The following weekend, the Long Beach Island Foundation of the Arts and Sciences hosts the Black Maria Film and Video Festival on Friday, June 13, at 7 p.m. Created in 1981, the festival exhibits and rewards uncommon, experimental and innovative work. Named for the first movie studio built by Thomas Edison, the festival brings 40 to 60 juried independent short works to 65 venues in 20 states each year. Black Maria "seeks creative, insightful, sensitive, free-spirited, expressive, poetic and experimental works in animation, narrative, documentary and hybrid forms." The ninth annual LBI Artist Open Studio Tour, scheduled for June 28 and 29, gives the art-loving public a rare opportunity to meet, observe and get inspired with local artists in their own studio or gallery environments, thereby deepening the public's understanding of the creative process. All participating artists offer demonstrations and have works on display and for sale. The tour's mission is to strengthen the growing cultural movement on Long Beach Island, by promoting the artists who work and exhibit there and by celebrating art as a vital part of a culturally and economically thriving community.
