. But I've got something I want to bring up. Today something got out I don't know if you heard about the Supreme Court leak or something like that. Something about abortion.

Years ago, and I'm a school bus driver in Toms River and I'm partial to kids, years ago I just decided to read the Declaration of Independence and this was right after I heard about this guy who found out through Planned Parenthood, that they were selling body parts of fetuses. And it hit me in the heart. And I was reading the Declaration of Independence and I came to this spot 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.' There's life right there. 'That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed' that's us, 'that whenever and form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new government, such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.' And I'm here speaking for the kids and I know the government, our Governor, said this is the law of the land but I think other people – hopefully some of you – will agree that our children that are born and even almost ready to be born deserve to be governed by the right people that are fighting for them. And I just want you to know that we will vote for you. And if you consider what we're talking about."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "I thank you for your comments. I hope you understand what that leak said that the Supreme Court is doing. They are ending Roe v. Wade nationally but sending it back to each state."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "I understand."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Sadly, our state is not going to change the law as long as the people who are in office are still in office. So really, if you are pro-life and want pro-life, go out there and work to elect people who are pro-life. If you're pro-choice and you want pro-choice, then go work and get people elected who are pro-choice. I proudly sit here and tell you I am pro-life."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "Very good."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "A lot of politicians won't say that and I don't blame them because I have been put in terrible editorials in the past for my views on all these issues, but they are what they are."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "Yes. So it is going to start from our local government before it gets to the state government to the..."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Not really. Local government will have no control. I just want you to understand the issue. Local government will have no say in this. The State Legislature does. If you want to be effective, I'm just trying to tell you, that is where to put your energies and work. It is the State Legislature that has to be changed because change in local government whether it's Democrat Mayors, Republican Mayors, Republicans on Council, it's not going to change what is going to happen with the pro-life/pro-choice. I mean this debate has been going on for 50 years. I don't have to tell you. You know."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "Well, they wrote that thing, Roe v. Wade, and put it back to the Constitution says it was a right that they could have an abortion and it's not a right. That's what they came up with."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah. That's what the Supreme Court has said."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "It's not a right."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "But yet they did say the states have the right to legislate it. And one of the things if you are watching the news, one of the states they highlight that won't change anything would be New Jersey, New York, California, and they went through a list of states that won't. Other states that will probably have stricter laws: Mississippi, Florida, Texas. They listed them all last night. So that's really where you want to put your energies."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "Like you said, maybe if taxes are too wrong for you, maybe New Jersey is not your state. So it's either we go or the state government goes."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Or we can make it our state by putting people in that have like thoughts. So that's where your energy should be put if you want to change that."

STEVE BERNATOWICZ: "Alright. And we've got to find out where we can put these masks instead of these plastic bags."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Yeah, I don't know. Only one time, Mary, because if I do it with you...Mary Lou, you haven't been here yet. Come right up. Former Councilwoman from Brick."

MARY LOU POWNER, 101 POLK DRIVE, BRICK: "I just wanted to add, while you are local government yes, but there could be a sense of...you pass resolutions and proclamations for an awful lot of things, right? You could do a resolution or a proclamation in support of pro-life changes to current law. You could work through the Association of Counties as well, right, and their committees, so I would encourage you – for those of you that are pro-life – to take those positions and try to get a proclamation, a resolution, of the Freeholder Board and maybe you'll be the first. Maybe another county will do it. Right? And if the Legislature, who in my mind doesn't listen to anybody, if they start getting these including our own Republican Legislators I might add, they're not up there fighting for us, right? If you start passing those kind of resolutions then they'll have to listen and they'll have to stand up and fight and they'll have to hold press conferences on the State House steps in opposition to Murphy, in opposition to the Democratic Legislature. They are not doing that. I would encourage you, this Board right here, to start that off and be proactive on these issues – pro-life issues, pro-gun issues, all the Constitutional issues – take a stand for us the people. Thank you."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Thank you Mary Lou. Anyone else?"

DEPUTY DIRECTOR HAINES: "Mary Lou, I'd just like to say one thing. I am the President of the Southern New Jersey County Commissioners Association and at our next meeting I will bring it up because there are eight counties in the southern part that are represented and I will bring it up to them on both of those issues to see how they feel or not and see what they are doing also. But I will go further on with those. And I'm sure that we will be talking."

MARY LOU POWNER: "That's great! We've got to get back to kind of forcing them to do stuff."

DIRECTOR KELLY: "Okay, anybody else like to address the Board at this time that hasn't already been up here for more than five minutes? Okay, seeing none, I'll close the public session and ask for a motion to adjourn."

There being no additional comments received, Director Kelly called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 5:09 PM.

WHEREAS, Lyme disease is the fastest growing vector-borne disease in the United States caused by the bacterium Borrelia burgdorferi, and is transmitted by the common black-legged tick found in nearly one-half of all US counties; and

WHEREAS, ticks that carry Lyme disease can also carry at least 15 other pathogens, many of them transmitted within minutes of being bitten, with one painless tick bite frequently resulting in multiple infections including bacteria, parasites, and viruses; and

WHEREAS, the risk of contracting Lyme disease can be year-round, however the nymphal tick which are the size of a poppy seed are most active in the Spring. Tick bites are nearly painless, with fewer than 50% of patients able to recall a tick bite nor reporting a "bull's-eye" rash; and

WHEREAS, Lyme disease infects more than 300,000 people annually in the United States, yet testing for Lyme disease remains only 50% accurate, with the average patient going two or more years before getting a proper diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, while most tick-borne diseases can be treated successfully with a few weeks of antibiotics, taking steps to prevent tick bites can help prevent tick-borne diseases including using insect repellent, removing ticks promptly, applying pesticides and reducing tick habitat; and

WHEREAS, in Ocean County, the Health Department, Extension Service and the Ocean County Mosquito Extermination Commission all work together to manage tick populations and the public health outreach programs to help educate the public about the symptoms, to seek prompt treatment and how to prevent tick-borne diseases.

ORDINANCE #2022-5

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$2,250,000 FROM THE RESERVE FOR OPEN SPACE, PARKS & RECREATION FOR THE COST OF THE RESTORATION OF THE COX HOUSE PHASE I, LOCATED IN BARNEGAT TOWNSHIP, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for the restoration of the Cox House Phase I, including but not limited to barn restoration and bathrooms, exterior restoration, structure stabilization and site work, located in Barnegat Township, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF \$2,000,000 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE ACQUISITION OF TITLE, RIGHTS-OF-WAY AND/OR EASEMENTS OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND (OR PARTS THEREOF) FOR ROAD AND/OR BRIDGE IMPROVEMENTS ALONG COUNTY ROADS, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean recognizes the need for the acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road and/or bridge improvements along County roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the Ocean County Engineering Department, including all else necessary therefor and incidental thereto; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County that funds be available for this purpose.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS of the COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING), as follows:

SECTION 1: \$2,000,000 is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the acquisition of title, rights-of-way and/or easements of certain parcels of land (or parts thereof) for road and/or bridge improvements along County roads, all in the County of Ocean, State of New Jersey; and, which sum shall also cover fees and contingencies.

SECTION 2: The capital budget of the County of Ocean is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program, as approved by the Director of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

SECTION 3: After passage upon first reading of this ordinance, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of the ordinance, together with the notice set forth below entitled: "NOTICE OF PENDING ORDINANCE" (with appropriate completions, insertions and corrections), at least once in a newspaper qualified under N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-19, at least seven days prior to the date set for public hearing and further consideration for final passage (which date shall be at least ten days after introduction and first reading). The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is further directed to comply with all provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 2-17(b) regarding postings, publications, and the provision of copies of this ordinance.

SECTION 4: After final adoption of this ordinance by the Board of Commissioners, the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to publish the full text of this ordinance, as

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$12,845,372, including the \$12,845,372 County Aid grant awarded by the New Jersey Department of Transportation to the County by letter dated July 28, 2021, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next

SECTION 6. The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A LIBRARY FACILITY, LOCATED IN THE TOWNSHIP OF STAFFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AND APPROPRIATING \$11,500,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$11,165,000 IN BONDS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN TO FINANCE THE SAME.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY (NOT LESS THAN TWO THIRDS OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF AFFIRMATIVELY CONCURRING) AS FOLLOWS:

There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$11,500,000, including the sum of \$335,000 as the down payment, and also including the \$4,824,000 New Jersey Library Construction Bond Act Grant awarded by the New Jersey State Library to the County by letter dated January 12, 2022, for the improvements or purposes described in Section 1 hereof as required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment has been made available by virtue of provision in the Capital Improvement Fund of the County of Ocean in one or more previously adopted budgets. A portion of the down payment is not required as a portion of this bond ordinance involves projects funded by State grants and other similar programs, within the meaning of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c).

SECTION 4. There is hereby authorized the issuance of negotiable bonds in an aggregate principal amount of \$11,165,000 to finance part of the cost of the purposes stated in Section 1 hereof. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not exceeding the limit authorized by law, and the maturities, method of sale and other details thereof shall be determined by subsequent resolutions to be adopted in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes provided for in Section 1 hereof, there is hereby authorized the issuance of bond anticipation notes of said County in an aggregate principal amount of

\$11,165,000. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the County Comptroller; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and shall be in such form as may be determined by the County Comptroller. The County Comptroller shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this Ordinance, and the County Comptroller's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8.1. The County Comptroller is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The County Comptroller is directed to report in writing to the Board of Commissioners at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

The County reasonably expects to commence acquisition and/or construction of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof, and to advance all or a portion of the costs in respect thereof, prior to the issuance of bonds or notes hereunder. To the extent such costs are advanced, the County further reasonably expects to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance, in an aggregate amount not to exceed the amount of bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof. This bond ordinance is intended to be a declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

SECTION 7. Any additional grant monies received for the purposes described in Section 1 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Ocean County Youth Services Commission, (OCYSC).

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

New Jersey P.L. 1995, c.282 established county youth services commissions in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Juvenile Justice Commission (JJC). These rules published in the New Jersey Register, Subchapter 2. County Youth Services Commissions (CYSC) 13:90-2.4 through 13:90-3.11, consolidate within a single county agency (CYSC), the planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the juvenile justice service system. The CYSC will perform all the duties and responsibilities set forth in this subchapter in order to qualify for funds from the Partnership Program and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission, including submitting yearly applications and obtaining Juvenile Justice Commission approval of a comprehensive plan of sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs that promote the goals of the Partnership Program and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission and that satisfy all additional requirements set forth in N.J.S.A. 52:17B-180(a)(2).

These by-laws are written to be in compliance with all New Jersey State statutes and JJC rules and regulations as currently known. In the event of changes or discrepancies between these by-laws and state rules, the Ocean County Youth Services Commission (OCYSC) will conform to the state rules and regulations as they are enacted, until such time as amendments to these bylaws can be made. Reference to the "Commission" means the Ocean County Youth Services Commission. Reference to the "State Commission" or "JJC" means the state Juvenile Justice Commission.

ARTICLE III: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A. The Ocean County Youth Services Commission shall:

- 1. Coordinate and integrate existing sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs;
- 2. Assess and prioritize the needs of youth adjudicated or charged delinquent;
- 3. Assess existing delinquency prevention programs to determine whether such programs meet the needs of youth, are effective in meeting program goals and in ensuring financial accountability;
- 4. Determine, through the collection and maintenance of data, the breadth of juvenile offenses and problems in the county and identify the geographical regions within the county where such offenses and problems are most prevalent;
- 5. Identify gaps in the system of sanctions and services for youth adjudicated or charged as delinquent and develop and implement an appropriate plan for closing the gap;
- 6. Develop and implement delinquency prevention programs to meet the needs of youth in geographical regions within the county where existing programs do not satisfy the needs of the youth;
- 7. Seek to expand existing delinquency prevention programs to better meet the needs of the youth of the county and to ensure the maximum availability of service to the youth of the county;
- 8. Review, evaluate and monitor through at least one site visit annually, existing sanctions and services under the jurisdiction, control or proposed by the Ocean County Youth Services Commission, for juveniles adjudicated or charged delinquent and existing delinquency prevention programs to determine effectiveness in meeting program goals and in ensuring financial accountability;
- 9. Cooperate with other state, county and municipal agencies in the planning of ongoing efforts relating to delinquency prevention programs;
- 10. Inform the public of the breadth of juvenile offenses, the needs of youth in the county and the availability of sanctions and services, and advocate for the needs of youth;
- 11. Serve as the advisory body of the county on issues relating to sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs;

- 12. Coordinate the efforts of municipal and regional Youth Services Commissions and ensure their participation in the county planning process;
- 13. Appoint liaisons to participate in planning and related activities with appropriate county bodies, for example, the Human Services Advisory Council, the Mental Health Board, the Local Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, and the County Inter-Agency Coordinating Council, as invited, to maximize efficient and effective use of partnership funds;
- 14. Determine whether a need exists, and if so, sponsor the establishment of a multi-disciplinary team (MDT) to plan specific sanctions and services to individual youth; as a diversion to be exercised by the Family court; as an alternative to detention for a juvenile charged as delinquent, as a recommendation for a disposition option for a judge of the Family Court upon an adjudication of delinquency; and, as a component of aftercare following the commitment of a juvenile to the Juvenile Justice Commission by a judge of the Family Court;
- 15. Coordinate the planning of aftercare sanctions and services for juveniles returning to the community following commitment to the Juvenile Justice Commission by a judge of the Family Court;
- 16. Comply with all applicable rules of the State Juvenile Justice Commission;
- 17. Recommend to the county governing body, the approval or disapproval of contracts with providers seeking to participate in the partnership;
- 18. Monitor the operations of programs of sanctions and services and delinquency prevention receiving partnership funds and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission with reference to compliance with rules established by the State Juvenile Justice Commission;
- 19. Monitor and evaluate the impact of programs of sanctions and services and delinquency prevention receiving partnership funds and/or other funds administered by the Juvenile Justice Commission and prepare annually, a written report with relevant documentation to the State Juvenile Justice Commission as part of the triennial comprehensive plan and annual update;
- 20. Encourage the involvement of youth and families in the planning of services and sanctions and program development;

- 21. Prepare according to JJC guidelines a comprehensive plan of sanctions and services for county juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent and delinquency prevention programs and submit same to the Board of Chosen Freeholders and to the JJC for approval.
- 22. Designate adequate staff to administer the duties and responsibilities set forth in this section.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

- A. The Ocean County Youth Services Commission shall consist of no fewer than 20 voting members and shall include both voting and non-voting members.
- B. The commission shall be composed of members who have knowledge relevant to the county's population involved in, or at risk of involvement in the juvenile justice system. The membership of the Commission shall include:
 - 1. The Presiding Judge of the Family Part of the Superior Court of the vicinage within which the county is located, or, a Superior Court Family Part Judge who hears delinquency matters in the county, as his or her designee;
 - 2. The Vicinage Family Division Manager or the Assistant Family Division Manager;
 - 3. The Vicinage Chief Probation Officer;
 - 4. The highest elected official of county government;
 - 5. The county prosecutor;
 - 6. The regional public defender;
 - 7. One official from the State Agency responsible for issues of child abuse and neglect;
 - 8. The county mental health administrator;
 - 9. The county superintendent of schools;
 - 10. The superintendent of the county vocational school;
 - 11. The director of the county human services department or such other department of county government directly responsible for providing services to youth;
 - 12. The director of the youth shelter located in the county;
 - 13. The director of the detention center serving the county;
 - 14. The director of the juvenile family crisis intervention unit established pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A: 4A-76;
 - 15. The president of the juvenile officers association of the county or other law enforcement representative who works primarily with youth;
 - 16. The county alcoholism and drug abuse director;
 - 17. A representative of the regional Workforce Investment Board (WIB), established under Executive Order No. 36 (July 12, 1995); and
 - 18. A representative of the business community in the county.

- 19. At least two (2), but no more than eleven (11) individuals in total, from the following groups who have demonstrated knowledge relevant to the county's population involved in, or at risk of involvement in, the juvenile justice system:
 - a. The education sector;
 - b. Mental health, family counseling, child advocacy, domestic violence, and/or victims rights groups;
 - c. Parents or parent organizations;
 - d. Clergy;
 - e. Family Law practicioners, as identified by the county bar association;
 - f. The minority concerns vicinage advisory committee of the Administrative Office of the Courts;
 - g. Civic organizations;
 - h. Representatives of major urban areas within the county;
 - i. Community youth;
 - j. Municipal youth services commissions; and
 - k. Other interested persons who deal with children.
- C. Each voting member identified in (B)2 through 19 above may be represented by a designee who is qualified by knowledge and/or experience to perform the duties of a member of a youth services commission. The names of the designees shall be submitted to the youth services commission chairpersons and YSC Administrator annually. Designees are strongly encouraged and have all the rights of the voting member.
- D. In addition to the members identified in (B) above, the membership of the OCYSC shall include as ex-officio members, a Juvenile Justice Commission Court Liaison. In addition, one representative of each of the following State agencies may sit on a youth services commission as non-voting exofficio members:
 - 1. The Department of Human Services;
 - 2. The Departments of Labor and Workforce Development;
 - 3. The Department of Education;
 - 4. The Department of Health;
 - 5. The Department of Community Affairs; and
 - 6. The Department of Children and Families.

- E. Each voting member appointed in (B) 17-19 above shall be made in such a way as to fulfill the objective that membership of Ocean County Youth Services Commission shall reflect the racial, ethnic and cultural demographic make-up of the county and the youth served by the sanctions, services and delinquency prevention programs planned, implemented, monitored and evaluated by the OCYSC.
- F. All members shall be appointed by the Ocean County Board of Chosen Freeholders and shall serve at the pleasure of the Freeholders.
- G. Members shall be appointed to a three (3) year term of office unless appointed to an unexpired term, and then the appointment will be for the unexpired term. Members will serve without compensation and shall be eligible to succeed themselves. (Add language about Statute Members are persons serving in that role and as such could fill an unexpired term with written notification of the change to the assigned person to the role)
- H. Any member who has two (2) consecutive absences from meetings of the Ocean County Youth Services Commission may be subject to recommendation for dismissal. Designated alternates are strongly encouraged to attend in a member's absence.

ARTICLE V: CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A. The following Conflict of Interest Policy has been submitted to the Board of Chosen Freeholders and the JJC with a written statement by County Counsel that the policy is in compliance with applicable law:
 - 1. No Commission member or employee of the Commission shall have any interest in a business organization or engage in any business, transaction or professional activity that is in conflict with the proper discharge of his or her duties as a Commission member or employee.
 - 2. No Commission member or employee shall use, or attempt to use, his official position to secure or warrant privileges or advantages for him/herself or others.
 - 3. No Commission member or employee shall act in his or her official capacity on any matter in which he or she, or a member of his or her immediate family, or business organization in which he or she has a direct or indirect financial interest or personal involvement.
 - 4. No Commission member or employee shall undertake any employment or service, whether compensated or not, which prejudices his or her judgment in the exercise of his or her official duties as Commission member or employee.
 - 5. No Commission member or employee, or member of their immediate family or business organization in which he or she has a direct or indirect financial interest, shall accept or solicit any gift, favor, loan, political contribution, service promise or other thing of value whether given or offered for the purpose of influencing him or her, directly or indirectly, in the discharge of his or her official duties as Commission member or employee.
 - 6. No Commission member or employee shall use, or allow to be used, his or her public office or employment, or any information, not generally available to the members of the public, which he or she acquires in the course of, or by reason of, his or her office or employment, for the purpose of securing financial gain for him or herself, or any member of his or her immediate family, or any business organization with which he or she is associated.
- B. Members shall refrain from voting when matters being voted upon present a conflict of interest. No member of the Commission or any of its committees shall participate in the discussion or vote regarding the awarding of monies or any contract or budget modifications if he/she has any direct or

- indirect financial interest in such official action. Members of the OCYSC shall abstain from voting on matters when that individual or agency they represent may be the grant recipient.
- C. "Financial interest" is defined as the employment or board membership of the OCYSC member or his or her immediate family, i.e. spouse, child, parent, grandparent, grandchild, uncle, aunt, brother, sister, sister-in-law, son-in-law, or any other member of the immediate household, by any business organization funded by or affiliated with the Ocean County Youth Services Commission.
- D. "Business organization" means any corporation, partnership, firm, enterprise, franchise, association, trust, sole proprietorship, union or other legal entity.
- E. Any member may challenge a Commission member's voting privilege in a matter that could be perceived as a conflict of interest. This question will be decided by a majority vote of the then-present members.
- F. OCYSC members will be asked to evaluate, on a yearly basis, their personal relationship with any county or private agency that conceivably could apply for State/Community Partnership and Family Court Appropriations funding, or other funding that utilizes the OCYSC funding allocation process and submit a signed conflict of interest form to the YSC Administrator.

ARTICLE VI: OFFICERS

- A. A Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson shall be elected annually from the membership.
- B. The Chairperson shall:
 - 1. Preside at all OCYSC meetings and decide all points of order or procedure in accordance with "Roberts Rules of Order."
 - 2. Vote on motions only in the event of a tie or when necessary to attain a quorum or minimum requirement of statute or state policy.
 - 3. Set meeting schedules and agendas.
 - 4. Call special, non-regularly scheduled meetings.
 - 5. Serve as official spokesperson for the OCYSC.
 - 6. Establish committees that may be found necessary.
 - 7. Appoint chairpersons of all standing and ad-hoc committees.
 - 8. Delegate responsibilities or tasks to committees and commission members and staff with the advice and consent of the OCYSC.
 - 9. Appoint a Nominating Committee in September to present a slate of officers in November for election by the Youth Services Commission in December.
- C. In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair or a designee shall perform all of the above functions necessary to conduct a specific meeting.
- D. Officers shall be ex-officio members of all committees.

ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

- A. The Ocean County Youth Services Commission shall schedule and hold regular meetings in accordance with the provisions of the Senator Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq. There shall be at least six (6) full YSC meetings each year, provided that no more than nine weeks shall elapse between meetings and at such other times as deemed necessary by the chair, or by the Executive Director or Designee. No meeting shall be held unless presided over either by the chairperson or by a co-chairperson of the youth services commission. The time, date and location for the OCYSC meetings shall be held at such times and in such locations as to encourage maximum public attendance and will be established annually at the last meeting of the preceding year.
 - 1. Special meetings may be called by the Chairperson or any five (5) members of the OCYSC, provided that at least forty-eight (48) hours notice of such meeting is given to each member and the public pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act.
 - 2. Emergency meetings of the OCYSC may be held without giving notice required by the preceding paragraph if substantial harm to the public interest is likely to result from a delay in the holding of the meeting. The subject matter of such meeting will be limited to discussion of and acting upon such matters of urgency and importance. The minutes shall reflect the urgent nature of such meeting and the reasons why the required notices were not completed.
- B. Conduct of Ocean County Youth Services Commission Meetings
 - 1. The quorum for OCYSC meetings shall be at least one third (33 1/3%) of the membership. On issues pertaining to public position or policy decisions, a majority of the voting membership present shall be required.
 - 2. All official actions of the OCYSC shall be in the form of motions, duly seconded, and carried by a majority of the Commission members present, provided a quorum is present. (Add language here regarding the use of email voting with proper documentation when the need arises)
 - 3. Any OCYSC member wishing to introduce an item of new business on which formal Commission action is desired, shall do so by submitting the item, as well as the proposed

Commission action, in writing to the YSC Administrator at least one week prior to the regular meeting.

- C. All Commission meetings shall be open to the public. Members of the public shall be permitted to ask questions or make comments at such times as the Chairperson deems appropriate. Comments and questions on agenda items can be made during discussion of the motion. Non-agenda comments and information can be given during the "Announcement" portion.
- D. The order of business at OCYS Commission meetings shall include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. Roll Call
 - 2. Approval of Minutes
 - 3. Reports of Liaisons
 - 4. Report of the MDT Chairperson
 - 5. Report of the Administrator
 - 6. Reports of Committees
 - 7. Old Business
 - 8. New Business
 - 9. Announcements
 - 10. Adjournment
- E. YSC staff shall keep minutes of all meetings of the OCYS Commission, showing the time and place, the members present, the subject considered, the actions taken, the vote of each member, the names of the members addressing the board, the names of persons appearing by attorney, and the findings made by the Commission and reasons therefore. A draft of the minutes shall be provided to Commission members prior to the next meeting.
- G. The minutes of the OCYS Commission shall be available for public inspection during normal business hours at the office of the Commission located at Ocean County Youth Detention Center, 165 Sunset Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey 08754-2191. A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall be provided to anyone requesting it.
- H. All meetings of the OCYS Commission shall be recorded verbatim by either stenographer, mechanical or by electronic means. Tapes may be listened to in the Commission office during normal

ARTICLE VIII: COMMITTEES & DUTIES

- A. Committees, subcommittees and ad-hoc committees shall be designated by the OCYSC chairperson. The chairperson(s) of each committee shall be appointed by the chairperson of the OCYSC from among the voting members of the OCYSC. Each Freeholder-appointed OCYSC member must serve on at least one committee. Committee membership may include non-voting members and any interested person with expertise in the area under study, including non-commission members. Committees shall report to the OCYSC at meetings unless otherwise directed by the chairperson of the OCYSC with consent of the full commission.
- B. The OCYSC shall have the following standing committees to consider the issues set forth in the JJC's regulations for CYSCs:
 - 1. A Bylaws & Membership & Legislative Committee, which shall,
 - a. Review OCYSC Bylaws and make modifications as needed for approval by the OCYSC, Board of Chosen Freeholders and the JJC;
 - b. Nominate candidates for Freeholder appointment to the YSC in order to ensure compliance with the bylaws and the rules and regulations governing CYSCs, in addition to the Freeholder nominations.
 - c. Research, study and comment on all state and federal legislation that impacts on court-involved and at-risk youth. Communicate comments and concerns to state and federal legislators and advocate for legislation that is in the best interest of children and their families:
 - d. Education, training and community awareness; and
 - e. Ethnic and racial disparity in the juvenile justice system. (Minority Concerns?)
 - f. Be comprised of any member having an interest in proposed legislation.
 - 2. A Monitoring & Proposal Review Committee, which shall,
 - a. Monitor and evaluate all contracted services;
 - b. Make recommendations for renewing such contracts to the OCYSC.
 - c. Review proposals from agencies seeking to provide contractible services through the Competitive Contracting procedures;
 - d. Select provider agencies and make recommendations of the same to the OCYSC and the

Board of Chosen Freeholders for the awarding of contracts.

3. A Needs Assessment & Program Development Committee, which shall,

- a. Develop the Comprehensive County Youth Services Plan that includes a needs assessment of sanctions and services for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent, and of delinquency prevention programs. Submit the Plan to the OCYSC for approval;
- b. Analyze all relevant data pertinent to the target populations of youth and develop recommendations to enhance the service delivery system for these populations of youth and their families.
- c. Review and analyze annual data for Plan Updates and Applications; make recommendations as needed.
- d. Receive data from the Needs Assessment Committee that identifies service gaps or enhancement needs that should be met by the design of a future program blueprint;
- e. Develop future program blueprints for sanctions and service's for juveniles adjudicated or charged as delinquent, and the delinquency prevention programs for identified service gap areas and present to the OCYSC for approval and promulgation to interested service providers.
- f. Explore alternative funding sources for programs and services.

4. An Executive Committee, which shall,

- a. Be comprised of the OCYSC officers and the chairs of all the subcommittees;
- b. Meet at the direction of the Chairperson as needed;
- c. Address long-range and systemic planning issues, or items that cross the purview of more than one committee.

ARTICLE IX: CONTRACTING & APPEALS PROCESS

- A. All contracts for services will be awarded according to N.J. State Law and County of Ocean procedures, commonly known as Competitive Contracting. Included in the process is the requirement for an appeals process.
- B. The Appeals Process will be as follows:
 - 1. A description of this process will be included in the "Request for Competitive Contract Proposals." Included will be a timeline giving the dates for filing proposals, filing an appeal, when recommendations would be made to the Commission and when services would be expected to begin;
 - 2. All agencies submitting proposals are advised of the Proposal Review Committee's recommendation via email, telephone and in writing. Agencies not recommended for funding are given a brief explanation of the decision and advised of the procedures for appeal. Appeals must be submitted according to the previously stated timeline;
 - 3. The appeal must indicate that there has been a violation of a statutory or regulatory provision of the law in the award of the grant. No appeal will be heard based solely on a challenge to the evaluation of the proposal or presentation by an agency;
 - 4. An appeals committee consisting of at least three Commission members, who were not on the Proposal Review Committee, will hear the appeal. The Chairperson of the Proposal Review Committee shall be in attendance but shall not vote. The Commission may also choose to hear the appeal as a "Committee of the Whole."
 - 5. Those agencies involved in the appeal or potentially affected by the appeal will be notified and permitted ten (10) minutes each to make a presentation;
 - 6. The Committee will either uphold the Proposal Review Committee's recommendation or propose an alternate-funding plan specifying agencies to receive funding adjustments. These recommendations will be presented to the Commission for action unless the Commission acted as a "Committee of the Whole."

ARTICLE X: ADOPTION & AMENDMENTS

- A. The OCYSC shall vote to recommend amendments, which shall be submitted to the Board of Chosen Freeholders and to the JJC for its review to assure compliance with applicable rules. Amendments shall take effect after approval by the Board of Chosen Freeholders.
- B. Amendments to the by-laws shall be made by the following process:
 - 1. Anyone wishing to suggest an amendment shall submit the change in writing to the YSC Chairperson for referral to the By-laws Committee.
 - 2. After review, the by-laws committee shall present all proposed amendments to the OCYSC meeting in writing. Copies of the proposed amendments shall be distributed to members of the Commission at least two weeks prior to the OCYSC meeting at which it will be voted upon.
 - 3. Amendments must be approved by a 2/3 majority of voting members present.

ARTICLE XI: MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Reference in these By-laws to a particular gender shall be applicable to either male or female gender.
- B. In the absence of any provisions herein, the proceedings of the OCYSC shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, as revised.
- C. The terms Chair and Chairperson, and Vice-Chair and Vice-Chairperson, respectively, are used interchangeably by custom or for clarity.

Director John P. Kelly opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Commissioner Haines and Mr. Agliata told the Board about an 11.67-acre property located on Eastern Boulevard in Berkeley Township that the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has recommended for acquisition. This property is adjacent to the Barnegat Branch Trail and just North of the Cedar Creek. Preservation would protect the site from the development of 35 homes. The property owner has accepted our negotiated offer of \$1,870,000.00.

Commissioner Crea discussed the success of the 2021 Recycling Program. 81,544 tons of material were recycled last year. Ocean County's profits were \$2,352,080.65, allowing the County to fully recover from its recycling losses from 2019 and 2020. 34,000 tons of brush and leaves were composted. 107 tons of documents were also shredded Introduced priough May 1,2022 dential Document Shredding Program. As a former Mayor, Commissioner Official Recreamistrate products is proud to be part of the Recycling Program on the County side, and appreciates the savings the County has afforded the municipalities.

Director Kelly said that the County has not charged the municipalities for processing their recyclable materials for the last two years because of the revenue generated. Mr. Agliata believes that the County will continue to benefit from the upswing in the recycling market.

Commissioner Vicari mentioned that the Board made a wise decision to invest \$5 million in equipment and renovations to ensure the recycling facility runs efficiently. These upgrades were performed to protect the environment, and have enabled the County to take advantage of the improved global market.

Commissioner Quinn said the Planning Department educates residents through all of our recycling programs.

Director Kelly and Mr. Ernst reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda which included the recommendation to advertise for Curb and Sidewalk Contract 2022. The prices submitted would cover the repair or replacement of curbs and sidewalks due to damage from various things, such as snow plows. The towns themselves are responsible for the cost of the repair, unless the damage was caused by the County. Mr. Ernst also told the Board about two Resolutions. The first Resolution is in support of Monmouth County's continued efforts to obtain the NJTPA FY 2022 Local Safety Program Grant to further develop infrastructure improvements along CR 537, Monmouth Road in Jackson and Millstone Townships. The second Resolution is in support of the US DOT, the NJ DOT, The Department of the Army, and The County of Ocean, to pursue funding sources from the Defense Access Road Program for CR 539 at Ridge Way Overpass and Access Road improvements in Jackson and Plumsted Townships. There were no questions or comments and all items will be listed on the Board Agenda for the April 6, 2022 Board meeting.

Ms. Gunther reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of April 6, 2022. There were no questions or comments.

Director Kelly asked the Board members for comments.

Commissioner Vicari would like the Board to do a Resolution commemorating the success of Saint Peter's University basketball team.

Commissioner Vicari discussed his concern for the rise in gas prices recently. The Commissioner reached out to our Senators requesting a tax break on gasoline.

Commissioner Vicari attended a meeting in a Berkeley Township age restricted community where there was a petition to allow Real Estate Agencies to purchase properties and rent to whomever they like, even if they don't meet the age requirement.

Many residents attended the meeting to support Mayor Amato's decision to oppose the Adopted on petition mand keep the age at 55 and above.

There were no additional comments.

Director Kelly discussed the long term capital plan for Ocean County. He mentioned that the downtown Toms River County complex will be addressed first.

Mr. Block shared a map with the Board which is attached.

Mr. Block said that due to the excessive rent and lease expiring in June, 2022, the Board of Social Services building was the first priority project, and is already under construction. The second project the Board decided upon which was recommended by the 2015 Mater Plan, was the Courthouse Annex. This project is already in the final design stage. A decision needs to be made on a possible area for the Sheriff's new building, which would be the next capital project. Mr. Block suggested that the County should hire a firm to complete new concept plans, since there is already money set aside in the County's Budget to cover that cost. The timeline for receiving a completed concept plan may be 3 to 6 months. Commissioners Quinn and Haines have discussed possible locations for this building with the Sheriff. Depending on the Sheriff's needs, there may be an area at Mott Place which could be large enough to accommodate the new building with sufficient parking.

Director Kelly said construction of the Sheriff's building will be the next project for Ocean County, followed by consólidating the Hall of Records, current Administration Building offices, and the Election Board into one new building. The Director would also like to see the Prosecutor's Office move into the current Administration Building.

Commissioner Quinn said the Sheriff is looking to consolidate his offices into one centrally located building. The Sheriff's Offices are currently located in downtown Toms River, on Chestnut Street in Toms River, and at Robert J. Miller Airpark. Mott Place would be a convenient area for the new building considering its close proximity to the Courthouse. The Sheriff would be able to have OEM, CSI, the Sheriff's general offices, and 911 all in one place, as well as keeping a smaller 911 outpost at Chestnut Street. Commissioner Quinn mentioned that Prosecutor Billhimer would like to have more space as well, whether through new construction, or by consolidating into a larger existing building. The Commissioner said in doing these projects, it will eliminate many of the rental property costs the County currently has.

Director Kelly said that when the economy dipped we held off on beginning any new projects.

Commissioner Quinn said he would agree to demolish older buildings, rather than

The Board agreed to put out an RFQ for the Sheriff's Building concept plan.


