A. CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean was called to order on October 1, 2024 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Director Crea presiding. Members Haines, Kelly, Quinn and Sadeghi were present at the call of the roll.

B. STATEMENT Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act

Barbara Jo Crea, Director, read the following statement of compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act:

C. ROLL CALL

D. THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND PRAYER

DIRECTOR CREA: "I believe we have a presentation. Madam Clerk."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Yes, it's my understanding that Commissioner Sadeghi would like to introduce..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Oh, I'm sorry. That's for me. Before we begin with the business portion of today's Board meeting it is my understanding that Commissioner Sadeghi would like to introduce Patrick Ahearn, President and CEO of Community Medical Center, who is here today to update the Board on the hospital's Residency Program. Commissioner Sadeghi."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "Thank you, Director. This year is the first year that Community Medical Center successfully graduated their first residency class. I had the opportunity to tour the facilities recently and we all know what a wonderful job they do. So, I've asked their representatives from CMC to come and speak to the Board of Commissioners about the new Residency Program and how it benefits not only CMC but also the residents of Ocean County in total. So, I see a familiar, a couple of familiar faces in the audience."

PATRICK AHEARN, CEO, COMMUNITY MEDICAL CENTER: "I appreciate you letting us spend a few minutes to update you. Thank you for having us. So, you know, the Residency Program, I'd be remiss if I didn't take a step backwards because before speaking about the Residency Program. There's 600,000 people in our community. And I've always said our responsibility as the hospital is for the health of our community. And quite frankly, probably seven, eight, nine years ago our reputation wasn't what I thought it should be. And part of that was because I think we weren't attracting top talent into our institution and also investing in the institution. So, part of my job when I came here eight years ago was to really invest in this institution and give this community what it needs because besides having 600,000 people, we're a 592-bed hospital. We're a big place. We should act like a big place, a highend tertiary hospital. I think we were lacking that. And so, if you think about our community and you think about the nearest tertiary hospitals, and I'm not demeaning community hospitals because I come from one, so I know the value of them, but the high-end tertiary hospitals. You're talking about Jersey Shore (University Medical Center). Go down south, Virtua, Cooper. You're talking about an hour away from our community. So, you know, where's our obligation to serve our community? And part of this also, was the fact that, frankly, our community is a little older than most. And so, we serve 73% Medicare patients. The highest super-senior population in the country is here. That's 85 and over. So, our population also does not like to travel. So, if we're not going to deliver the services than to me that's doing a disservice to the people that we were meant to take care of. And so, part of this when I came here, was, what do we need as an institution? Well, you know, again, older folks like myself we have the most strokes in New Jersey here in Ocean County. We have the most cardiac surgeries come from Ocean County and we don't do

them here. We need Orthopedics. We need Oncology. We need to be graded those services because quite frankly if we're not graded it a lot of our patients what we found were not seeking services. We could give them an appointment at Robert Wood Johnson or Jersey Shore or any place else and they won't go. They actually avoid healthcare.

So, again, what's our obligation? So, part of this was building programs but in order to build programs I looked at it and I was ashamed to say it on our website we used to have a little thing that said the largest non-teaching hospital in the State of New Jersey. I didn't think that was actually something that we wanted to be proud of and put out there because, clearly, being an educational institution attracts talent and it also, you know, brings the people in here for the higher services. And so, part of our quest was to start a Residency Program. It took us three years because you have to file applications, get federal approval. We did that. And as the Commissioners have said we graduated our first class last year. We were proud of that. We'll actually graduate our first surgery class this year because that's a fouryear program. So, we've gone from 27 residents in our first year to 120 this year, and we'll end up with 140 next year. We just were approved for a Pulmonary Critical Care Fellowship. So, it really went from 0 to light speed, if you will, in the last few years and we're proud of it. And the benefit of having the Residency Program is we have attracted some of the best doctors in this country here. Doctors from some of the biggest programs in Bailey, UPMC, New York City - Montefiore, Yale, Connecticut, LIU in New Orleans. We are attracting really high-end talented people to take care of what I had talked about before what I thought was the deficiency in the services that we were delivering. And I don't think we could have done that without the Residency Program. Now, what it also brings, you know, my quest, I have no personal interest other than I feel like our patients deserve the best care. And I also feel like you and the people in this room, you know, I want you to feel proud of the institution that we have here. I want you to say when people are moving down here or interested in coming here that you're able to sit there and say, 'you know what? And we have a great hospital.' And so, to me that's all I'm looking to do is to build a great hospital. I think we're well on our way there. We weren't years ago but I think we're really being improved in everything we see and all the feedback I get from our community is people are really proud of what we're doing. We rebuilt the emergency room. Actually, they just had it in Atlantic City the Residency Awards for the year. We got the top residency in emergency medicine for the State of New Jersey this year. So, to me three years into the program and we got the top resident in the State of New Jersey here at Community. That's what we're trying to do here. And I need everybody here in the community to assist us. We're not perfect but we strive to be perfect. And so, we strive to deliver great services for the community. And part of that, a big piece of that, I think, is the Residency Program. So, I appreciate you acknowledging that or at least recognizing that because I think it was a major step forward in this institution going forward.

We also opened clinics. So, again, the benefits here is the residents...we also serve the population, the underserved population. We have a medical clinic. We have an OB clinic. And those wouldn't be possible without residents. In addition to the residents our doctors then step because, a, they love teaching and b, they get the community spirit again. Maybe some of them were lacking that and so they're the ones that are actually with the residents manning those clinics on their time, on their dollar.

So, again, I think there's a lot of benefits from a community point of view, people moving into the area. We want to be an asset to this community where you're proud of what we do. And, again, I'm always interested in feedback from folks as to where we can improve and what we can do better or what's on the horizon. As I say any good team takes a few years to put together, to change the culture, to make it what it should be. I think we're well on our way and I'm proud of the work that we're doing. So, I appreciate..."

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "You didn't mention the rooftop helicopter pad."

PATRICK AHEARN: "What was that?"

COMMISSIONER SADEGHI: "The helicopter pad."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Oh yeah. Well, you know, that was one of the other things I said, listen, until we can build the programs, I felt an obligation to be able to...if you're really sick and you have to get into an ambulance because we don't deliver the service, you're talking about an hour or more to get to the next, you know, high-end hospital. And when you're talking about strokes and things of that nature that's the difference between life and death. So, one of the first things we did was I put a helicopter on the emergency room - twelve minutes from our place to Robert Wood Johnson to the high-end tertiary or quaternary care. So, again, part of this, ultimately will be, hopefully people will be traveling into our institution and bringing care here but in the meantime, I have an obligation to take care of the folks that we serve."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you. I just want to say something to you. Thank you for what you're doing for the people, the local people, the people of Ocean County. It's amazing to see the services that you provide. And thank you for doing what you're doing. It is incredible."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Thank you. Thank you, Director. I appreciate that. And I thank the group here. I know that you're going to consider a shelter for, you know, the cold and I appreciate that because we're in this together. And I take it very seriously. When I say our mission is for the health of the 660,000 people, it does not say within the four walls of the institution. You've heard me say it before, Barbara. To me we are responsible for the health of the 660,000 people, not just in the hospital but outside the hospital. So, this is a partnership between us and this commission and everybody on it and the community. So, I thank you for supporting us. I appreciate it."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "It was our pleasure."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Thank you very much."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

PATRICK AHEARN: "I was supposed to say, proceed with the video. There was a video. I missed my cue. This video is about the graduation of the first residency."

Video plays on the graduation of the first Residency Program at Community Medical Center.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Beautiful."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR QUINN: "Great job."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Very good."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Very, very nice. Thank you."

PATRICK AHEARN: "And some of those residents actually have decided to stay here which is, again, part of why we're doing this because we want to keep the future generation of great doctors here in our community. I just notice I'm wearing the same tie." (Laughter)

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I would just like to say I've had to use the services of the hospital, and I can honestly tell you there has not been one time that they have not been wonderful. In fact, Terri had been one of the nurses there one time when I had been there and seriously it was very, very good service and I always made sure that I filled out the survey because I feel it's important that the hospital knows the good, the bad and the ugly, whatever it might be because how else can you approve what it is. But I can tell you that the times that I've had to be at Community it was very good. I remember when it was just Paul Kimball Hospital and then Community and then Brick and then Southern was down there – SOCH was there. But we're just very grateful."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Well, interestingly enough, with our population..."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Yes."

PATRICK AHEARN: "...we get more surveys than any hospital in the State of New Jersey."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Surveys are important."

PATRICK AHEARN: "So our patients clearly like to tell us what they think. (Laughter) Once again, I value, because as you just said, the good, the bad, the ugly..."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "It is."

PATRICK AHEARN: "...it's the only way you're going to be able to improve."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "That's true."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Don't hide your head in the sand. Take the comments for what they are and keep improving. That's the sign of a good team."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "That's true."

PATRICK AHEARN: "So, I appreciate that. But yes, Robert Wood Johnson, Jersey Shore...we get twice as many surveys as everybody. So, we're not short of input and we like it."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "That's good. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "I don't have anything to add to the hospital's greatness, but I will say I noticed your tie and it's a very expensive tie. (Laughter) And that's why you're wearing it again."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Very good. Thank you. Okay, we'll move on with the agenda. Thank you again and thank you for being here."

PATRICK AHEARN: "Thank you. Appreciate it."

Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Commissioners Haines, would you like me to turn it over to you?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Okay. Thank you. As you can see up there (shows on map) it's very hard for you to see but there's a little yellow speck up there and that's the property we're talking about. As was stated it's 0.13-acre property located on Lighthouse Drive, preserved area in Ocean Township. It adds to nearly 57.33 acres of current preserved land in that area. The parcel is completely encumbered in wetlands with no development potential. The township supported the acquisition as it is necessary for each piece of Natural Lands that we purchase that the township is supportive of this and the property owners accepted our negotiated offer of \$3,000.00. Since we have many new people in the audience I'd just like to say, and you won't believe this but 60% of Ocean County is preserved land. That's your federal, your state, your county and local. And there's approximately 30,000 acres of Natural Lands and about 3,300 acres of farmland is preserved which we rank pretty good in the State of New Jersey with preservation. And this is a small piece. The biggest piece we had was 8,000 acres which is the Forked River Mountains. And of course, this is a small piece, but each piece keeps adding to it to show the preserved land. When I say preserved land under Natural Lands it will never, ever, be built on. That's part of the Natural Lands Act with the State of New Jersey. That's how it is along with our farmlands – will always be preserved land. So, I just wanted to just mention that since we have a lot of new people in the audience today about the Natural Lands, but we're always looking for people that might want to...some people donate their land to us and some people, you know, wish to have it sold. But there's a process we go through with our Natural Lands Committee that they meet, and they make a determination. They do site inspections. They go out and do appraisals if they feel it's going to be a good piece because it's not something that they just present it and it's just one step. It's not. There's many steps that are taken in order to make sure we're going to be acquiring the property that we wish to acquire to add to the Natural Lands Trust Fund. Thank you."

U. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:25 PM, Director Crea opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR CREA: "Wow. Okay, and I have nothing either. We'll now open it up to public comments. Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five minutes per speaker. If anyone wishes to speak, please come up to the microphone, provide your name and address for the record. Is there anyone in the audience that would like to speak, please? Okay, sir. Go right ahead. Before you begin let me point out that you have five minutes to speak."

SEAN NELSON BOERO, 949 PAINTER LANE, MANAHAWKIN, NJ: "Got it. I've spoken to the commission before, and I've sent you emails before. I am retired from the state police. I retired in 2012, and I was a unit head of cybercrimes. When I retired, I went over to Afghanistan with a small team of Marines. And when I came back, I was recruited to come here and work at Ocean County to get your laboratory accredited by Joe Coronato and Glenn Miller. You gave us half a million dollars to build that laboratory, and we did get it accredited in 2018. In 2020 I left and now I travel around the world doing digital forensic classes. I'm glad this is Cybersecurity Awareness Month. I just came back from an extensive overseas trip. But this is about the CyberTips. The Ocean County Prosecutor's Office is a member of the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force and what that is, is the National Center's for Missing and Exploited Children receive CyberTips from all over the world about the sexual abuse of prepubescent children - children from infants to ten, eleven years old. They identify IP addresses in Ocean County where these children are being victimized, sexually tortured and there's images and videos that are being uploaded and shared.

Since 2020 I've identified six children, one in Ohio, one in Colorado and four here in Ocean County who were sexually abused for months while these CyberTips sat on a desk in Ocean County. I'd like to point out a couple cases. One was the Richard Knight investigation. On December 8, 2020, five high-priority CyberTips were received by Ocean County. High-priority CyberTips are children in imminent danger. They sat on a desk for six months. When a search warrant was executed in June of 2021 in Plumsted, they rescued his two children, but they were neglected and abused for six months. It was probably much worse. I asked for them to publish all the CyberTips that they received from the Jersey State Police and the number of arrests that they made. From 2019 to 2022 the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office received approximately 1,000 CyberTips. They made 18 arrests. To compare that, Monmouth County probably made a couple hundred. On September 21st, CyberTips were received by the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, and they identified a location in Brick. In June of 2022 more CyberTips were received. They identified the same location, the same person. They didn't do anything about it. In September of 2022, 13 months later they finally executed a search warrant from Homeland Security and arrested a gentleman named Chris Budelman. It turned out when they did the analysis of what they recovered from his scene, during that year the CyberTips were sitting there, he sexually abused a child in Ohio and sexually abused a child in Colorado. I'm asking you to go to Bradley Billhimer, and ask, what is he doing with the CyberTips? There are children in Ocean County who have been sexually abused while CyberTips are sitting on a desk in Ocean County. I think that's reasonable. We have some people from the Law Enforcement Academy here. Police work is easy. People call for help and we respond. These are children calling for help. We are not responding and there is no reason for it. You gave us all the resources. We have all the resources.

So, that's it. I want you to go talk to Bradley Billhimer and find out what's happening with the CyberTips in Ocean County. Thank you so much. I apologize for being nervous, really. I was in Afghanistan and last week I was in Beirut

and I'm not nervous at all but talking in front of you about something so important I get a little nervous. Kind of crazy, right?"

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Don't be nervous."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Don't be nervous."

SEAN NELSON BOERO: "Do you have any questions for me? I put all these things on the OPRA machine which is publicly available, and this is according to their own reports. They're responding to less than two percent of CyberTips and we have six children who were sexually tortured for months. That's 98% they're not even responding to, right? Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You're welcome. Is there anyone else? Your name and address for the record, please."

CARMEN MORA, 3 GIBRALTAR COURT, BARNEGAT: "First of all I'd like to express my most sincere gratitude for your continued efforts and support in supporting Code Blue. Your dedication in facilitating a facility, that sounded redundant, but for the season is important. Your commitment to creating a safe and accessible services for those in need makes immeasurable differences in the lives of so many. By taking this step you're not only providing shelter from the elements but you're also helping to reduce the stigma surrounding homelessness and the trauma that often accompanies it. As a survivor of domestic violence and an advocate I know first-hand that this trauma is the leading cause for homelessness here in Ocean County. Domestic violence forces many people, especially women and children, into situations of instability and fear. It is through efforts like Code Blue and the compassion showed by leaders by you that can begin to address the deep-rooted issues and offer real hope for those of us in crisis.

As a professional working in this field, I see the impact of your work every day. And by providing these critical services you are sending a message that no one should be left behind and that we can build a stronger, more compassionate community together. So, I thank you for your dedication and for standing up with those who need it the most. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you for your kind words. Thank you. Is there anyone else?"

MITCH LITTLE, COUNTY RESIDENT: "Good afternoon. Thanks for having me. I just wanted to talk about the same issue from a law enforcement perspective. We've dealt with that for years. Homelessness obviously is a big concern with everybody, and I've been reading what's going on and I just want to applaud the Commissioners for at least looking into this and seeing what we can do. We were housing, during Code Blue, probably about 30 to 31 people, per evening, anytime, obviously, it got below 35 degrees and other conditions. And if it wasn't for the work that Paul Hulse was doing and having the location in Toms River, our officers would be saddled with trying to deal with these people in trying to, obviously, keep them from freezing to death. And having a place for them to actually drop somebody off and get back on the road is extremely important, not to mention the safety of the people. But, not having a location would definitely tie the hands of law enforcement and be very difficult to try to place somebody, even in a hotel. Everybody says that's the easiest thing, just put somebody in a hotel. But when you physically have someone in your police car and trying to find a location for him it's extremely difficult.

So, I just wanted to share our concerns. Obviously, I'm retired now so I really can't have hands-on with this but I just wanted to share my experiences in how successful it really was and how easy it was for our officers to get a call, take this person to a set location, know they're handed off to professionals, know those people are being taken care of and we could go about our business. So, thank you very much."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "We do accept volunteers even though you're retired." (Laughter)

KIM VEITH, 1552 MERMAID AVENUE, BEACHWOOD: "Good afternoon. And I am the CEO at Bright Harbor Healthcare. Bright Harbor is a Behavioral Health Agency that treats folks with mental illness, addiction and we offer primary care. So, I come today, along with our executive staff, Kathy Greene, our Chief Operating Officer, and Tom Trageser, our Chief Financial Officer. And we come today on behalf of our staff to thank you for your vision and for offering perhaps a county building for Code Blue. At Bright Harbor we don't really have anything to do with Code Blue. We're not tied financially. We don't really do much to help but it provides a place for us to be able to interact with those who are vulnerable and most needy. Many of us here have spent our careers working on behalf of those who are vulnerable and disenfranchised. And so, it's programs like Code Blue that help us to help them. I think that most recently there's been some press that would lead anyone to believe that the majority or the ownness of caring for all of the homeless in the County falls on Toms River. And while I think that Toms River is the County Seat is a place where many homeless folks may tend to migrate because there's services and such. The homeless are dispersed throughout the County. And I think that it is the stigma of homelessness that invites us to create a picture of who we think is homeless.

But I thought it was important to come today and talk a little bit about how the homeless are not just those who are living in the woods here in Toms River and around the County. They're a bit of what Carmen (Mora) talked about in

terms of being survivors of domestic violence. They're the elderly. They're the working poor who are just one car repair away from complete disaster. Right? They're our neighbors. They're nurses. They're professionals. They're not always all sleeping outside. Sometimes they're sleeping on a neighbor's couch or in their car or places like that. I know that as the Commissioners, you know this, right? I received a call a couple of years back from one of you asking to check on a group of folks in the woods. And that day that we went I met a young man who was recently divorced, and he could either pay child support or rent. And so, he lived in the woods so that his children and their mother could live in a safe, warm apartment. And he had a gym membership so he could work out and take a shower and he went to the laundromat, and he rode his bike to work. And he did all of the things that the rest of us do except that he went home to a tent in the evening. And so, if it weren't for places like Code Blue people like that gentleman would freeze at night. And so, I thank you again very much on behalf of the community of advocates that we are for recognizing the need for Code Blue and making that building available. Thanks."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. Anyone else. Good afternoon. Your name and address"

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY, PASTOR OF ST. PAUL LUTHERAN CHURCH: "Good afternoon, Madam Director."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Good afternoon, Pastor."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "My name is Reverend Peter Hartney and I'm the Pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church located at 130 Cable Avenue in Beachwood. I am a resident of the Borough of Surf City at 213 North 24th Street. I rise to speak also to the Code Blue Program and to provide contacts and comment on the program. St. Paul has had a long history of reaching out and caring for our community neighbors whether they be from Bayville, Jackson, South Toms River, Toms River, Beachwood, Pine Beach, Ocean Gate, through our various programs. Through our food pantry, which is over 40 years old and this year, the past years, have served about 500 individuals in food that we just...you're hungry, I'll give you food. We have hosted and we're part of the original founding of Interfaith Hospitality, now Interfaith Family Services. And, in fact, this week we are hosting nine people, three mothers with children who are now calling St. Paul their home for the week. I have been their Pastor at St. Paul for eighteen years. I started in 2006. And as I began there in the past I remember coming to, at that time, Freeholder Little, and asked him about the problem of persons who find themselves living on the margin within vulnerability and insecurity and Freeholder Little said I have something for you to do. Why don't you join the Human Services Advisory Council? I never asked Gerry anything again. (Laughter) And so, I did. And then 2008 I had the opportunity to join your Department of Human Services staff, Ocean Mental Health Services, at that time, Preferred Behavioral Health, the Health Department, the Sheriff Office, the Lakewood Police Department, Chief Little and the officers from the Toms River Police Department and making numerous visits for about three years out into the woods where the folks were living in homelessness. And then we made many connections. Helped people out of the woods. Some people didn't want to go but it was an ongoing effort, and it was a partnership between many people. Time passes, (Hurricane) Sandy comes. Time passes some more and the Governor signs into legislation the Code Blue Law. Ocean County steps up to meet the requirements of the law and steps beyond the requirements. As you know the law just simply says that each County shall prepare a Code Blue Plan. The law was signed. Human Services invited me back to lead the group that was beginning that planning process. And that planning process went beyond simple planning into implementation developing the Code Blue Program which I believe is a best practice for all the other counties in the State of New Jersey because it draws together partnerships from non-profit service organizations to the faith community to the municipalities to serve those who find themselves in the vulnerable place of being housing insecure. Not only does it provide a place for them to gather out of the cold, but it also provides an opportunity to begin that trajectory towards self-reliance and that trajectory has been provided by the actions that this Board has taken over the course of the years. And your support, of kind of the soft services...everybody sees the roads and the bridges being built and whatnot..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Excuse me, Pastor..."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "I ran out of my five minutes?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "No, you have one minute left. Go ahead."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "Okay. Do I get time back for when you're telling me I have one minute left?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "You'll have an extra half a second." (Laughter)

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "Extra half a second. Okay. Some of those soft..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Forgive me. I should be careful who I'm telling but go ahead."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "...those soft services that nobody sees. I've been a member of the Ocean County Mental Health Board for years. We developed programs to reduce the stigma related with mental health and mental illness. Through many programs and successfully getting 30 municipalities in this County to pass resolutions to be stigma-free municipalities. The funding, as a member of the Board of Social Services, and currently serving as the

Chair of the Board, the funding that you provide for the Board generates \$40 million in other operating revenue from other sources and provides millions of dollars in benefits to the residents of Ocean County and sets them on that path, that trajectory to self-sufficiency meets them in their time of need and vulnerability and in the midst of their insecurity. I'm going to end Commissioner."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much, Pastor."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "Wait, I got a story to tell you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Yeah, but I'm sorry your time is up."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "You can tell me after the meeting."

REVEREND PETER HARTNEY: "Thank you. I'll tell you after."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Okay. Thank you. Thank you, Pastor. Is there anyone else? Good afternoon."

ELIZABETH GOLLA, 244 HOMESTEAD AVE, WEST CREEK: "I just wanted to take this opportunity to thank the Commissioners for all of your work that you have done and continue to do in our community of Ocean County, really on the Code Blue Program. But I also wanted to express how much if you don't even realize how much work has gone into that just on your level but also how much that the folks we are serving actually have the opportunity to see the work that you're doing as well. So, I'm the Executive Director for Family Promise of the Jersey Shore and unfortunately the need of what we see right now is at an all-time high. I have been with Family Promise for over 11 years, and I know there's a lot of different things, you know, buzzing around on social media and also within the press, but you guys really do show up and you not only put in the headwork, but you also put in the hard work, and we really appreciate that. We see it. We've been serving almost 2,000 households this year, alone, and that's the highest I've ever seen. Now, that's families. That's not folks that are living out in the woods or in tents, but it's families. It's students. It's seniors that are really struggling. And the Code Blue building is so important because it not only just addresses all of the populations that really need a place to go, but it also helps to destigmatize homelessness and that helps all of the folks that we continue to serve have some hope that their community really does care about them and it starts that next step of how they're able to get assistance.

So, I also included for you just some thank you letters from folks, recently, that we have in our programs that really wanted to express their gratitude as well for all of you in all the work that you do because it does not go unnoticed. So, thank you and I'll give this over to the Clerk."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "It's always good for me to see somebody from West Creek." (Laughter)

ELIZABETH GOLLA: "I didn't bring my golf cart." (Laughter)

DIRECTOR CREA: "Is there anyone else? Yes. Your name and address, please."

JACK SAHRADNIK, COUNTY COUNSEL: "Commissioner, Director, I'd like to make a statement, please. As the Board of Commissioners know Mr. Yaiser's been here many times before. As I previously advised the Board many of the issues that he raises concern confidential personnel and student matters involving another public entity, the Ocean County Vocational-Technical School Board, and in light of that fact, I strongly recommend the Board refrain from commenting on any of the items raised by Mr. Yaiser. Thank you."

ROBERT YAISER, 7 WARREN CT, MANAHAWKIN: "No surprise there, right? I'm here to thank you for your help. Commissioner Sadeghi, Mr. Fiure. I appreciate you. We're looking at this strictly for our children. This has nothing to do with me or Ocean County. I'm asking for your help. On Thursday, the students, parents and I attended the Board of Ed meeting and I'm going to read to you real quick what I sent to the State Commission of Investigations.

"Good morning, Gerry. I'm preparing an auto copy of last nights, roughly, two-hour Ocean County Board of Ed meeting that numerous parents, students and I attended. The students and parents were hysterically crying explaining to the Board of Ed that their children had been tormented, bullied and verbally abused with racial slurs for years and nothing has been done to address the issues. They begged for help to protect their children at a Law Enforcement Academy. I publicly recommended that this be immediately investigated outside of them, again, investigating themselves, and that all officials in this, these complaints be put under oath and answer these serious complaints. I volunteered to go first. The audio is difficult to listen to and numerous individuals at the meeting were in tears listening to what has occurred. I have cc'd Director Cunningham of the New Jersey Police Training Commission. Please let me know as soon as possible."

I got an immediate reply. Called the tip line, absolutely nothing. Again, I replied. First off, has anyone reviewed the evidence, listen to the tapes, read the emails or the OPRA requests I have forwarded? We have not received any answers or seen one report since all these complaints were filed from any agency. These are not allegations. These are

facts that the parents, students, faculty and I believe are intentionally being concealed to protect the Prosecutor's Office and the Attorney General's Office. Who is the appropriate Law Enforcement Agency who has the power to investigate and prosecute any potential violations of the state's criminal statutes that may involve the Prosecutor or the Attorney General? I haven't received an answer back. When you hear that tape it's very difficult to listen to. I'll let that speak for himself. Two days ago, an article posted, New Jersey needs accountability for prosecutors by former Federal Prosecutor, Lee Vartan, who I know personally. If you ask anyone in State Government probably the most ethical Attorney I've met.

In August, Attorney General Mat Platkin lauded the release of his offices major discipline reporting for Law Enforcement officers across the state. Platkin said, 'We need increased transparency to help the confidence in law enforcement leading to greater public safety.' Platkin is right. Transparency and accountability that comes with it are critical to the effective functioning of our Criminal Justice System and fostering public confidence, but the police are only half the equation. Prosecutors, municipal, county and state are crucial players in the system. And for too long their bad acts have gone mostly unreviewed, unreported and unnoticed. To be on the opposite side of the State of New Jersey whose resources are limitless, even when the state is wrong, or has engaged in misconduct, is daunting. The system is hopelessly weighted toward the prosecution. We reviewed this. I've been here, how many times. This, I've said, I'm willing to go to jail. This is a lie and a cover up. And how I know that, unequivocally, the police told me that. I said I'm willing to testify anywhere anyone wants. They've ignored me for four straight years. I'm asking you, because they ignore me, to help me. I'm asking for a federal investigation into this. If no one's going to protect these kids... when you hear it, their mom and their kids, begging for someone to help. My law enforcement instructors are here with me. How are we teaching these kids the rule of law when we're making a mockery of them? If you could help me. I'll work with you, Mike (Fiure). I'm happy to be on your side. I think we all have the same goal, yes?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "You have a minute to go, Mr. Yaiser."

ROBERT YAISER: "I'll be here all day."

DIRECTOR CREA: "No, you have a minute to go."

ROBERT YAISER: "Another disturbing mistake by the AGs (Attorney General's) Office, August 25th. The State Attorney General's Office wrongly filed charges against a Paterson cop by not considering important evidence. That evidence was never provided to the grand jury. It's hardly the first time a high-profile case mistake was by this unit. Last week we wrote about the even more egregious case in Lakewood where a Rabbi who was wrongly prosecuted apparently by the same corruption division in the AGs (Attorney General's) Office - accountability. In that case the unit withheld evidence helpful to the defense, saw its own detective, witness testified that there was no crime and had a judge shut down.

So, as this goes on, real quick, Wednesday, June 7th, 2023, email to AG, Mat Platkin..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Mr. Yaiser, your time is over."

ROBERT YAISER: "Are you telling me 30 seconds as a whistleblower? Is there a legal statute to that? We're both here trying to protect kids and you're going to censor me for a few seconds?"

DIRECTOR CREA: "I'm telling you that we allow five minutes..."

ROBERT YAISER: "Alright, no sweat."

DIRECTOR CREA: "...per speaker and your five minutes is over. Thank you very much. Is there anyone else from the public that would like to speak this afternoon? Oh, yes sir. I'm sorry. I didn't see you walking up."

MIKE ROCHE, 8 RIVERBEND DRIVE, TOMS RIVER: "I'm a member of the Mental Health Board. Just as an aside, I want to say you have the best Mental Health Board in the state. The people that run it. The people who are involved with it and it's just terrific. I'm also the Vice-President of the National Alliance on Mental Illness here in Ocean County. I have a son who has bipolar disorder. He was treated here in Ocean County and he's now back standing on his feet. He's a jazz musician. He plays in clubs in New York City. He has bipolar disorder but the reason for my coming out tonight is to just thank the Board for the work that you do and specifically the work that you do with Code Blue and the shelter that you're working on. We think this is very important. One of the jobs that I have with NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) is that I answer the phone. We call it a warm line. I get between 10 and 30 calls a month. And I would say three quarters of them have to do with housing and particularly in the winter months. It's really terrible to try to help people to get places to stay, to stay with their families. One night I spoke to a woman who was sitting on a bench in Seaside Heights with her three children and her husband. They were homeless and they were looking for a place to stay before the night was out.

So, I appreciate what you're doing. I encourage you if you need any help from us, we're happy to help you. It's very important work that you're doing, and we, again, thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you for your work."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you, Mr. Roche. Thank you. Anyone else from the public would like to speak? Good evening. Your name and address for the record, please."

VICTORIA AZZOPARDI, 17 ARROWHEAD CIRCLE, JACKSON: "Good afternoon. I am coming to you this afternoon as the CEO with Ocean Partnership for Children which is a care management organization serving youth right here in Ocean County with emotional behavioral health, substance use, and intellectual and developmental disabilities. We serve about 1100 kids right here in Ocean County and we come here to support the Code Blue, so I want to thank you for that ongoing support. But just to talk a little bit about how it impacts the youth in our families. I've been at the Ocean Partnership for Children for 20 years and I can say there's been such a profound impact recently about homelessness and housing insecurity for our caregivers of the youth. And as a result of that, that of course negatively impacts the children and their mental health and well-being. So, in order for those kids to improve and do better their parents have to be okay and feel safe and secure in their housing insecurity. Kim Veith shared a beautiful story about a gentleman who was selfless in his willingness to be homeless as a result of wanting to pay for his children to have a better life. We see more and more of those stories right here in Ocean County and until we can secure those families and those youth our kids are not going to get better despite what services we put in place. So, I encourage you all to continue to just invest and do what you do so beautifully so our kids and our families can have a healthy, secure, safe upbringing. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you very much. Thank you for coming forward. Anyone else? Seeing no hands...I'm sorry, sir. I didn't see you. Okay, your name and address for the record, please."

CARLOS ALMANZAR, WINTERINGHAM, TOMS RIVER, NJ: "I'm here also for Code Blue. I know my hometown very well and right now the weather is getting cold. It's been raining. And I want to say thank you for stepping up because if we don't step up now in two, three weeks from today we're going to have a very crazy chaos. I had a few neighbors get evicted this past two weeks ago. They live in a Walmart. Someone is living back here in the woods. So, the job that Paul (Hulse) and his facility were doing, it was a great thing for our community. And especially, I grew up in this town. I get to see everybody and get to meet everybody. So, you know, if we could give somebody a hand we could switch their whole life around. And, you know, I'm here the same way because somebody gave me the opportunity. My mother...we lost our house. We were in the street and that one person gave us that hand when we needed it. Today we own our house. We own our company. And, you know, we are grateful. God is great. So, thank you for stepping up for this. And I know the journey is going to be a little hard, but we could do it. And thank you so much, guys."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you. Thank you very much. Is there anyone else? Yes, sir."

TONY DIPAULA: "Good evening, folks. My name is Tony DiPaula. I retired from the State Police in 2012. I currently live in Manalapan, New Jersey. But what brings me here today is that I applied for the Academy of Law and Public Safety on four different occasions and as time went on, I became very interested in what was going on at the Academy. And I would simply like to...and Major Yaiser has shared some of the ongoings that he's been involved with, I'd like to share an excerpt from one of the emails that Major Yaiser had shared with Attorney General (Matt) Platkin.

"In September of 2019, I requested an investigation from your office regarding suspected misconduct impropriety within the New Jersey Department of Education. This request was generated after numerous attempts to get an honest answer from the New Jersey Department of Education yielded negative results. I initially reported this incident to the New Jersey Department of Criminal Justice who declined to investigate. After confirming with multiple state leaders that included two New Jersey State Senators and a former New Jersey Attorney General, all believe the matter should be investigated. In all complaints which may or may not be directly related there have been no accountability or consequence for dishonesty or misconduct. Moving forward how can any complaint, hearing or appeal be conducted fairly when employees of the state district are permitted to cover up their actions with dishonesty." And this was sent on June 7, 2023, at 8:54 a.m. and there was no return from that office. Thank you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you, sir. Anyone else? Yes, sir."

BISHOP DANIEL WILSON, 1186 LAKEWOOD ROAD, TOMS RIVER, NJ: "Good evening. And I am the Pastor of Refuge House of Prayer. I am a former recipient of Interfaith Hospitality, and also..."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Could you speak up just a little bit? I'm having difficulty..."

BISHOP DANIEL WILSON: "Sorry about that."

DIRECTOR CREA: "That's okay."

BISHOP DANIEL WILSON: "I'm a former recipient of Interfaith Hospitality Network, me and my family, and I'm also former Director of Interfaith Family Services. I am now a Code Blue site. Last year was my first year. Looking forward to doing it again this year and I just want to say thank you to you, all of you."

DIRECTOR CREA: "Thank you so very much. Thank you. Is there anyone else from the public that would like to speak? Okay, seeing no hands I will close the public comment and is there a motion to adjourn?"

V. ADJOURNMENT

There being no additional comments received, Director Crea called for a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:58 PM.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Commissioners to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the acquisition of property identified as Block 138, Lot 5 in the Township of Ocean totaling approximately 0.13 acres located on Ensign Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for a purchase price not to exceed \$3,000.00; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Commissioners on October 1, 2024 as required by PL 1997, c24.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

- It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund 1. Advisory Committee to acquire property identified as Block 138, Lot 5 in the Township of Ocean totaling approximately 0.13 acres located on Ensign Drive.



The Hudsonia tomentosa (Woolley Beach Heather) is an extremely scarce and rare plant. We would like to supply an alternate plant that we feel would help to stabilize the sand while adding some distinct beauty and benefits to the dune system.

Our alternate suggestion would be Schizachyrium scoparium (Little Bluestem) grown in plastic trays of 72 plants per tray. These would be easy to keep watered and transported to each planting destination as they can be included with the normal beachgrass allocations. Our suggestion would be to start this year with 10-20,000 plants, divide them up to each municipality and monitor their growth and success.

Little Bluestern has beautiful foliage consisting of greens, blues or purples turning to oranges and reds in the fall. Schizachyrium scoparium produces downy white seeds in September providing a stunning contrast to it's fall color. This native grass grows upright approximately 2-3 ft. and provides great cover for birds seeking protection from predators and the elements.
