

Freeholder Director Joseph H. Vicari opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Bartlett reviewed with the Board two parcels recommended for acquisition by the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee. The first site is located in Plumsted Township and is approximately 6 acres. Freeholder Bartlett advised that the negotiated price is \$22,000. The Freeholder noted that this site is located next to farmland preservation property and adjacent to 107 acres of Natural Lands Trust Fund properties and access is difficult. Freeholder Bartlett stated that this site is located in the middle of a large farmland property; however, the owner is not interested in preserving the property as farmland. Freeholder Bartlett stated that the second

property recommended for acquisition is located in Waretown adjacent to already acquired property. This is not a large acquisition, but the Freeholder noted that it connects with other properties the County owns and the purchase price is \$40,000. Freeholder Bartlett stated that both properties are small in size but they make sense, fitting in with other properties already preserved. Both acquisitions will be listed for Board action on April 16, 2014.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the April 16, 2014 Board meeting.

Freeholder Kelly stated that the County received a request for reducing the weight limit on one of the County roads that the County had to deny. Mr. Scarantino advised that County Route 618 is a primary route with the only access for Interchange 77 to the Parkway. This is a 600 series road, which are wholly contained within the County and depriving use by trucks would put them on local streets. Freeholder Kelly stated that the County is working to make roads safer. After Mr. Scarantino's review of the request, he advised that it was impossible to do and he has advised the person requesting the change that the County can not do this.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of April 16, 2014. There were no questions or comments.

Director Vicari asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little stated that he represented the Board today at the new mobile counseling service for veterans at the Southern Resource Center in Manahawkin. The Freeholder noted that this is in partnership with the Veterans Center from Lakewood and is fully federally funded by Veterans Affairs. A large RV fitted with satellite will be available to veterans and will take appointments for counseling veterans. Freeholder Little noted that there will be 70 RV's across the country and Ocean County will be getting the first one in New Jersey. The Freeholder advised that the RV will be onsite one day a week and veterans will need to make an appointment.

Freeholder Little stated that he attended an honorable ceremony today at Anderson and Campbell Funeral Home provided by the New Jersey Mission of Honor which was created by State law in 2009. A ceremony was held for 21 cremated veteran remains which were then transported to the State Veterans Cemetery in Wrightstown. All 21 of the veterans were from Ocean County.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.
