The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the County of Ocean was called to order on November 17, 2021 at 4:00 PM, Room 119, County Administration Building, 101 Hooper Avenue, Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey, with Director Quinn presiding. Members Little, Vicari, Haines and Kelly were present at the call of the roll.

CLERK GUNTHER: "The first item on the agenda is a Resolution Public Hearing, Item E-1."

Clerk Gunther read the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution by title, which was scheduled for Public Hearing at this time.

Director Quinn opened the Public Hearing on the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution to the public for comments.

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay, being a Public Hearing, Commissioner would you like to say a few words?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Okay, thank you. As was stated by the Clerk, the property is 10.01 acres. It's on Hickory Lane in Berkeley Township and it's adjacent to over 837 acres of already Ocean County Natural Lands Trust property and it is near the Barnegat Branch Trail.

The owner accepted the negotiated offer of \$1,550,000.00. And the property had been approved for 15 family single

dwellings so we think it's a very good thing that we're able to preserve this piece of property."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Okay, being a Public Hearing, I'm going to open the floor to public comment. If anyone would like to speak, please come up to the microphone and give your name and address."

WILLIE DECAMP, PRESIDENT, SAVE BARNEGAT BAY, 117 HAINES ROAD, TOMS RIVER: "We support this vote, this resolution, the acquisition of this property. We thank the County for doing it. We sent the County a letter a while back, several months ago, just giving our perspective on this particular piece of property and it turned out that that was your perspective also. The EPA, I think, has declared it clean and there was an additional Phase 2 Environmental Study done and no taxpayer money, no Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund money was spent to clean up the pollution. So we really think this is a happy outcome. I could go back decades remembering this is really a source of misery for Bayville that this site existed. And so this is a happy moment where we thank the Board for acquiring this property.

I'd like to note also that there is a resolution, is it number 15?"

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Yes."

WILLIE DECAMP: "And if I may comment because this is a very much related subject and it was actually going to be further up in the agenda – that we support the acquisition of that property too. It's being donated by Berkeley Township and we would like to thank Mayor Amato for that. Success has a thousand fathers and everybody's probably rightfully proud of the role they played at saving the New Jersey Pulverizing site. Save Barnegat Bay is among the proud entities.

If you go back to March of 2003 and check the Asbury Park Press – March 15, 2003, to be exact, you will see the beginning of Save Barnegat Bay's involvement in saving the New Jersey Pulverizing site which was extensive. And now it's nice to see properties being added to that. So we thank you very much."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Willie. It's good to see you. But one of the things with this piece of property because Phase I was done, even though the EPA and the DEP said that it was clean, in speaking with staff and everything I wanted to make sure so that's why I had asked to do a Phase II just to double check to make sure that the land was clean. And it was. It came back and it was fine so that's why I said it's okay, I think it is a good piece for us to buy. And as I said, it's right near the Pulverizing Plant. The 837 acres is right next to it. So it's good."

WILLIE DECAMP: "Right. Thank you."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you Willie."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Willie. Anyone else like to speak? Seeing none I will close the Public Hearing."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Before we make a motion I just wanted to talk about what Willie said about Resolution I-15 and the reason to not have a Public Hearing. That's a donated piece of property. In the past we have had Public Hearings, but according to the attorney and the Director of Planning it is not required to have a Public Hearing because of being donated. It's not being taken off the tax rolls because it is already property owned by a municipality. I just wanted to put that on the record."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Do you want me to talk more?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Yes."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I was going to talk when we got to resolutions but since Tony is up there and we can have him show that, this piece of property is a 74-acre donation that we're receiving from Berkeley Township. It's within one of the sending zones of their Transfer of Development Rights districts. The donation confirms a commitment by the Township in pursuing preservation of a 110-acre project area on the west side of the County Natural Lands' 800-acre former NJ Pulverizing Plant. So we're very happy that Berkeley Township is donating this land. We work with many of the townships, but of course they have to agree that this land is coming off (tax rolls). Of course it already was because it was owned by the Township who are very happy with this and it just keeps adding to more of the Natural Lands that Ocean County has.

Again, a lot of people don't realize that 60% of Ocean County is preserved and that includes your federal, state, county and some municipal properties. So there is a tremendous amount. And of course, our Natural Lands is constantly doing whatever they can to, if there are any properties that would like to be put on. There is a process that they have to go through and if it meets with the requirements of Natural Lands then, of course, we will either purchase it and of course we always accept donations. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you very much Commissioner. Thank you Tony. Can I have a motion?"

No additional comments were received, therefore, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

On motion duly made by Commissioner Haines, seconded by Commissioner Vicari, the Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Fund Advisory Committee recommendation resolution was adopted on final reading.

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Now regarding Item number 3, before we vote we have a couple of people who want to speak on that. I will ask Michelle to read into the record a letter that we received from New Jersey Citizen Action, to be put on the record, that was sent to Commissioner Vicari."

CLERK GUNTHER: "As you'll note on the agenda today under Correspondence, R-4, we did receive a letter from Phyllis Salowe-Kaye who is the Executive Director of the New Jersey Citizen Action regarding the bank branch closure activity. I have copies of the letter on the table here in the front if anybody would like a copy. And we will go ahead and record that correspondence with our Board actions today."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Is that okay?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Fine."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Perfect. Okay, again, before we vote on it I know we have special guests here. Steve Steiner is

here today, who is the Chair of the Tourism Advisory Council and I know Steve would like to come up and say a few words in regards to this resolution."

STEVE STEINER, 521B AMBER STREET, BEACH HAVEN: "I am very pleased to speak with you all here today. As Chair of the Business and Tourism Advisory Committee, we're very concerned about these closures. Apparently, 24% of the banks in Ocean County are being closed or are in the process of being closed – bank branches. That's an enormous, ENORMOUS, loss of services for our population. And first of all, about a third of our population here in Ocean County, nearly a third, are seniors and they don't necessarily feel all that comfortable doing all of their banking online. We get that that's where the banking industry wants us to go, but that face-to-face service is really, really important, especially to our seniors.

And I'll tell you another problem. I live on Long Beach Island. We used to have four banks. We now have two. I think on the next island north there are no banks. Am I correct about that? (Yes) There are no banks at all and for a business in summer to have to go across that bridge just to get change orders to come back is really awful. Those businesses are under a tremendous burden by not having these services. And we really believe that our population in Ocean County is quite spread out, we are a very large county in area, and our transportation isn't anywhere near what it is in other areas of the State of New Jersey.

So it's really, really important that we do everything that we possibly can to avoid closing any more (banks). And if we can try to bring some services back to areas that have been completely shut out because the seniors can't get around as well as other people in our County. But the businesses that have to cross the bridge in the summertime that's just so much time and so much trouble. Please do everything we can to make everyone aware of how difficult this trend in the banking industry is on Ocean County specifically. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Steve. I know there are a few other members of the Tourism Council here if you would like to speak, come up and speak now before we vote on it. Just your name Joe and address."

JOE MAZZOLA, MANAHAWKIN: "That gentleman there comes from Beach Haven and what he is saying is correct. They have a certain amount of people out there and if you take banks away from them, they have to come over to the mainland. And coming over that bridge, you come over that bridge in the wintertime, it's no fun. Isn't that right?

But that's not the only thing. It seems to me and I talked to Mr. Vicari, he brought me into this, and it seems to me that the banks are taking their time on letting us know what is going to be. If this is not something that is widespread, if it's in the papers or not, and seniors saw this yesterday. Yesterday there was an article in the paper in the Asbury Park Press about the banks closing down. Now you take Point Pleasant, they have quite a few banks that went out. You have another bank here that got turned into a Starbucks. So they are taking them away a little at a time so it looks like they're picking them out. But this can't keep going on.

These seniors, the ones that called me on this here, that 22% or 24% of the banks – that's less than what we had before. And down here in Ocean County in Stafford, they're getting a larger amount from seniors and they're squawking. And in one day, that was put out yesterday and in one day people are calling you. So I do a lot down there. And now they're getting worried. We had at one time...it seems like everything is going against the seniors. We had the, what do you call it? The Home Rebate and all that. That went down. Then they reinstated that thanks to Mr. Vicari and they thanked him. And that's coming back. But it's always the seniors that are picked on and they are losing out. But this is worse than the tax. How do they get to the banks? Call your friend? You can't! Some of their friends need a friend. Then you have relatives, but some of them don't have relatives down here. How do they get to these banks? What are they going to do with them?

But why is it taking so long for them to put this in that they started this here and it's not going to end. But if it doesn't end it's going to cause people a lot of trouble. Now if they want the help, if you let me know what you want down in my area and I'm not worrying about going to Beach Haven because my daughter has a place out there. I'm not worried about going to different towns. I'm not afraid of that. Ask my friend (inaudible). She's sitting here. She'll tell you. I'm not afraid to go anyplace. But if you need the help, tell me what we have to do to stop this and I'll work along with you. But if we don't know about it, then it's like a sneak attack. And that's what I think it is with no one saying anything. But once they see it, it opens their eyes and they're going to start squawking.

Now if you want petitions or you want how many people are going to squawk down from Stafford, I can send you a load if you want to pay the postage. That's fine. But if you need the help, it's honest, I will do it. And you know that too Gary."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you very much Joe. We appreciate it. And you're not a member of the advisory board, but you know what is taking place in your town and you always keep us in touch with senior needs. And you were one of the first with the Senior Tax Freeze and the Homestead Rebate."

JOE MAZZOLA: "Okay? I thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Joe. Anyone else from the advisory board? Mayor Curatolo."

MAYOR PETE CURATOLO, LACEY TOWNSHIP: "Good afternoon and thank you for the opportunity. I also sit on the Advisory (Council) for Business and Tourism. I just want to first as a municipal leader say thank you for your

advocacy for this issue not only for our seniors, but our veterans too. I certainly support what my colleagues have said and I'd like to add to those comments.

One of the primary issues that we are concerned with and seniors have reached out to me in my hometown of Lacey Township/Forked River/Lanoka Harbor/Bamber is about scams. Overwhelmingly, our seniors are victims of these scams. And as a dad and protector, that part of me just kicks in. There are vicious scams both internally and externally from overseas so when a senior is required to do banking online that may not be that technologically savvy, you risk inviting some of that activity. So I just feel very appropriate to advocate for our seniors and I want to thank you because I know you've done it and you've memorialized your comments in a resolution as well. So that's very, very commendable. Without your support at the high county level, and we can't bring this service and this advocacy to our municipalities as mayors. We know you reach out and you have reached out to the Department of Banking and Insurance and we want to thank you for that.

In addition, I have also reached out to our Chief Michael DiBella. He's created a power point and he's updating it with one of our bank managers in town. But some of the latest scams – I certainly know and have high respect for the leadership in the county with Sheriff Mastronardy and Prosecutor Billhimer, but if you do want us in Lacey Township to share that power point with you to send out to seniors and businesses that's a resource there for you. I'll send it to you. You look it over and you decide. And I would be remiss if I didn't mention the Department of Senior Services with the Department of Tourism and Business Development who have all been in my town and have all really helped our seniors and our veterans and this is just an extension of that. So I want to thank you for your advocacy. And if you would like that or if you need my assistance, just tell me what to do and I want to help out certainly all of you and our seniors and I thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Mayor. Rory."

RORY WELLS, ESQUIRE, 208 OAK LANE, MANCHESTER: "I also serve on the Business Development and Tourism Council. I'm also just here in support of the issue. I believe it's a legitimate issue. I recognize that the times are requiring us to change and all businesses and entities are changing. Personally, I myself deposit checks through my phone. I deposit checks through an ATM. And I utilize in-service banking services. So I'm kind of much more adaptable. But before I went into private practice I did serve with the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office here for nearly 13 years and what the Mayor said is accurate. We almost send mixed signals. We tell seniors, 'Be very careful. Don't give any personal information out online or on the phone. Don't do any of that. There's victims every day, all day long.' And then the word coming from the banks is we want you to do all of your banking online or through a phone or through a computer. That's even if they have the technological ability to do so.

So I think it's a legitimate issue. Perhaps, I know Commissioner Vicari has been working and trying to get the attention of the state. My concern is much more local. Perhaps we could have a local roundtable at the county level. And if these businesses are closing and reestablishing their practices then perhaps they can give us a stay of five to ten years. Give us a commitment to our community. I mean there are other things they can do. Maybe they can do mobile banking sites in some of the senior communities. I know I was in the Brick Shoprite – there's a bank branch inside the Shoprite up there which I was pleased to see. So there are other options besides just closing these retail stores and leaving a vacuum.

So before the situation gets any worse, hopefully we can open up dialogue. I don't know if we're going to get any help from the state, but quite frankly I'm not necessarily concerned about outside of Ocean County at this point. I'm more concerned about Ocean County. I live in Manchester. We have a high senior population as well. So with that, I just want to thank you for giving me some time."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Rory. John."

JOHN CRISAFULLI, 18 BARTEEN STREET, TOMS RIVER: "So I'll speak on behalf of this being a banker. I'm a community banker for 26 years. I've seen the banking industry change tremendously, but I've always stayed with community banks. What is a community bank? It's a bank around a billion in assets or less. How many are left in our area or our county? Not many. If you remember going back, Summit Bank, United Jersey Bank – those are banks I used to work for. United National Bank in Plainfield. A lot of great, small community banks.

One thing that Commissioner Vicari shared with me is your advocacy to the state is so important. I will tell you as a community bank headquartered in Lakewood with 10 branches, around a billion in assets — we get pressure from the state regulators of branching out. We have a challenge with that. So if a regulator was to call our bank president and say we need you to branch out, we will support it, it will happen.

So you have to ask yourself why don't we see these community banks? Why don't we see de novos or startup banks anymore? Why not? Maybe it's about \$75 million in private capital to get your own bank chartered. That's very expensive. It's risky and it's expensive. It used to be when I started a bank in Cranford it was \$25 million in capital. So again, could that change? Could we work on that?

I was in Myrtle Beach and I went to a cross corner – four community banks on each corner – not even one national bank. So the other thing too is, I'm not going to name the banks, but there are national banks in our area that are headquartered out of our country. You have to really look at that. And the consumers need to really say 'maybe the pens are really great and their TV commercials are on TV, but where are they headquartered'? So look at that and support your community banks too.

But the advocacy on the state level is very needed and appreciated. And again, I am a proud community banker. It's a challenging industry for community banks. We are regulated by the state though, not national or the federal regulations. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you John. Anyone else? Seeing none, thank you to all the speakers that came out today to speak on the record. Michelle, if you could read the resolution."

CLERK GUNTHER: "Do you want me to read the resolution for the record?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Oh no, I'm sorry. You don't have to read it. Just a motion on resolution number 3."

On motion duly made by Commissioner Kelly, seconded by Commissioner Vicari, the resolution was adopted on final reading.

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "I would like to give comments after the vote."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Commissioner."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you. First of all, I would like to not only thank everyone that came today but this has been an issue for about one full year. And how does it get to this point? Well we get our information from the directors that are here today, from Maria LaFace from Senior Services, regarding issues. From the Veterans, Ed McBride is over here today, and also from Consumer Affairs. And it's been happening continuously. Why is it more of an issue in Ocean County than any place else in the State of New Jersey? For one reason, it's the largest county in the State of New Jersey and our senior and veteran population. The population that we're talking about, those that are in need, is over 250,000 people. And what they're doing in the banking industry – I'm not attacking the banking industry – we realize that they are controlled by profits and interest and whatever the case may be and they have a charter. It's the services we're talking about. They're removing a vital service that has been given to our senior citizens forever since the banks started. And they were always community - community bank, community service.

And you know what? A bank cannot make a profit on every single person that walks through their door. What it is doing is opening it up not only for fraud, not only for scams, but something else. The service is very important and when they remove that service, our senior citizens up there in years cannot afford to put food on their table. How are they going to afford wi-fi? That can't afford a computer. So they have to trust other people or keep the money in their house.

A lot of businesses you know today, they want the credit card, they want you to go online. We cannot afford to lose this service. A lot of people want to get a bank check and they can't get into a bank. The businesses, the small businesses in the Seaside Heights boardwalk area, cannot go to a bank several times a day or even several times a week. They have to do it electronically.

So what we are looking for is to keep the service we have. And if 24% - I was very surprised when I read that in the newspaper. I thought it was like 10% - 15% when we spoke about it. And we were interviewed, we had a committee that Michael Diamond interviewed all of the people, and he put things in perspective. More and more people are talking about the serious issue of removing banks that we have already.

Going back 10 years ago people would see on every corner in Ocean County, you would have a pizza place and a bank. And you go to the bank and you get a radio if you put money into it. You get a mixer. You get a TV set. You get a blender and a toaster. Now they pay virtually nothing in interest, the fees are high, and they are taking away a vital service. And what we are saying is we want them to rethink what's taking place.

The guidelines are set in place by two things – the State of New Jersey and the federal government. We have no control. What we are doing as a Board of Commissioners is giving the people a voice – basically the middle-class people and people at the lower end. Let's face it. They can't afford to go anyplace else to cash their check except check-cashing places. And it's very, very unfair to them because they don't have money right now. We have a shortage of workers to begin with. So what it is going to do is take more money not only out of the local economy, but the people want a voice. They want to see the person.

When we spoke with Senior Services the first thing they said was 'There is no gatekeeper.' When a senior goes into a bank and they take out large sums of money, the first thing under federal and state law is 'Well, why do you need this money?' As a friend they say, 'Do you need it? What are you doing with it?' A lot of times it's a scam. When they go into a bank and take out \$5,000.00 or \$6,000.00, \$10,000.00, the first thing the gatekeeper does – which is of course the bank teller, which they are trained to do – what are you doing with the money? If this goes through at even more than 24% it's going to be the biggest bomb in Ocean County that we have ever had.

I am planning to meet with a number of banks not to cut back but to offer the service. Most banks that I spoke to have encouraged me to go there, talk with the bank president, and say you know something? We want to expand the services. When it first came out in Berkeley Township, two banks that come to mind on Route 9 – Ocean First which Carmen Amato mentioned is right in the center of our senior citizens. And when I mentioned it, Commissioner Haines mentioned TD Bank on Mule Road right in the heart of our seniors in Toms River and Berkeley Township. That's not the place where you would start. I think what the banks have to do is to rethink what they're doing in the future. The

second thing is that continued services are so vital to our quarter of a million people in Ocean County.

I thank again Michael Diamond from the Asbury Park Press. 101.5 did a great job. WOBM. But we have to get the word out. So when they go to a bank, they pull up, they want to go inside, the bank is closed and they're in shock.

Now the wave of the future is for many people, technology – no question about it. People are not going to complain if 35, 40, 45 years old. But when they are 85, 90, 95 years old that is the issue. So what we are looking for is a plan that coexists, a hybrid plan that will take care of both. Goes to technology, we're not saying no to that. We're not saying look you can close the branch. But continue to supply and give needed residents that service.

This all started with a conference with our agencies talking back and forth. It didn't come from me. It came basically from the phone calls that have been coming in continuously. They're in a panic right now. They want something done. It's been very difficult with COVID-19 to communicate with our residents. But it's coming to a point now where they say to us as a Board of Commissioners, what are we going to do? Are we listening? We are listening. And some people are not on the advisory board. Joe Mazzola came as a private citizen representing his area in senior services, calling up continuously. We don't want this to continue unless they continue with the services. And there are alternative ways of doing it if they would listen. We want to work in government with a partnership – explain what the problem is, define it, ask the question of what are we going to do to solve the problem.

So I thank everyone that came out on behalf of all of us on the Board of Commissioners. Not only do we say thank you, but your voices have been heard. I will be meeting with the banking industry and looking for one thing, let's be community-minded, let's reach out and let's serve the residents that we represent. The banking industry makes a lot of money and there's nothing wrong with that. They make a profit. That's what America is all about. But they have a social responsibility. They have a responsibility to our seniors that are most vulnerable. And those are the people that will suffer most. Thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Okay Michelle."

JOE MAZZOLA: "Can I say one thing?"

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Make it very quick because we are in the middle of the voting."

JOE MAZZOLA: "All I know is that if anybody wants the help from the Commissioners up there, he knows how to get in touch with me. I have to have something every once in a while of what you people find that you're doing to come back to me because I spend the money. If I can get that cooperation, I will work with anything you guys want to do."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Maybe when Joe goes, the Commissioner goes down to Stafford to some of banks you might join him and the two of you can talk to them."

JOE MAZZOLA: "Okay."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "You know as a matter of fact I am going next week and what they can do if they want to talk to someone, which is a good idea, about the need of that because several banks want to make a change and banks want to move into Ocean County with the support of county government. And I think what made a difference when the reporter did the story he spoke with citizens at the Toms River Senior Center. So it was a combination of everybody working together and I appreciate that Joe."

JOE MAZZOLA: "All you have to do is call me. I've never turned you down yet have I?"

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "No."

JOE MAZZOLA: "You just let me know and I'll take you in a development if you want to talk, they'll allow you to talk. Okay? Thank you and have a good evening. Thanks for inviting me."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Thank you very much."

S. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

At 4:33 PM, Director Quinn received the following comments from members of the Board:

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Okay moving on, Item number S, Commissioner Comments. Commissioner Little."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Mr. Director. Briefly, our Health Department reports today that we have an average of 192 new cases over the last two days. On each day about 190 and that is an increase. So we are seeing a slight uptick. We have 84,502 confirmed cases. Deaths are at 2,224 and sadly that's an increase of four overnight. Long-term care facilities, we are experiencing unfortunately an outbreak at an assisted living facility which of course is under investigation.

Testing...I'm sorry, vaccinations, we are seeing an increase of people who are coming in for their booster shots. So we, for instance yesterday at Toms River North, 320 people which is one of the largest days we've had for this booster shot. And 110 at Southern Regional on Saturday. And again, we thank the Toms River School District and the Southern Regional School District for their cooperation which has been extremely helpful throughout the course of the pandemic. We can't thank them enough.

And total vaccinations, 117,726. So we're moving along. And flu – we are still seeing a low turnout for that - 13, 17 and 4 over the last day. So not many. So thank you Mr. Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Gerry. Commissioner Vicari."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Yes, if I may, I have two items. The first one is as the time approaches I know the biggest problem is going to be as far as the inflation with food and people buying food, of course, for Thanksgiving and we're getting more and more people saying, 'Help us ask for donations. Help us get more contributions so people can enjoy Thanksgiving.' The good thing that I found out several days ago that the Ocean County Vocational School received donations from Fulfill, the FoodBank, and will be preparing over 3,000 meals that will be delivered for people that cannot afford to purchase a turkey or purchase food. One of the issues, and here's where I get my information in talking to supermarket managers, the people that work the cash registers at supermarkets and stores — when people are buying food, they can't believe the cost factor. They don't have money. They put things back. And you know what a lot of them are doing? Using their credit card! Maxing it out! Paying 26% (interest).

Now we can't do anything as a Board of Commissioners, but we want to thank those who are making it a lot easier for our residents of Ocean County, the most needy, family people – most of them work, they have a job – to put food on their table for the holidays. So we thank all those participating.

And this one I wasn't going to mention until Joe Mazzola mentioned something else. How do we get the information? We listen to people. The people that pick up the phone I listen to with Senior Services, Consumer Affairs and Veterans. One of the things they did when I was Director of the Board and up to 21 counties, they always had the Director on the line, it was...talking about services is so important. And Joe Mazzola called me up and one of the issues was the property tax freeze and the State of New Jersey would not make a comment on it. The Homestead Rebate and (inaudible) found out from Senior Services and Maria LaFace is here and she gave me the figures, over \$87 million one year. \$87 million that the State of New Jersey questioned that eventually was restored. Because of the effort of our department, they not only gave us what we were asking for, sometimes more than that because they saw the need in Ocean County. They saw the costs of the median income of Ocean County. They knew the plight of our seniors. A lot of seniors live on \$1,800.00 per month. So I want to thank not only Maria LaFace that's here today, but the people that pick up the phone that made me aware of that. And as Carl Block was listening and a few of the other people, sometimes the state got a little annoyed with me. They said I was a little pushy, a little aggressive. But was it the right thing to do? When we have documentation of over \$87 million restored for one year and we know it's going to go on year after year and it's because of the workers that pick up the phone.

Sixteen people work in the Department of Senior Services and Maria we want to thank you very much because when you gave me the numbers I was startled too at first. And going back when I was talking back and forth with the state, there were several things and I had an opportunity which I did not do when I questioned – everyone knows – with the surgical centers. And I had an issue with that and we went back and forth. And when I was called several times twice – by Sean Hannity, the show and once by him. And the reason I refused to go on the program was because they would have said, you know what the news media would do, it's political. He's a Republican and everything else. So we had other people do it. And the thing is with this Board is getting results. Not going on national TV, not getting anything else. And I did not want to go on Channel 12 until, as we spoke about it before, until it was passed by the Board. Because what is taking place today is not one person, it's not me, it's the entire Board of Commissioners. But more so, it's the workers that pick up the phone, that talk to our residents, that take a personal interest, that show empathy and report it back to the supervisor who reports it to me. So you know something? You have an obligation to do something. And that's what we did today with the leadership of our Director. And that's what we did going back last year when the State of New Jersey questioned a lot of things we did. And that doesn't include the federal aid we got in Ocean County or the municipal aid for the different Mayors that complain all the time. And it's a fact, we have gotten notification from our Auditor of what took place. And you know being a Republican was a...the Governor's race, and I have been trying to keep out of that thing. And I was never criticized or attacked by anyone from the State of New Jersey which is a big plus. But sometimes they take it personal.

Everyone knows on the Board that was here years ago when I sent several resolutions and the Governor at that time questioned me and said, 'Joe Vicari will not run again ever for Freeholder.' I ran twice and I won. 'Never again.' And

when it came out, I mentioned many times before in Bridgegate when my name was questioned and the Governor of the state at that time, Chris Christie, got very upset with me and at that time the Board of Freeholders and the leadership of the Republican Party in Ocean County said, 'We will support any elected official that's Republican that does the right thing.' And that's one of the reasons probably why I'm here today is because of the support of the Republican Party and at that time those that supported me on the Board of Freeholders for doing the right thing. And the letters that I saved because I was going to be subpoenaed, that we still have, questioned what was taking place by our utility companies and questioned decisions by the Board of Public Utilities. So when I saved that , according to my attorney because I was subpoenaed but they never called me before the federal court at that time, when the news media found out I was questioned several times. And they said, 'Is it true?' They read actually documentation that they subpoenaed that criticized what we were doing because we did the right thing. And it was not only me. The letters I signed because I was Director at the time, but it was a decision by all five members at that time of the Board of Freeholders. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Joe. Commissioner Haines."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "Thank you. Well Gerry, I just want to let you know I got my booster shot yesterday and I have to say the staff and everybody at Toms River North were absolutely wonderful. And I didn't even feel the shot. I think the alcohol rub on my arm was worse than the shot. But I will tell you, it's just as it was when I got my first shots of the Moderna. They were as professional and it was just very well run. People went right in. There were not any problems. And I just want to compliment you and of course our Health Department because they do an excellent job.

The other thing I want to talk about is I happened to call and speak with Congressman Smith because of the Infrastructure Bill that was passed and just ask him questions about what does it mean for New Jersey. And he has part of the District. We have three Congressmen that cover Ocean County – Congressman Smith, Congressman Kim and of course, Congressman Van Drew.

And just a couple of highlights. He says that the Infrastructure funding – because it was the \$1.2 trillion – and that sounds like a lot of money and it is, but when you're spreading it across the 50 states and of course probably some of our territories...and he said, according to Smith 'The recently passed bipartisan \$1.2 trillion bill isn't as big as bold, but will help rebuild New Jersey's crumbling infrastructure by providing at least \$6.9 billion is going to go for our highways and roads just in New Jersey. \$4.2 billion to improve New Jersey public transportation and \$1.1 billion for bridge replacement and maintenance.' And Smith said that it was pointed out to him that out of the 1,156 bridges in the counties of his Congressional District, 117 or 10.1% are classified as structurally deficient and that repairs are needed.

So this is one area that we all know because John Ernst, our County Engineer, and as we've seen as Commissioners how we've been replacing and fixing our bridges that have come up that needed to get work done. And also he said that the 'bipartisan infrastructure bill authorizes \$55 billion in emergency funding for drinking water and wastewater infrastructure including \$15 billion for lead service line replacement over the five years through the Clean Water Supply State Revolving Fund and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund. Safe drinking water is an essential necessity of everyday life. It's not a luxury', says Smith who authored Get the Lead Out Act, H.R. 3300, to specifically combat lead tainted pipelines in towns in his district and other places in New Jersey. And this was first introduced in 2020 and Smith's bipartisan legislation would authorize \$66.2 billion over ten years and direct every utility in America to develop a plan to identify and remove lead pipes that threaten the health of residents, especially our children.

So I wanted to have some questions answered for me because of people that had talked to me about the legislation that was passed and I wanted to find out what it is going to do for the people of Ocean County and he did explain it. And I didn't call Congressman Kim or Congressman Van Drew, but I did happen to...I figured I would just call Congressman Smith because they're going to be telling me the same thing about all that needs to be done. And of course, there are 33 towns in Ocean County and of course we care about our roads and our bridges and our drinking water and of course any of the other infrastructure. But I think it might have been a very contentious vote, but I think it was something that Congressman Smith as well as the other Congressmen – because Congressman Van Drew as well as Congressman Kim voted for this infrastructure bill – and I think it's going to be very beneficial to the people of Ocean County because of the things that need to be done.

And I do know that Congressman Smith is not going to be voting on the next bill where it's very contentious with regards to money that will be given out to places that we don't want it to be given. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner Haines. Commissioner Kelly."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "It should be noted that the reason most of us reach out to Congressman Smith first is he is the senior member of the entire Congressional District from New Jersey. Not just the Republicans, but the Democrats and both the Senate and the House. And he has a very good understanding of what it means for our district and for the state. Say that out loud."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I said also Congressman Smith ranks either the top one, two or three across this country with legislation that has been signed into law. It is not easy. If anyone looks to see how legislation in order when a bill is introduced in Congress the steps that it has to take. It's not like the New Jersey Legislature where you introduce a bill and then it goes into committee and then it hopefully gets voted on in committee and then out on the floor and then gets sent to the Senate or the Assembly depending on which House it's going to. In Congress it's not

that way. There are many committees it has to go through before and they even have a committee to determine how long you can debate a bill and then how many amendments you can do besides all of the other areas that you have to go through in order to get a bill.

So for Congressman Smith, as Jack had said, to be able to be one of the top three in this country and all of his bills have always been either for human rights or for illnesses or things – it's always been about the people of this country and not just a small group of people. He's always put them first. Thank you Jack for letting me say that."

COMMISSIONER KELLY: "Thank you. That's all I have for today."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "And just adding on to what Commissioner Haines said, Commissioner Little certainly thank the Board of Health. I've gotten a lot of calls in the office upstairs from people that have gone and gotten their third shots not only at the arena, but at the different sites that you've set up throughout the county. And certainly the Board of Health has stepped up as much this time around as they have over the last two years and we have got to give them a tremendous amount of credit as well as yourself for doing what they're doing for the residents here in Ocean County. So please extend a thanks on behalf of the entire Board of Commissioners."

DEPUTY DIRECTOR LITTLE: "Thank you Director."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "The only other thing I want to mention is next week our meeting is going to be on Tuesday because of the Thanksgiving holiday. We'll be meeting for our PreBoard Meeting at 4:00 PM. Having said that, I want to wish everyone a happy, healthy and safe Thanksgiving. Enjoy yourselves. Don't eat too much. But stay safe, that's the most important thing."

COMMISSIONER HAINES: "I just want to say one thing. Jack Sahradnik's daughter is getting married this weekend and I want to wish Kristin and her fiancé, her husband to be, a very, very best wishes and congratulations."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Hey Jack, eat as much as you want. Drink as much as you want."

COUNTY COUNSEL SAHRADNIK: "It's not Thanksgiving. It's a pre-Thanksgiving."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Correct. Commissioner."

COMMISSIONER VICARI: "Yes, if I may add to what Commissioner Haines just mentioned. As far as the Infrastructure money, for the last four years we have been sending letters and I spoke personally to our Congressman that going back about 20 years ago, Navy Lakehurst Joint Base came to the County of Ocean and said, 'In order to keep the base with the BRAC Committee, we want to put a school in the Joint Base in Hangar One.' Because of their insistence we built a building with our money, County money, 54,000 square feet I believe for classrooms. The Navy decided it was essential for their programs to give back the school. We gave them back the school in pristine condition. We did everything perfect. But we had to build a new academy, the Performing Arts Academy, paid for with County money.

Now, we've been waiting for the last four years for the military, for the Joint Base – and we're very, very supportive of the Joint Base – to take some consideration and give us part of the money that was used to build the building that they would have had to build probably at four times the cost so we can build another addition and keep it in the vocational system. So when it came to the Infrastructure money, and I believe it's money they owe us, I said that should be considered. So I don't know where it's going now, but the building that we built and they said come and pay \$1.00 for the opportunity to have that. We received nothing. And I was going to continue to support that as far as getting money back into Ocean County. We've seen trillions of dollars spent in the United States. Biden, in my judgement, wasted or whatever the case may be, whatever it is I'm (inaudible) standard. But the United States government owes Ocean County money for a full building built specifically for classrooms that is being used for the Navy, which is good, which I'm not complaining – we did the right thing, so they could have another mission in that particular building that is a secure building. So I just want to make that point that we're not going to stop pursuing getting reimbursed for something that we gave the Navy because we wanted to support the military as we have always done. Thank you."

DIRECTOR QUINN: "Thank you Commissioner. Okay thank you Commissioners for your comments."

T. **PUBLIC COMMENTS** - "Comments from members of the audience are invited at this time with a limit of five (5) minutes per speaker."

At 4:51 PM, Director Quinn opened the meeting to receive comments from members of the public.

DIRECTOR QUINN: "At this point I will open the floor to public comments. If anyone would like to say anything please come up to the microphone and give your name and address and don't all jump at once."

No comments were received, therefore, Director Quinn asked for a motion to close the meeting.

\$122 million in telecommunication surcharges as "911 System and Emergency Response Fees

(Fees)" and deposits those monies into the 911 System and Emergency Trust Fund Account

(Fund); and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has collected over \$1.5 billion in fees since 2006

with only 11 percent of Fund monies being spent on eligible expenses including costs

associated with emergency response training, operating expenses and capital expenses; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has failed to provide funding for eligible

expenses to local 911 centers operated by Counties and municipalities across the State and has

instead diverted Fund dollars for ineligible expenses such as funding for the State's Department

of Law and Public Safety; and

WHEREAS, in its recent "Annual Report on the Collection and Use of 911 Fees" the

Federal Communications Commission (FCC) concluded that New jersey diverted more than

\$92 million of the almost \$123 million in 911 fees collected and adopted rules that now prohibit

the State of New Jersey, including its Counties and municipalities from applying for federal

grant monies to upgrade 911 centers; and

WHEREAS, Counties and municipalities handle the vast majority of 911 service

requests through local "Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP)" and have come to inequitably

rely on the collection of local property taxpayer dollars to improve, operate and maintain 911

systems; and

WHEREAS, Ocean County alone in 2020 answered over 385,182 calls made to the

911 emergency system; and

WHEREAS, recently introduced legislation to further enforce the will of the residents

legislatively expressed over 15 years ago will assist in prioritizing distribution of 911 System

and Emergency Response Trust Fund money, permitting use of funds for certain expenses

incurred by Counties and municipalities for the provision and maintenance of 911 emergency

services; and

WHEREAS, the proposed State legislation, A-5962 and S-4051, requires funds to be

distributed on a prioritized basis first to County, regionalized, or large centralized public safety

answering points, following by other local public safety answering points.

WHEREAS, many of our seniors and other residents have voiced their concerns to the Ocean County Office of Senior Services and the Ocean County Department of Consumer Affairs that their local bank branches, which they have patronized for years, are suddenly closed and bank employees are redirecting them to "nearby" branches which, based on the size of Ocean County, may be miles away forcing them to drive further distances; and

WHEREAS, these actions will also force many low to moderate income residents to seek the assistance of check cashing services which charge fees for simple transactions; and

WHEREAS, banking leaders must consider the needs of all of their stakeholders, in particular, their customers that are the heart and soul of any bank; and

WHEREAS, our seniors have worked their entire lives and deserve to enjoy their retirement without the added stress of finding and traveling to a bank far from their homes.
