

RESOLUTION September 2, 2015

WHEREAS, the voters of Ocean County authorized the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund to provide funds for the acquisition and preservation of natural lands, open spaces and farmland; and

WHEREAS, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee was established by the Board of Chosen Freeholders to review nominations to the program and forward recommendations for acquisition to the Board of Chosen Freeholders; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has received a nomination for the property identified as Block 18801, Lot 18, totaling approximately 11.39 acres located off of Route 571 and High Bridge Road in Jackson Township; and

WHEREAS, the property is located along the Ridgeway Branch of the Toms River and is within the Pinelands Commission designated TR Corridor Study Area, which deemed the area as a high resource value area; and

WHEREAS, a professional appraisal has been completed to establish the fair market value of the property; and

WHEREAS, the Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee has determined the property's attributes are consistent with the Ocean County Open Space Plan and Recreation Inventory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean would acquire the property for an amount not to exceed \$33,000 of equivalent land value of the property; and

WHEREAS, this property may be eligible for up to 50% cost share from United States Department of Defense consistent with the agreement authorized by resolution dated May 16, 2012; and

WHEREAS, this property is in an area that is eligible for up to 33.3% cost share from the Pinelands Conservation Fund; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed acquisition was conducted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders on September 2, 2015 as required by PL 1997, c24.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

- 1. It accepts the recommendation of the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee to participate in the acquisition of Block 18801, Lot 18 in Jackson Township.
- 2. It authorizes the expenditure not to exceed \$33,000 in acquisition funds from the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund, Account Number 225-155-0151.
- 3. It authorizes the Freeholder Director to execute any agreements for additional funding made available for this purchase, including from the Department of Defense and the Pinelands Commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT

Freeholder Director John C. Bartlett opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Present:

Freeholder Director John C. Bartlett, Jr. Freeholder Deputy Director Gerry P. Little Freeholder John P. Kelly Freeholder James F. Lacey Freeholder Joseph H. Vicari Michael J. Fiure, Acting County Administrator Mary Ann Cilento, Recording Secretary Betty Vasil, Clerk of the Board Keith J. Goetting, Director of Human Resources Frank Scarantino, County Engineer Julie N. Tarrant, Comptroller/CFO Donna Flynn, Director, Public Information John C. Sahradnik, Jr., County Counsel

Director Bartlett stated that there are two nominations recommended by the Natural Lands Trust Fund (NLTF) for acquisition on today's agenda. The Director advised that the first is a 1.6 acre parcel in Berkeley Township located adjacent to land purchased in the Potter's Creek area. The negotiated price is \$156,666. Director Bartlett stated that this piece fits nicely with approximately 120 acres of land already preserved by Ocean County and Berkeley Township. Director Bartlett stated that the second parcel is .25 acres located in South Toms River on Lakeview Drive, adjacent to the Jakes Branch property already preserved by the NLTF. The Director noted that a trail goes through this site to the adjacent NLTF property. David McKeon, Planning Director, was in attendance and advised that this site used to be a cranberry bog 100 years ago and a former talcum mill. The negotiated price for this acquisition is

\$48,500. Both of these acquisitions will be listed for the Board meeting of July 15, 2015.

Freeholder Kelly stated that the Board has discussed previously the Route 9 Corridor Study and several of questions came about from those discussions. The Freeholder advised that he has asked the County Engineer to put together a presentation for the Board regarding the Corridor Study.

John Ernst, Director of Engineering, reviewed a power point, a copy of which is attached, on the US 9 Corridor Study from Route 571 in Toms River to Route 88 in Lakewood. Freeholder Kelly noted that both communities are very much looking forward to this and are working cooperatively. Mr. Ernst stated that the study will take into account land uses along the corridor. Over 20 working group meetings and separate public outreach meetings are scheduled. Meetings include local officials for their project input. Mr. Ernst advised that the County will participate in all of the meetings as well.

Freeholder Kelly stated that the County is continuing to look at the overall plan and what the County can do now and how to move traffic better in this area. The Freeholder noted that long-term goals include a four lane highway, but there are no promises from the NJDOT that this will happen; past Commissioners have stated that this will never happen in our lifetimes. Freeholder Kelly stated that the amount of traffic that moves through this area necessitates a four lane highway; noting that accidents are 3 times higher on this State highway. The Freeholder advised that the two municipalities are reviewing their ordinances regarding access to Route 9 and trying not to put encroachments along Route 9 for the possibility of a future 4 lane Route 9 highway. The Freeholder applauded the NJDOT for meeting with County and the Townships of Toms River and Lakewood officials to work on both short term and long term plans for this State highway. Director Bartlett stated that the County has put a lot of money into our road system and has kept up with its growth.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the July 15, 2015 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of July 15, 2015. There were no questions or comments.

Director Bartlett asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Little noted that the Board of Health reported that an individual was taken to the hospital with possible Ebola. The Board of Health has advised that the individual does not have Ebola. The Freeholder stated that not one word of this was reported by the media. Freeholder Little advised that Ocean County is well prepared for Members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders July 9, 2015 Summary of the Pre-Board meeting of July 8, 2015 Page 3

these types of situations and that the Ocean County Health Department is monitoring this on an ongoing basis.

Freeholder Little noted an article in the Record on July 7 regarding 18 sewerage authorities in North Jersey that the State has denied requests to ignore new regulations for the dumping of raw sewage. The requirements were to go into effective on July 1, 2015. The towns have 3 to 5 years to resolve this. The Freeholder noted that when in rains in North Jersey, the article stated that 23 billion gallons of raw sewage and pollutants are going into the rivers and bays in North Jersey. Director Bartlett stated that not one drop of effluent goes into the Barnegat Bay in Ocean County. Ocean County does not dump in the Barnegat Bay. The Director thanked the NJDEP for not relieving those towns from dumping into their bays and rivers.

Freeholder Vicari noted that seniors and other residents have been receiving calls claiming to be from the IRS and other scams. The Freeholder stated that our residents need to be on guard and remain vigilant about these types of scams.

Director Bartlett stated that he had good news, the County received notification from the NJDEP that the Garden State Preservation Trust approved Green Acres matching grants in the amount of \$1,375,000 for natural lands acquisitions.

Director Bartlett passed on the sad news that Betty Hurley, Bay Head, passed away this weekend. The Director expressed condolences to her family from this Board. Director Bartlett stated that she was always working for good government and was a very dedicated woman and a good friend to Ocean County.

There were no additional comments.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Vicari, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:45 PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.

Director Bartlett noted that at the conclusion of the Closed Session, the Board would return to Open Session to close the meeting. No action would be taken.

The meeting returned to Open Session at 6:33 PM. There being no further business, on a motion by Freeholder Kelly, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting adjourned at 6:34 PM.



Freeholder Director John C. Bartlett opened the meeting at 4:00 PM and read the Statement of Compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act. The Clerk of the Board called the roll.

Freeholder Director Bartlett opened the meeting by introducing Freeholder Vicari who discussed the Energy Savings Program. Freeholder stated that in the past, marketing experts made recommendations in regards to the County's energy costs. Had the County followed their recommendations, our costs would have been extremely high. Federal funds and an updated County audit have enabled the County to implement money saving solutions as well as increased benefits to the environment.

Acting County Administrator Michael J. Fiure explained that the audit consisted of recommendations on how the County of Ocean can reduce energy costs. We have a contract with DCO energy, which we will only begin to pay for when their

recommendations are implemented. 2016 is the target date for implementation; the savings will be seen in the first year as well. An example of a long term money saving project would be boiler replacement, and a shorter term example would be energy saving light bulbs. Mr. Fiure stated that the County saved over \$500,000.00 over a two year period with the replacement of the County irrigation system.

Director Bartlett introduced David J. McKeon, Planning Director to discuss 3 Natural Lands Trust Acquisitions.

The first property is Stafford IV. It consists of 3.45 acres; Block 296, Lot 13, Stafford Township. It is located on Route 9 near the Hilliard Blvd. intersection. The adjacent property is owned by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as part of the Edwin B. Forsythe Wildlife Refuge. There are many other Natural Lands Trust Fund acquisitions within the same corridor of Rt. 9, totaling approximately 153 acres. The current owners are Joseph and Donna Marie Baebi. The asking price was \$380,000.00, and the negotiated price is \$166,250.00.

The second property is the Verwey Property. It is a 48 acre property on South Stump Tavern Road in Jackson Township, Block 17501, Lot 4. The wooded part of the property is in a Pinelands Conservation Area, containing an important pine snake habitat. It has 9 horse paddocks, and a 1,920 foot Amish constructed barn. This property is to be acquired in partnership with the Ocean County Parks Department, with the Parks Department purchasing the portion of land containing the barn which will be used for storing equipment for use in maintaining the natural lands and nearby Parks nursery. The Parks Department intends to move the horse paddocks to the Ocean County Fairgrounds for the 4H Club. The current owners are Gilbert and Verat Verwey. The asking price was \$487,500.00 and the accepted offer was \$377,000.00.

The third property is Tall Cedars. It is approximately 69 acres of land located on Nugentown Rd. in Little Egg Harbor Township, Block 78, Lots 33.01-33.25, 24.01. The property has approval for a 24-lot subdivision. It is adjacent to Pinelands Regional High School and within corridor of approximately 1,070 acres of NLTF, 142 acres of Parks and Bass River State Forest. The current owner is Tall Cedars, LLC C/O Marian Knowles. Asking price was \$3,000,000.00 and the negotiated offer is \$1,150,000.00.

Freeholder Director Bartlett explains the importance of the County's "green areas" and preserved land. Freeholder Little states that over 60% of Ocean County's land is preserved forever.

Frank Scarantino, County Engineer, awards 2015 B for the road resurfacing project on County Route 539 to Earle Asphalt in the amount of \$2,908,613.18. The 7

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mile reconstruction of Route 539 from the Parkway through Plumsted Township is Federally authorized and ready to go out to Bid. It encompasses 6 curves and many dangerous areas which will be constructed with a high friction wearing surface and colored aggregate. It will also have a new curve warning system with LED radar which will detect vehicles approaching, triggering a flashing light system indicating traffic pattern change, as well as radar speed signs. 25 miles of center line rumble strips will also be installed.

Mr. Scarantino reviewed the items listed on the attached Engineering Department agenda. There were no questions or comments, and all items will be listed on the agenda for the August 5, 2015 Board meeting.

Ms. Vasil reviewed the Clerk of the Board's agenda for the Board meeting of August 5, 2015. There were no questions or comments.

Director Bartlett asked the Board members for comments.

Freeholder Vicari commented on the Ocean County Airport. He stated that if more airport hangers were readily available, more planes could be accommodated there. This would increase revenue to Ocean County with the increased availability to private and executive planes.

Ms. Vasil read the resolution to move to closed session.

On a motion by Freeholder Bartlett, seconded by Freeholder Little, the meeting moved to Closed Session at 4:47PM for personnel discussion, appointments, reappointments, property acquisition and possible litigation. The motion was unanimously carried.
